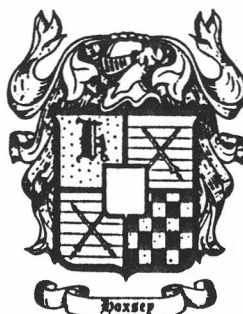

FOREWORD

Not many husbands would spend the hours and hours and hours and more hours of research tracing the ancestry of his wife's family and then take more time to type and organize it into book form, but mine has done just that. I am especially grateful to my husband for putting this information in written form since the name "Hoxsey" through my grandfather's and father's line stops here. INTRODUCTION

After getting a good start on my own family connections, I became interested in also working on my wife's family connections which was about twenty-five years ago. When we would visit her family, we began gathering information. As more and more information was obtained, a file folder on each ancestor proved very helpful. When we lived in St. Louis, we were close to her Illinois roots in both Madison County and Macoupin County. Here I visited the Hoxsey Cemetery as well as Courthouses, other cemeteries, libraries, family members, etc.

Finding the origin of a family is always interesting. We found that her immigrant, Lodowick Hoxsey, had come to the New World in the early 1650s while my Steffy immigrant, Ulrich, had come in 1727. It seems that Hoxsey (Hoxie, Hawksie, etc.) is of Scottish origin. An expert on surname origins states concerning "Hoxsey" the following: "One who came from Hoxay mound on an island of Scotland." There is agreement that Lodowick came from Great Britain.

My interest in both my family and my wife's family has been to concentrate on getting information on our direct ancestors. This pattern has also been followed in this book. I started with biographical data on her earliest Hoxsey ancestor in the first section and then the next one, etc. Then in the next two sections of "Connections with Her Father's Family" and "Connections with Her Mother's Family", I started with the most recent ancestor of that name. It will be helpful to refer to the "Pedigree Charts" of my wife and see all the connections that begins with her and includes all her direct ancestors that have been found.

After writing "MY STEFFY FAMILY CONNECTIONS" last year, I began thinking about writing "OUR HOXSEY FAMILY CONNECTIONS" to complete both of our family histories. I have followed the same pattern that was used in my previous book. I would like to say that I have achieved accuracy, but I realize this is not possible. However, I have tried to be as accurate as is possible. Sometimes records on the family do not always agree, but one must give the most logical information.

"Family records are as our footprints in the sands of time." This statement shows the importance of preserving our family roots so it will be easier to learn from those who have gone before us.

JOB AND DEBORAH BABCOCK

Job Babcock was born c1671 in Westerly, Rhode Island, to John and Mary (Lawton) Babcock. He died before February 10, 1755, in Rhode Island when his will was probated there.

Job married Deborah Reynolds, the daughter of Joseph and Mary Reynolds, in Rhode Island c1695. Deborah was born in 1674 in Westerly, Rhode Island. She was still living in 1708 when Abigail was born so the exact date of her death is unknown.

Job owned land in Kingston as he was mentioned in the deed of Rachel Cottrill as "west part by land of Job Babcock" (dated February 17, 1720/21). Also, Judith Cottrill mentioned "west on land of Job Babcock" (dated March 17, 1720/21). Job Babcock and Peter Wells, Jr., both of Kingston and both yeomen bind each other "to accept the arbitration of Captain William Clarke and Daniel Brown, both of Westerly, and Rouse Helme of Kingston to end a difference between them concerning the boundary line separating their land" (dated November 24, 1720, Westerly--Witnesses: William Congdon and Joseph Sheffield). Job Babcock and George Babcock, his brother, both of Kingston and both yeomen own land in Kingston "in partnership which is undivided between them; they agree to a division of the land between them" (dated and acknowledged November, 1720, with Witnesses: William Tanner and Stephen Willcock).

