Of the sphere you occupy.

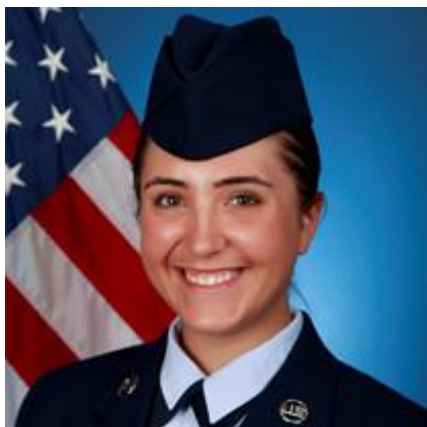
"Do you wish the world were wiser?

REYNOLDS IN THE CIVIL WAR

As many of you know, I'm a member of the Sons of Confederate Veterans and in doing research I have found many Reynolds' that fought on both sides of the war. If you have any

information on any Reynolds who was a soldier during this time, please contact me.

**PRIVATE,
WILLIAM JAMES REYNOLDS, SR.**

William, son of James Reynolds b. 08/16/1823, Patrick Co. Va., d. 04/02/1865, Fort Delaware, Del. m. 02/08/1859 Serepta Ann Robertson Reynolds Gill who was b. 08/08/1833 in Patrick Co., Va. Captured as a Private in Captain D. Lee Ross's Company D of the 51st Virginia Infantry under Maj. Gen. Jubal A. Early at the Battle of Waynesboro VA March 2, 1865. Transported by train as a prisoner of war to the federal military prison on Pea Patch Island in the Delaware River, he died within a month of "yellow measles" one week before the surrender at Appomattox. He and 2,435 more Confederates are quasi-buried at Finns Point National Cemetery on the New Jersey shore of the Delaware River. His name appears on the memorial obelisk there. Issue: William James Reynolds, Jr. (Quasi-buried means the Yankees dumped the daily contagion victims wholesale into the swamp.)

Fort Delaware State Park on Pea Patch Island is well worth visiting. It is an elegant complex of early 19th Century brickwork originally built as a coast artillery post to defend Philadelphia. In that role it never fired a shot in anger. An entire forest is buried underneath the brickwork, having been driven into the soft mud as pilings.

This old fortification was pressed into a use for which it was never designed. 21st Century visitors will be momentarily locked standing in a chamber. You are shoulder to shoulder with 18 others. The guide will ask how many more do you think could be squeezed in. Perhaps half a dozen you say. The guide says this lockdown cell contained 158 Confederate soldiers overnight. Since habeas corpus had been suspended by Lincoln, civilian Southern sympathizers were also kept there. A Methodist minister who survived the ordeal, the Rev. Isaac W. K. Handy of Augusta County, Virginia, left the best written account of the experience in his book *United*

States Bonds; Or Duress by the Federal Authority, (Turnbull Bros., Baltimore 1874)

Will Reynolds escaped Prison Division Four by dying in it. Back home in Patrick County, Virginia he was not a debtor but a soft-touch creditor. Scores of people around Meadows of Dan VA and Woolwine VA each owed him sums under \$10 for lumber he had cut, dressed, and sold them. His widow spent better than 20 years suing for these paltry sums. She obtained several judgments — all uncollectable in a rural economy from which both cash and commerce had vanished.

REYNOLDS BATTLEFIELD



Reynolds' Battlefield Monument is located about 28 miles southwest of Broadus on the Powder River down County Road 391 towards Moorhead Road. This battle on March 17, 1876 was a forerunner to the Battle of the Little Bighorn. The original purpose of the expedition was to force the Sioux Indians to return to the reservation. Colonel Joseph L. Reynolds column came across the camp of Cheyenne warriors and attacked their village thinking they were Sioux. After a 5 hour battle the Indians drove the soldiers back and made their way to the Ekalaka area where they joined Crazy Horse and his people. Reynolds was later court marshaled in part for leaving 2 dead soldiers on the battlefield. Although it lacked the glory of the Rosebud and Little Bighorn battles, Reynolds battle was an important event in western history.

