LOWER NORFOLK COUNTY VA

Deeds. Norfolk, VA, Liber IV, folio 207: "To all Xtrian people to whome these psents Shall Come Knew yee that I James Peeters of Little Creek in Linhaven parish of the County of Lower Norfolke together with the free and voluntary consent and good will of Elizabeth my wife have sould, aliened, ... unto the above mentioned Thomas ffenick Two hundred acres of land sittueate, lying and being in Linhaven parish aforesaid and upon the Western shore of Linhaven and now by lease in the tenuer and occupation of Jno. Ladd and was formerly granted to owne Wm. Smith and since found escheate and by patent granted to Robert Blake dated the 28th day of octob 1672 according to the ancient bounds thereof, and was for some yeares formerly in possession of Leuin Coll Lambert the said 200 acres of land being sold and exchanged by the said Robert Blake with and to THOMAS REYNOLDS who dyeing without issue living was afterwards sold unto mee the said James Peeters by JNO. REYNOLDS brother and heire to the said THOMAS REYNOLDS and to my heires and assignes as by his sale to me dated 16th Aprill 1679 under the hand and seals of the said JNO. REYNOLDS will apeare Recorded in Lower norfolk County 20th May 1672 ... In witness whereof I the said James Peeters together with my wife Elizabeth have hereunto sett our hands and seales this 16th day of sep. 1685 Anno Regis Jaichbj Second... Witnessed by Wm. Thompson, Gillbert Hamilton, Jacob Johnson; Acknowledge in Court 16th Sept. 1685. Test: Wm. Porten, C. Cur." [Sellers, Edwin Jaquett. Allied Families of Delaware: Stretcher, Fenwick, Davis, Draper, Kipshaven, Stidham.]

WHERE AND WHO ARE YOU PERRY RANSON REYNOLDS?

Wealth? Murder? Robbery? What else did Perry Ranson Reynolds have to hide?

His name was Perry Ranson Reynolds, born 1 Oct 1850 (1849) supposedly in New York. New York, where? He would never tell. He was raised by two wealthy maiden aunts (no names). He would not speak of his parents -- whether they died, or if he was abandoned or sent away. He ran away from home when he was 16 years old (around 1866).

He first went to Springfield IL, where he pulled ice while riding on a mule. Later, he traveled to Springfield MO.

He then settled in southeastern OK, having acquired an Indian wife. They had a little girl together. Perry was working for the government at the time, chasing renegade Indians who would cross over into TX and steal horses. If he found them on the OK side, he took them to Fort Towson. If he found them on the TX side, he took them to Sugarland TX.

His wife died and he was left with the little girl. We are unsure if the aunts came and took care of her or if he left her with neighbors while he traveled. During one of his trips, his dead wife's two Indian brothers came and stole the little girl. When Perry came home and found out, he went after them and killed the two brothers and got his little girl back. The little girl later died.

It was a common belief in the Reynolds family that Perry had ridden with the James brothers prior to his marriage to Nannie Jane Hise in 1883. A man by the name of Doc Butterworth had come to the house one day to see Perry. They would not talk in front of the children so they went outside. As boys will do, they hid in the bushes and listened as Perry and Doc discussed the James brothers. They were arguing about the horse that Frank James rode in a particular robbery -- the name of the horse and the color.

The boys were led to believe through this conversation that the two men had been with the James brothers. In fact, whenever Perry would work in the fields, he always carried his rifle close beside him -- always looking over his shoulder. The boys, however, never came right out and asked him, it was just accepted -- you didn't question Perry Ranson Reynolds.

In 1833, he married my great-grandmother, Nannie Jane Hise, from Honey Grove TX. She was almost 14 years old. Perry was about 33 years old. They had 12 children and lived in OK and TX until his death in 1927. Nannie died in 1928.

