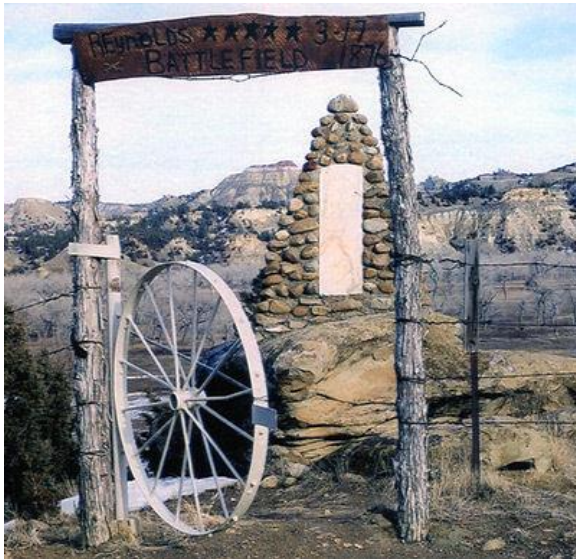


Peggy Reynolds Oliver

REYNOLDS BATTLEFIELD

Reynolds' Battlefield Monument is located about 28 miles southwest of Broadus on the Powder River down County Road 391 towards Moorhead Road. This battle on March 17, 1876 was a forerunner to the Battle of the Little Bighorn. The original purpose of the expedition was to force the Sioux Indians to return to the reservation. Colonel Joseph L. Reynolds column came across the camp of Cheyenne warriors and attacked their village thinking they were Sioux. After a 5 hour battle the Indians drove the soldiers back and made their way to the Ekalaka area where they joined Crazy Horse and his people. Reynolds was later court marshaled in part for leaving 2 dead soldiers on the battlefield. Although it lacked the glory of the Rosebud and Little Bighorn battles, Reynolds battle was an important event in western history.

Joseph Jones Reynolds (January 4, 1822 – February 25, 1899) was an American engineer, educator, and military officer who



fought in the American Civil War and the postbellum Indian Wars.

Reynolds was born in Flemingsburg, Kentucky. He briefly attended Wabash College before he received an appointment in 1839 to the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York. After graduating tenth of thirty-nine cadets in the Class of 1843, Reynolds was brevetted as a second lieutenant and initially assigned to the 4th U.S. Artillery.

He successively served at Fort Monroe in Virginia, Carlisle Barracks in central Pennsylvania, and then in Zachary Taylor's occupation army in Texas in 1845 before returning to the academy as assistant professor in 1846. On December 3 of that same year, he married Mary Elizabeth Bainbridge.

He left West Point in 1857 and subsequently returned to frontier duty, this time in the Indian Territory. He resigned his army commission and taught engineering at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri, for a time.

In 1860, he moved to the state of Indiana, where he owned a grocery business with one of his brothers.

After receiving a colonel's commission from Governor Oliver P. Morton, Reynolds was placed in command of Indiana's Camp Morton, the wartime state's militia muster encampment at Indianapolis. Reynolds's 10th Indiana Volunteer regiment was sent to western Virginia, where it played a decisive role repulsing Confederates under Robert E. Lee at Cheat Mountain.

Although promoted to brigadier general, Reynolds resigned in January 1862 and resumed training Indiana regiments at Camp Morton until November 1862 without a commission. Retroactively appointed colonel of the 75th Indiana volunteers, brigadier general with orders to build a depot and field works in Carthage, Tennessee, and then major general of U.S. volunteers, Reynolds commanded a division of XIV Corps, Army of the Cumberland, at Hoover's Gap and Chickamauga.

After serving as the army's chief of staff before Chattanooga, Reynolds was transferred to the Gulf of Mexico, where he led a division of XIX Corps that garrisoned New Orleans, Louisiana. He was later promoted to the command of the XIX Corps, and then commanded VII Corps in Arkansas.

He was the brother-in law of Brevet Brigadier General Jules C. Webber.

