At our annual meeting held in Albany last fall, a speaker asked those present to answer the question, "How did you become aware of or interested in the RFA?" and I would like to take this opportunity to answer this question; to let you know that although I am a relatively new member of the RFA, I have long been associated with and familiar with our Association. FROM THE RFA HISTORIAN'S DESK: Dorothy C. Jellinghaus

After a long absence from home due to heart surgery and a long convalescence, the writer is glad to be home again and digging into Reynolds' records and roots. Many of you who have written me during this period and not had an acknowledgement may now hear from me again. The many expressions of empathy and concern which were received by me were very much appreciated.

You have all had copies of Reynolds Recollections, so you know about the good meeting held in Albany last October and that the 1988 meeting is scheduled for Wethersfield, CT, an area where so many of our Reynolds descendants resided. In fact, according to our records Robert of Boston came to Wethersfield for a year or so as did John of the Watertown line; but both supposedly left that area to return to their first choices -- the Boston and New York areas.

The RFA thirty-eighth Annual, 1892-1929 gives a complete genealogy through seven generations of the line of John Reynolds who married Naomi Latimer. This John is said to have come from Cheshire, England. He was born prior to 1650 and died in 1682 at Wethersfield. The earliest records of Wethersfield are now kept in the State Library at Hartford, CT. Unfortunately these records do not go back beyond 1640. There is no mention of John in them but his private record appears in the records of Judge Adams at Hartford --

"1673 -- The ear mark which John Rennals give s all his creatures is an half-penny on the foreside the right ear and an half penny on the underside of the same ear."

It is interesting to note that the same earmark of John Reynolds of Greenwich, CT is the same as that of John of Wethersfield.

If this is your line, it may interest you to know a few copies of this annual (1929) are still available. There are interesting, unpublished manuscripts in the RFA files; family genealogies of such interesting characters as Henry Reynolds of Mutton Hill, Mohawk Valley, New York who lived in Revolutionary days and acted as protector to his own family and others who were left alone as their men went off to fight; who was persecuted by the Tories and Indians; who with his family and cattle lived in a large cave and was rescued from a fire in his own cabin where he had been hanged and was rescued by his twelve year old daughter, Phoebe. Doesn't that sound like a good tale? If these brief facts touch on your lines, please contact the writer.

SECRETARY'S MESSAGE: Continuing the painstaking process of organizing and compiling all of our members' family records, I have run into a serious obstacle. My files do not contain family charts on many of our members. These files were handed down to me by my predecessor so I have no explanation why some records are complete and some are not. The situation needs to be rectified, however, especially as I am in the process of indexing all our files to make research easier and more accessible to the members. 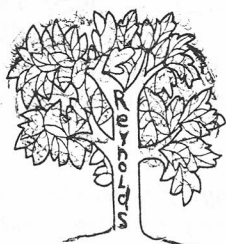

From the collection of Richard G. Woodbridge III, '39, *49."

The above announcement was accompanied by a letter mentioning the book on the life of JNR which is not yet published, plus some family data excerpted as follows:

"Haven't been able to trace his father. His widow mother married a quaker. In his youth in Ohio, he was known as Jeremiah but as an adult used the name James. He rec'd honorary degree from Columbia - "James Neilson Reynolds." His mother's maiden name was Elizabeth Nicholson, dau of Joab and Isabella Nicholson of Erie Co., PA. Poss. he born in Cumerlain Co., NJ. No indication he ever married. My sister, Margaretta W. Chadwick is a member of the RFA. Any info would be appreciated."

Anyone interested in the exhibit should contact the library above for further details. While we can share the above information with you, we cannot treat his request for info. as a query as Mr. Woodbridge is not a member, nor did he submit the data as a query; therefore we cannot include his address for the membership. If you, as a member, need to contact Mr. Woodbridge, then call your editor, 1-313-584-7467 after 6 PM or on Week-ends, or write if that is more convenient for you and time is no object. (I answer all mail with SASE in the order received, and a lot is received so it's hard to say how long before a reply will be forthcoming.