Samuel (son of Job and Deborah) and Bethiah Babcock of South Kingston deed land "for love" to their sons: John of Exeter (a shoemaker), Simeon of Richmond (a weaver) and Job of Richmond (a tailor). These transactions were dated February 12 and acknowledged on February 13, 1755. Witnesses were: Jonathan Babcock, Simeon Perry and James Babcock. Samuel And Bethiah Babcock of Richmond, yeoman (farmer), deed to John Peterson of Rochester, Massachusetts, yeoman (dated and acknowledged on September 16, 1755). Witnesses were: Jeremiah Crandall and Job Babcock.

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JOHN AND MARY BABCOCK

John Babcock was born in 1644 in Portsmouth, Rhode Island, to James and Sarah Babcock. His father gave testimony in court in 1670 stating that he was fifty-eight years old and his son, John, was twenty-six. He died on June 26, 1685, in Westerly, Rhode Island, after going there with his father.

John married Mary Lawton, the daughter of George and Elizabeth (Hazard) Lawton, in 1662 in Rhode Island. She was born in 1648 in Rhode Island and died on November 8, 1711, in Westerly, Rhode Island. Mary also married Erasmus Babbitt on April 21, 1698. Mary was baptized on May 14, 1698, in the Seventh Day Baptist Church.

John was appointed one of the additional trustees when Westerly was settled. He was only about eighteen years old. He was made a freeman at Westerly on October 28, 1668. When King Philip's War broke out in July of 1675, Rhode Island, heavily Quaker, took little part in the war. John turned therefore to Connecticut and enlisted in the militia and took part in the Great Swamp Fight. He was made freeman of the Colony of Connecticut on May 14, 1676. He was appointed as Conservator of the Peace for Westerly on June 12, 1678. He swore allegiance again (previously May 17, 1671) to the King and to Rhode Island on September 17, 1679. He served as Deputy from Westerly in 1682 and 1684.

John died intestate in 1685 and the Town Council made a settlement of his estate on June 26, 1685. They found that James had made an agreement with his mother giving her half the estate which could have been his. The estate amounted to 790 pounds, 3 shillings and was the largest estate recorded in years. The estate included a Negro boy, 2 Indian men and Indian girls, plus 329 oxen, horses, cows, sheep, 141 pounds & 15 shillings, seven bedsteads with beds & sheets, pewter flagons, porringers, earthenware, etc. She received 263 pounds, 7 shillings and each of the children were to have 57 pounds & 2 shillings as they came of age. The widow was the executrix and was to give a bond.

A COPY OF THE WILL MADE BY THE TOWN COUNCIL
RESPECTING THE SETTLEMENT OF THE ESTATE OF
JOHN BABCOCK OF THE TOWN OF WESTERLY.
Deceased, the Twenty-Sixth of June, 1685

"These are to certify all persons who it may concern, That
whereas John Babcock of the town of Westerly, deceased without a
will, whereby the care of the widow and orphans respecting the
settlement of the deceased man's estate is by law commended to the
cognizance of the Town Council.

"We therefore who are the Council appointed by the town
according to trust committed unto us having taken an inventory of
the deceased person's estate, and likewise finding a settled
agreement between the widow and the eldest son James Babcock the
son of John Babcock respecting his own portion out of his deceased
father's estate, judge it meet to make no alteration of the said
estate to amount to the sum of 790 lbs. 3s. Op. We do order and
appoint unto the widow of the deceased John Babcock the sum of 263
lbs, seven shillings & 8 pence for her part of the above said sum
it being one third part. And whereas there are nine children
more to wit Ann Babcock Mary Babcock John Babcock Job Babcock
George Babcock Elihu Babcock Roger Babcock Joseph Babcock Oliver
Babcock: We do order and appoint Mary Babcock, the widow of the
deceased John Babcock, executrix of all the orphan's estate
consisting of lands or cattle or horses or monies and whatsoever
else valuable according to inventory, And likewise to take the
charge and care of the orphans during their nonage, and in case
any one or more of the orphans die before they come of age then
his or their portion to be equally divided among those that
survive, we do hereby also order and appoint that the widow shall
pay or cause to be paid the several legacies unto the children as
is before expressed and in the mean time to give bond to the
Council for the performance thereof."

