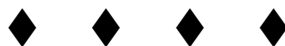
THE EIGHTY THIRD ANNUAL REUNION of the Reynolds Family Association as held at the National Headquarters of the Sons of the American Revolution, Louisville, Kentucky, Monday, September 16th, 2013.

The day before the meeting the weather changed for the better and a finer day could not have been asked for as our members started to arrive from the various states, some as far away as New Mexico, Delaware, and the State of Washington. Those arriving prior to the appointed date met on Sunday afternoon in the Hospitality Room of the Hampton Inn for fellowship, saying hello to old friends from past reunions and meeting new friends that we look forward to seeing at future reunions. Some enjoyed the material and books from the RFA Archives that was brought for research assistance by Corporate Secretary Ern Reynolds.

On Monday, after a tour of the Sons of the American Revolution Museum, the meeting was called to order by President Larry Joe Reynolds of Mount Pleasant, Texas and two guest speakers, Mr. Mel Arnold, past president of the Louisville Genealogy Society and Lynne Hollingsworth, Kentucky Historical Society gave informative and interesting speeches.

Throughout the day names of those present were drawn for door prizes, which consisted of items donated by our members. Most were arts and craft items that were hand made.

On Tuesday as some members headed for home, others took advantage of the location by visiting the Sons of the American Revolution Library where they were met with a wealth of information in this most excellent library.



Order of Business

The Board Meeting was then called to order at 2:30 pm on September 16, 2013 by RFA President Joe Reynolds. The following minutes from the February 25, 2013 were submitted by Secretary/Treasurer Ern Reynolds was approved unanimously by the board:

Board of Directors' Minutes - February 25, 2013

After due notice lawfully given, the Board of Directors of the Reynolds Family Association met via telephonic conference call on February 25, 2013. We began at 7:30 PM and ended at 8:46 PM. As indicated by check marks √ above, all eight currently serving officers and directors participated.

The roster maintained by the VP/Registrar Debra Jones lists 136 members of the Reynolds Family Association. We've gotten 4 or 5 new members by the end of last year. Cynthia Murdock is the latest.

The most recent bank account statement in hand effective January 31, 2013 shows no recent withdrawals, and a positive balance of \$8,984.61.

Line Coordination VP Gary Reynolds reported on his work with the Reynolds Family DNA Project. He does some DNA Project work nearly every day. Our Human Y-chromosome DNA haplogroup is passed exclusively from father to son, which makes the proper adjective to describe our project to be patrilineal.

Cheek swab sampling kits are submitted to Family Tree DNA in Houston TX. The project began a few years ago with 30 men participating. Currently our project's database records what 170 participants have submitted. These usually Reynolds-surnamed men live in the UK, Australia, Canada, and the US.

The RFA becoming web-centric has another advantage. Our American-centric group could expand to have useful members worldwide. These days people do not believe an organization exists if its website googles too low.

Despite these successful demystifications due to DNA, only two men out of every ten who are deemed qualified actually get around to ordering the swab kit. Gary's efforts to attract such participants through Reynolds Recollections has been disappointing. There used to be a Reynolds DNA website. But it was hacked twice and had to be taken down. If revived it would be nice to have linked to the RFA website Joe Reynolds tends so assiduously.

A by-law change is needed to recast Reynolds Recollections from a postally delivered benefit to "an electronic newsletter". The latter would include hyperlinks to relevant sources well-developed elsewhere.

Initially the DNA project leaders expected to identify a single haplogroup. But just one turned out to be a few - labeled R1, B1, A2, and I1. (Your Secretary-Treasurer turned up in haplogroup G, due to a suspected 1883 meretricious relationship that DNA testing finally verified.)

The distribution of these four haplogroups indicates that the Reynolds surname has a least two geographic sources. Colonel Stephen Frederick Tillman's 1948 and 1959 books written about the supposed descendants of Christopher Reynolds has proven to be dead wrong -- there is not just one single source of yDNA in that dubious line. (Ern Reynolds belongs only through his mother!)

The recent scientific revelations about DNA discoveries provoked a brief discussion about abandoning line designations altogether. Doing so would require a by-law change. But the discussion was inconclusive for two reasons: (a) we have far too few yDNA participants to be predictive; and (b) mDNA that is mitochondrially descended only from mother to daughter loses connection with the Reynolds surname upon marriage - in all but a few places like Iceland.

