REYNOLDS RUMMAGING: Norma Rannels sent in an article on a Reynolds connected statue located at the outside of the library at the University in Columbus, Ohio..A statue of Dr. William Oxley Thompson (sculpted by Erwin Frey) Ohio State's president from 1899 to 1925, was presented to the University by the Classes of 1923, 1925, 1926 and 1928. Dr. Thompson's niece, Mary Lorenda Thompson was married to Albert Harvey Reynolds (1852-1924) and lived for many years in Galion, Ohio.

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Elizabeth Yost (Mrs. James. F.), a new member, had recognized St. Luke's church in VIII, No.2, page 1. One of her ancestors, Rev. Robert Bracewell/Braswell was the fourth minister of this church, 1656 to 1667. Rev. Braswell was elected to the House of Burgesses in 1653 but was "suspended" by that body because of the sensitivity to separation of Church and State. He was not allowed to serve. Mrs. Yost has Braswell information to share if anyone is interested and/or has Bracewell/Braswell ancestry. (St. Luke's Church is across the river from Jamestown.) (SEE QUERY #991 = MRS. YOST'S ADDRESS.)

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The RFA officers held their second conference call since the last RFA meeting. This last call had a wide range of topics-- from committee reports to the meeting agenda to copyright status of RFA material. Also discussed is probably an issue most closely related to the entire membership. It was decided that articles featuring allied families could be used in the newsletter, as long as Reynolds relationship was alluded to in the article. This is not to say we are going to concentrate on allied families; just acknowledging that for every Reynolds ancestor we have, we are probably interested in the spouse's families of the ancestor as well as the Reynolds, and by such acknowledgment, perhaps more members will be better served by the RFA by receiving "Unexpected Clues" by sharing a little more data on the allied families. The more common "threads" found by members could produce a "tapestry" rather than leaving "tangles" in the "threads".

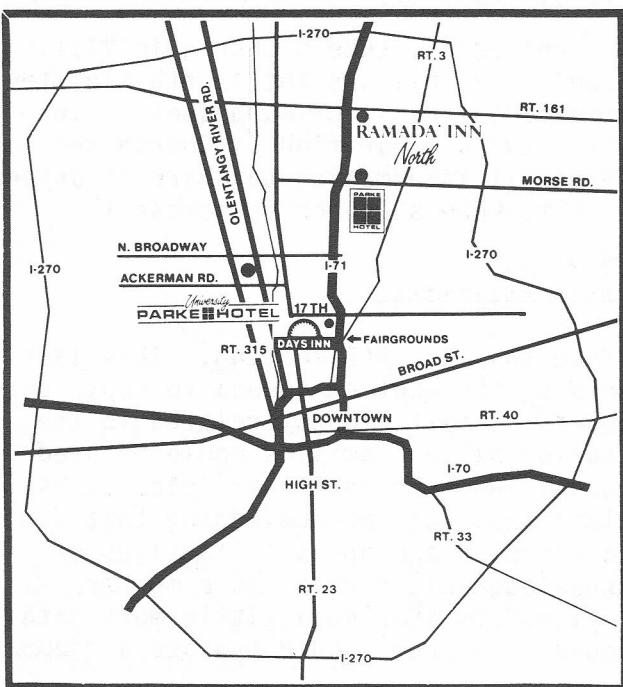

Upon my birth at 316 Meeting Street, Charleston, South Carolina, on the 3rd of October, 1910, I was given the name of John Fogarty Reynolds by my parents, Dr. Thomas Willard and Katherine Margaret (Fogarty) Reynolds. I attended the Cathedral Parochial School, Bishop England High School and the College of Charleston (B.S., 1931). I received the M.A. degree in 1949 from Teachers College, Columbia University, New York. Following employment from 1931 to 1936 as a secretary in the president's office of the College of Charleston, I taught history for one year at Bishop England H.S. then taught history, English and mathematics at Bronxville H.S., New York from 1939 until my retirement in 1970. In 1969, I received the Valley Forge Teachers Medal by Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge in 1969.

During my tenure at Bronxville H.S., time out to serve in the United States Army (from Aug. 1941 until Jan., 1948) interrupted my teaching duties while I served our Country in the Philippines and Okinawa. My military career began in 1928 as an enlisted man in the Medical Detachment of the 118th Infantry Regiment, South Carolina National Guard. In 1932, I was commissioned a Second Lieutenant of Field Artillery in the Officers Reserve Corps. After active duty in WWII, I reverted to the Reserves where I remained active until my retirement as at Lieutenant Colonel in 1960.

Ruth Lucille Nichols of Westerly Rhode Island, daughter of John David and Lucy Norman (Anderson) Nichols became my bride on 11 February 1944 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. We were blessed with three children: Margaret Nichols, born 1945, died 1973; Dorothy Ann, born 1947 and David Middleton, born 1949. We have four grandchildren.

I am a direct descendant of Christopher Reynolds who came from England to the Jamestown Colony, Virginia in 1622, and have been a member of the Reynolds Family Association for many years. I also am a member of the Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity & was admitted to membership while at Columbia Un. to Phi Delta Kappa and Kappa Delta Pi honorary educational fraternities and to Gamma Theta Upsilon, international honorary geographical society.
