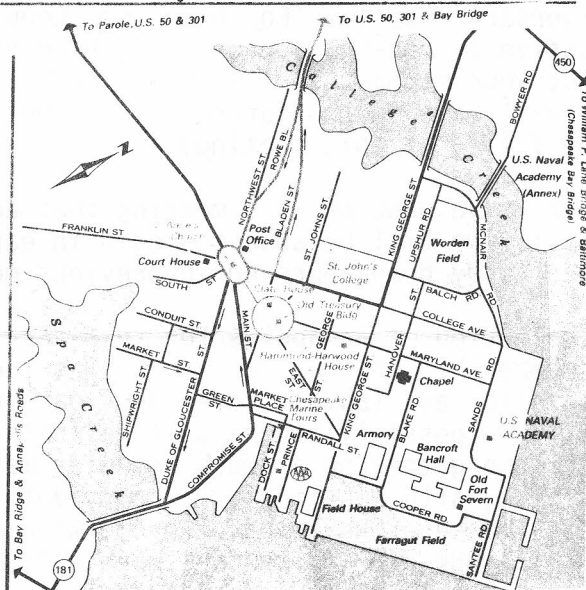
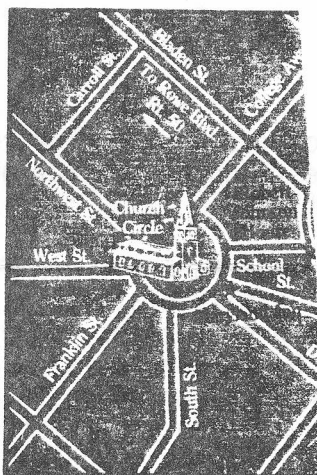
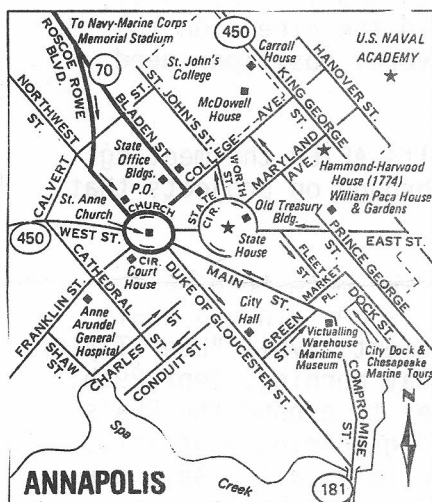

MAPS OF ANNAPOLIS / DOWNTOWN AREA (For Reference only...NOT TO ANY SCALE)

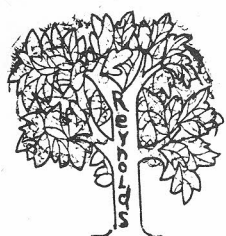

This is an excellent book showing ancestry of Sarah Backus who married John Reynolds. If time allowed I would have copied the entire book, but since we cannot photocopy and must handwrite the information, there just isn't time to copy all the pages. Sarah Backus was the daughter of William and Sarah (Charles) Backus Wm. Backus was one of three bro. landing near CapeCod, MA...one killed by indians, 2nd settled in Maine & Wm ended up at Norwich CT. OTHER SURNAMES NOTED: CHARLES, BINGHAM, PRATT, CLARKE, BRADFORD, ADAMS, RIPLEY, RUDD, DYER, WHITING.

ELIPHALET, JERUSHA, Zerviah, NATHANIEL, JOHN, SAMUEL and William are some of the given names that were noticable in this Backus book which are also found in Reynolds family.

(In looking thru old notes, I found several other Backus books on the Backus family that I had already used and located an item of interest to descendants of John and Sarah (Backus) Reynolds.....opposite page 122 in the book, A GENERAL MEMOIR OF THE BACKUS FAMILY by

William W. Backus, 1889, Norwich, CT was a picture of a beautiful Backus monument in the Yantic Cemetery, Norwich, Connecticut.

Editors Note: This material was sent in just prior to last year's annual meeting, so I put it into one of the 3 ring binders I took with me, enabling those present to make use of the material. My intention was to print it in the next issue of R.R., but for some reason, it remained in that 3 ring binder and was shelved. Mrs. Rohrer has obviously put a lot of work into researching her ancestry and we thank her for sharing some of her findings with us.

Because people migrated in groups, all the records sent in by Mrs. Rohrer will be printed without attempting to excerpt Reynolds data only. It is possible that the information will be of benefit to present or future members.

Beginning with part of the letter from Mrs. Rohrer, then a couple of her reduced charts followed by the data:

Having received some extra data on my line I am enclosing it with this letter. Also am sending in my chart, if that is alright, as I have not completed my line. I wondered, as you seem to lack news to print, if you would print my data, part or all of it. Perhaps someone in our family will recognize the latest Reynolds I have unearthed.

This data was researched from the county clerks offices in (Nicholasville Ky, Jessamine Co) (Lancaster, Ky, Garrard Co), (Richmond, Ky, Madison Co), Raleigh N.C., Books from N.C., from the Archives at Frankfort Ky and the Historical Society at Frankfort, Ky. Numerous distant relatives have sent items that fit in, from all over the country. I have published queries in the North Carolina Hist. Soc Journal as a member, and from the Kentucky Hist. Soc Journal, also a member of that.

I hope I have my data in order. I am descended from two lines of Reynolds, one is: Henry, Rachel, Mariah Jones (married Willis Reynolds) Lindsay B., William L, Lindsay J and me. The other is Thomas, Willis, Lindsay B., William L., Lindsay J and me.

Now, I think Henry's father was Thomas of N.C. as Thomas left a deed of maintenance to Henry for his care until his death. Thomas Reynolds had been granted 2000 A. of land on Indian Creek in Tryon Co. That County has had numerous names and is now Lincoln Co.

The Journal of N C Gen. vol 12, 1966---975.8 B2J says Capt. Samuel Cobrin's company of militia were first settlers of Gaston and Lincoln counties. Among the list is Thomas Ranils 18 and Richard Ranils 19.

Quote " Charles McPheeters probably from Cecil Co MD lived on the west bank of the Catawba River.. about 3 miles north of Samuel Cobruns. Thomas and Richard Reynolds from Cecil Co MD were granted land on Indian Creek some 6 miles S of the modern town of Lincolnton NC.

The Reynolds in the area at this time and their wives were" (William--Hannah) (Richard--Elizabeth) (Thomas-- Martha) (Alexander-- Mary ann) (Henry--Elizabeth) also John + Thomas.

If you wish to publish this, do so. and also, if this is entered in the computer and if co-ordinated with data of other members, perhaps someone will recognize a name and see where I belong. I feel it will be Christopher or Thomas who came to the Isle of Wight.

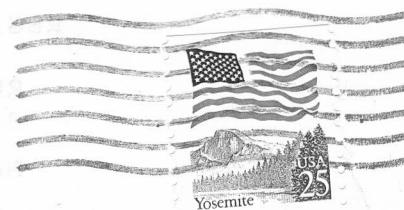