After the war, Reynolds remained in the regular army as colonel of the 26th U.S. Infantry and was assigned command of the Department of Arkansas. He later was transferred to duty in Texas during Reconstruction, replacing Charles Griffin in charge of the Department of Texas {5th Military District}. When military rule in Texas ceased in 1870, Reynolds again returned to frontier garrison duty.

In the early and mid-1870s, Reynolds fought hostile Indians on the Great Plains. During the Black Hills War of 1876, he led an attack on Sioux warriors under the chief He Dog in the Powder River country. At the Battle of Powder River on March 17, 1876, Col. Reynolds attacked a village of mostly Cheyenne Indians, whose principal chief was Old Bear. The Sioux contingent there numbered between 20 and 30, the most

notable of whom was He Dog, who was riding a horse belonging to Crazy Horse. The principal warrior chief was Two Moons, a Cheyenne. However, the campaign ended in failure, and Reynolds was subsequently court-martialed for his premature retreat. He was found guilty of the charges and given a suspended sentence, and was allowed to resign from the army on June 25, 1877.

Reynolds died in Washington, D.C., and is buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

FROM THE RFA ARCHIVES

The following information is from the Arkansas 1911 Census of Confederate Veterans. Transcribed and edited by Bobbie J. McLane and Capitola Glazner, 1977. Sent to RFA by Ella R. Emery from the TN Gen. Soc., Memphis TN, Mar 1992.

REYNOLDS, Archibald Hamilton of Camden AR, b 24 Mar 1845 at Starkville

(Oktibbeha) MS, s/o Hugh Montgomery Reynolds born in Fairfield District SC who lived in (Troup) GA and served in Indian War in FL. He was the son of William Malcom Reynolds and his wife Mary Montgomery who lived in Fairfield Dist. SC. Maiden name of subject's mother was Martha Hamilton d/o Thompson and Susan Hamilton who lived at Stone Mtn (Gwinnett) GA. "My father, Hugh Montgomery Reynolds, enlisted in service from (Troup) GA and went to FL to and served in the Seminole and Creek Wars for which his wife is now drawing a pension. My great-grandfather on my mother's side was Archibald Hamilton and was a descendant and landed in this country in VA [sic]. Subject was a Democrat, Presbyterian, Odd Fellow until charter was surrendered. Served in Co. F, 19th Regt AR Volunteers, enlisted at Lisbon, Union Co. or Camden AR 10 Mar 1862 to about last of May or 1st of Jun 1865, 3 years, 3 months. Was in 11 major battles besides light engagements through MS & TN. Married Willie Clay Heath, d/o William A. Heath and his wife Carrie Elisabeth Beverly of Wesson MS on 9 Jul 1885 at Starkville MS. Children:

REYNOLDS, Daniel Houck Harris, D 14 Mar 1902 Lake Village AR, b 14 Dec 1832 near Centerburg (Knox) OH, s/o Amos Reynolds b (Loudon) VA, lived there from 26 Mar 1850 in Knox Co. He was son of William Reynolds and his wife Rebecca

Harris who lived in (Loudon) VA. Maiden name of subject's mother was Sophia Houck, d/o James Houck and his wife Sarah Shadley who lived their last years in OH. Under "Remarks on Ancestry," the following: John Reynolds emigrated from England and settled in Loudon Co. VA. Daniel Harris emigrated from England and settled in Loudon Co. VA., time not known. Jacob Houck emigrated from Germany and settled in Baltimore Co. MD. Henry Foley emigrated from England and settled in Frederick Co. VA. Daniel Shadley emigrated from England and settled in Frederick Co. VA. William Reynolds, b 1771 (Loudon) VA, d 1824 (Knox) OH.