Within the RFA, Line 17 has long been our most numerous of the 15 charted lines and another 10 stonewalls. Perhaps 80% of our members show Line 25 - stonewalls. Some of the 15 charted lines now lack any member at all. Ern raised the Israel Pinsky case, in which in the 1970s a rich Jewish family all changed their surname to Reynolds en masse. It was written up in great detail

in a Washington Post feature. The family apparently thought Reynolds was grander than Pinsky. Should we open up a new line for them? They are greatly philanthropic in their outreach to other people.

Gary Reynolds proposed, and all seven entitled to vote agreed, that Dr. Robert Baird should be tendered honorary life membership in the RFA. This was a first. Bob Baird has performed Christopher Reynolds research to a remarkably high degree of scholarly fidelity, and made all his work and sources available for free. He subsequently received RFA Membership Number 3286-25. His work is a paragon of rigor that Ancestry.com can't match.

The usefulness of Ancestry.com for tracing descent came up. Ancestry.com includes a Reynolds Forum. While that commercial operation has numerous sources online for fee-based research, it is an agglomeration instead being a unified database. "Thought-to-be stuff" gets deleted as contradictions. But despite this stab at rigor and a preference for better documented information, its provenance is dubious. Scientific honesty remains at a premium.

The implication for the RFA from Ancestry.com is this. We should have a backup source for everything. Anything sent VP/Registrar Debra Ann Reynolds Jones should also be stored offsite from her home in Delaware. We need to explore "cloud computing" in light of this requirement.

In the past there has been way too much burden cast upon whoever was serving as VP/Registrar. Even stalwarts like Marilyn Newton burned out. We need to institute an understudy for each elected position - preferably a generation younger.

That's why each officer and director should begin by writing out a job description for each position - with a view to reconstituting how work can be divided up. Once written, the understudy or deputy position can be advertised. People reticent to take on the lead job might be more comfortable as the designated understudy. Such position descriptions should be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer. (As yet none have come in.)

President Joe Reynolds has offloaded from our Registrar to himself the duty to welcome new members. This new thrust has included an electronic welcome listing earliest Reynolds forbear, a greeting letter, a membership card, and a formal certificate suitable for framing. The September 2012 Revival Letter needs to be reworked into a brochure.

Our President Joe Reynolds described his most recent efforts to make the RFA more website-centered. A major incentive to (re)join RFA is the member-only access that exceeds public access to the site's resources. For example, once we are decidedly web-centric, the RFA could target its recruiting in England to County Kent, around Canterbury. Walter Reynolds was Archbishop of Canterbury there from 1313 to 1327. There are dozens to hundreds of Reynolds listed in Kent phone books today (despite the growth of cell phones).

Joe reports that every issue of Reynolds Recollections from 1983 to its hiatus in 2008 has been put online. He is missing only 1983's volume one (later contributed as well). They appear on the RFA website as searchable printer definition files (.pdf's).

Volunteers are needed to index this trove. Such a massive job can be divided up and performed on home computers at multiple distant locations - provided there are clear and integrated directions to go by.

Joe has also scanned in searchable .pdf's the RFA Annual Reports created between 1899 and 1922. He is seeking these and other E-Books to put online besides the seven E-Books he has already posted.

The publisher is down to a single for-sale copy of the following book: Clement, Susan Rogers, ed., Reynolds Family Association Centennial Collection: 100 Years of Historical and Genealogical Material Collected by the Reynolds Family Association, (Gregarth Publishing Co, POB 505, Wyandotte OK 74370, 1992, 813 pages in hb published w/o dj). Gregarth is supposed to send Joe a contract that will permit his reprinting this compilation in E-book form.

Joe's yeoman labors to bring RFA information resources into the 21st Century is ongoing. Individual members' family trees need

eventually to be reproduced electronically in TNG software. The Allen County IN Public Library is willing to be a repository for family trees, but only when put up in TNG first.

Wikipedia describes the package as follows: "The Next Generation of Genealogy Sitebuilding or TNG is a genealogy software installed in a web server ... The data is stored in MySQL database tables and displayed in PHP scripting language." In other words the application is written in PHP but must have MySQL databases underneath it.

