May, 1981, My Aunt Alma and I visited my cousin Peggy in Ashland, Boyd Co., Kentucky. Being Memorial Day week-end, we decided to visit known relative graves. After we had done this, we decided to try locating the grave of my Aunt Alma's sister in Dixon Cemetery which is west of Ashland. We did not find it, and started towards my cousins house in Ashland.

While driving down the road, we came to Pollard Baptist Church, which one of my grandfathers helped found. As we were abreast of the Church, I happened to look to my left and saw an overgrown cemetery. I thought I saw the name Maggie Clark on a large tombstone. (Maggie was an infant daughter of my great grandmother that died young.) I stopped the car in the Church parking lot, left my Aunt and Cousin in the car and walked across to the cemetery. Needless to say the name was not Maggie Clark, so I turned to cross the street and go back to my car, but instead of turning to my right, I turned to my left and there in front of me was a tombstone engraved T. K. Reynolds. Just imagine my scrambling up the small wall, wading through the tall weeds to get a closer look. Indeed, it was my T. K. Reynolds and next to him was his wife, Letitia. What a find! I took both Polaroid and regular pictures of both graves and went back to the car very happy.

When I had resumed our journey towards my cousin's house, she told me I was very lucky that I hadn't been bitten by a snake. I don't think I would have minded a small snake bite, as long as it wasn't poisonous. I'm quite sure I probably wouldn't even have felt it at the time, I was so elated.

ANSWERS AND QUESTIONS ON MY REYNOLDS OF KENTUCKY

Mrs. Bert Rohrer (Emaline Reynolds), 112 Willow Dr., Nicholasville, KY 40356

I am the daughter of Lindsay Reynolds who's father was William Levi, his father Lindsay Beaumont, his father Willis, his father Thomas Reynolds who was a Rev. War soldier. I have failed to connect Thomas to any of the VA Reynolds. A distant cousin found Thomas' record in the National Archives in Washington DC. In it his name is spelled Renolls and shows the following: Pvt 2028, 7th VA Reg. of Foot from July 1777 through Feb. 1778 Capt. Thos Posey's Company, Commanded by Col. Alexander McClanachan. The story has been handed down in the family that he was a Rev. War soldier, but the family did not know any details.

As to Mr. S. F. Tillman, he is not accurate. I am also descended from Henry Reynolds of Jessamine County that married Elizabeth Willis, the dau of Sherod Willis and his wife Mary Ann. Elizabeth was the sister of Catherine Willis who married my Thomas Reynolds. Henry was the son of Henry Reynolds, Sr and Eliza _____. Henry Sr. was born in VA as was his wife and he left a will which was settled in 1826 (Henry died in 1824). In his will he names his sons Henry Jr., Moses, Thomas (not mine, this one settled in Madison Co.) and David. Moses was the first birth found in that County, 1780 and David was born in 1785. Henry Jr. was born in VA in 1774 as Old Henry in 1739. David and Moses stayed in Garrard where Henry Jr. came to Jessamine Co.

Henry Reynolds¹ did not name his daughters but from an estate settlement of his son Moses, who died intestate and childless, I have been able to establish many names, assisted by marriage records from that time that gave parents names. Old Henry had a daughter, Rachel, who married Joseph Jones, probably in VA. They had children who were listed as heirs of Moses Reynolds. One of Rachels dau's was Mariah, who first married Samuel Brown and had two daughters. She then married Willis Reynolds in 1828. Their son Lindsay B. was my great grandfather who died after I was born. I have a copy of Henry Reynolds Sr.'s will, Moses deed, showing his heirs, cemetery records, marriage records, and numerous deeds.

Sherod Willis estate was settled in 1812. A notation on the back shows my Thomas Reynolds listed as receiving money as were others being sons or husbands of Willis daughters. The notation stated that all the Legatees but Henry Reynolds met at the house of Thomas Reynolds and decided that said Henry should receive the whole benefits of (Bairds?Bond?) for his part. Thomas' son, Thomas Jr., married Henry Jr.'s daughter, Nancy. These two children of Thomas are listed as heirs in Moses Reynolds deed, but they were both married to grandchildren of Old Henry. I think Henry Sr.'s children were Nancy Barlow, Rachel Jones, a dau who married a Williamson, Thomas, David, Henry and Moses.

From a deed in the Jessamine Co. court house I have pretty well established that Henry Jr.'s children were: Henry A. (Tillman's #6017) b 1800 md. Patsy Goins, Moses md. Araminta Potts, John W. M. md. Caroline Pilant, Nancy M. md. Thomas Reynolds Jr., Elizabeth M. md. Chas. Murphy, Lucinda M. md. Henry Wylie and Polly never married.

Kentucky con't

In the 1850 census Henry A. and Patsy Goins Reynolds are listed as having the following children: Eliza B. (md. John Jefferson Reynolds, son of Willis), Susan, Sulda (named for her Aunt Saluda Willis), John W. (named for his uncle), M. Francina Baker, William and Twins Louise and Louisa (md. Paris Hager grandson of my Thomas Reynolds).

You can see the two families of Thomas and Henry were closely related after they came here in marriages, exchanges of property, but I have found no proof that Thomas and Old Henry were related.

I have found that most of the people I have researched in my lines, Reynolds, Willis, Burton, Underwood, Miller, Stinnett, and Masters all seemed to have come here about the same time and from (the few references) Virginia. I would say they came mostly from Culpeper, Albemarle, Orange. They all settled in S.E. part of Jessamine Co. and across the river in Madison and Garrard Counties. I wonder if they could have come with Lewis Craigs Traveling Church, in which he gathered up 200 Baptists and 400 other pioneers in the aforementioned area of VA and settled a few miles from what is now Lancaster, in Garrard County.

I find no William Reynolds listed as being a son of Henry Sr. or Jr. Thomas did have a son William who married Polly Stinnett, and had children: Absalone, Harrison, Lindsay, Hugh, A.R.M. (is Marshall), Fronia, and Bella. My father personally knew some of these children when they were old. William must have been one of Thomas younger children, possibly the youngest. I remember Fronia as being very old and I was born in 1911.

Henry Reynolds (#6018) is listed by Tillman as the son of #6012, but I have proof that he was the son of Henry, Sr. Henry Jr. had no son William, and I find Guy Moreton is too young to be their child, possibly could be the son of Henry's feeble minded sister. Moses (Tillman's #6018) is married to Araminta Potts, not Samantha. Children are correct. John W. seems correct.

Pat Smith has sent me some things to check, as she is also descended from Thomas. As far as I know she is not descended from Henry, as I come into that family by the marriage of Thomas' son, Willis to Mariah Jones, the dau. of Rachel Reynolds Jones (Rachel was the dau. of Henry Sr.).

From the Chronicles of Scotch-Irish Settlement In Virginia, I found that on the 25 May 1762 Mary Renold, 16, orphan of James Renold, chose Nathaniel Evans as guardian. I realize that I am "reaching", but since the names are similarly spelled to Thomas on his war record, he was born in approximately 1762. Mary becomes an orphan in that year, and I have wondered if Thomas could be an orphan, perhaps a nephew of Henry Sr. and came here when they came. Did that James have any children besides Mary? Who were his brothers? Who was Henry Sr.'s father? I feel that somewhere someone has the answer to these questions and may want to know what became of these people. The last Reynolds names in my particular line from my great grandfather Lindsay, is carried by three sons of a cousin of mine - One in Denver CO, one in St. Petersburg, FL, and one in Atlanta GA.
