The 65th Annual Reynolds Family Association Reunion, Columbus, Ohio
5 and 6 October 1990, Submitted by Susan E. Clement, Executive Secretary

This year's annual reunion in Columbus was quite a success, thanks in great part to the hard work of our local host, Tom Reynolds. There were so many events that occurred that our President requested that I prepare a summary of the entire weekend rather than just the usual printing of the minutes of the general business meeting.

Many members arrived in Columbus on Thursday and by Friday morning had already hooked up with other members. Since Tom had reserved a block of rooms at the Days Inn across the street from the Ohio Historical Society Complex, most members were within close proximity of each other. On Friday morning, a large group descended upon the OHS research library and were welcomed by the staff who were most helpful and cooperative. For anyone doing Ohio research, this was the place to be. Records and resources of all kinds were available to the researchers. In the afternoon, members were taken on a guided tour of the Historical Society's museum on the lower floors of the OHS building. Meanwhile, back at the Days Inn, Sue Clement and Lee Taylor had made their room available to members who wanted to do some advance digging into the RFA archives and materials that Sue had brought along.

On Friday evening, a dinner was held for RFA members and guests at the Lenox Inn in Reynoldsburg (a suburb of Columbus), sponsored by the Reynoldsburg Historical Society. Along with members of the Historical Society, the Mayor of Reynoldsburg was on hand and presented the RFA President with a Proclamation. In addition, those attending received souvenir Christmas ornaments, patches, and "tomatoes" (Reynoldsburg is the "Home of the Tomato" and celebrates a Tomato Festival annually). A few words were given by officers of both organizations, and all attending had a marvelous time. In addition a sign welcoming all Reynolds families to Reynoldsburg was displayed on the front lawn of the City Hall and a special message in honor of the RFA was available on their "Dial-a-History" phone line. The Historical Society extended a warm invitation for the RFA to return to Reynoldsburg.

On Saturday morning, the reunion meeting got underway. Coffee and pastries were available. The majority of the time was spent getting to know "cousins" and exploring and researching with all the Reynolds archives material available. At least one brand new member found her entire line back to James of Rhode Island and a number of clues and interesting information were found by others. RFA member Nancy Reynolds Bartlit of Los Alamos, New Mexico gave an interesting talk on Stephen E. Reynolds, an outstanding member of the Reynolds clan who worked unceasingly within the state government of New Mexico to preserve precious water resources.

Buffet luncheon was served at the historic Colonel Crawford Inn. The food was delicious and we dined in quaint and authentic Ohio colonial atmosphere and surroundings. There was enough time for members to explore the Ohio Historical Village, a reproduction of an 1850s Ohio colonial town with "live" townspeople going about their business.

The afternoon business meeting got underway with reports of the past year's activities by the officers. The Treasurer reported that as of Oct. 1, the RFA had a balance of \$2311.47. The Secretary reported that the RFA currently has 233 members, with 67 new members for the 1990 membership year. This large number of new members is due primarily to increased publicity by the officers over the past year. Stewart Essex, Vice President, reported on the publicity efforts undertaken by him and the Corresponding Secretary. In addition, they are conducting a survey of Reynolds material in libraries across the country.

A vote was taken on a proposal to revise current membership qualifications as stated in the by-laws, i.e. to expand membership eligibility to anyone with a connection to any Reynolds family without restriction to date or line. This was adopted unanimously by the membership. Election of Officers was held and the following will be the Officers for 1991:

Appreciation was expressed to 1990 Executive Vice President, Col. Jack Reynolds and Vice President for Publications, Frances Clark, both of whom were resigning their positions. This was a most successful and productive annual meeting. Over 40 members and guests attended the activities, the highest attendance in several years. It is also of note that this is the first time that the Annual Reunion was held in a location away from the East Coast. It was voted that next year's reunion would be held in Atlanta, GA, and plans are continuing for the big 100th Anniversary Celebration in 1992. Overall, the weather was beautiful, the accommodations were warm and hospitable, and the company was superb!

The above was submitted in lieu of minutes of the meeting at the request of the RFA President, Dr. Glen G. Reynolds. This is the first time since I have been editor that minutes of the meeting were not made available to the members.

SYBIL R. TAYLOR'S MEMBERS SHOULD KNOW:

LEGAL STATUS OF RFA: In 1977 RFA was incorporated in the State of Delaware as a non-profit, non-stock corporation. Under the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Code, RFA is a tax exempt organization, but is not considered to be a charitable or educational organization; therefore, membership dues and contributions to RFA may not be deducted from the donor's federal income tax as a gift to charity.

AMENDMENT TO RFA BY-LAWS: At the 1990 annual meeting, it was voted to amend Article I, Section 2, Qualification of Members, to clarify membership requirements and to open membership in RFA to any person with interest in membership. As adopted, Article I, Section 2, now states:

Section 2. Qualification of Members. Membership in the Reynolds Family Association is open to all individuals who wish to share genealogical information, promote recognition of a common ancestry, develop acquaintance among Reynolds kindred, and collect and maintain a permanent record of Reynolds family history who provide the following:

- An ancestor chart showing all known Reynolds generations at the time of application;
- Family group sheets, completed insofar as possible at the time of application, for each Reynolds generation shown on the ancestor chart; and
- Payment of annual dues as and when specified by RFA.
