A BLAST FROM THE PAST

There is a very large island at the doorstep of New York City which was once named for --and who knows-- might have been owned by one of us Reynoldses. From its appearance on a very old map, it might have been what is now Long Island.

I first discovered this intriguing bit of information a number of years ago as I was looking through a copy of Captain John Smith's General History of Virginia, New England, and the Summer Isles, the

original of which was printed in London in 1624. I turned to the title page and studied the details. I found below the oval portraits of Queen Elizabeth, King James and Prince Charles part of a map, presumably done by Smith, of the east coast of North America from Cape Fear to a part of Maine which he called Pembroke Bay (probably Penobscot Bay). Because of its configuration I recognized his Cape James as the present Cape Cod. Then, to my surprise and delight, I read alongside an elongated island just about where Long Island is situated the name "Renolds I".

I read through many pages of Smith's History but failed to find any mention of a Reynolds Island, though he was rather concise and complete in his observations. I learned, however, from general references on Captain Smith that he named many places after his sponsors or benefactors and his friends. One source stated that in his will Smith left some of his belongings to his "good friend, John Reynolds". It is possible that he named Long Island after this member of our family.

I have spent many hours throughout the past ten years or so in trying to learn something about "Reynolds I." but without success. Being a member of an international geographical society, I sought help there. I consulted the National Geographic Society, the Library of Congress, the New York Historical Society, the American Geographical Society, the Association of American Geographers, the Nassau County (NY) Historical Museum and even conferred in person with the head of maps division of the British Museum, all without a glimmer of a solution.

A mystery? Perhaps one of our readers has some knowledge of the origin and eventual disposition of the name "Renolds I". Or will this forever remain a mystery?



THOMAS REYNOLDS AND MARY OF RHODE ISLAND

My Biographical Sketch of my Reynolds Family shall focus on the Family Bible pages of my Great Grandmother Hattie Reynolds. When My Great Grandfather Lamont Deforest Reynolds married Hattie Newkirk Eastman they were given a large Bible. In it was a beautiful Certificate of Marriage for them dated June 3, 1885. There was also a page of "Family Record" that had been completed at the same time. The entries were obviously made in the same handwriting and reflected the oral history of the family at that time. Hattie herself had been orphaned when she was a young child and was raised by the Eastman family with no knowledge of her own family. The history of her husband's family, the Reynolds family, was important to her. This Family Record was the start of my family history research. Each of the generations below were listed in that Family Record and interestingly the birth and death dates in these pages are accurate up to the entry for Thomas and Mary Reynolds where no dates are listed.

Lamont, my Great Grandfather, was born in 1838. He was the only surviving child of his parents. Lamont was not very interested in the farming that his father did and pursued a career as a shop owner in Roulette PA and also as a budding photographer. He died of measles in 1899 at the age of 41, leaving behind 3 children including my grandfather Herbert Eastman Reynolds who was 6 years old at the time. Herbert did not have much memory of his father but he did remember his Grandfather William Coon Reynolds and told my mother several interesting stories about him.

My Great, Great Grandfather, Lamont's father, was William Coon Reynolds (1830 – 1904). William Coon was born in 1830 in Alfred NY. From there his family moved to Hebron PA where several of his siblings were born. William would live his entire life in Hebron as a farmer, logger and often a census enumerator. His parents were early members of the Seventh Day Baptist movement and where they lived, and where their offspring settled, reflected where these early SDB settlements were located. Much information about the family has been located in the archives of the SD Baptists.

William Coon Reynolds' parents were Foster S (1803 – 1892) and Fanny (Potter) Reynolds, my Great Great Great Grandparents. Both Foster and Fanny were Seventh Day Baptists with supporting records in the SDB library. In 1839 Fanny's father, Stephen H. Potter Jr., gave each of his living daughters, including Fanny, a gold bead necklace with an accompanying poem. The necklace has been passed down the Reynolds family women since then with documentation of each person along the way. I now have one third of that necklace.

My Great Great Great Great Grandparents were Foster (1772-1849) and Huldah (Crandall) Reynolds. Their families were originally from Rhode Island and were part of the migration to the New York area. Foster and Huldah settled in Petersburg, Rensselaer County NY in the Rensselaer Patent. They are confirmed as Foster S's parents in articles in the Seventh Day Sabbath Recorder and of course in the pages of my Reynolds Family Bible.