Subject attended school at the OH Wesleyan University in Delaware IA in 1854, thence to Somerville TN in 1857 he taught in OH, read law in IA and (Hardeman) TN, read law in office of Hon. John W. Harris, Somerville TN, was admitted to the bar there 13 May 1858. He came to AR in May 1858, was admitted to Bar 8 Jun 1858. On 15 Jun 1858 located to practice law at Lake Village (Chicot) AR and remained except time he was in the war. Was Brigadier General, 4th AR Bn AR Infantry; member of

legislature in Little Rock in 1866-67. He was elected to AR Senate from the Counties of Ashley, Chicot and Drew in 1866, and served until the legislature was disbanded by Military Order in 1867 under the Reconstruction Act of Congress. The subject was mustered in as captain 14 Jan 1861, elected Major 14 Apr 1862, elected Lieut. Col. 1 May 1862, appointed Colonel 17 Nov 1863, to take rank 20 Sep 1863, was appointed Brigadier General on 12 Mar 1864 to command the Brigade (McNairs) of which his regiment formed a part which was thereafter known as "Reynolds AR Brigade." Married Martha Jane Wallace, d/o Jeremiah Wallace and his wife Eleanor Waddell, 24 Nov 1868 at Lake Village (Chicot) AR. John Wallace emigrated from Scotland and settled in (Holmes) MS. Mary Coleman b GA, d (Holmes) MS in 1845. John Waddell emigrated from England and settled in LA, died Clinton LA 1846. John Waddell b LA 1794, d (Madison) MS 26 Dec 1844. Isaac Wells b GA 1859. Nancy Coleman b GA 186_. Caroline Matilda Wells b MS 1803, d Holly Springs MS 1847. Jeremiah Wallace born (Holmes) MS 25 Aug 1822, d 8 Nov 1848. Eleanor Waddell in Each [East?] Falician Parish LA 22 Nov 1826 - living. Martha Jane Wallace, subject's wife b (Holmes) MS 23 May 1845 and is now living in Lake Village AR. Children:

REYNOLDS, James William, of Omaha AR, b 20 Jul 1830 (St Genevieve) MO, s/o Samuel Reynolds of KY, and Nancy Boyd d/o William and Polly Boyd of St. Genevieve MO. He was a farmer, Democrat and Baptist. Entered service in 1861, under Claborns Div, Grandbergs Brig. released at Atlanta GA in Apr 1865. Married Mahalie White, after the war, near Omaha AR. She was d/o Charlie and Anna White of Bear Creek AR. One child: George Reynolds m Rhodie Blevins, Enon AR. Certified by D.A. Tomlinson, Assessor of Boone Co. AR. undated.

REYNOLDS, Richard Thomas, of Scipio AR, b 25 Mar 1838 Aberdeen (Monroe) MS, s/o John Clay Reynolds b (Hardin) TN, and was County and Probate Judge of Tishomingo MS 1852. He was the s/o Henry Reynolds who lived (Hardin) TN. Maiden name of subject's mother was Elizabeth Holbert, d/o William Holbert who lived at Bay Springs MS. "My grandfather Henry Reynolds came from Ireland to America and first settled in (Hardin) TN." Subject was educated in Carrollville MS. He was a farmer, Democrat and deacon, Primitive Baptist Church. Entered the war as a private soldier under Capt. Samuel Gibson in Gen. Churchills Co. in Apr 1863. Disbanded Jan 1865 in (Lafayette) AR. Married Susan Collins Johnson, d/o T.K. and Sarah Ann Johnson of Lacey AR on 9 Feb 1868 at Deane AR. Children:

REYNOLDS, Robert Alexander, of Conway AR, b 4 Feb 1848 Kerrville (Shelby) TN, s/o Robert Reynolds b (Davidson) TN, who lived at Purdy (McNairy) TN and was the s/o William Reynolds and his wife Mary Exum. Maiden name of subject's mother was Tabitha Person, d/o of William Person and his wife Susan Davis who lived in (Warren) NC. "My ancestry on my father's side came from Ireland. My great-grandfather took part in the Revolutionary War and was Capt. under Geo. Washington." Subject was educated in common schools of (Shelby) TN in Big Creek Academy. He was Deputy Sheriff and Justice of the Peace, a Democrat and a Methodist. Served in Co. K, 12th TN Cav. from 1864 to 1865, enlisted in (Shelby) TN. Married Mary Ella Hill, d/o Richard Hill and his wife Susan Glover of (Marshall) MS, married at Holly Springs MS. Children:

1. William Henry Reynolds m Jenny Fullmer.
2. Cora Reynolds m Geo. Simpson.
3. Florence Reynolds.
