- 1) This family is subject to further development, correction, revision or possible refutation. The Thomas of the will of M. Baird may not be Thomas.
- 2) Margaret Baird's will, probated in Washington County, Maryland in 1800 named sons Joseph, Thomas, William, and daughters Mary, and Elizabeth Reynolds, and Fanny and Peggy Baird.
- 3) Will of Margaret Baird dated 12 May 1800, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland, recorded Harrison County, Virginia, Will Book #5, p. 445, names Joseph and Mary Clark, son-in-law and daughter 1/8 shilling. Joseph Reynolds, son, 500 acres on Gnatty Creek, Harrison County, by mother of testatrix and paid for by Reynolds; Elizabeth Reynolds, daughter, 100 acres in Kentucky, Thomas Reynolds, son, 1 English shilling; Fanny Baird, daughter, 1 pair of sugar tongs and 6 teaspoons, Peggy Baird, daughter, 6 teaspoons, etc. Exr. William M. and Elizabeth Reynolds. Probated 13 September 1800, Washington County, Maryland.
- 4) Margaret was "The widow Reynolds" before she became "the widow Baird".
- 5) Pemberton's "History of Pleasants County" says the English emigrant of the 18th Century was the father of Thomas who came to Middle Island. The family Bible, in possession of descendants of Thomas's son George W. Reynolds, also makes this statement. Pemberton, an English newspaperman was a more accurate reporter than most, knew the Reynolds family (George Washington and Daniel's) personally, and reported that Noah was the name of the "ancestor" of their father, Thomas.
- 6) Militia Roll 1790 - Hampshire County, Virginia, Captain John Blue, includes John Reynolds and Robert Reynolds.
- 7) From H. W. Newman "Anne Arundel Gentry" p. 100-2 re: Reynolds: Capt. John and Joseph Reynolds, brothers, from Washington Co., - father's name not given, date not in notes.
- 8) From "Sidelights of Maryland History" by Hester Dorsey Richardson: "Foxe's Den" 1,000 A. surveyed in Prince George's Co. for Thomas Reynolds 3 Oct. 1702; also Lords of the Manor from Lord Baltimore's rent rolls incl.: Thos. Notes:

1) Mary Anne Edelin, Edolin, or Eardolin b. 1758, Maryland, died 1830-1840. [Try All Saints Parish, Frederick Co., MD where Edelin, Reynolds and Wilson families lived.] Also Prince Georges Co., MD, St. John's Parish, where James, son of Edward and Elizabeth Edelin was b. 14 Apr. 1710.

2) Patriots Oath, Ann Arundel County MD included Thomas Reynolds among many other Reynolds.

From a list of Revolutionary War Veterans one Thomas Reynolds was Private, Maryland Line. Another [possibly the same ?] Thomas Reynolds, Private, Maryland Line, prisoner, received 100 acres 14 August 1794 [where ?] Grant number 14, 124.

But see p. 41 Records of Maryland troops in the Continental Service: Wm & Thomas Reynolds enlisted by Edw. Spurrier, passed by Thomas Dorsey. Also, Thomas Reynolds enl. 15 June 1778, discharged March 1779, 5th Maryland "Lynch's" and Thomas Reynolds enlisted 10 May 1779, discharged 16 August 1780, missing on discharge. [MSE]

3) Thomas's will, dated 1 August 1815, in Will bk 1-A p. 27 Tyler County, Virginia. Thomas signed by mark. All the children except Noah and Hiram were listed. Names and birthdates of children were in family Bible as copied and supplied to me. [MSE]

4) A deed from Thomas Reynolds and wife Mary to John Carter 30 October 1779, Frederick County, MD, Liber WR p. 277 should be looked into.

5) Williams "History of Washington County, Ohio", p.568 " Among the earliest settlers in the township were the children of Thomas and Mary Ann Reynolds, who emigrated from Maryland [agrees with the census of 1880, MSE] and settled opposite Newport Township in West Virginia. All their children but one settled in Newport. [not true, MSE] John and Samuel settled near Ferguson's Landing in 1805. *** (John the sole survivor of the veterans of 1812 from this township)" [list and relationship of family members is garbled in this history, yet more complete than most, MSE].

7) Centennial Edition, St. Marys Oracle 30 June 1949

"Thomas Reynolds was a soldier in the War of 1812, [A search was made for Thomas Reynolds in the Archives for service in 1812 - nothing was found to fit the known facts. His sons were in the War of 1812. I believe he was too old for it. MSE] settled at Rea's Run up river. [William Rea kept Rea's Hotel "Travelers Rest" near Independence until 1808 when he moved it to Rea's Run.] Bought from Jacob LaRue (son-in-law) 40 acres of lower Middle Island for an old iron kettle used to boil

down maple syrup. [This is a good story, but it is not true - MSE] The date on the side was 1755. At the time of purchase, 1806, he was apparently camped up- river (Daniel seems to be the only one of the children who was born in Ohio, 1801-although George W. was listed in one Census as having been born in Ohio, in others he was said to have been born in Virginia as were John and Samuel. Noah and Thomas Jr. were born in Maryland, others not known. Jacob LaRue's family lived on Middle Island- Isaac LaRue lived on Middle Island Creek. But Uncle Lynden says Daniel Reynolds paid \$60 for the lower end of the Island [he did- to his brothers MSE]. See Deeds from John Leath in Tyler County Records, purchase of 30 acres on the Island.