Interesting messages were presented in this issue from your association president, secretary and historian-consultant and if space had allowed, there would have been a special report from the executive vice president (which includes a preliminary report on the annual meeting to be held in Wethersfield, Ct in Oct.) covering several areas. REYNOLDS RECIPE: SOUTHERN PECAN PIE.....by Catherine Reynolds King

1 Cup Sugar
3/4 Cup Light Corn Syrup
1/4 teaspoon Salt
1/2 teaspoon Vanilla Extract
1/4 Cup Margarine, Melted

3 Eggs, Slightly Beaten
1 1/2 Cups Pecan Halves
1 Unbaked 9" Pie Shell

STIR Sugar, Corn Syrup, Salt and Vanilla into the Melted Margarine.
BLEND this mixture into the slightly beaten Eggs.
STIR in the Pecans.
POUR mixture into the unbaked pie shell.
BAKE at 350° F for approximately 40 minutes (or until done)



Catherine has been making this pie for many years and it is definitely her favorite pie. She bakes the pie to give for Christmas as well as taking it to her Reynolds reunion. And while the pecan pie was never served on the riverboats the family owned, it was the family's favorite pie down through the years. Catherine runs a house, looks after a retired husband, a cat and writes in addition to keeping up with the family history. (Provisional -- probably will connect to either Henry of Chicester or Christopher of Virginia)

THE LINK LINES: If you are fortunate enough to possess them, there is nothing to beat the personal records of your ancestors. Bibles, scrapbooks, diaries, written mementos (like a birthday card, postcard, etc), letters received from older relatives and letters collected by our departed ancestors can be an invaluable tool for those of us fortunate enough to fall heir to this material.

When I was a little girl, my grandmother (Sheppard) kept a set of scrapbooks which she added to each day. One scrapbook was of newspaper clippings and letters related to my uncles and the war. Both of my Sheppard uncles were in the Navy during World War II and my grandmother would clip anything to do with the Navy in particular and the war in general including the letters my uncles wrote home. Another scrapbook was devoted to my youngest aunt, Lucille, who was only a few years older than me. Then there was a scrapbook for anything to do with the family from birth announcements and obituaries to any event in between. Unfortunately no one knows what happened to those scrapbooks and they were not to be found when she died in 1983. We lost two ways.



On the other hand, sometimes a scrapbook collection is preserved and can be a wealth of information for the descendants. My great aunt Jennie Smith kept a scrapbook on anything and everything, not only on the family, but things like poetry from newspapers, the words to a popular song. Jennie was from a large family of 12 children and had a large family and kept close contact with all.

She lived to be near 100 years old and had quite a collection of scrapbooks which were inherited by Jennie's granddaughter, Peggy Adams. Jennie also left enough old photographs to fill at least eleven photograph albums which Peggy painstakingly coordinated with the scrapbooks and shares with other family members who are interested. Any visit with this cousin is always "my pleasure". Peggy's mother is in her mid-eighties and sharp as a tack when it comes to recalling events involving our family. Combine the memories of Goldie (Peggy's mom) with the photo albums and the old scrapbooks and you are surrounded by genealogical gold. Perhaps you have similar circumstances within your family and can take advantage of this great asset before it is lost to you.

BY MEMBER RECORDED: The following is from material sent in by member Virginia Reynolds of Smyrna, GA (Provisional Mem.)

GENEALOGICAL DATA ON THE HEZEKIAH REYNOLDS FAMILY OF WALLINGFORD, CT: Hezekiah was born in Watertown, Ct 4 July 1756. He moved to Roxbury CT then to N. Branford. He married Martha Davenport Wolcott, born 18 Aug, 1762. She died 19 Aug. 1839, aged 77 yrs. He died 30 June 1833 at age 77. Hezekiah and Martha had ten known children as follows:

- 1) Hezekiah Reynolds b. Dec 1773 in Roxford CT; mar. 1806 at Savannah, GA Anna Wilson. They had a dau Martha Ann b 1807 who mar. 1828 Henry Belden of Hartford CT.
- 2) Wolcott Reynolds (Capt) b. 18 June 1779; mar. 1804 Serephina Beaumont; he died 28 Sep 1842, age 44. They had a dau Serephina b. 16 Jan 1805 and died 1833 age 28.
- 3) James Reynolds b. 12 Apr 1783; d. 31 Mar 1807
- 4) John Davenport Reynolds (Hon.) b. 27 Apr 1785; mar. 1822 Lydia Scarritt (dau of John). He was judge of the Probate Court for the dist. of Wallingford. Lydia died 28 July 1862 age 65; He died 18 Oct 1853 at age 68. They had three children: Martha b. 27 March 1826; John D. b. 20 Apr 1828; and Serephina b. 15 March 1833 who mar. 1852 S. N. Edmonds.
- 5) Luanna Reynolds b. 23 Apr 1784; mar. 23 Dec 1825 Nehemiah Carrington of New Haven CT
- 6) Martha Reynolds b. 13 Feb 1794 mar. 1823 Col. Thaddeus Street of Cheshire
- 7) Sarah Reynolds b. 12 Jan 1796; mar. 1819 Alexander Harrison
- 8) Thomas G. Reynolds b. 16 Mar 1798; died 26 Sep 1826 at age 28.
- 9) William A. Reynolds, b. 1 Apr 1800 Wallingford Ct; mar. Jane Lynde of New Haven CT and had four children - 2 boys, 2 girls
- 10) Beverly Reynolds b. 15 Nov 1806; d. 5 Nov 1807