Children were: Stillborn; Bessie Louella b 10-19-1884; Milo Allen b 10-20-1886; Charles Huntley b 2-14-1889; Frank Leotney b 7-31-1892; Jess Ranson b 2-24-1894; Ida Canora b 3-16-1896; Perry Archibald b 3-25-1898; Reuben Lee b 4-06-1900; William Velmer b 8-31-1902; Katie Gertrude b 10-08-1904; and Floyd Elige b 7-07-1907.

TANGLED BRANCHES

WAS SUSANNAH BABCOCK THE WIFE OF JOSEPH REYNOLDS?

This concerns Joseph of Joseph of James Reynolds - James being the American progenitor of this line who settled at North Kingstown, Rhode Island. Joseph married in about 1696 at Westerly, Rhode Island to Susannah Babcock, daughter of John and Mary (Lawton) Babcock, according to both the 1922 RFA Annual article by Henry Reynolds, and the 1930/31 RFA Annual article by Dr. Sheridan Gardiner.

The immense Babcock family history, Babcock Family, by Stephen Babcock, published in 1903, lists Ann Babcock as a daughter of John and Mary Babcock and gives her birth year as 1665 (?). Stephen Babcock notes that the birth year of 1665 is not exact. Henry Reynolds in the 1922 Annual states that Susannah Babcock is in fact the Ann Babcock listed in Babcock Family (with the presumption that Ann is a shortened form of Susannah).

Henry Reynolds suggests that she was actually born sometime after 1665, perhaps in the early 1670's. Unfortunately the Babcock genealogy does not carry the line of this Ann forward, so an independent check of the Babcock family tie to the Reynolds cannot be undertaken. Ann is listed as the second child of John and Mary Babcock in Babcock Family. John Babcock died intestate and this list of children is taken from a will drawn up by the Westerly Town Council to settle John's estate.

James Babcock is listed as the first child, and it is known that he was in fact the eldest child of John and Mary. A presumption must be made here that the list of children is in the order of their birth. If this presumption is followed, then the 1665 (?) birth year given would be accurate based on birth dates of the following children on the list.

Since Henry Reynolds was aware of the Babcock genealogy, it is puzzling as to why he didn't offer an explanation as to how he arrived at a birth year of the early 1670's as opposed to 1665 (?). It should also be noted that it would seem that an official document such as a will would list the formal names of John Babcock's children. The fact that Ann is listed instead of Susannah raises some doubts as to Henry Reynolds' and Dr. Gardiner's assertion that Joseph's wife Susannah was in fact a Babcock. It is unfortunate that Henry Reynolds and Dr. Gardiner do not address this matter more fully, and their original source records could shed some valuable light on this puzzle.

From Joseph's will, and other records, there is no doubt that his wife was named Susannah. Joseph names wife Susannah and "loving brother[-in-law] Job Babcock" as executors of his estate. There is no doubt that this Job Babcock was a son of John and Mary Babcock. On the surface it would appear that this statement would offer the proof that Susannah was also a daughter of John and Mary Babcock based on the "brother-in-law" reference. However, it has

to be remembered that Job Babcock married Joseph's sister, Deborah, so he was also Joseph's brother-in-law via that connection. Henry Reynolds and Dr. Gardiner were both careful researchers and they must have surely recognized this additional connection since they also cover Job Babcock and Deborah Reynolds in their works.

It is hoped that these two authors did not solely base their conclusions on the excerpt from Joseph's will. This compiler has never seen any other reference that Joseph's wife was indeed a Babcock, other than that presented in the aforementioned RFA Annuals. Other descendants of Joseph invariably list Susannah as a Babcock, and it must be presumed that the annuals are their source of information. Whether Susannah was a Babcock is of vital interest to those of us interested in tracing these lines because so much material has been published on the Babcock family, and on back to the Lawton and Hazard families via Mary (Lawton) Babcock. THE REYNOLDS ROUGH RIDERS ARE THESE MEN PART OF YOUR FAMILY?