13th International Conference on Genetic Genealogy, Houston, TX Nov 10-14, 2017

In mid-November I attended the Family Tree DNA's annual Genetic Genealogy Conference for project administrators. The conference was an excellent opportunity to learn about new data interpretation and mapping tools, the latest breakthroughs in genetic genealogy, and to network with fellow project administrators. Tommy Reynolds, Co-Administrator - Reynolds Y-DNA Project, was also able to attend this year's conference, his first. Tommy and I were fortunate to get to meet a couple RFA and RSP (Reynolds surname project) members during our visit to Houston.

There were many outstanding presentations. For example, Dr. Maurice Gleeson presented the usefulness of the SAPP tree modeling tool created by Dave Vance. Maurice showed how he used the SAPP tool to create subgroups in his Gleeson Project and calculate the approximate age of the most recent common ancestor (TMRCA) on the project's diagrammed tree. The tool simplifies the process of using STRs, SNPs, and traditional genealogy to create a descendent tree. It matches the genetic markers with others that share the same ancestor and estimates how recent the common ancestor was likely to have lived.

Another excellent presentation was by Peter Sjolund, Director of the DNA Academy from Sweden. He presented The Power of Mitochondrial DNA. Peter explained how he traced his wife's maternal line to the 1600s using mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA). Peter encouraged all mtDNA testers to register their kits at GenBank (tinyurl.com/mtDNAtoGenbank). He made an interesting comment that Viking remains

have been found in the Mississippi River. Now that is intriguing, isn't it?

Family Tree DNA announced their new laboratory expansion and new equipment acquisitions. They are now positioned to process more DNA test kits in a shorter timeframe. Their Y-DNA tests have been upgraded to provide more information. The 2017 Holiday Sale prices and discount coupons were revealed.

If you are considering upgrading now is the perfect time. Y-DNA tests provide the Short Tandem Repeat (STR) markers which are the basis of grouping members' kits into subgroups of more recent genealogy significance. Currently, FTDNA tests for a range of markers from a minimum of 12 up to a maximum of 111. During their Holiday Sale FTDNA is offering a free Y-111 STRs upgrade when you order the BIG Y. The Holiday Sale lasts until the end of the year. If you are already a FTDNA member you are receiving weekly discount coupons which saves you additional money over and above the Holiday Sale price. If you don't see a coupon for the test that you want to purchase, you can check the Reynolds Family Association Facebook group for unused coupons or contact me and I will try to find you a coupon.

The BIG Y test looks at only your personal male paternal line and will, in due course, give you the specific SNPs you have inherited from your male paternal ancestors. In turn both the Y111 STR results and these BIG Y SNPs (nearly 25,000 known SNPs will be considered) will enable you to take your male paternal family into ancient origins.

The Reynolds project needs more members to test up to Y-DNA 111 (STR markers) and to also complete the BIG Y (SNP markers). This combination is considered the "Golden Standard" for genetic genealogy. These are exciting times in genetic

genealogy and hopefully you can find the budget to do this. Maybe family members would like to pool money and give a present of DNA discoveries.

I cannot stress enough that accurate information and comprehensive testing is the key to a fruitful project. I encourage project members to take a few minutes to review their profiles on the FTDNA website to make sure they are up to date and that you have your most distant known ancestor listed. Don't guess about your ancestor, if you are not sure it is best to state that the ancestor is unknown. While you are reviewing your profile, please also check that your email and mailing address are up to date. Also, it is highly recommended to name a beneficiary for your kit.

In the coming months we'll be analyzing the Reynolds Y-DNA project's subgroups using the new methods that were shared during this year's conference. As the world of genetic genealogy is growing at an exponential rate, we are eagerly looking forward to next year's conference.

David Reynolds, enlisted in Captain Ely's Regiment in Lyme, Connecticut in April 1777. He was taken prisoner at Tarrytown and escaped in Lubec, Maine. He later returned to Maine with his land grant to settle in Washington County and marry Rebecca Cox. He died 31 March 1832 in Columbia, Maine. In his pension papers, a letter from Eliphalet Reynolds - whom enlisted at the same time and place and served with him - states that Eliphalet "knew David from infancy" and later says "he was a brother". I'm not assuming that Eliphalet and David were actual brothers, but it is a possibility. Both went to Washington County and settled in towns near each other.

In the Annuals report of 1923, David and Eliphalet are mentioned and it is suggested they were brothers - and somehow related to a Samuel Reynolds.
