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This building (St.Luke's) resembles the unique brick churches of S.E.Essex, England which closely resemble Dutch and Flemish examples. St. Lukes appears to be very like the little brick church of Woodham Walter, a hamlet between Maldon and Colchester, near to the small and beautifully situated town of Danbury. It is possible that St. Luke's could be the work of some craftsman who accompanied Captain John Smith. That famous voyager was born in Lincolnshire in 1597, apprenticed at King's Lynn some 15 years later, learned to ride in the stables ofTattershall Castle and was in Virginia from 1605 to1609. In his writings he compared the countryside of Virginia to "the high grove or tuft of trees upon the high hill by the house of that worthy Knight Sir Humphrey Mildmay, so remarkable in Essex in the Parish of Danbery, where I writ this discourse.....