Despite all the effort to become a web-centric group, high tech must be accompanied by high touch. President Joe Reynolds believes a face-to-face reunion every year is a must. To that end, Louisville, Kentucky is a strong possibility for September 15-17, 2013.

We will be holding our members-only programs Sunday and Monday at a fine American history museum that outgrew its library. We get to use both locations - the impressive museum site PLUS the separate new library site. Both places are convenient to our block of rooms reserved at the Hampton Inn.

When the program part of our conference ends early Tuesday morning, that's when we get a crack at the big library -- for as many extra days as you may wish to spend.

On Tuesday we're all set up to dig into the SAR's prime genealogical research library. It was expanded from the previous one. The specialized collection contains 20,000 volumes.

The research facilities and furnishings are new and very comfortably appointed. The fulltime professional librarian is on hand to be as helpful as he can be.

The library itself has recently been re-situated to a refurbished and upgraded historic area of Louisville, closer to the Ohio River. Its nearby restaurants and restorations have been designed to attract heritage-minded tourists.

So, the RFA conference will allow you to be as family-focused or else as vacation-minded as you care to be. Stay long enough and you can enjoy both possibilities.

The Board discussed Old Business of Updating the By-Laws to include anyone related to or interested in the Reynolds Family, this would include people in other countries and not just earlier American Settlers. Ern Reynolds agreed to take other suggestions from members and draft a new RFA By-Laws for Board Approval.

Also under Old Business we discussed the fact that Gregarth Publishing Co., was only authorized to produce and sell the *Reynolds Family Association Centennial Collection* in printed format. Joe Reynolds reported that he has signed a contract authorizing them to also publish it in Digital Format.

The last item of Old Business was that of Officers; we voted on and agreed that we would create the position of Vice President - Public Relations, that we would split the current duties of Ern Reynolds and have both a Corporate Secretary and a Treasurer, and lastly we agreed the Joy Reynolds' position of Registered Agent would be a "Voting" position with the RFA Board.

The following New Business was discussed:

- A new *Reynolds Family Association Application* was discussed, voted on and approved (See Appendix A). Also approved was putting the Application on-line on our web site and accepting PayPal as a means of payment.
- A lengthy discussion pursued about increasing our current line numbering system from two numbers to three numbers. This would allow us to start creating new lines in order to eventually eliminate Line 25, Stonewalls. When a person first joins the Association they will be placed in Line 25 until we can tie them into a current line or if it's determined that they do not fit into any of the known line then they will be assigned a new line. The three vehicles used to determine their line will be Family Group Sheets and Ancestral Charts that they submit, a GEDCOM file

submitted by the member, or YDNA testing by the member or a Reynolds family relative. Every effort will be made to make a determination of their line within the first 90 days. Gary Reynolds along with Joe Reynolds agreed to work together on a new numbering system and present it to the Board.

- We discussed, but no decision was made on the possibility of a *RFA Bookstore*. This bookstore would sell items of interest to members and possibly non-members. The proceeds of Bookstore would be used by the RFA or possibly donated to the Reynolds YDNA project "Testing Fund". Joe Reynolds agreed to look into the interest of our members in having a Bookstore.

Next came the Election of Officers, All current RFA officers agreed to serve and were elected to an additional term by a unanimous vote and the following new officers were elected:

- Director at Large - Connie Lee Reynolds Davis, New Brighton, MN
- Treasurer - David Archer Reynolds, Albuquerque, NM
- Corresponding Secretary - Margaret "Peggy" Reynolds Oliver, South Thomaston, ME
- Corporate Secretary - Ern Reynolds agreed to remain as the Corporate Secretary only.



Report of Treasurer

September 3, 2013

The spreadsheet roster maintained by the Secretary-Treasurer lists 176 members of the Reynolds Family Association.

By vote of the Board of Directors, no dues were imposed for the first eight months of the year 2013. After our Louisville meeting we expect to resume dues of \$20 per year covering 1 September 2013 thru 31 December 2014.

Dues-paying members for the year 2012 total 124 people. Twenty-one life members have no further dues to pay. That leaves a mere 31 freeriders.