Among the Rough Riders (First U.S. Volunteer Cavalry) at San Juan Hill were at least three members of the Reynolds family. Thanks to Karen Green of Alpine TX for this information. If you know of others, please let the editor know. RFA would like more biographical material on the three identified members. Can you help fill in the blanks on the following Rough Riders? Are there others?

BENJAMIN F. REYNOLDS, listed Ardmore, Indian Territory as his home in 1898, joined the Rough Riders 14 May 1898 in Muskogee.

EDWIN L. REYNOLDS, listed Santa Fe NM as his home in 1898, joined the Rough Riders at Santa Fe 6 May 1898. He was 24 years old and born in Cheyenne WY.

LEWIS REYNOLDS, listed Kingston AZ as his home in 1898, joined the Rough Riders 1 May 1898 at Whipple Barracks AZ. He was 33 years old and born in Bedford IL. He was mortally wounded in battle on 1 July 1898.

EARLY VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL HISTORY

Gathering a genealogy of the Reynolds of Virginia requires some knowledge of how the State of Virginia came to be. Moreover, a list of vital statistics does not make our family come alive. The "flesh" is added to the "bones" in many, many books; more than one has the time to read and still have time for family history research. There are two books that provide a basic course in "the founding of Virginia."

The best condensed background for Virginia I have found is the introduction to Cavaliers and Pioneers 1623-1800, Volume I, by Nell Marion Nugent. It is too long to repeat in an RFA document, too condensed to further condense.

The companion book to put Nugent in the context of the mother country and the Virginia Company, is The Complete Book of Immigrants, by Peter Wilson Coldham. It is a chronology of happenings between England, the Virginia Company, and the settlers.

Those of you who are interested may wish to obtain a copy of the first parts of these books. If not available in your local library, probably can be obtained through the inter-library loan system.

THE TILLMAN PROJECT IN SEARCH OF EVIDENCE FOR THE TILLMAN BOOKS

This is the second in a series of articles about RFA efforts to locate source materials for the information provided by Col. Stephen Tillman in his two books on the Reynolds Families. The information begun in this series will be included in, and expanded, in the Centennial Collection.

RICHARD REYNOLDS OF ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY, VIRGINIA

T1-434 **RICHARD REYNOLDS**, son of Christopher (433) and Elizabeth Reynolds, b 1641 (Isle of Wight) VA and d 7-27-1711 Newport Parish VA. Data from his will. He m ca 1669 Elizabeth Sharpe. Issue: Richard b 1669 [T1-435]; Christopher b ca 1670; Sharp who d 7-8-1754; Elizabeth who m -Lewis; and John b 10-5-1710.

T2-6293 **Richard Reynolds**, of (6292), b 1641 Isle of Wight Co. VA, and d 27 Jul 1711 Newport Parish VA. Data from his will. he m 1669 Elizabeth Sharpe. Issue: Richard b 1669 [T2-6294]; Christopher b 1670; Sharpe who d 8 Jul 1754; Elizabeth who m -Lewis; and John b 5 Oct 1710.

There appears to be a two-generation difference in Tillman's marriage for Richard Reynolds of Isle of Wight. Jester, in the 1956 edition of Adventurers of Purse and Person, Virginia 1607-1625, (1956) states, "Richard² Reynolds (Christopher¹)...married Joyce, daughter of Richard Staples." [Isle of Wight Deed Bk 8, p242].

Boddie, in Vol. II Historical Southern Families states: Christopher³ Reynolds (Richard², Christopher¹) of the Lower Parish sold Timothy Tynes of the same 100 acres "purchased of my father, Richard Reynolds and Richard Reynolds, Jr., 9 Jun 1698, and my father Reynolds lately dying, descended to me and dower of Joyce Reynolds, relict of my father Reynolds and Elizabeth Reynolds, my wife." Wits.: Arthur Smith, John Frizzell, Thomas Summerelle. (D.B. 1704-15) Arthur Smith, father of the Arthur Smith who witnessed the above deed, in his will dated 1 Oct 1645, gave his daughter Jane Smith land next "Christopher Reynolds", the grandfather of the above Christopher of 1698.

