Joseph Reynolds b 26 July 1761 (number 645 in John and Sarah Reynolds) son of Caleb Reynolds b about 1739. That is only a span of 22 years.

In town of Pine Plains- Old gravestones of Dutchess County, New York.

Page 199 number 742- Smith, Peter died 16 Nov. 1820, age 92 years.

Page 199 number 748- Smith, Sarah Winans, wife of Peter, died 3 Oct. 1801, age 62 years.

Little Nine Partners, (History of Pine Plains, New York by Isaac Huntting) page 380, he says, Peter Smith, son of Benjamin above married Sarah Winans, granddaughter of James Winans, the first settler of Winans name in this vicinity. They came from "Horse Neck", about 1770.

In descendants of John Winans by (didn't get the author HWS.)

James Winans³ b 17 Feb. 1715 Rahway, New Jersey died 4 April 1795 Dutchess County, New York. Married 11 Dec. 1735 to Sarah Reynolds, born 20 April 1714 Greenwich, Conn. She died 10 Oct. 1802 Dutchess County, New York.

Their daughter, Sarah, born 22 May 1739, died 30 Oct. 1801, married Peter Smith.

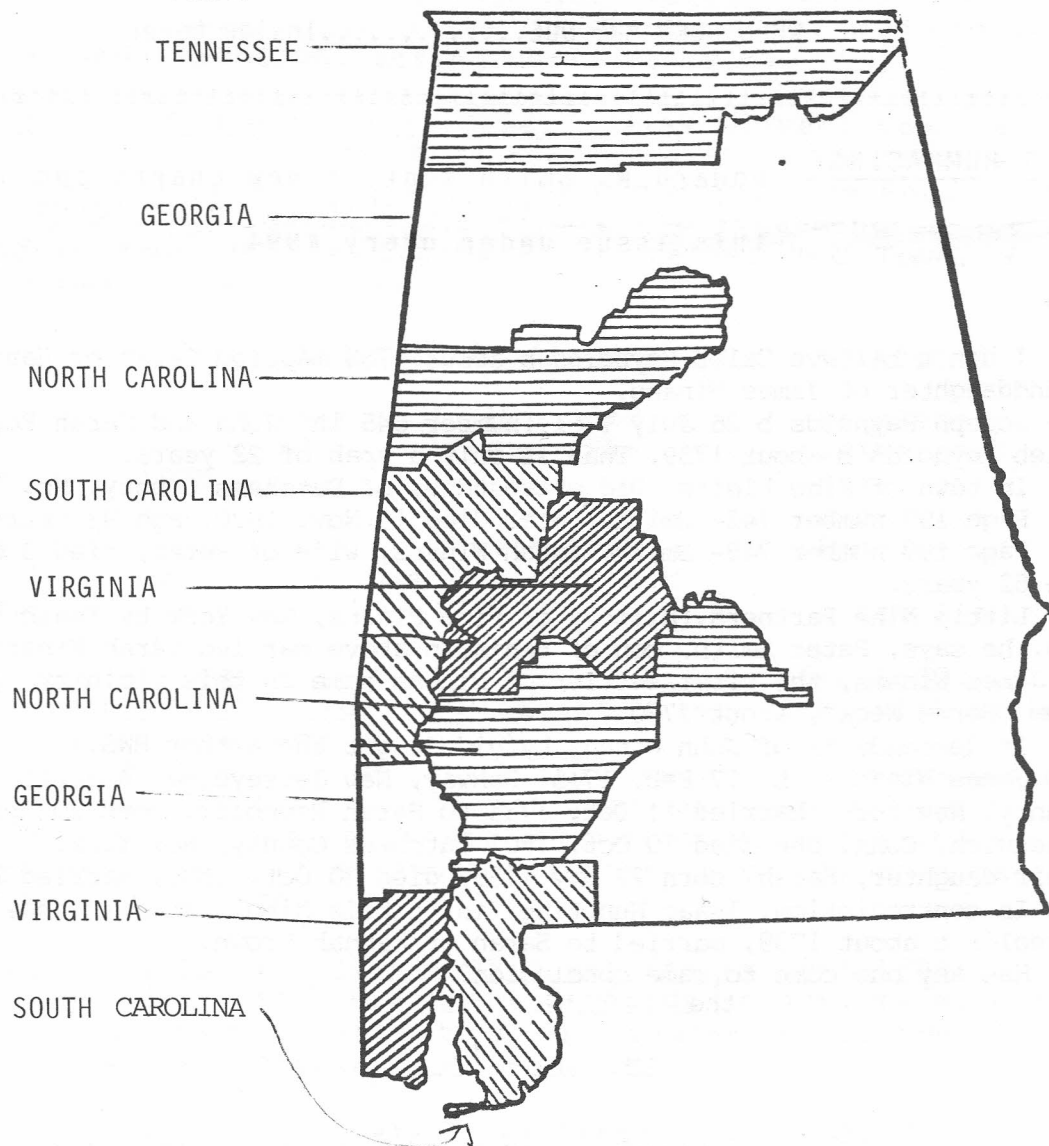
In contradiction, Isaac Huntting, in "Little Nine Partners", has Caleb Reynolds b about 1739, married to Sarah or Hannah Brown.

LINK LINES: Our early ancestors migrated following established trails and they usually traveled in groups. By using a map and pin-pointing journey, you can get a better idea of what they might have had to deal with en route to their final destination...which was sometimes far removed from their intended destination. In most instances, large numbers of those migrating together ended up in close proximity to others from their original starting point. This confirms the use of established routes.

Below is an example of a migration pattern copied from a book dealing with English origins. The book addressed the different over-all "character" of a particular region based on comparison with the origin of the settlers. The basic influence on customs, diet, architecture, traditions, religion and society in general is much more significant than we think. The environment absorbed the characteristics of former residences of the migrators and melted all these traits into communities which met the needs of the settlers. Map study can certainly show you more than roads, rivers and county lines.