The RFA maintains just one financial account. It is a checking account held with the TD Bank, N.A. The latter institution has branches in 15 states.

Each bank statement as received monthly by postal mail is scanned and e-mailed to all Board Members, along with images of any checks deposited.

The most recent account statement in hand effective July 31, 2013 shows no withdrawals, and a positive balance of \$9,776.61.

Subject to the August 31, 2013 bank statement not yet in hand, the RFA has thusfar written two checks toward expenses of the Louisville conference, totaling \$246.82. Deposits made in the month of August 2013 amount to five checks totaling \$132.00. Thus the August 31st bank statement once received should show RFA with \$9,661.79 on hand.

Ten checks deposited September 3, 2013 bring us to \$10,135.79 prior to our conducting the reunion in Louisville KY September 15 thru 17, 2013.

Conference billpaying can be expected to drop our balance below that \$10,000+ level. We anticipate that all further conference-related receipts and expenditures will be fully reflected once the September 30, 2013 bank statement is in hand.

REVISED BY-LAWS Adopted as amended Oct. 12, 2007:

ARTICLE I General.

1. Controlling Authority. The Reynolds Family Association, hereinafter the Association, is incorporated in the state of Delaware as a non-profit, membership organization. The Certificate of Incorporation, hereinafter the Charter, serves as the constitution of the Association.

2. Saving Clause. Any portion of these by-laws, or any subordinate rules or regulation adopted by the Association found to be inconsistent with any statute or regulation imposed by federal or Delaware authority or by the Charter shall be deemed null and void until amended to conform.

3. Not Tax Exempt. Individual or corporate contributions to the Association are not tax exempt and ought not be written off as deductible. The Association reserves the capability of applying to the federal Internal Revenue Service to gain tax-exempt status in the future.

ARTICLE II Purposes.

The purposes of the Association shall be as stated in the Charter, and in addition thereto:

- to promote the recognition and honor of a common Reynolds ancestry by Lines.
- to foster the development of acquaintances and fellowship among Reynolds surnamed people regardless of Line. By no means do we assume genetic kinship with all other Association members.
- to collect and maintain a permanent record of Reynolds family history in all Lines.
- to encourage cooperation and coordination of the genealogical research efforts of individual Association members.
- to conduct any other lawful business permitted a non-profit membership organization by the laws of Delaware, the U.S. Internal Revenue Code, and the Charter.

ARTICLE III Membership.

Section 1. Qualification. Membership is available to any person with a legal or genetic link to a Reynolds-surnamed direct ancestor or collateral relative. A legal link includes adoption or court-authorized change of surname. In order to qualify, such applicant must also submit requested genealogical information about the individual's connection to the Reynolds surname, sufficient to become associated with a specific Line (though "stonewall" is acceptable). Such applicant must subscribe to the purposes stated in the Charter and these by-laws, and must pay required dues each year.

Section 2. Rights and Privileges of Members.

- a. All dues-paid members in good standing, regardless of age, are entitled to attend annual and special meetings, and vote.
- b. All dues-paid members in good standing who are twenty-one years of age or older are eligible to hold office.
- c. All dues-paid members in good standing whose postal address on the membership list is different from any other postal address shown there are entitled to one subscription of the newsletter *Reynolds Recollections*.
- d. Machine-manipulable copies of the newsletter *Reynolds Recollections* shall be transmitted at no additional charge to a dues-paid member when sent via Internet to an electronic-mail address.

Section 3. Dues and Fees.

- a. Annual dues shall be established by the board of directors from time to time. Regardless of when adopted, any change in annual dues shall become effective on 1 January of the year following the adoption of such change.
- b. The board of directors may, from time to time, levy special fees and assessments for specific purposes, and establish the dates of effect for such fees and assessments.

ARTICLE IV Officers.

Section 1. General. Any dues-paid member of the Association who is 21 years of age or older and in good standing shall be eligible to hold office. All officers must be elected directors ex-officio. The officers of the Association shall consist of, in order of succession:

president
vice president / registrar
vice president for publications
vice president for line coordination
secretary
treasurer

and such other posts as may, from time to time be created by the board of directors. All officers and agents of this Association serve without compensation, although reimbursement for reasonable necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties on behalf of the Association shall be authorized. All officers have the authority to appoint subordinate agents as may be deemed necessary to carry out the functions and duties of office, and to delegate any or all of the authority of his or her office to such appointed agent or agents, but shall retain full responsibility for the proper conduct of the affairs of his or her office.