The final generation in the Family Record in the Bible pages is Thomas and Mary Reynolds as the parents of Foster Reynolds and who would be my Great Great Great Great Great Grandparents. This is the interesting part and clearly a big brick wall. A Thomas Reynolds is long known to genealogists as

being born in 1733 in Rhode Island and marrying Elizabeth Hopkins. Thomas and Elizabeth had many children listed in many sources although documentation is only found for the first several who were born in Rhode Island. When the family apparently moved west, perhaps to the New York area, documentation is lost. No records have been found of a relocation place, birthplace of additional children, possible earlier death of Elizabeth, possible remarriage of Thomas and death of Thomas. However, the Olive (Reynolds) Petty Will dated 1864 has shed some light on this family. She lists as her siblings a couple of the ones known to be born in RI along with other later siblings and their offspring. It would have been impossible that Elizabeth could have had these last children (including Olive) at such a late age and there was most likely a second wife after the death of Elizabeth. This may be the Mary Reynolds noted in my Bible pages as my Foster is most likely one of Thomas's later children according to the Petty Will. This continues to be an area of much research for me.



DAVID REYNOLDS AND ABERELLA METCALF OF MD (RFA LINE 53)

David Reynolds was born in 1806 in Maryland, according to census records. One of his obituaries described him as a native of Cecil County, but I have found no birth record to confirm this.*

Aberella Metcalf was born 25 Jan 1809 in Pennsylvania, to Andrew Metcalf and Mary Mitchell. Aberella's family history is well documented and includes early Quaker settlers in

southeastern Pennsylvania and northeastern Maryland.

David and Aberella were married in 1830 in Lancaster, PA.

David and Aberella lived in Little Britain, Lancaster, PA, where they had 4 sons and 5 daughters:

1. Mary Ann Reynolds, 1832-1893
2. Lewis Franklin Reynolds, 1833-1919
3. Reuben C. Reynolds, 1836-1909
4. Martha Jane Reynolds, 1838-1893
5. David Harrison Reynolds, 1840-1918
6. Catharine Reynolds, 1842 (d between 1866 and 1887)
7. Abraham M. Reynolds, 1846-1901
8. Aberella W. Reynolds, 1846-1901
9. Sarah L. Reynolds, 1850-1866

They moved to Prospect, Harford County, MD sometime between 1850 and 1860, where David worked as a wheelwright and a farmer. They owned a little over 100 acres, which was split between Lewis, Reuben, and David H. upon David's death.

Aberella died 30 Aug 1882, Harford, MD

David died 23 Sep 1889, Harford, MD

They are buried Mt. Vernon United Methodist Church, Whiteford, Harford, MD

*There are several trees now on ancestry.com that have John Reynolds (great grandson of Henry Reynolds of Chichester, b 1655) and Hannah Knight as David's parents, but I have seen no documentation showing how the tree owners arrived at this conclusion. None of the tree owners that I have contacted could provide any explanation, aside from some saying they copied it from another tree. Family lore has it that we do descend from Henry Reynolds and Prudence Clayton, and several of my

Y-DNA matches make that claim as well, but I am not yet able to connect David to Henry.

I have hit a dead end at my 5th great grandparents and am hoping you can help.

I am searching for the parents of Sarah 'Sallie' Reynolds, born April 8, 1796 in Tennessee. She married Abraham Hawk on Nov 28, 1815 in Hawkins County, Tennessee (Joab Brewer signed for her). She died Feb 7, 1858 in Tennessee and since she is buried in the Lee Cemetery, McDonald, Bradley County, Tennessee I assume she died nearby. I can find no hint of her parents.

Abraham Hawk was born Sep 7, 1790 most likely in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. He died Mar 1, 1854 in Knox County, Tennessee and is buried in the Cedar Springs Presbyterian Church Cemetery, Knoxville, Knox County, Tennessee.

