Esq. NATHANIEL⁵ REYNOLDS, b. Boston, MA 19 March 1718 son of Nathaniel⁴ (Nathaniel³, Nathaniel², Robert¹) & Mary (Snell) Reynolds (*A Report of the Record Commissioners of the City of Boston, Containing Boston Births from 1700 to 1800* [1894], p. 131. VR Bridgewater, Mass. gives birth as 19 March 1718). Nathaniel Reynolds d. at Sidney before 25 Nov. 1807 when his funeral was held. (*Martha Ballard's Diary* 1785-1812 [1992] p. 740. VR Sidney gives his death as 27 Nov. 1807.) He m. at West Bridgewater, MA 12 Dec. 1739 HANNAH HARTWELL (VR) b 20 Dec. 1719 dau of Samuel & Hannah (___) Hartwell (VR) of Canton, MA (Lyman W. Densmore, *The Hartwells of America* [1956], pp. 2, 7); she d. at Bridgewater, MA 12 Aug 1742 (VR). He m.(2) at Stoughton, MA (spelled Reignolds) 14 June 1744 MARY⁵ TOLMAN of Stoughton (VR, p. 133) , b. 4 Nov. 1724 dau of Thomas⁴ (Thomas³, Thomas², Thomas¹) & Mary (Rice) Tolman (Marion H. Reynolds, *The History and Some of the Descendants of Robert and Mary Reynolds (1630?-1931) of Boston, Mass.* [1931], p. 96). She d. at Sidney, ME 28 June 1806 (*Martha Ballard's Diary*, p. 696). He was ; bpt. 30 Aug. 1747; d. testate Sidney 1813 (Kennebec County, Probate, ME # R-2) . M. at Bridgewater, MA 15 June 1769 his 1st cousin **REBECCA⁶ TOLMAN** of Stoughton, MA, b. at Stoughton 8 May 1751, dau of Thomas⁵ (Thomas⁴, Thomas³, Thomas², Thomas¹) & Hannah⁶ (Shepard) Tolman (VR *Stoughton, MA*, p. 67). Note: Hannah Shepard is descended also from Thomas¹ Tolman of Dorchester, MA through his dau Rebecca Tolman who m. James Tucker. In his will dated 3 Feb. 1813, probated Kennebec County, Augusta, ME, Timothy Reynolds named his wife Rebecca and his children Hannah Jackson, Mary Reynolds, Thomas Reynolds, Rebecca French, his eldest son Timothy Reynolds, Silence French, and Abigail Reynolds. Timothy Reynolds was living in Vassalboro, ME before 1790, but his brother Jonathan Reynolds was enumerated at head of his household.

According to a deed, dated 31 March 1813, Rebecca French sold her "dower's right assigned her out of Lemuel Daveport's estate, her former husband." Francis¹ Baker, a tailor, age 24, arrived on the “Planter” on 7 June 1635 in Boston.^[1] Francis Baker was born in England in 1611; in 1641 he married Isabel Twining of Yarmouth, Massachusetts. Their sons were: Nathaniel, John, Samuel, Daniel, William, and Thomas.^[2]

1. CAPT. SHUBAEL⁵ BAKER (*Shubel⁴, Shuabel³, Samuel³, Frances¹*) was born in Yarmouth, Massachusetts 10 July 1772, son of Shubel⁴ and Rebecca (Chase) Baker of Yarmouth, Massachusetts.^[3] Capt. Baker died testate, in Sidney, 23 January 1829, age 57. He married on 10 June 1793 **MERCY SMALLEY**,^[4] who died in 1844. Both are buried in the Bacon Corner Cemetery, Dinsmore Road, Sidney. (Note: she is probably the Mercy (Weeks) Baker who died 22 August 1844 and erroneously cited as the wife of Mulford Baker, in the Vital Records of Augusta, Maine, 2: 229.) In his will, dated 14 January 1829, and probated in Kennebec County 10 March 1829, Shubael Baker named his “eldest daughter Lydia,” daughters Hepsibath, Kesiah, and Caroline, and his sons Mulford, Shubael, and Gilbert and his “wife,” whom he did not name.^[5] Mulford Baker was named executor. Rufus Davenport and William Hatch testified in court on Mulford Baker’s behalf, concerning his will. On 24 November 1829, Elisha Folger of Sidney was named guardian of Gilbert Baker, a minor.^[6]

PHAREZ JACKSON, SR.