Richard Reynolds, with wife "Joyce", was probably the Richard Reynolds who married an unnamed daughter of

Richard Staples (D.B.1, p25; C.M. 38) It will be noted that Richard Reynolds with wife Joyce made a deed 9 Jun 1697, and Joyce was his widow when he died in 1707. [Boddie, Vol. II Historical Southern Families.]

There are several references to Richard Reynolds and Joyce in Isle of Wight records:

... Richard Reynolds, Sr. He and his wife Joyce witnessed a deed of John and Mary Luther (Lothar), 1 Oct 1693. [Boddie Vol. II]

Richard² Reynolds and Joyce, his wife, on 9 Sep 1706, "for love of Jane Casey, my daughter, and Richard Casey, her husband," sold a tract adjacent to Tristram Norsworthy "part of land I live on." Wits., Arthur Smith, Richard Reynolds, Jr., Thomas Joyce (D.B. 2-1704-15).

Richard Reynolds, Jr., witnessed a deed of Richard Reynolds and Joyce his wife to Richard Reynolds' daughter Jane Casey, 9 Sep 1706 (D.B. 2-1704-15).

On 9 Oct 1706, Richard Reynolds gave his daughter, Elizabeth Reynolds, land on Mill Creek between plantation where Widow Haris lives and where James Hamblin lives. Wife Joyce relinquished dower right. Wits., Arthur Smith, Richard Casey, Sarah Williams (Id. 1704-1715.)

Contrast the above reference to Richard with the following:

Richard⁴ Reynolds (Richard³, Christopher², Christopher¹) married Elizabeth, daughter of Richard Sharpe, as shown by the will of Richard Sharpe, Jr., dated 15 Jan 1699/1700, probated 9 Apr 1700, as follows: "... to my cozen (nephew) Richard⁵ Reynolds, silver tumblers, also all land during term of my lease from Col. Arthur Smith, decd., he to give same to his three sons Richard, Sharpe, and Christopher Reynolds; Rich. Reynolds, exr. 15, Jan 1699/1700, prob/ Apr/9, 1700; Henry Applewhite, John Flood, Jas. Mathews." [Boddie Vol II]

Richard⁴ Reynolds made his will 27 July 1711, probated 26 May 1712, as follows: "To wife, Eliz. where I now live for life, and adjacent lands there were formerly Richard Jordan's...to son Richard⁵ Reynolds a plantation...to son Sharpe Reynolds a plantation...to son Christopher 320 acres where Edward Griffith lived...to Richard Jackson land I have sold him and given bond...to son Richard...where George Strode lived...to son Sharpe where John Green lived... 27 July, 1711." Pro. 26 May 1712. A. Smith, Giles Driver, Jane Benn. (W.B.A.-536; C-2-74)

JOHN PARKER REYNOLDS OF NEW YORK AND OHIO

During a recent search at the Worcester County, MA Registry of Deeds, a document was found that adds a significant amount of information to the story of John Parker Reynolds. John Parker was the eldest son of Rev. Parker Reynolds of Dutchess Co., NY and his first wife Esther Daggett. John Parker is the seventh generation from John Reynolds of Watertown and Greenwich, and he is no. 735 on pg. 169 of the John and Sarah Reynolds of Watertown...book.

M.H. Reynolds, in his entry for John Parker Reynolds, states that he was born Nine Partners, Dutchess Co., NY 21 Sep 1782, died Hamilton OH 21 Mar 1858. It goes on to say "He m., 1, Rebecca Newell of Salem, Washington Co., NY, who died. Two children." His second wife was Laura

Patience Wilson of Hebron NY and his third was Eliza Newcomer. He lived in Salem NY and later in Cincinnati, Middletown and Lebanon OH. His five children are given with minimal information about each.