Section 2. Term of Office. All officers shall be elected at an annual meeting. Their term of office shall begin at the adjournment of the annual meeting at which elected, and shall continue until the adjournment of the next annual meeting.

Section 3. Duties.

- a. President -- The president is ex-officio the chairman of the board of directors and a member of all committees, except any nominating committee. The president shall be responsible for the proper conduct of the affairs of the Association. The president shall be the official representative of the Association in all relations with other organizations, to include the voting and acting on behalf of the Association at any meeting of stockholders of any company in

which the Association is a stockholder. This latter function may not be delegated without formal written proxy executed in advance, but all other representational and liaison functions may be delegated by the president to any other member.

b. Vice President / Registrar -- The (first) vice president / registrar shall:

(1) be responsible to the membership, the board of directors and the president for all matters pertaining to membership, to include: maintenance of membership lists, postal mailing lists, e-mail addresses, and all other membership records; collection of annual dues from members and forwarding such monies to the treasurer; conduct of correspondence with members and prospective members on membership matters when not handled by the appropriate Line Coordinator; and devising and printing such forms and materials as are required and necessary for the expedient performance of the duties of office

(2) maintain and republish from time to time a list of:

(a) websites containing Reynolds-specific genealogical data; and

(b) variant spellings of the Reynolds surname (such as Renault, Reighnold, Reynaldo, MacRaigeneld, Wrenolds) that may not always have an English origin.

(3) perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be assigned by the board of directors.

(4) assume the duties of the president in his or her absence.

c. Vice President for Publications -- The (second) vice president for publications shall:

(1) be responsible to the membership, the board of directors and the president for all matters pertaining to the publications of the Association, to include: preparing, editing, printing and distributing the newsletter *Reynolds Recollections*, and for editing, printing and distributing such other publications as may, from time to time be authorized by the board of directors.

(2) strive to have Reynolds-specific publications included in such online efforts as the Google Library Digitization Project.

(3) perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be assigned by the board of directors.

(4) assume the duties of the president in the absence of all other officers more senior,

d. Vice President for Line Coordination -- The (third) vice-president for line coordination shall:

(1) be responsible to the membership, the board of directors and the president for all matters pertaining to the collection, reliability and processing of Reynolds Family history and genealogical data to include: determine if and when a new line should be established, or old ones merged or disestablished; monitor the activities of the Line Coordinators to insure a minimum of overlap and duplication of effort; establish standards of quality to insure that any research conducted under the auspices of the Association meets the highest standards of accuracy and thoroughness of the American genealogical community; serve as point of contact for forensic DNA research among Reynolds kinsmen regardless of Line; encourage and coordinate publication of newsletters or Internet-based forums within established Reynolds lines; serve as liaison and coordinator between individual Line coordinators and the vice president for publications about notifying the membership articles and books of Association-wide and general public interest; and maintaining those files (paper-based and/or electronic) necessary for the expedient performance of the duties of office,

(2) perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be assigned by the board of directors.

(3) assume the duties of the president in the absence of all other officers more senior.

e. Secretary -- The secretary shall:

(1) serve as the point of contact for any communication coming to the Registered Agent for Service of Process located in Delaware, such as tax notices and annual report forms coming from the Secretary of State in Dover.

(2) be responsible to the membership, the board of directors and the president for recording and documenting the proceedings of annual and special meetings of the Association, the proceedings of meetings of the board of directors, and maintaining the official book of record of the Association.

(3) prepare all officially sealed correspondence of the Association to include; serving as sole signator (or with the president as co-signator when required) and affixing the Association's corporate seal.

(4) coordinate with the vice president for publications to insure that required notices of meetings and other required matters required by law are published and mailed to members in a timely manner.

(5) serve as the archivist maintaining a library of reference works and those published and unpublished works of members deemed worthy of archiving.

(6) perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be assigned by the board of directors.