Pharez⁵ (Perez, Peris, Peres, Phares, Pharus) Jackson was born Middleborough, Massachusetts 1760 (Carleton B. Fisher and Sue O. Fisher, Soldiers, Sailors, and Patriots of the Revolutionary War Maine [1982], p. 406; however, Perez Jackson is not cited in White's Massachusetts Soldier and Sailors of the Revolutionary War [1896-1908, 17 vols.], son of John and Jemima (Jackson) Jackson of Vassalborough, and formerly of Middleborough, Massachusetts.). Phares Jackson died intestate in Sidney in 1828. Pharez Jackson married in Vassalborough between 11 July 1790-March 1791 (VR Vassalborough; m int Vassalborough 4 September 1790, as Pains Jackson, VR, Book 1, p. 29) Hannah Reynolds, born at Bridgewater, Massachusetts 16 September 1770 (VR Vassalborough Part 1, pp. 5, 29; marriage intentions give his name as "Fares"), daughter of Timothy and Mary (Tolman) Reynolds, Sr. (Vital Records of Bridgewater, Massachusetts to the Year 1850, 2 vols [1916] 1:276), of Vassalborough, also early settlers of Vassalbourough (Sidney). Hannah (Reynolds) Jackson died before October 1845, for her daughter Promelia (Jackson)(Hammond) Estes wrote in a letter to her brother Alfred, that she missed her mother.

Kennebec County Superior Court records show that Elisha Gifford of Dartmouth, County Bristol, Massachusetts filed a trespass suit against Phares [so spelled] Jackson of Sidney, in September 1805. A jury acquitted him (box 30-40). Kennebec County Probate records show that Pharez Jackson lived in Sidney, Monmouth, and Malta (Windsor). On 16 October 1816, Pharez Jackson of Malta (Windsor) was appointed guardian of Thomas and Perna (Jackson) Pool, Jr.'s two daughters (Kennebec County Probate record #P-7). On 16 December 1817, Pharez Jackson, yeoman, of Monmouth, and Joseph Wight of Malta (now Windsor), were appointed administrators of the estate of Samuel Jackson of Monmouth (Kennebec County Probate records #J-1). On 13 February 1821, Pharez Jackson, of Sidney, requested the court to allow him to sell Samuel's property to pay off the debts; he himself was owed \$43.10 by the estate (loc. cit.). Records dated 26 August 1823 give the resignation of Pharez Jackson, of Sidney, as an administrator of the estate of Samuel Jackson, signed by Dais Tilpa, Mary Springer, Elizabeth Jackson, Samuel Jackson, Abraham Jackson, and Levi Jackson (loc. cit.), who were obviously Samuel Jackson's children. Pharez Jackson was discharged as the administrator of Samuel's estate, 28 August 1823 (loc. cit.)

Pharez Jackson, Jr. was appointed administrator of his father's estate, 11 July 1828; witnesses were Stephen Townsend, Abigail F. Townsend, Ebenezer Mathews, and Dodivah Townsend (Kennebec County Probate records # J-2. [Note: Stephen Townsend was the grandson of Mathew and Mary (Battle) Hastings, Dodivah Townsend was their son-in-law, and Abigail [Lovejoy] Townsend was the wife of Stephen Townsend.] However, Pharez, Jackson, Jr. died "without completing his administration" of his father's estate, so Gideon Robinson, yeoman, of Sidney, was appointed the administrator, 28 April 1829 (loc. cit.; note: Gideon Robinson was Pharez Jackson's son-in-law).

On 28 April 1839, Hannah Jackson and her son Alfred Jackson and his wife Sarah Ann Jackson signed a deed of sale of land to Samuel Clark of Sidney, witnessed by Asa Smiley

and Rodolphus D. Smiley (Kennebec County deed 119:40. Note: Samuel Clark was the brother-in-law of Alfred Jackson as well as his nephew-in-law). The deed reads: "Alfred Jackson and Sarah Ann Jackson, wife of the said Alfred, and Hannah Jackson (widow of the late Perez Jackson), in token of relinquishing their right of dower in the above described premises." The land appears to that which Pharez Jackson, Sr. purchased from Samuel Butterfield, 5 November 1795 (Kennebec County deeds 2:26. See the Appendix.) Pharez Jackson, Sr. owned several parcels of land in Sidney, as did his sons Pharez Jackson Jr., Alfred Jackson and his grandsons William H. Jackson, Willard Jackson, and Wilson P. Jackson.