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JAMES AND SARAH BABCOCK

James Babcock (Badcock) was born in 1612 probably in Wavenhoe (or Wivenhoe), County Essex, England, to James and Mary Babcock, Sr. Sir Richard Babcock (possibly uncle of James) was said to have been 19th in descent from the first holder of the Babcock Estate in Wavenhoe. James died June 12, 1679, in Westerly, Rhode Island, after verbally declaring his will to his sons, John and Job, who appeared before the court on September 17, 1679, to testify to it. All his tools that he used as a blacksmith were to go to Job, housing and land plus one cow and a calf to his daughters and all the remainder was to go to his widow. He left nothing to his son, John, because he was already well provided with land and goods to judge from John's inventory.

James married Sarah (surname unknown) c1640 in Rhode Island. She was born c1616 and died in 1665 probably in Portsmouth, Rhode Island. He then married Elizabeth March in 1669 in Rhode Island. Their children were: Joseph (1670-1729+) who married Dorothy Ket and then Hannah Coates (widow), Nathaniel (born c1666) who died on January 2, 1719, and Elizabeth. After James' death, Elizabeth married William Johnson on September 22, 1679, and they went to Stonington, Connecticut, to live.

James immigrated to New England, first appearing on the records as an inhabitant of the town of Portsmouth, Rhode Island, on February 25, 1642, when he was granted ten acres of land. James was made a freeman on July 10, 1648, at Portsmouth, Rhode Island. He served as juryman on November 21, 1649, August 11, 1652, March 2, 1657, and in October, 1661. He was assessor on February 19, 1650, and was appointed to examine the military arms of the people in 1642 and 1650. He was in constant trouble with the Pequot Indians and was brought into court on a charge of driving them off their planting ground. On June 29, 1660, a company that had formed to establish a new settlement at Misquamucock (now Westerly, Rhode Island) bought land on June 29, 1660. The names of James and his son, John, were added to the trustees when the number was increased from eight to eighteen. He moved to Westerly, Rhode Island, in March, 1662, when the first settlement was made. The following were listed on "A List of the Free Inhabitants of the Town of Westerly, May 18th, 1669": James Babcock, Sen., James Babcock, Jun., John Babcock, Job Babcock plus twenty others. James was baptized on March 2, 1678, by Elder William Hiscox and united with the Seventh Day Baptist Church of Newport and Westerly.

WILL OF JAMES BADCOCKE
Born 1612, Died June 12, 1679

"The last Will and Testament of James Badcocke Sen'r as he verbally declared before us Under written.

"Imp he willed and bequeathed unto his Son Job Badcocke all his Smith tooles of what sort or Kind Soever that he dyed possessed of:

"2ly he Bequeathed one cow to be delivered unto his daughter Mary Champlin by his Administratrix hereafter mentioned with in convenient time after his decease.

"3ly he bequeathed a Cow Calfe to William Champlin Eldest daughter as above said.

"4ly he Bequeathed unto his Son Joseph all his housing and lands for him the said Joseph Badcocke to take into his possession when he shall attaine to the age of twenty one yeares.

"5ly he Willed and declared that all the Remaining part of his Estate besides what he hath herein Bequeathed, he did give unto his wife Elizabeth Badcocke for the Maintanence and bringing up of the three children he had by his said wife and for her and her heires and assignes forever.

"Lastly of this his Will he declared that his loveing wife Elizabeth Badcocke should be Administratrix to this his last Will and Testament.

"This Testator dyed the 12th of June 1679."

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JOSEPH AND MARY REYNOLDS

Joseph Reynolds was born on November 27, 1652, in North Kingston, Rhode Island. His parents were James and Deborah Reynolds. He died in June, 1739, in Washington County, Rhode Island.

Joseph married Mary (surname unknown) by 1672 in Rhode Island. Mary was born c1654 in North Kingstown, Rhode Island. She died after 1696 in Rhode Island. After the death of Mary, he married Mercy (surname unknown).

