HENRY REYNOLDS

HENRY REYNOLDS, born 3 Dec 1840, NY was the son of Stephen Reynolds, born 17 Nov 1800, Washington, NY and Mariam Babcock, born 11 Mar 1807, VT.

Henry lived and worked on a farm near Nichols, Tioga, NY. He married Chloe Vandermark c 1861 in New York. Chloe was born c 1840 in New York. A son was born to this union, Oscar Henry Reynolds, 7 Dec 1861.

He then joined the Union Army, as a Private, 6 Aug 1862 in Company E, 130 Regiment, New York, 19th Calvary. He was captured by Confederate General Jubal Early's troops on 28 October 1864 at Middleton, VA. He was held at Richmond, VA then on 4 Nov 1864 sent to the Confederate Prison Camp at Salisbury, NC. He was paroled on 15 Feb 1865 at Richmond, VA. He spent some time in a couple hospitals before being returned to his Regiment. He was charged \$12.55 for his transportation.

Below is a page from: The Civil War Day by Day, An Almanac 1861-1865. October 19, Wednesday - BATTLE OF CEDAR CREEK OR BELLE GROVE, VIRGINIA

"Working their way carefully around the base of Three-top Mountain by a concealed pathway, and hidden by early morning fog, the three main forces of Gen. Jubal Early struck the Federal encampment at Cedar Creek or Belle Grove. The Northern positions crumpled and some still-sleeping soldiers were rudely awakened. As the sun rose and the fog lifted, the Confederates of Joseph B. Kershaw and John Brown Gordon had full possession of the camps and earthworks

of the Eighth and Nineteenth Corps of Sheridan's army and had taken many prisoners, considerable artillery, camp equipment and trains. Next Early attacked the Federal Sixth Corps, which had just returned to the army. Sixth Corps commander Horatio Wright was in charge of the entire Army due to Sheridan's absence. Sheridan had been in Washington part of Oct. 17 and hurried back toward the Valley by special train the same night. On Oct. 18 he went from Martinsburg, W.VA, to Winchester arriving in mid-afternoon. Instead of leaving directly for Cedar Creek, Sheridan paused to survey the defenses of the town.

The Sixth Corps did manage to make brief stands against Early's thrusts, withdrawing to a post north and west of Middletown, supported by the other slowly rallying Federals. Some of the Confederates looted the Cedar Creek camps as Early halted the drive. About ten-thirty in the morning Sheridan arrived from Winchester, helped inspire the Federals, strengthened the lines, and about 4 P.M. attacked. He drove Early back to Fisher's Hill with heavy losses in men and material. The Confederates were badly beaten, but they made a gallant showing. Sheridan's return became the theme of the famous poem of T. Buchanan Read, "Sheridan's Ride," which perhaps exaggerated the Federal commander's role. Out of more than 30,000 engaged, the North lost 644 killed, 3430 wounded, and 1591 missing for 5665 casualties. Confederate figures are disputed, with estimates of numbers engaged ranging from 8800 infantry to 18,000. Losses were possibly 320 killed, 1540 wounded, and 1050 missing for 2910. Confederate Maj. Gen.

Stephen D. Ramseur was mortally

wounded. Cedar Creek marked the last major battle of the war in the Shenandoah. Early's remnant continued to be a nuisance, but Federals controlled the Valley until the end."

**MAJOR GENERAL
JOHN FULTON REYNOLDS
by Justus "Jud" D. Reynolds, Jr.**

Major General (M.G. - 2 stars) John F. Reynolds entered the U.S. Military Academy at West Point NY from Lancaster PA in 1836 and graduated with the class of 1841. His classmates and friends during the four years at West Point included Generals Grant, Doubleday, Buckner, Buell, Bragg, Longstreet, Rosecrans, Pope, Thomas, Hooker, D.H. Hill, Jubal Early, Hancock, Thomas, P.G.T. Beauregard and W.T. Sherman. His graduation number was 1084, which means he was the 1,084th cadet to graduate from the academy.

There is a hero's place at West Point overlooking the Hudson River known as Battle Monument which was dedicated on 31 May 1897. General Reynolds' name is inscribed on this monument erected to the men and officers killed in the Civil War. The stone shaft atop the monument is the largest piece of turned granite in the world. It also contains the names of 2,230 brave fallen soldiers.

M.G. Reynolds served as an artillery officer in the Mexican War and was the Commandant of Cadets at West Point when the Civil War broke out in 1861. This was, and is a very prestigious position in the Army. He was appointed brigadier general of U.S. volunteers in 1861. He served with distinction in the Peninsular Campaign.

In his first principal engagement in the Civil War, he defeated Robert E. Lee at Cheat Mountain in western Virginia near Elkwater. Reynolds' losses were 21 while Lee lost almost 100. This action secured that portion of Virginia for the North in the early part of the war.

General Reynolds was shot dead by a Confederate rifleman as he rode forward disposing his troops on the first day of the battle at Gettysburg. His death occurred at 10:15 a.m., 1 July 1863, along a woodline adjacent to McPherson's Ridge a few miles south of the town. There is a large equestrian statue of him where he fell.

General Reynolds was at the time of his death the Commanding General of the Union's I Corps or 1st Corps, and was ironically replaced by a classmate, M.G. Abner Doubleday, later to become famous as the founder of baseball.

His body was brought back to be buried with his kindred in Lancaster PA by two of his aides, Capt. Ridle and Major Rosegarten. At his burial, Napier's eulogy was quoted, "no man died on that field with more glory than he, yet many died, and there was much glory."

General Reynolds was born in Lancaster 20 Sep 1820. He had a brother named James L. Reynolds, a prominent democrat who served on Governor Curtin's draft commission during the Civil War.

From many memoirs of that era it is clear that General Reynolds was highly respected. Perhaps representing the best of that said of him is the statement by General Robert E. Lee in his memoirs: "Among the officers killed at Gettysburg was Major General John F. Reynolds, whose gentlemanly bearing

and soldierly qualities were unsurpassed in any other officer of either army."

The only requirement is that you have a computer and a Genealogy Software Program, such as "Family Tree Maker", "MyHeritage Family Tree Builder", "Brother's Keeper", or any other genealogy program that can Export a GEDCOM file.

The RFA Archives contains many family histories that have been submitted by our cousins over the years; however these are all on paper and many in book format. We need to get them entered into the computer and a GEDCOM file completed so that we can put the information on our Members Only web site for the use of everyone and not just who may happen to have the books at the time.

If you are interested and can spare as little as an hour a week to do data entry then please let me know. I can scan the material and send it to you through email, a little at a time, or as much as you want. If you have any questions on how to export a GEDCOM file from your Genealogy Program I'm sure I can help and walk you through it. If you want to just give it a try to see how it goes then let me know. I'm willing to work with anyone to make this happen.

I would love for our members to simply log onto our web site, do a search and immediately connect with other cousins.

It has been to goal of our Archivists and our "Keeper of the Records" for many years to get all of the vast amount of information that we have accumulated into one central location where we could search for the exact information we are looking for. We now have that ability, please don't let it go to waste.