PHAREZ JACKSON, JR.

Pharez⁶ Jackson, Jr. was born in Sidney 2 April 1798, the son of Pharez and Hannah (Reynolds) Jackson, Sr. (Sidney VR, Book 1, pp. 3, 513). He died in Sidney between 11 July 1828-28 April 1829, not having completed the administration of his father's estate (Kennebec County Probate file # J-1; g.s. gives death date as 20 Mar 1832, ae 32y [sic], Clark-Goff cemetery, West River Rd., Sidney). He married in Sidney 26 November 1820, Mary (Polly) Dyer (Sidney VR, p. 13), born Sidney 8 November 1798, daughter of Jonathan and Lydia (Bacon) Dyer of Sidney ("Births 1795-1813, p. 171, Sidney Town Office; see the BENJAMIN DYER family in Joseph C. Anderson, II, ed., Maine Families in 1790 [Camden: 1996], 5: 87-90. See also, written by the author, "James and Abigail [Marsh] Bacon, Early Settlers of Sidney, Maine, and Their Descendants," [1998], ms at the Maine State Library, Augusta.) Polly (Dyer) Jackson married (2) in Sidney 1 November 1834, Benjamin Adams Small of Sidney (Sidney VR, p. 47).

Pharez Jackson, Jr. was a landowner in Sidney. He deeded land there to his brother Alfred Jackson, 8 September 1823; his wife Mary signed her name as Polly Jackson (Kennebec County deed 111:194). David Dyer and Edith Dyer witnessed the deed (ibid.)

Jackson age 10, all residents of Sidney (Ken Co Probate, Book 154, p. 251) In "Letters of Guardianship," dated 14 March 1870, the children were named as being those of Harriett R. Jackson, signed by Willard Jackson, Est Field, and D.H. Field. On 4 April 1883, C. H. Lovejoy and Martin L. Reynolds, selectmen of Sidney, filed in probate that Willard Jackson was unable to attend to his business (Book 144, p. 347). On 4 May 1883, Lorain B. Ward of Sidney was appointed Willard's guardian, who was declared "insane." Thereafter Willard Jackson was admitted to the asylum in Augusta and then released at a latter date. On 7 May 1883, Carlos Hammond of Sidney represented Willard in Ken Co Probate Court (Book 144, p. 348).

When Willard Jackson died in 1883, his estate was valued at \$50 and \$0 for real estate (Ken Co Probate, ibid). His widow Angeline P. Jackson was living in Hallowell at the time of death, and there were no minor children; his son Pharus [so spelled] W. Jackson resided in Salem, MA. Angeline was appointed administrator of his estate, 26 Nov. 1883 (Book 190, p. 404). The bond of administration of his will (Book 189, p.475) was signed by Angeline, Pharus [so spelled] W. Lyon, Hattie F. Jackson, all of Hallowell.

Willard was a large landowner in Sidney. He was deeded land formerly owned by

Alfred Jackson, from Mary Jackson, 4 May 1843 (Kennebec County deed 133:430) and his wife Angeline, on 1 Nov. 1881. Willard also deeded land to Wilson P. Jackson who likewise deeded land to him too.

The 1850 USC Sidney (Kennebec County, microfilm roll #256, dwelling 152, Maine State Archives), lists Willard as age 26, Harriett age 23, Angeline age 7, Phebe S. age 3, and Harriett A., age 4/12. The 1860 USC Sidney (microfilm roll #439, dwelling 142) lists Willard as age 28, Harriett age 36, Pharez W., age 7, John age 5, William H. age 3, Nancy A. age 9/12.