(7) assume the duties of the president in the absence of all other officers more senior.

f. The Treasurer -- The treasurer shall:

(1) be responsible to the membership, the board of directors and the president for the proper conduct of financial affairs of the Association to include: establishing an account in the name of the Association in a federally insured financial institution for which he and two other officers shall have signature authority; taking receipt of monies from officers and agents of the Association and expeditiously depositing such monies in the Association's account; maintaining accurate and complete books of account; making such available for audit annually and at such other times as may be directed by the board of directors; assuring prompt payment of all county, state, and federal fees and taxes; making disbursements for promptly satisfying all other financial obligations of the Association while assuring that such disbursements do not contravene the Charter or any financial policy established by the board of directors; and assuring that all financial activities are those permitted of non-profit membership organizations as defined and described in the US Internal Revenue Code, whether or not tax-exempt

(2) undertake to apply to the IRS for a letter ruling that would find the Association to be tax-exempt.

(3) perform such other duties as may, from time to time, be assigned by the board of directors.

(4) assume the duties of the president in the absence of all other officers more senior.

Section 4. Records and Reports.

(1) All records and reports of the Association prepared and maintained by the directors, officers, or agents may be maintained in electronic, magnetic, or other media

devices, provided that such records are capable of being printed on paper and that adequate measures of redundancy are employed to minimize the loss of such records in the event of equipment failure or malfunction.

(2) Any member may examine any record of the Association by applying in writing to the president or the secretary and stating the reason for the request. Such examination by members at times other than the annual or special meeting shall be at a time and place agreeable to the director, officer or agent responsible for the maintenance of those records requested for examination.

ARTICLE V Membership Meetings.

Section 1. Annual Meeting. A face-to-face meeting in person of the Association shall be held annually. The purpose of the meeting shall be to elect officers/directors and to conduct any other business of the Association. The time and place of the annual meeting shall be fixed by the board directors and proper advance notice thereof shall be made to all dues-paid members in good standing by means of the newsletter *Reynolds Recollections*. Waivers of Notice conforming to Delaware law shall also be acceptable.

Section 2. Elections. Election of officer/directors shall be by paper ballot, except when there is a single candidate for an office/directorship Election shall be by majority. When conducted in conformity to Delaware law, balloting may optionally be accomplished via Internet so long as the face-to-face convocation is held as specified in the lawful Notice.

Section 3. Special Meetings. From time to time the board of directors may call a special meeting. The time and place of the meetings shall be fixed by the board of directors and proper notice shall be served on all dues-paid members eligible to vote. A special meeting may occur as a telephonic conference call or Internet-mediated forum, so long as done in conformity to Delaware law. For example, Skype / Voice Over Internet Protocol conferences can be conducted for free from as many as nine simultaneous locations anywhere in the world with participants who use a video camera as well as a microphone visible to each other.

Section 4. Quorum for Membership Meetings. A quorum for all meetings of the membership shall consist of those dues-paid members present in person but in no case less than seven present in person.

ARTICLE VI Board of Directors.

Section 1. Headcount. The board of directors shall consist of not less than three nor more than fifteen directors. Six directors are elected officers as described in Article IV above. The other directors serve without attendant office.

Section 2. Quorum for the Board. A quorum for the conduct of business shall be one-third the total number of directors, but in no case less than two.

Section 3. Compensation. Directors serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties on behalf of the Association.

Section 4. Resignation. Resignation of an officer or other directors shall be made in writing. The resignation shall become effective upon delivery to the chairman of the board of directors, or the secretary, unless another time is specified in the written resignation. An authenticated electronic mail communication once reduced to hard copy counts as a writing.

Section 5. Removal. Directors may be removed from office by a two-thirds vote of the dues-paid members present and balloting at a special meeting called for that purpose.

ARTICLE VII Parliamentary Authority. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, Tenth Edition (2000), shall apply to all questions and procedures not specified in these by-laws.

ARTICLE VIII Dissolution. Should it become necessary or desirable to dissolve the Association, such action will be undertaken by a resolution of the board of directors approved by a majority vote at any annual meeting or special meeting called for that purpose. Disposition of assets shall be in accordance with law and as further specified by the board of directors.

ARTICLE IX Amendment. These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of approval by the board of directors of the Association. Members may propose amendment at any meeting of the Association, and such amendment shall be considered by the directors at the next meeting of the board.
