LIST OF PAROLES OF THE ARMY OF NORTHERN VIRGINIA ISSUED AT APPOMATTOX COURTHOUSE, APRIL 9, 1865. Paroles were issued to approximately 28,231 men. Some 2400 cavalry refused to surrender. General T.T. Mumford stated in 1887 in a letter to R. A. Brock, editor of "Appomattox Roster" that though he was paroled about 10 May 1865, his command were not surrendered, but were disbanded at Lynchburg, Virginia, and dispensed to their homes. The original of each parole is in the National Archives, Washington, DC. The only copy was kept by General Robert E. Lee and eventually given to the Southern Historical Society and used for compiling *THE APPOMATTOX ROSTER: List of Paroles of the Army of Northern Virginia issued at Appomattox Courthouse April 9, 1865*; edited by R. A. Brock, Southern Historical Society, Richmond VA, 1887, from which the following Reynolds names were extracted. The following caption and endorsement appear on the original of all paroles:

"We the undersigned Prisoners of War, belonging to the Army of Northern Virginia, having been this day surrendered by General Robert E. Lee, C.S.A, Commanding said Army, to Lieutenant General U.S. Grant, Commanding Armies of the United States, do hereby give our solemn parole of honor that we will not hereafter serve in the armies of the Confederate States, or in any military capacity whatever, against the United States of America, or render aid to the enemies of the latter, until properly exchanged, in such manner as shall be mutually approved by the respective authorities.

Done at Appomattox Courthouse, Virginia this 9th day of April 1865.

"The within named men will not be disturbed by United States authorities so long as they observe their parole and the laws in force where they may reside. George H. Sharpe, Assistant Provost Marshal General."

There is a very large island at the doorstep of New York City which was once named for --and who knows-- might have been owned by one of us Reynoldses. From its appearance on a very old map, it might have been what is now Long Island.

I first discovered this intriguing bit of information a number of years ago as I was looking through a copy of Captain John Smith's General History of Virginia, New England, and the Summer Isles, the original of which was printed in London in 1624. I turned to the title page and studied the details. I found below the oval portraits of Queen Elizabeth, King James and Prince Charles part of a map, presumably done by Smith, of the east coast of North America from Cape Fear to a part of Maine which he called Pembroke Bay (probably Penobscot Bay). Because of its configuration I recognized his Cape James as the present Cape Cod. Then, to my surprise and delight, I read alongside an elongated island just about where Long Island is situated the name "Renolds I."

I read through many pages of Smith's History but failed to find any mention of a Reynolds Island, though he was rather concise and complete in his observations. I learned, however, from general references on Captain Smith that he named many places after his sponsors or benefactors and his friends. One source stated that in his will Smith left some of his belongings to his "good friend, John Reynolds". It is possible that he named Long Island after this member of our family.

I have spent many hours throughout the past ten years or so in trying to learn something about "Reynolds I." but without success. Being a member of an international geographical society, I sought help there. I consulted the National Geographic Society, the Library of Congress, the New York Historical Society, the American Geographical Society, the Association of American Geographers, the Nassau County (NY) Historical Museum and even conferred in person with the head of maps division of the British Museum, all without a glimmer of a solution.

A mystery? Perhaps one of our readers has some knowledge of the origin and eventual disposition of the name "Renolds I.". Will this forever remain a mystery?

A very old church near Jamestown, VA, St. Luke's Church, 1632 (Some bricks bear the date 1632) is thought to have been fashioned after a church (or churches) left behind, may be an indirect clue to earlier Reynolds origins in the old country. The resemblance of this building to the unique brick churches of s.e. Essex (England), themselves closely akin to Dutch and Flemish examples of architecture, is confirmed in The Story of Architecture in America by T. E. Tallmadge (pp 42-3) @1928.