- 8) 1810 Census, Washington County Ohio: son Thomas Runnels 1 M 26-45; 2 F -10; 1F 16-26 per DAR magazine.
- 9) 1820 Census, Tyler County, Virginia. This census was alphabetized - no Thomas, but a new head of family, Mary Anne Reynolds: 1 M 10-16; 2 M 18-26; 1 F 10-16; 1 F over 45.
- 10) 1820 Census, Washington County, Ohio: John Reynolds 2 M under 10; 1 M 26-45; 2 F under 10; 1 F 26-45.
- 11) 1830 Census, Tyler County, Virginia:
 Mary Anne Reynolds: 1 F 70-80
 George Reynolds: 1 M 5-10; 1 M 20-30; 1 F -5; 1 F 20-30
 Daniel Reynolds: 1 M -5; 1 M 20-30; 1 F -5; 1 F 20-30
- 12) For what it might be worth: 1782 Census of Frederick County, Virginia, near Isaac LaRue, Sr. were Thomas Reynolds 4 W, 1B, and Anthony Reynolds 6 W. Shenandoah County 1785, Joseph Reynolds 4 W and Thomas Reynolds 6 W. 1 dwelling. But back in Frederick County, Maryland, in 1790 reconstructed Census: Thomas Reynolds 1 M over 16, 3 M -16, 3 F, also Hugh Reynolds, 4 M over 16, 4 M - 16, 4 F, 4 slaves. All three Thomas Reynolds families fit the size of the family at the time of the head count. Pemberton, quoting the Reynolds of his day in Pleasants County, states that the progenitor of all the Reynolds families in that area was an Englishman named Noah who arrived in America in the 18th Century. The Bible also names Noah as the father of Thomas. There was an H. B. [or U. B. or N. B.] Reynolds [1810 Ohio County] 3 M -10, 1 M 10-16, 1 M 45+, 3 F -10, 1 F 10-16, 1 F 26-45.
- 13) Rea's Run, up-river, a hotel and tavern kept by William Rea [Williams "History of Washington County, Ohio] called "The Travelers Rest"
- 14) Will of Margaret Baird dated 12 May 1800, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland, recorded Harrison County, Virginia, Will Book #5, p. 445, names Joseph and Mary Clark, son-in-law and daughter 1/8 shilling. Joseph Reynolds, son, 500 acres on Gnatty Creek, Harrison County, by mother of testatrix and paid for by Reynolds; Elizabeth Reynolds, daughter, 100 acres in Kentucky, Thomas Reynolds, son, 1 English shilling; Fanny Baird, daughter, 1 pair of sugar tongs and 6 teaspoons, Peggy Baird, daughter, 6 teaspoons, etc. Exr. - 17) Margaret Reynolds married Jacob Seavers of Washington County, Ohio 29 November 1807.
- 18) Noah Reynolds, not mentioned in his fathers will dated 1 August 1815 probably was dead. He had no children. [married ?] One story said that he went to New Orleans, one that he fought in the War of 1812. He was in the 1800 Census in Newport Township, Washington Co. Ohio (Heads of Families) but not in 1803.

 hair, fair complexion & by trade a Cooper, who is now about
 to leave this place in the American Schooner HIRAM Commander

Capt. Lebben Rodgers bound for New York, has this day produced to me proof in the manner directed in the Act entitled An Act for the Relief and Protection of America Seamen in pursuance to the said act, I do hereby certify that the said Noah Reynolds is a citizen of the United States of America and a passenger on board the said Schooner in writing whereof I have here unto subscribed my name and affixed my seal of office in New Orleans this 17 day of April in the year of our Lord 1801.

17) Thomas Reynolds's first wife, names not yet available, was b. 1784-94 d. by March 1824. [There was a Wilson family in All Saints Parish, Frederick Co., MD in close proximity to Reynolds and Edelin families. Try it. MSE]

DR. GEORGE WILLIAM WEST

George William West, eldest son of Howard E. and Foye Dotson West, was born in St. Marys in 1920. He had a brother, Robert E. Lee who was eleven years younger. He was educated in St. Marys schools and married Lucille Quillen, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. O. L. Quillen, in 1944.

He attended W.V.U and was a Naval Torpedo Bomber pilot in World War II. After the war he graduated from O.S.U. and attended Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia where he received his M.D. degree in 1950.

He enlisted in the Public Health Service and was stationed in Staten Island, New York where he interned. He served two years in a General Surgery residency in the same hospital.

Born from this marriage were Mary-Jo, myself - Sandra Lynn and Max Lee. Mary-Jo is married to Charles Jeffrey Brinkman, formerly of Wheeling, and they are both physical therapists. I married Glenn Scott Goff, formerly of Rochester, New York, and we have a son named George Scott. Max is married to Nina Spence, of Clarksburg, and is attending Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia, PA. He will receive his M.D. degree in 1981 and expects to enter family practice.

My father entered practice in 1953 with D. O. L. Quillen, my grandfather, in the office next to the Methodist church. Later he bought the office at the corner of second and Lafayette streets and began his own family practice.

During his years of practice, he was Doctor for the football team in the high school. At one of the games during a crucial play, he was so excited that he sent in a player from the bench. This was one of the activities that he loved the most.

An innovation he brought to his practice was the ice cream prescriptions he gave to the children if they needed an injection. One of the children he treated during a prolonged illness received so many prescriptions, he traded them back to my father for cash.

My father was very active in community affairs. He was instrumental in establishing the Health Department and was County Health Officer for many years. He was on the county school board, was commissioner for Little League, went on Band, School Patrol and Girl Scout trips.

My father was a Mason and Shriner, belonged to the Elks Club, Lions Club and Presbyterian Church. He was on the staff of both Parkersburg hospitals and Marietta Memorial and belonged to local, state medical associations and the A.M.A. His main hobbies were hunting and boating.

In practice, as well as his personal life, he portrayed his interest and concern for people. He was good at family counseling and always had time to sit and talk to his patients.

On October 15, 1970, he had a fatal automobile accident as he returned from making rounds at the St. Joseph's Hospital in Parkersburg.
