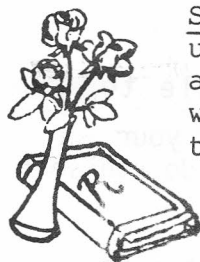

LINK LINES - Cont'd: any idea if this is something that can be programmed into the computer, is already part of a program, or if it is too time consuming to be considered. Of course, this is something that would have to be discussed at the annual RFA meeting, as does anything new we propose to do. But lets DO something to begin unravelling all the mysterious tapestries that have been woven by ancestors, leaving "tangled trails", wrong directions and misconceptions. (Example: a well-known, published genealogist who edits a publication for her historical society stated in one of her newspaper columns that my gr. grandfather, James T. Reynolds was the son of Reuben Reynolds and the gr.son of Thomas K. Reynolds. James T was born May, 1852 and was NOT the oldest son. Thomas K. was born 29 December 1815, which would make him 37 when James was born. Since James T. definitely was not the oldest..not even next oldest child, it doesn't seem possible that there could be a generation between them. Taking the published newspaper article as factual, two other columns were written about James T. showing his father to be Reuben instead of Thomas. Who knows how many persons researching the same line of Reynolds as I am have picked up this WRONG piece of "thread" and woven it into their "tapestry"?)

Not only is this a possible "link line" through the RFA, but it is an additional tool to use for quick referral.....they are all your ancestors and sometime looking at a whole list you might see something you have been overlooking for some time. A copy can also be sent out when corresponding with others re genealogy. It could also be sent along to accompany replies to queries. And so on.

QUERIES: Queries should be no longer than eight (8) typed lines, giving enough data to identify your Reynolds ancestors and include you name and address. Queries are free to RFA members. Non-members may insert queries for a fee of \$2.00 each query, payable to the Reynolds Family Association. Queries are limited to ancestors showing Reynolds relation.

BY WAY OF INTRODUCTION: Glenn G. Reynolds, M.D., Vice President, Reynolds Family Assoc.

The accomplishments of this man have been documented extensively in the medical community, enhanced by community and public service involvement and recognized by peers. He has been honored for distinguished service, has been the "Handicapped Physician of the Year", and the recipient of other awards. He has taken part in at least a dozen film and audiovisual productions, has co-authored numerous publications and has delivered selected professional papers on three continents! Dr. Reynolds was born in India, the second son of Earl R. and Maude (Lower) Reynolds. Dr. Reynolds served in the military prior to attending medical school. He was in his third-year studies when he was stricken by polio, and went on to graduate from Loma Linda University, School of Medicine in 1954. Dr. Reynolds uses a wheelchair but he certainly isn't dependent on it, as he has piloted his own plane, sails his boat, has been an inventor, participated in river running....he's even "shot the rapids"! He has certainly been involved with life as well as with lives. He works with traumatized persons and has spent many years ministering to the disabled. He stresses that many of their problems relate to becoming participants of society once again. He also feels that the medical profession should stop working "for" the disabled and work "with" them. Dr. Reynolds stated in an article that anyone can become disabled at any time -- through accident, stroke, whatever.....that in fact, in most extended families someone is disabled. Elsewhere he has stated that people should look at disabilities in terms of their own statistical risk...that any person who lives long enough will eventually become disabled, and that Americans are growing older every year. He has argued that statistics like those ought to be impelling the nation toward making its public and private buildings accessible to all.

Dr. Reynolds is an interesting person to talk to.....when you can catch up to him, that is. He is working on his Reynolds genealogy when he finds time and plans to have more time for the business of the "RFA" in the future. Perhaps he will be able to attend this year's meeting and more of the members will be able to meet Dr. Reynolds. He has attended the last 2 annual meetings and his input has been along the lines that some of us would like to take this organization. GENEALOGY, COMPUTERS, AND ABBREVIATIONS

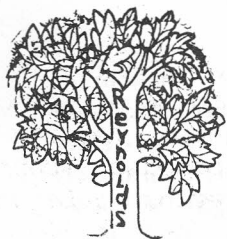
FINDING YOUR ANCESTORS..... Submitted by Sybil R. Taylor, RFA Provisional Member.

Any automation of genealogical records requires abbreviations, and they must be standardized. I use the U.S. Postal Service's two-letter state abbreviations and *The Genealogical Helper's* three-letter country abbreviations, in capitals without punctuation. Any other abbreviations will fit into this scheme. When counties have more than 12 letters: omit all vowels, e.g., Isle of Wight is Ile of Wght. Please read from left to right.

Your local Chamber of Commerce can give you the address and phone number of the Annapolis Chamber of Commerce for their material and your travel agency should be able to provide you with as much material as you want or need.

Annapolis was first settled by a group of Puritan families from Virginia in 1649, and was known as Arundelton by 1670. Actually the first settlement was on the north bank of the Severn River and called Providence. and the newer settlement across the river was called Arundleton. In 1684 Ann Arundel Town was laid out on 100 acres. Then Maryland moved its capitol from St. Mary's City to Anne Arundel Town, which was renamed Annapolis in honor of Princess Anne, later Queen of England. With history this old, there is bound to be lots of genealogical material on hand for Reynolds members with Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania & Virginia ancestry. Much material expected to be found in the other states mentioned, but hasn't been found possibly could be located in the Colonial records of Maryland.

For those planning to spend vacation time in the Annapolis area, you might like to know that the weekend AFTER Labor day Annapolis hosts the Maryland Seafood Festival, and that the United States Sailboat Show is held in early October.

Annapolis has a wealth of specialty shops near the city dock area, including boutiques, and a shopping mall is at junction of SR 50 and US 50 houses Penneys, Wards, Hecht's, Garfinkel's among others. Then there is the Bay Bridge Market Place about a mile west of the Bay Bridge on US 50 which has about 25 factory outlet stores.

There is lots to see and do. The U.S. Naval Academy has tours as does the Maryland State House. Self-guided tour and guided tours are available for touring historic Annapolis. Then for those who want to spend time in the water, there is certainly enough of that in the area. There is plenty of 18th century housing available in the form of old mansions, houses and churches and St. John's college. Or bay fishing and boating, take marine tours, or a day on the bay cruise, or one of many 40 minute cruises available. Also you can find lunch, dinner moonlight cruises and brunch cruises. Public and private golf courses, crabbing on the Severn, gardens restored to other eras, the Market House at the City Dock, Reynolds Tavern, the Barracks on Pinkney Street, the Chase-Lloyd House, the Carroll House, the Hammond -Harwood House, or Liberty Tree, St. John's College Campus are some things that come to mind to see and do. And I'm sure they have the usual McDonalds, Wendy's, Pizza Hut, etc.

In the next issue, we will try to find more reasons for you to plan on coming to Annapolis. Also will try to locate restaurants you might enjoy while you are in the area, and what is available to those interested in genealogy....libraries, court records, etc.