ALFRED JACKSON

Alfred⁶ Jackson was born Sidney 10 July 1813 (obituary in “The Somerset Report,” 2 December 1895, found at the Skowhegan History House), son of Pharez⁵ and Hannah (Reynolds) Jackson, Sr. He died Bingham 1 December 1895, aged 82 years, 4 months, and 20 days (obituary; death record State of Maine gives 1 December 1895 as his date of death, the same age at the time of death, and “Phineas” as his father; g.s. South Solon cemetery incorrectly gives 21 December 1895, MOCA).

Alfred Jackson was of Sidney when he married in Sidney (1) 15 July 1832 Almira/Elmira L. Clark (Sidney VR Book 3 “Marriages and Births 1764-1854.” p. 32, Sidney Town Office; Jackson family Bible gives the middle initial “L.”), born 1811 (g.s. Clark-Goff Cemetery, West River Road, Sidney), daughter of Joseph and Sally (Pillsbury) Clark of Sidney; she died 1836 (g.s.; see the JOSEPH CLARK family in Joseph C. Anderson, II., ed., *Maine Families in 1790* [1998] Vol. 6.). He married (2) 25 December 1837 Sarah Ann Heald, of Madison (Sidney VR gives “Hale”; Solon VR 1721-1848), born 17 September 1817 (Jackson family Bible), probably the daughter of John and Hannah (Norton) Heald of Madison; she died 6 November 1862 age 45 (g.s. South Solon Cemetery, Solon, MOCA Somerset County 3 vols, 3:553. (Her parents married in Solon 3 July 1816 [Solon VR]; in 1830 they lived in Madison [1830 USC, Somerset and Penobscot Counties, microfilm roll #51, p. 248, MSA]. See also the John Heald family in the 1850 USC Dukes Co., MA, p. 85, at the NEHGS, Boston, MA. John Heald was born in Farmington and died in Tisbury, MA 14 October 1849 [Massachusetts State Record of Death] See also William Collins Hatch, *History of Industry*, rep 1984, pp. 757 and 765 for the Norton and Hale families). Alfred married in Solon (3) 8 July 1870 Mrs. Naomi W. (Bates) Holden of Solon (Solon VR), born at Bingham 22 February 1843 (dates and middle initial in the Jackson family Bible), daughter of David and Jane (___) Holden (death certificate), widow of Austin R. Holden who died 12 May 1870. Naomi (Bates)(Holden) Jackson died 6 January 1920 (g.s. Bingham Village Cemetery, Bingham, where she is buried with her first husband, MOCA Somerset County 3:93.)

The Kennebec County deeds show land transactions in Sidney and Gardiner, 1823-1892, among Alfred and his brother Pharez, his nephews Willard and Wilson P., brother-in-law Samuel Clark, his cousin Edwin Reynolds, and Hattie M. Jackson. On 25 September 1823, Pharez Jackson, Jr. deeded land to Alfred Jackson (Kennebec County deed 3:194); on 4 May 1843, Alfred deeded property to Willard Jackson of Sidney (133:430). On 29 October 1839, Alfred and his wife Sarah Ann Jackson, and his mother Hannah Jackson all signed a deed of sale of land in Sidney to Samuel Clark, of Sidney, witnessed by Asa Smiley and Rodolphus D. Smiley (119:40; see the Appendix). On 23 October 1860, Silas Ward and Edwin Reynolds deeded property to Alfred (226:335). On 11 June 1891, Wilson P. Jackson conveyed land to Hattie M. Jackson, his sister-in-law (386:386) as did Alfred (386:385), which on 29 June 1891, Alfred mortgaged to the Gardiner Savings Bank (387:74), as did Wilson P. Jackson (391:158). According to Alfred Jackson's obituary, he lived in Sidney 26 years before he moved to Solon, where he lived for 35 years. In 1874 he moved to Bingham, where he resided for 27 years. He was a Methodist.