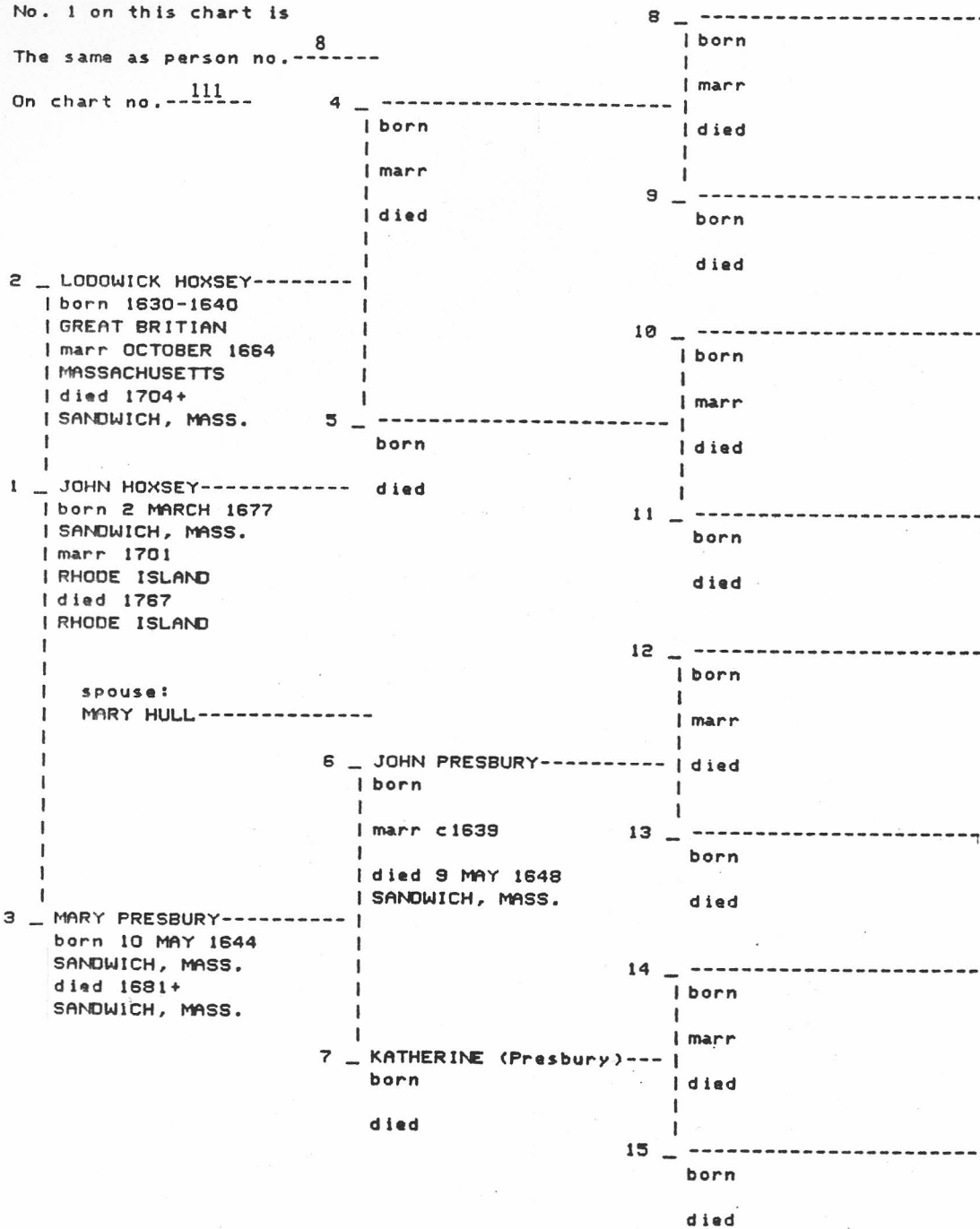