Most people show Abraham's father as John Hawk born 1750 in Virginia and that he probably died about 1835 in Looneys Creek, Hardy County, West Virginia. His mother is supposedly Catherin Switzer born about 1769 and died possibly June 5, 1822 in Looneys Creek, Hardy County, West Virginia. I can find no absolute proof they were Abraham's parents. ANY assistance tracing Sarah Reynolds is greatly appreciated.

They are the only Reynold's surname matches I have, there of course could be others not listed as Reynolds.

I have saw several postings on Ancestry.com that William's parents were James and Susannah Lindsay but have found no documentation to back it up. Hopefully DNA will be able to confirm or deny this

This is a bit long, and not entirely a query, unless someone has more information on George H. Reynolds and/or typical customs concerning marriage.

It is about my ggg grandfather George H. Reynolds. My ggg grandmother was Ann Amelia Anderson from Nova Scotia.

I have a transcript of their marriage which states Jacob Reynolds and Mary Olds were the parents of George. However all the sources I find prior to their marriage lists George married to Louisa Beebe. What is curious to me is whether George and Louisa were divorced? Did he have contact with Alonzo and Adie his children with Louisa? The Ripplier book says he was still living in 1900 even though he died in St. Louis in 1892. The book does not mention Ann Amelia. The gravestone of Louisa has the inscription, wife of Geo. H. Reynolds which seems odd to me if they were divorced or separated. Yet the transcript of his marriage record clearly states that his parents were Jacob and Mary (Olds)

Reynolds. My DNA results on Ancestry seem to support both families using thru lines.

In the book, "A Genealogy of Runnels and Reynolds Families In America" I see my 4th great grandfather John Fulton Reynolds (1786 - 1870) listed, but I can not get the required documentation to show the lineage between John Fulton Reynolds and Jesse David Reynolds. Do you have anything on these two Reynolds?

I've been researching my friend's family. Her greatgrandfather was Pierce Reynolds born abt 1800. In some censuses, he states that he's from CT and others NY. His first wife was Mary Patten (I can't find anything on her) and his second wife was Frances Day.

I have quite a bit of information on him but I can't seem to figure out who his parents are. Pierce lived in New Rochelle from about 1840 to 1870. Then brooklyn where he died. I believe Pierce is from either Bedford NY or Greenwich CT. I found a deed online selling land from "Perez Reynolds Jr" and his wife, Mary to some other man. There is a man named either Perez or Ferris Reynolds who is buried in Bedford NY that I think might be Pierce Reynold's father.

When I look on ancestry.com and familysearch.org, all trees have Ferris/Perez listed as being the son of Nathaniel Reynolds & Sarah Ferris (but no sources) & born in the Bedford NY area. Ferris/Perez REynolds Sr is buried in Bedford and his date of birth on his gravestone is listed as Feb 26 1764. I found a baptismal record for a different Perez Reynolds, son of Enos Reynolds & his wife Sarah Newman in Greenwich. Feb 26, 1764 is listed as his baptismal date on church record. i think that the Ferris/Perez Reynolds buried in Bedford NY is really the son of Enos Reynolds & Sarah Newman

of Greenwich because the gravestone specifically lists his baptismal date.

Is there any way I can determine this? Do you have access to Reynolds records that aren't publicly available.

FYI - Enos Reynolds is descended from Jonathan Reynolds (son of John Reynolds & Sarah Chesterfield) while Nathaniel Reynold married to Sarah Ferris is related to John Reynolds (son of John Reynolds & Sarah Chesterfield).

My friend's daughter had asked me to look at her family tree to see if she has Revolutionary war ancestors. I can see there are ancestors on both family lines but I'd like to fine tune who their branch is. Anything you can do to point me in the right direction is appreciated.

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Has anyone ever found actual proof that Archelius "Woody" Reynolds ever married Mary Adams? His family seems to have a close DNA connection to my third great grandfather Lancelot "Lott" Whitlock. In all of my research, I have never found any proof Archelius and Mary ever married. I also have a problem with all of the children under 10 in his household in the 1800 census. There four, but I only find three children with his first wife and they were all born after 1800 (they were married in late 1797). I would appreciate any ideas concerning these mysteries. He did not seem to have any problem with having children out of wedlock and I wonder id one of those four children in the 1800 census could be Lott whitlock who was born 1n 1792.
