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A Note From The Editors

We have had many questions about our Computer; it is a Radio Shack TRS-80 model II computer and uses the CPM operating system with "Word Star" word processing program. The only way to choose a computer is first to decide what you want it to do. Then compare computers. Note: be sure to consider both the computer hardware (equipment) and the computer software (programs). Some computers are better at one thing than another, but software availability and price are probably more important than hardware frills. Serious computer users almost all agree that two disk drives is the minimum requirement. It allows you to copy data and programs much easier. Also allows you to keep programs on one disk and data on another. This lets you use the same program for several tasks - eg. word processing. If you put the program on one disk, then you can use additional data disks for word processing, one for Reynolds Family data, one for personal correspondence, etc. In our opinion, cassettes just don't offer enough storage or allow enough access to data.