Solon 24 Dec. 1915, age 69 ys 1 m 29 dy (g.s. Evergreen cem, Solon, MOCA); m (2) B. Frank Thompson. William C. Jackson was a private in the Civil War, when age 27. He enlisted 1 Nov. 1861, at Solon, for three years; he was mustered as a private 10 Dec. 1861, at Augusta, ME, in the 13th regiment of Maine, to serve three years (pension file # 1975337). He re-enlisted as a veteran 11 Feb. 1864 (loc. cit.). He was reported missing in action in Pleasant Hill, LA, where he was captured; he was a prisoner of war since April 1864 (loc. cit.) According to the records, Wm. C. Jackson was a farmer, born in Sidney and buried in Solon. He had brown hair, was 5’6”, light complexion with blue eyes. He was transferred to Co. C 13th Battery, 25 Dec. 1864 (The History Committee of the Solon Sesquicentennial Committee, Sketches from Solon’s History [The Skowhegan Press: 1959], p. 77 states that William C. Jackson was mustered in the 3rd Infantry, 29 Feb. 1864 and was missing in action 19 April 1864.)

GIDEON ROBINSON & HANNAH JACKSON

Hannah⁵ Jackson was born in Sidney 9 March 1794, daughter of Pharez and Hannah (Reynolds) Jackson (VR); she died in Sidney 31 March 1863 (VR Sidney Book, 2, p. 33, ms at the MSL); she died age 69 years (g.s. Quaker Hill cemetery, Sidney gives "Hannah J. wife of Gideon Robinson, 3 mo. 31, 1863, 69 y). Hannah married (int 19 February 1814, Sidney and Malta VR) Gideon Robinson, born Vassalborough 9 December 1788, son of Richard and Hope [] Robinson (Henry Sewall Webster, "Records of the Society of Friends at Vassalborough, Me," NEHGR 87 [1915]:340. Gideon Robinson was named in his father's will, dated 19 April 1850 and probated 26 August 1850 [Kennebec County Probate, file #R-8: in addition to Gideon Robinson, Richard Robinson named his sons Daniel, Edmond, Joseph, Stephen, and Richard and his daughters Abigail Russell, Elizabeth Keene, Rhoda Hallowell, and Phebe Blaisdell. Gideon Wing, of Sidney, was named executor). Gideon Robinson died intestate in Sidney 11 November 1850, age 61 years, 9 months (g.s. Quaker Hill cemetery, Sidney). Named as "heirs" of Gideon Robinson were Hannah Robinson, Joseph Woodward, Christine J. Butterfield, and Roxanna Woodward (Kennebec County Records #R-9, 25 August 1851). Jonas Butterfield was appointed the administrator of his estate. Jonas Butterfield, William Ward, principal, and Asa W. Cummings, all of Sidney, were named sureties (ibid).

Gideon Robinson was appointed administrator of the estate of Pharez Jackson, Sr., 11 July 1828, when Pharez Jackson, Jr. died, thus without completing his job as administrator of his father's estate (Kennebec County Probate records Book 22, folio 137, file #J-2). He was also appointed executor of the estate of Pharez Jackson, Jr., 28 April 1830 (Kennebec County Probate file # J-1). On 6 November 1832, Othaniel and Hannah Hammond sold land to Gideon Robinson; witnesses were Libby Blaisdell and Phebe Robinson (Kennebec County deed 77:290). On 6 April 1840, Gideon Robinson was a witness for John Hammond, who was appointed the guardian of Obadiah Butler, son of Stephen and Sarah (Hammond) Butler, of Sidney (Kennebec County Probate file #B8. Note: Obadiah Butler was the nephew of his sister and brother-in-law Ephraim and Promelia (Jackson) Hammond, Jr., who named their son Gideon R. Hammond [Kennebec County deed 151:336]). Gideon Robinson was last enumerated in the 1850 USC, Kennebec County, Sidney (microfilm roll #256, p. 117). Cited in his household were Hannah Robinson, agee 62, Jonas Butterfield age 34, Christine Butterfield age 25 and Richard Robinson age 20.

As "Permilla" Hammond she married (2) [marriage intentions at Sidney 3 November 1844] as his second wife, Silas Estes of Durham,^[60] born Durham 3 November 1776, son of Edward and Prudence (Goddard) Estes.^[61] He died Durham 9 December 1855. Note: Silas Estes married (1) Mary Sargent, by whom he had nine children, two of whom married people from Vassalborough. Mary is a direct descendant of the same Sargent family as was Mary Sargent, first wife of Reuben Page, who married (2) Mercy Hastings of Vassalborough.

