April 1828 to Maria Metcalf at NYC Methodist Episcopal Church (records at LDS) had son Albert N. Reynolds born there July 1829. Albert N. Reynolds md. Jane Ann Jack in 1853 Detroit, MI and d. 1906 in Bay City, MI. Nathaniel and Maria said to have had a son Isaac and dau. Sarah whom we haven't located. We have all stats on Albert and Jane Ann but would appreciate any and all information on Nathaniel, Maria, Isaac, Sarah and any other issue they may have had. Need ancestry and whereabouts of Nathaniel after 1829.

Mrs. Eugenia Reynolds Cloud, 890 Edgewood Rd., Redwood City, CA 94062. Would like to know if Jesse (Henry, Henry) was a patriot? Jesse was born 22 Oct 1747 in Nottingham, Chester Co., PA. He was married to Sarah Haynes 31 Jan. 1770 in Lancaster, PA at the St. James Episcopal Church. These facts would make me believe he was not a quaker and my question is: did he fight in the American Revolution, if not, did he sign the Loyalty Oath? If anyone has any knowledge of this, I would certainly appreciate knowing. (Editor's note - many county quarter sessions (County Court minutes) available thru the LDS Library Service. It is hard reading, but may just tell you what you need.)

Mrs. Matthew L. Hooper, Rt. 1, Box 148, Estero, FL 33928, Dorcas Reynolds married before 1725 in Isle of Wight Co., VA, my John Bowen. She was the Dau. of Henry Reynolds and Elizabeth and he was the son of Henry Reynolds and Joyce. One source calls Joyce a Wombwell/Womble, daughter of Thomas Wombwell, Jr. and granddaughter of John and Margaret Wood. Mr. Tillman calls Henry Reynolds son of Thomas and Mary Reynolds and grandson of George and Thomasyn Church Reynolds. Other possible family relations include Brent and Clay. CAN ANYONE HELP?

Mr. Louis J. Reynolds, 2027 Reuter Rd., Timonium, MD 21093. Can any one help me find: Joseph and Mary Reynolds b.? d.? Md.? They were the parents of Israel Reynolds born 30 July 1799 at East Nott. township, Chester Co., PA, (we think), died 20 Feb. 1862, md. 2 Nov 1824 lic. 5 Nov 1824 - Family Bible - Mary Alexander of Cecil Co. MD (b.1800 d. 1866).

Edith B. Pierce, 716 Columbus Court, Wallingford, PA 19086. WHO IS SALLY REYNOLDS? b. 1802 Sullivan Co., NY. She is in LDS index card to Logan Temple Records no. 4598, Bk. C, Pg. 129; Heir: Caroline Reynolds - who is she? - Rel.(?); Baptized: 19 Oct 1886 - Endowed: 27 Oct 1886. To make matters worse: - this index card does not show the letter's P or C; therefore, there is no record of her as a parent, or a child in the archives department for the requisited sheet, I inquired for.

Amelia Beck sends the following: "WATER PIONEER REYNOLDS CELEBRATES 103RD BIRTHDAY. Friends Fete - Many of Albert Reynolds' friends gathered together Tuesday at the Devonshire Downs to celebrate his 103rd birthday. Albert Chadsey Reynolds turned 103 years today, October 24, 1981. Born in Chicago, Illinois. After his father died his mother moved the family to Rhode Island, and Albert lived for a time with his aunt in Trenton, New York, where he attended school until 1894. He spent four years at the Worchester Academy in Massachusetts, graduating in 1898. Came to California in 1908, and worked in Ontario Orange groves for two years. Three years as bookkeeper and office manager for the Stimson Lumber Company in Los Angeles. From this time on his chief interest has been in Water Development for Southern California and now lives in Hemet, CA."