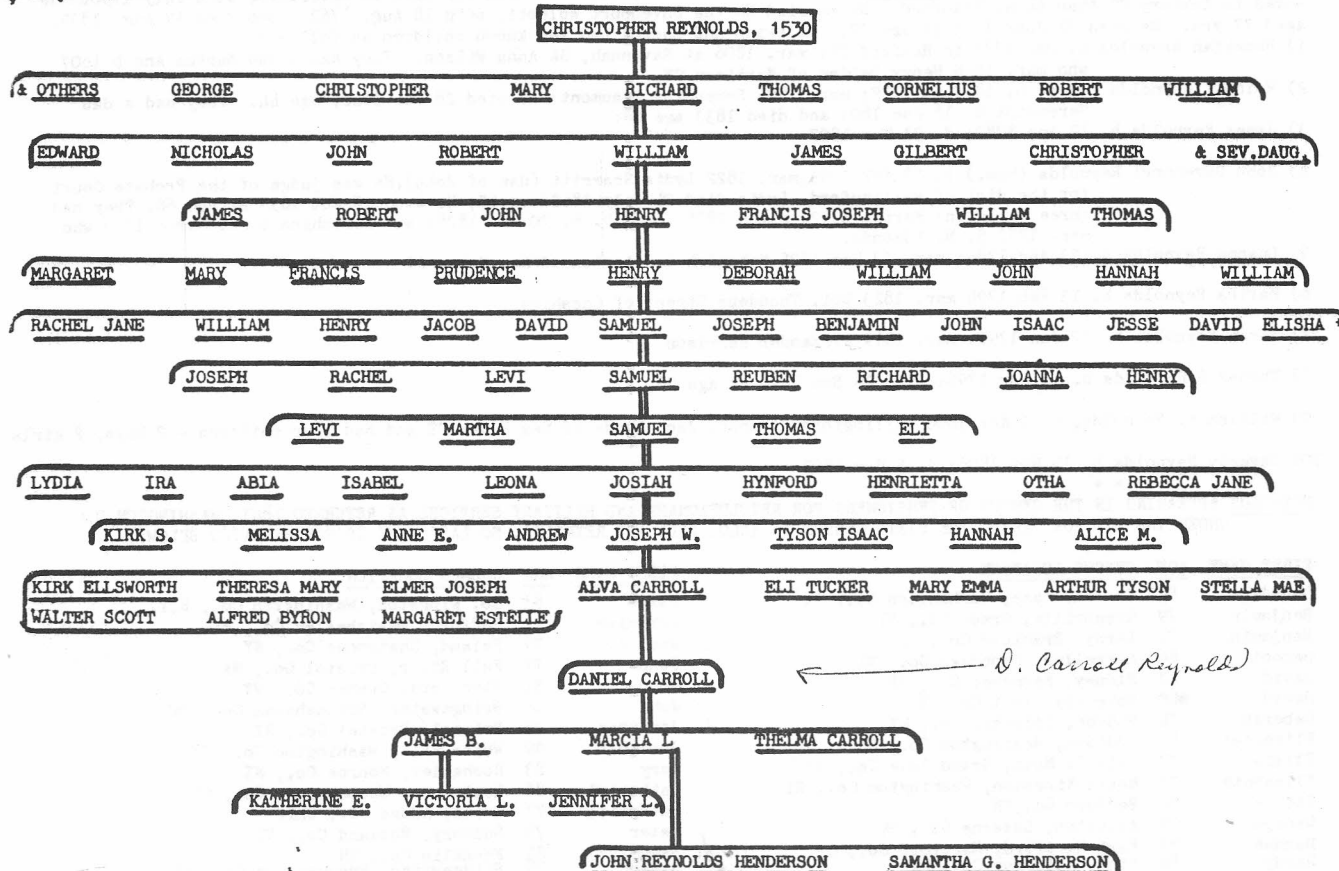

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his absence, and ingratiated himself at that time in the good wishes of the emperor; and so it was that on this visit Mr. Reynolds was shown every honor, extraordinary honors to a stranger, to an American. It was just after the Boxer outbreak in China, and he was shown every honor and the emperor loaded him with gifts when he returned and sent messages by him to President Roosevelt and to the emperor's son who was studying in this country. So you will see that the name of Reynolds has gone to China and it must be familiar with the consuls who are ruling that country. It would doubtless be interesting to you should I read it, but that is a brief synopsis of what the article was.

Mr. Reynolds I think holds some position in the national capital at this time, and I was hoping that he would be present to-day.

Now I know we are all anxious to get away and get out this beautiful day, especially on this sort of holiday here. I am glad that we have heard from so many and we would like to hear from more.

At this time I am reminded again of the young politician—young lawyers are sometimes young politicians, so I am reminded of all these things—whose friend asked him how his first speech was received. "Well," he said, "a friend of mine who was there told me when I sat down it was the very best thing I had ever done." So I think now I will sit down and I am sure you will say it is about the very best thing I have done.

Immediately after adjournment the members and friends of the Association went to Ocean Beach where the remainder of the day was spent very pleasantly.

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ARTICLE III.

SECTION 1. The officers of this Association shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, who shall perform the duties pertaining to their offices, and shall constitute an executive committee. They shall hold their several offices for the term of one year, or until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 1. The meetings of this Association shall consist of an annual reunion, and such other meetings as may be called by the executive committee, or request of the members of the Association.

SEC. 2. This Association shall hold an annual reunion at a time and place to be designated by the executive committee, at which time the officers shall be elected for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE V.

SECTION 1. Membership shall consist of all persons connected with the Reynolds family by blood or marriage.

SEC. 2. Any person who is eligible may become a member of the Association.

SEC. 3. That whenever any person desires to become a member of this Association, he shall present with his petition a chart filled up with such data concerning his Reynolds ancestors, as far as he has any knowledge of the same; such charts to be prepared by the committee on family history, and to be furnished by the secretary at the expense of the Association.

The secretary, upon receiving such charts, shall forward them to the chairman of the publication committee, whose business it shall be to refer them to that member who is editing the line to which the applicant belongs.

Amendments

August 30, 1899.—Voted that the descendants of all families whose surnames were Reynolds that came to this country prior to the year 1660 shall be eligible to membership in the Reynolds Family Association.

Voted to increase the number of vice-presidents to three.

August 23, 1900.—Voted that the date prior to which ancestors of those eligible to membership in the Reynolds Family Association came to this country be changed from 1660 to 1700.

Voted to increase the number of vice-presidents to five.

August 21, 1902.—Voted that any one eligible to membership in the Association may become a life member on payment of \$25.

August 20, 1903.—Voted to increase the number of vice-presidents to six.

August 16, 1906.—Voted to reduce the life membership fee to \$10.