The Kennebec County Registry of Deeds shows two land transactions for Permelia [so spelled] Estes of Durham, Cumberland County. On 11 August 1846, she and her children Phineas B. Hammond, Abigail J. Davis, and Gideon R. Hammond of Sidney, together sold land to William H. Mason of Sidney, 11 August 1846.^[62] On 20 March 1847 Permelia (so spelled) Estes of Durham sold land in Sidney to Joseph Knowles of Readfield.^[63]

In a letter dated 24 October 1845, Sidney, Promelia writes to her "affectionate brother" Alfred Jackson, in South Solon that she is ill in health, for which she has been taking medication for four months; that her daughter lost her baby; that she misses her "dear mother" and "often thought how you missed your dear brother," whom she also misses as well as "my sister too." She asks that her "dear brother" bring his wife to Sidney "this winter excepting January, for I shall be absent in that month." Then she asks that

JOHN MATHEWS

1. JOHN MATHEWS was born at York, ME 4 March 1770, and baptized at the First Church of York 10 March 1771, son of Elijah and his first wife Hephizah (Bryer) Matthews.^[1] He died at Sidney 22 November 1868, although his gravestone gives 25 October 1868, age 98 y 8 m at the Bacon's Corner Cemetery, Dinsmore Road, Sidney.^[2] John was "of China" when he married at China 25 January 1807 (m. intention at China 28 December 1806) POLLY CROWELL,^[3] born 4 September 1790; she died 8 April 1857.^[4] On 3 October 1849, John Mathews was declared a "spendthrift" due to his drinking, and a request for a guardian for him was made by selectment Asa Smiley, John Merrill and Gideon Wing, of Sidney.^[5] John Mathews was enumerated in the 1850 USC Kennebec County, Sidney, "born Maine," age 77, a farmer with his wife Mary Mathews, age 58, in the household of Josiah Whittier.

John Mathews' estate was settled in 1870 with his children having been named the Kennebec Count Probate documents: Walter Mathews of Augusta, Eliza Ann Robie of Readfield, John H. Mathews of Sidney, and Jane A. Philbrick of Vienna.

JOHN MATHEWS

EDMOND MATHEWS was born at Yarmouth, MA 22 September 1748, son of David and Sarah (Hedge) Mathewes [so spelled],^[1] who married at Yarmouth, MA 11 March 1748/49.^[2] His siblings included Elisha, Desire, Thomas, Thankful, David, Jonathan, Ezekiel, and Enoch. Edmond Mathewes [so spelled] married at Yarmouth, MA 21 December 1769 Anne Eldreg.^[3] Born at Yarmouth, MA to Edmond and Anna Matthews was Polly Mathews, b. 25 June 1779.^[4]

On 21 September 1786, Edmond Matthews of “Yarmouth, Barnstable County,” sold land in Vassalborough on the west side of the Kennebec River (now Sidney) to Reuben Pinkham of Bowdoin.^[5] Anna Matthews relinquished her right of dower. Witnessing the deed were William Howard, Samuel Howard, (unclear) Barton, and Frederick Faught.

The Vital Records of Vassalborough cite the marriages for Desire Matthews to Elisha Bisbee, by the Rev. Asa Wilbur, 8 May 1794; Polly Matthews to Joel Gardner on 20 March 1800; Temperance Matthews to Robert Emery of Fairfield on 30 April 1801; Desire Matthews to Heman Robbins Jr. on 13 May 1810; Isaiah Matthews to Abigail Robinson of Gardiner on 27 March 1814, and Betsy Matthews to John Colman on 7 Aug. 1821. The parents of these Mathews are undetermined.

ELISHA MATHEWS

ELISHA MATHEWS was born at Yarmouth, MA 3 December 1750, son of David and Sarah (Hedge) Mathewes.^[6] Elisha Matthews, “Jr.” married at Yarmouth, MA 30 January 1772 Marcy Wheldon,^[7] born at Yarmouth 30 September 1749 (date of birth given in the Sidney records is 11 October 1749)^[8] daughter of John and Susanna Whilden [so spelled]. She is probably the Mrs. Mercy Mathews “widow” who died at Augusta, called “widow,” 3 January 1830 age 80.^[9]

Elisha Mathews died testate at Sidney 12 June 1803.^[10] In his will dated 28 April 1802, Elisha named his sons Jonathan, Ebenezer, daughter (name unclear),

PHILIP FOUGHT

Philip Fought/Faught, a “poor German” who migrated from the Rhine, Germany in 1751, settled in Dresden (Frankfort) in 1753.^[1] It is not known whether or not Philip Fought was a widower when he migrated, for no spouse is cited in the Allen’s History of Dresden. However, Allen does cite Philip’s children and states that his sons Frederick and Anthony “petitioned for land in Vassalborough in 1797.”

