BURT REYNOLDS DEAD AT 82



Burton Leon Reynolds Jr. was the son of Harriette Fernette "Fern" (née Miller; 1902–1992) and Burton Milo Reynolds (1906–2002). He had Dutch, English, Scots-Irish, and Scottish ancestry, and is also said to have had Cherokee roots, although this has been contested. During his career, he often claimed to have been born in Waycross, Georgia,

but said in 2015 that he was actually born in Lansing, Michigan. He was born on February 11, 1936, and in his autobiography stated that Lansing is where his family lived when his father was drafted into the United States Army. He, his mother, and his sister joined his father at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, and lived there for two years. When his father was sent to Europe, the family moved to Lake City, Michigan, where his mother had been raised. In 1946, the family moved to Riviera Beach, Florida. His father became Chief of Police of Riviera Beach, which is adjacent to the north side of West Palm Beach, Florida.

During 10th grade at Palm Beach High School, Reynolds was named First Team All-State and All Southern as a fullback, and received multiple scholarship offers.

After graduating from Palm Beach High, he attended Florida State University on a football scholarship and played halfback. While at Florida State, he roomed with college football broadcaster and analyst Lee Corso, and also became a brother of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity. He hoped to be named to All-American teams and have a career in professional football, but he injured his knee in the first game of his sophomore season, and later that year lost his spleen and injured his other knee by a car accident. These injuries hampered his abilities on the field, and after being beaten in coverage for the game-winning touchdown in a 7-0 loss to North Carolina State on October 12, 1957, he decided to give up football.

Ending his college football career, Reynolds thought of becoming a police officer, but his father suggested he finish college and become a parole officer. To keep up with his studies, he began taking classes at Palm Beach Junior College (PBJC) in neighboring Lake Park. In his first term at PBJC, he

was in an English class taught by Watson B. Duncan III. Duncan pushed him into trying out for a play he was producing, *Outward Bound*. He cast him in the lead role based on having heard him read Shakespeare in class, leading to his winning the 1956 Florida State Drama Award for his performance. In his autobiography, he referred to Duncan as his mentor and the most influential person in his life.

Reynolds was married to English actress Judy Carne from 1963 to 1965. He and American singer-actress Dinah Shore were in a relationship in the early 1970s for about five years. He had a relationship from about 1977 to 1982 with American actress Sally Field. Reynolds was married to American actress Loni Anderson from 1988 to 1993. They adopted a son, Quinton. He and Anderson separated after he fell in love with a cocktail waitress, with whom he later traded lawsuits which were settled out of court.

Reynolds' close friends were Johnny Carson, James Hampton, Dom DeLuise, Jerry Reed, Charles Nelson Reilly, Tammy Wynette, Lucie Arnaz, Adrienne Barbeau, Tawny Little, Dinah Shore and Chris Evert.

In the late 1970s, Reynolds opened Burt's Place, a nightclub restaurant in the Omni International Hotel in the Hotel District of Downtown Atlanta, and briefly operated a second version at Lenox Square. He was a life-long fan of American football, a result of his collegiate career, and was a minority owner of the Tampa Bay Bandits of the USFL from 1982 to 1986. The team's name was inspired by the *Smokey and the Bandit* trilogy and *Skoal Bandit*, a primary sponsor for the team as a result of also sponsoring Reynolds' motor racing team.

Reynolds co-owned a NASCAR Winston Cup team, Mach 1 Racing, with Hal Needham, which ran the #33 "Skoal Bandit" car with driver Harry Gant. He was awarded an honorary doctorate from Florida State University in 1981 and later endorsed the construction of a new performing arts facility in Sarasota, Florida. He also owned a private theater in Jupiter, Florida, with a focus on training young performers looking to enter show business. In 1984, he opened a restaurant in Fort Lauderdale, "Burt & Jacks", that he co-owned with Jack Jackson.

While filming *City Heat*, Reynolds was struck in the face with a metal chair and had temporomandibular joint dysfunction. He lost thirty pounds from not eating. The painkillers he was prescribed led to addiction, which lasted several years. He underwent back surgery in 2009 and a quintuple coronary artery bypass surgery in February 2010.

On August 16, 2011, Merrill Lynch Credit Corporation filed foreclosure papers, claiming Reynolds owed US\$1.2 million on his home in Hobe Sound, Florida. He owned the Burt Reynolds Ranch, where scenes for *Smokey and the Bandit* were filmed and which once had a petting zoo, until its sale during bankruptcy. In April 2014, the 153-acre (62 ha) rural property was rezoned for residential use and the Palm Beach County school system could sell it to residential developer K. Hovnanian Homes. Reynolds also once purchased a mansion on a tract of land in Loganville, Georgia, while married to Loni Anderson.

Reynolds died at a Jupiter, Florida hospital on September 6, 2018. He had heart problems for a number of years. He was 82. His ex-wife Loni Anderson issued a statement saying that she and their son Quinton would miss him and "his great laugh."