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Constitution

The purpose of this Association is to promote the recognition of a common ancestry; to increase acquaintance and sociability among relatives; to collect and preserve memorials; and to secure the preparation and publication of a genealogical and historical sketch of the Reynolds Family.

All descendants of John Reynolds of Stonington are invited to become members of this Association.

ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. This Association shall be known as The Reynolds Family Association.

ARTICLE II.

SECTION 1. The objects of the Association are declared to be: Promotion of fraternal feeling among the members; encouragement of each other in every laudable undertaking; and the collection and preservation of facts and events in the history of the Reynolds Family.

SEC. 2. A publication committee shall be forthwith elected, and shall hold office until their successors shall be duly elected. Such committee to be composed of at least one representative from each of the following American families eligible to membership in this Association the progenitors of which being as follows:

Robert Reynolds of Boston, Mass.
John Reynolds of Watertown, Mass., and Wethersfield, Conn.
John Reynolds of Weymouth, Mass.
James Reynolds of North Kingstown, R. I.
Henry Reynolds of Burlington, N. J., late of Chichester, Pa.

and the historian to be *ex officio* a member of such committee. The committee to have the power to add such members thereto as to it may seem advisable.

WAYS AND MEANS

SEC. 3. The expense of publication shall be defrayed from contributions and from funds received from sales of books after publication.

MANNER OF PUBLICATION

SEC. 4. No contract shall be made for publication of any of the series of books until the funds actually in the hands of the treasurer are sufficient to pay the cost of publication of the history of the particular family then about to be published.

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Appendix

A Brief Record of the Descendants of JOHN REYNOLDS, of Watertown, Mass., (later of Wethersfield and Stamford, Conn.)

JOHN REYNOLDS, undoubtedly a brother of Robert, was born in England in 1612. It is believed by many that he was also a brother of James of Narragansett and William of Providence. It is not known just when John reached America, but he first appeared in Watertown about 1634, in which year his wife, Sarah, and others later associated with him at Watertown, Wethersfield and Stamford, sailed from Ipswich on the ship Elizabeth. He was admitted as a freeman of Watertown, May 6, 1635. Several months later he removed with other settlers to Wethersfield, Conn., and in 1641 to Stamford, where his wife died August 21, 1657.

THE REYNOLDS FAMILY ASSOCIATION

FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR PUBLICATION

SEC. 5. No more than thirty per centum of the funds in the hands of the treasurer received from any source whatever shall be applied to the payment for publication of the family history of any particular family. Provided, however, that this prohibition shall not apply to the last history published. And provided, that if any branch of the family shall advance the necessary funds, or any part thereof, to enable such family to publish, the amount of such advancement shall be returned to the contributors when and as soon as the profit derived from the sale of the history of such family shall be sufficient, and the account of sales of each of the publications shall be kept separate until reimbursement of the amount of such advancement.

SUBSCRIBING MEMBERS

SEC. 6. Persons subscribing to the fund shall be credited with the amount of their subscriptions as payments *pro tanto* for the books to be published by the Association and shall be the first to receive copies of such books, provided that the amount of such subscription is sufficient to pay for the book then published. If not sufficient, upon payment of the requisite balance the book shall then be furnished such subscribing person.

COPYRIGHT AND METHOD OF SALE

SEC. 7. Each of the books shall be copyrighted, and shall be numbered from one upward, and the secretary shall write the name of the subscriber or purchaser in the book under the number thereof, and shall attach his signature thereto.

CUSTODIAN OF FUNDS FOR PUBLICATION

SEC. 8. Funds contributed for the purpose of publication of family history and amounts received from the sale of any of such publications shall be paid to the treasurer of this Association, who shall deposit the same in such bank as he may select, upon an interest account at the best rate of interest he can obtain, and shall be paid out by him upon a voucher check, which shall disclose upon its face upon what account such disbursement is made, which check shall be countersigned by the president.

BILLS TO BE APPROVED

SEC. 9. Bills payable from this fund shall first be approved by the chairman of the publication committee, or by the chairman of any sub-committee acting under the publication committee.

APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS

SEC. 10. After the publication of the several histories, the profits, if any there be, derived from the sales of the various books shall be at the disposal of the Association.