1. PHILIP¹ FOUGHT married (2) at Hallowell 15 September 1769 **MRS. HANNAH SHARP.**^[2] Phillip died testate in Vassalborough in 1781. In his will dated 6 January 1781, which Philip signed with an “X,” probated in Lincoln County 11 June 1781, he named his wife Hannah, and his children Jacob, Frederick, Rachael, Margret, and Anthony.^[3] Ebenezer Moore, Samuel Basset, and Nat’l Davis witnessed the will. Mathew Hastings of Vassalborough was appointed executor of his estate.

Mrs. Faught died before 3 January 1786, for Martha Ballard wrote in her diary entry on 3 January 1786, “mr Billin & Rachel Faught came here at 9/O Clo^k going to attend the funeral of mrs Faught.”^[4]

5. **ANTHONY² FAUGHT** was the son of Philip Faught of Vassalborough. He married (intention at at Vassalborough 10 May 1778) **HANNAH DURENT**, of Vassalborough.^[34] On 11 June 1803, Anthony Faught of Vassalborough, sold 250 acres on the east side of the Kennebec River to Jacob Faught, also of Vassalborough.^[35] Witnessing the deed were Nathaniel Reynolds and Jethro Gardner. THOMAS CLARK

Thomas¹ Clark migrated from England to New Hampshire and then to Vassalborough with his nephew Joseph Clark.^[1] Both men were inhabitants of the Kennebec River prior to 1766, for they signed the petition to divide the town of Pownalborough into two towns, 27 August 1766.^[2] Joseph Clark died testate. In his will dated 2 September 1782, and probated 11 March 1783, he named his nephew Joseph Clark, a minor of Vassalborough, sole inheritor of all his real and personal estate and named Lois Clark exector.^[3]

Lois Clark, of Vassalborough, widow, *Adm'x de bonis non*, 1 March 1783; Mathew Hastings and Jonathan Dyer, both of Vassalborough, were named sureties.^[6] Lois (Spencer) Clark married (2) (intention at Vassalborough 27 December 1791 Jegdulahm [Jeduthan] Hammond,^[7] born at Falmouth, MA 25 December 1737, baptized at Falmouth MA 25 December 1738, son of John and Mariah (Green) Hammond.^[8] Jeduthan Hammond married (1) at Falmouth, MA 27 December 1759 Fear Gifford.^[9] Lois (Spencer) (Clark) Hammond is buried in the Clark-Goff Cemetery, West River Road, Sidney, ME. Her inscription reads: "Gramma Hammon."

On 2 March 1830 Elijah Hammond purchased land in Solon from Joseph Clark, Jr.^[28] On 29 March 1830, Joseph Clark, Jr. [so stated] purchased land in Solon from Elijah Hammond.^[29] On 1 September 1835 he purchased land in Solon from Samuel Clark.^[30] Note: Elijah Hammond was the son of Othaniel Hammond, his step-uncle.

Joseph Clarke [so spelled] was enumerated in 1830 in Solon, ME next to Othaniel Hammond, son of Othaniel and Elizabeth (Butler) Hammond. Joseph Clarke is listed as age 30-40 with a woman age 20-30 and two males age 5-10.

In 1845 Joseph Clark of Solon, Somerset County, ME was accused of embezzlement, owing goods and effects of John M. Clark, of Sidney, ME. Octavus Wring of Waterville, was the auditor.^[31] In 1858, Joseph is named in his father's will. Unfortunately, he cannot be located in the 1850 USC in Maine, and there is no record of his family in the vitals records of Solon. Note: A Joseph Clark born say 1855, died 15 September 1888, age 33, at Sidney, son of Thomas and Climena Clark; his is buried at the Springer Cemetery, West River Road, Sidney.