On the day of Reynolds' death, Antenna TV, which airs *The Tonight Show* nightly, aired an episode of *The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson* from February 11, 1982, featuring an interview and a *This Is Your Life*-style skit with Reynolds. The local media in Atlanta and elsewhere in the state noted on their television news programs that evening that he was the first to make major films in Georgia, all of which were successful, which helped make the state one of the top filming locations in the country. From car-crash comedies like "*Smokey and the Bandit*" to romances like "*Starting Over*" to the hit television series "*Evening Shade*," Mr. Reynolds delighted audiences for four decades, most often playing a good-hearted good ol' boy seemingly not that different from his offscreen self.

Reynolds Family Coat of Arms.

There is no such thing as one official Reynolds coat of arms. Coats of arms were granted to individuals, not surnames. They may be used by the descendants of the person to whom they are granted, but not by others who just happen to have the same surname.

Below are several different Coats of Arms that bear the Reynolds name.



I have had several individual over the years ask me about the coat of arms that is used and displayed by the Reynolds Family Association. After a great amount of research, I have found how it all started:

This was published in the Reynolds Family Association Annual Report in 1900:

A resolution by Mr. Howard Reynolds, of Boston, MA was offered, to the Reynolds Family, providing for the appointment of a committee whose duty shall be to suggest a dignified design for a coat-of-arms for the Reynolds family and submit same at the next annual meeting of the association, said committee to be appointed by the chair.

The Motion carried and the following was taken from the RFA Annual Report in 1901.

Report of the Arms Committee. By Howard Reynolds, of Boston.

Mr. Chairman:

It occurs to me as well as to probably all of you who come here as I do for the first time, that it would be extremely desirable if we should have some mark, some badge, some unique designation, insignia, that we could wear on occasions of the sort for identification, and that we could use for marking our private papers. I consider that we may, as an organization, assume with dignity, a mark, badge, or arms, which as private individuals, might seem rather against the best taste, perhaps. Of the five general branches of the association there are only two, I believe, that have a distinct right to arms, that can definitely trace it, and of those branches the chairman of the arms committee, Judge J. P. Reynolds, represents one. I have conferred with him, and he has suggested, and so far as he is concerned is entirely willing to waive his prerogative in that matter and permit the use of the arms to all members. Instead of the members' arms being cut up into half a dozen different designs by quartering the Reynolds arms with the various other arms into which the branches married, we think it best in the interest of unity to unite upon one simple device, holding it for all of us and for our descendants. I have prepared the following motion which I would like to read to you:

In having been found desirable for the Reynolds Family Association to adopt some emblem by which members may identify each other, and

Whereas, it is desirable to choose some design of historical value rather than a purely arbitrary symbol, therefore be it

Resolved, That an heraldic device of three gold foxes statant upon a shield of blue with a crest of a gold fox statant, be adopted by the association as its official badge and emblem, to be also used by the members for the marking of their private property, as a seal, or in such manner as they may desire.

While it is not claimed that the descent of every member of our association from the ancient Norman family of Renard which bore this device can now be indisputable proven, the insignia proposed has some probability and is of more significance and interest than any other which the association can adopt.

Now I will say further that Vol. III. Of the Battle Abbey Roll by the Duchess of Cleveland, gives five names of Renard in the men at arms who came over from Normandy with the Conqueror; that this same device of the three foxes obtained more than five hundred years ago in the French family; and that its antiquity is to a certain extent guaranteed by the fact that in the earliest times the symbols adopted were largely representations of animals. As a rule they adopted what they called a "canting" device, that is, an allusion to the real name of the proprietor, simply that the illiterate men at arms should at once distinguish it. My cousin, for instance, whose name is De Wolf, comes from an old line and has a wolf as his crest, and for the same reason the old Norman name of Renard has the fox, which is of course for the sake of the illiterate men at arms who would immediately associate it with the name as they would not perhaps a star or a circle or some such device which has no possible connection with the name. Now that being the case, my proposition is to adopt the French coloring, which was a blue shield with three gold foxes upon it, as the general seal of the association and the private make by which the

members may identify each other on occasions when they meet; and I have had prepared, as secretary of the arms committee, a rough sketch by an able draftsman who understands such matters, and I wish to submit that to you all so that you can inspect it at your leisure, and possibly later, I hope, decide as to whether it would be suitable to take that as a mark of the association.

I wish to say, carrying it a step further, that I think it would be of considerable interest to the members of the family to be able to have copies of this device in the proper colors. I picked out Mr. Henry Mitchell, of Boston, who is recognized as being an authority on heraldry, to make a drawing, and this sketch, although it is somewhat crude, will give a very good idea of it. I also had some estimates prepared for my own satisfaction to see what it would cost to produce these in the best lithography and of suitable size to frame and hang if people chose, and I found that my estimate on two was rather faulty because I could get five hundred just about as cheaply. I found that the total expense for five hundred would not be over eighty dollars (\$80). That would mean that if the present assemblage here would agree to take two each at fifty cents apiece, we could immediately have the device printed and always preserve it, and there will be a quantity of copies remaining which as they were sold from time to time the proceeds could be turned into silver badges of a similar design which could be distributed among and worn by the members as they might choose. That is the report of the arms committee.

Motion made and carried that the report of the arms committee be accepted and the resolution contained therein adopted.

There are many books and web sites dedicated to Coats of Arms and Family Crest. You may want to see if you can discover the one issued to one of your ancestors. A very excellent book on Heraldry is "Heraldry and You, Modern heraldic Usage in America by J. A. Reynolds.
