FROM THE EDITOR: If everyone in attendance enjoyed the annual meeting as much as I did, then Annapolis was indeed a successful meeting!

For some of us, the meeting began on Thursday in the Washington, D.C. area and continued on through Sunday and/or Monday. Use was made of the Library of Congress, the DAR library, the Hall of Records in Annapolis and of personal material brought by various RFA members.

Dorothy Shea collected material (including maps) to be handed out to those attending the meeting, and was kind enough to initiate some of us into using the Hall of Records. Some of the members who met up with each other quite by accident ended up dining together at a small, elegant restaurant on State Circle and had a delightful meal on the Friday night before the meeting. Some of us stayed in historic inns in the area as I did. I stayed in the REYNOLDS TAVERN but never did learn the history of the tavern as no one seemed to know much about the tavern. The meeting on Saturday was held in the Maryland Inn, in a room which was very charming and cozy in an elegant sort of way and lent atmosphere to our meeting. The morning was spent perusing each other's materials on hand and getting to know new cousins. The business meeting is covered by the minutes of the meeting found on page 2. All of those in attendance seemed to approve of the location, the site, the surroundings, the food as well. The majority of those in attendance had been to three or four other RFA meetings and seemed to look forward to the next one.

If any members have any information on Reynolds in the Ohio area, we could use it as we did the Maryland Reynolds, only earlier so that it may be of benefit of those who will attend the Cleveland meeting.

The Reynolds migrations extracted from Rev. M.T. Reynolds (1873) should prove to be of value to some of the RFA members and of interest to all. It appears that a lot of work went into extracting this information.

MINUTES OF THE RFA 1989 57th ANNUAL MEETING

President Brian Reynolds opened the meeting and welcomed members.

Treasurer's report presented by the Secretary. For the period Jan. 1 through Sep. 15, 1989, total income was \$1785, total expenditures were \$1428. Remaining balance is \$5287 with pending obligations of the cost of the meeting and \$175 due editor.

Secretary's report presented by Exec. Secretary, Susan Clement. There are 204 current members, with a total of 26 new members since last year's meeting. A review of the projects and activities approved at last year's meeting and their status indicated that several projects had not been addressed during the year by the Executive Committee and will be carried over to the present year. Of particular concern was the lack of action to begin the Officers quarterly conference calls. Other issues reported on were: the centralization and storage of all RFA materials with the Secretary completed; no action on publication of new annual; no action on regional activity or publicity; preliminary planning for the 100th anniversary meeting begun; all membership processing to be managed by the Secretary completed; questionnaire developed and presented to members. It was also reported that the Secretary had undertaken to notify all members with dues in arrears of payments due. This effort netted \$725 in back dues and current 1989 dues payments from these members. Members not paid were dropped from the membership list.

Election of officers was held since two vacancies existed. It was voted to upgrade the position of Editor to that of Vice President for Publications. The following officers were elected:

The Secretary presented a printed membership list overwhelmingly requested by members via the questionnaire. It was approved that the list will be distributed on a trial basis during the upcoming year; distributed free to members attending the annual meeting and available for a charge of \$3.00 postpaid for other members.

The Constitution and Bylaws Committee will be reactivated and will propose revisions and amendments to be considered by the membership at next year's meeting.

Timelines for payment of dues and membership were established as follows: Dues are due for the upcoming year on Jan. 1; members not paid by Mar. 1 will receive a reminder notice; members not paid by June 1 will be dropped from the membership list. New members joining after Oct. 1 will be credited with membership for the upcoming year and will be entitled to a full volume of the newsletter for the membership year only.

Persons volunteering or recruited for the positions of Line or Area Coordinator will be ratified by the Executive Committee. The indexes prepared by the Secretary and other resources will be made available to Coordinators.

It was resolved that efforts begin to have old volumes of RFA books reprinted. The Vice Pres. for Publications will investigate various methods and costs.

A vote was taken on the site for next year's meeting and it was decided to hold the meeting in Cleveland, OH in an attempt to attract more members to attend from other areas of the country. It was also decided to return to holding the meeting on the Columbus Day weekend.

Motion to adjourn was made and seconded.

Secretary's note: Eighteen members and guests were in attendance at the Annual Meeting. The accommodations were extremely enjoyable. The morning was spent in research using the computer indexes and other books made available and in general socializing. The owner of Family Line Publications, a printer of genealogical source books, was available to speak with members about the possibilities of printing or reprinting annuals and books and was quite informative. Two new members joined the RFA from among the guests. The RFA is grateful to Mary Hurd and Fran Clark who made the arrangements for this most delightful meeting.

Fraternal Cemetery, Pratt City, Birmingham AL, located in the northern section of Pratt City, as suburb of Birmingham AL, facing Sheridan Road, at the western end of Hibernian Ave. A plot of land was donated to be used as a cemetery for burying miners and their families, by the Pratt Coal and Coke Company in the 1870's; additional land was acquired in 1898, and more in 1926. Memorial Day was always held on Mother's Day, the 2nd Sunday in May each year, when survivors of loved ones interred there cleaned off the graves and decorated them. Members of the Fraternal Orders and Lodges met at the City Hall and marched in procession to the cemetery where a stage had been erected and various politicians addressed crowds of people gathered there. The earliest death date found was in 1881. There are probably as many unmarked graves or with unreadable stones as appear in the list prepared.

However, each county heading reads "1816 Census...." The first page of "Historical Background" was considerably rewritten and contained the name of the compiler, Joyce Davis. She stated at the beginning "Names gleaned from secondary sources and then compiled into one alphabetical list....The MS Department of Archives and History, Jackson MS, on microfilm contain 1816 census records for [a list of MS counties]."

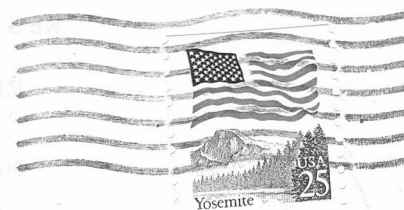
