He did not get the bibliography info, but the page no. is 4 and the Article/Book is NORWAY TIDINGS. The following is excerpted from this page: Gideon Reynolds was a native of RI. He mar. Anna Crandall of RI. His family came to Norway @1790, res. log house. He died 6 July 1798, age 53. Gideon had 3 ch: Wm, Robt C & Mary A. (she died young) Wm, eldest son, was 6 when family came to Norway. Wm mar. 2 Feb 1812 Betsey Giles dau of James Giles. Wm farmed @300 acres. (dairy) He sold farm in 1860 and then we think he held gov't position in NY custom house. He was a man of sanguine temperament, active, honest, capable and intelligent. For several terms he was elected assessor and held office of justice some years. He was Capt. of military co. He died 9 Oct 1868, age 79. His wife had died years before. Wm had 7 ch: Giles G., Maria E., Mary A., Almira, John J., Wm. Jr., and Samuel C. Giels mar. Evaline McMitchell of Newport in 1837, d. 15 Jan 1887. Maria E. mar 8 Feb 1838 Elisha O. Randall. Mary A. unmar. at time of printing. Almira mar. 1854 Newton Carpenter and resided Winnebago Co, IL. John J. mar. 1849 Catherine D. Powers of Tompkins Co NY & had mercantile bus. at Groton NY & resided in NYC. Wm. Jr. mar 1860 Esther Coffin of Deerfield & pruch. family homestead. Samuel C. mar 1859 Mary Gooding of Groton NY and engaged in mercantile trade there with his uncle, Robert C.

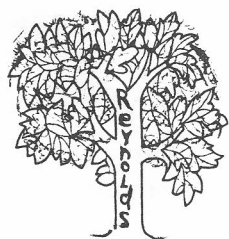
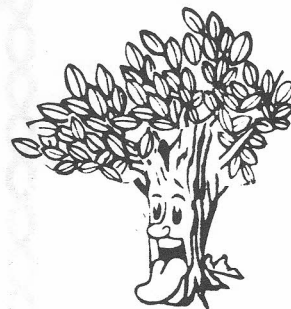

Dear Mrs. Rippier:

Some time ago (about a year or so as near as I can remember) you wrote me a letter, asking me to give you some information.

Being rather busy at the time, I laid your letter aside intending to answer it in the future. However, when I did get around to it - either I mislaid your letter or it had been thrown away.

However, I did find your address on a letterhead which I had been carrying in my billfold.

I have forgotten just what it was that you asked me now, but I believe it was something about my brother Ralph (killed in a R.R. accident) and also something about my brother Ray and his family.

However, at this time, I do not remember the contents of your letter well enough to give you the proper information.

I am enclosing a stamped envelope and if you care to write me and let me know just the information you want, I will reply promptly.

I have an old county history [Brown Co] where the Reynolds settled in 1797 and perhaps I could give you some interesting sidelights of that period long ago. The settlement (Reynolds) was known as the "Yankee Settlement". Also the log house (now weather-boarded on the outside) from which my great-great grandfather (Oliver Reynolds) went to the war of 1812, leaving a wife and 7 or 8 children behind, is still standing in Brown Co. It is now owned by my Aunt and Uncle, both past 85 years of age.

I assure you I am very sorry about losing your letter as I fully intended to answer it. If I can give you any information that will be of use to you, feel free to write me.

The seventh paragraph is the key paragraph and the reason this letter was reporduced. It also identifies three brothers [Ralph, Ray and HughD.] and the location of one of the brothers in 1949.....perhaps one or two generations back for some member? -- Hugh D. Reynolds descent was probably through James of N. Kingstown, based on RFA records.