All of this sounds pretty straight-forward and is the standard fare of genealogies. However, what Reynolds fails to mention is that the first marriage of John Parker Reynolds and Rebecca Newell ended in 1816/1817 in a nasty separation/divorce. George Randall in his typescript "Reynolds, Rose and Wordell" found in the Genealogy Room of the New Bedford MA Public Library states, "John Parker [Reynolds] of Salem NY mar. Sturbridge [MA] 24 June 1808 Rebecca Newell." According to M.H. Reynolds, their children: Timothy Newell Reynolds b. 22 Jun 1809 or 22 Jan 1815, and Caroline E. Reynolds b. 10 Dec 1810. The indenture outlining the conditions of their separation was dated 19 Dec 1817 and references a separation date of Nov. 20, 1816 [Worc. Co. Reg. of Deeds 221:350-352]. Rebecca Newell Reynolds apparently did die soon after for on 21 Oct 1819 a guardianship petition was filed on behalf of "Caroline E. and Timothy Reynolds, grandchildren of the late General Timothy Newell of Sturbridge, to Alfred Ely of Monson, Hampden Co. MA. Both minors under 14. Father of children John R. [sic] Reynolds, of parts unknown. Mother recently died in Sturbridge." [Worc. Co. Reg. of Probate, Index #49411 and #49430]

It is unclear whether John Parker and Rebecca lived in NY or in Sturbridge MA during their marriage and where the children were born. What is evident, however, is that Rebecca and the children were back in Sturbridge under the protection of her father, Gen. Timothy Newell, before Dec. 1817, and he obviously had a hand in drafting the conditions of the separation. Timothy and Caroline Reynolds apparently did not live with their father after the separation and the deaths of their mother and grandfather, though a search of the records indicated have turned up no additional information on them.

Because the Indenture made between John Parker Reynolds, and Rebecca Newell Reynolds and Timothy Newell is an interesting example of legal separation and divorce at that time, it is here reproduced in its entirety.

"This Indenture of three parts made this nineteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Seventeen between John P. Reynolds of Salem in the County of Washington and State of New York of the first part Rebecca his wife of the Second part and Timothy Newell of Sturbridge in the County of Worcester and State of Massachusetts of the third part - Whereas some unhappy differences have arisen between the said John P. Reynolds and the said Rebecca his wife and they have separated and now live separate and apart from each other - Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said John P. Reynolds doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Timothy Newell his executors and administrators and doth also agree with the said Rebecca his wife in manner & form following to wit - that it shall and may be lawful for the said

Rebecca his wife, and that he shall and will permit and suffer her from time to time and at all times hereafter during her natural life to live separate and apart from him and to reside and be in such place and places and in such family and families and with such relations friends and other persons and to follow and to carry on such business as She the said Rebecca from time to time at her will and pleasure notwithstanding her present coverture and as if she were sole and unmarried shall think fit and that he will not prosecute her for living apart from him or compel her to cohabit with him or molest disturb, or trouble her, for such living separate and apart from him or any other person for receiving harbouring or entertaining her nor shall nor will, at any time claim or demand any of the monies clothes, goods or chattels whatsoever which the said Rebecca hath now in her custody nor any estate real or personal which she may at any time hereafter purchase or which shall be devised or given to her or she shall otherwise acquire and that she may absolutely enjoy and dispose of the same as if she were a same sole and unmarried without any molestation whatever of him her said husband and the said John P. Reynolds doth hereby release to the said Timothy Newell his heirs Executors and administrators all claim which he may at any time have to the estate of the said Timothy Newell by virtue of being husband of the said Rebecca and the said Timothy Newell for himself his heir executors & administrators and for the said Rebecca doth covenant and agree to and with the said John P. Reynolds his heirs executors and administrators in manner and form following to wit that the said Rebecca shall during her natural life live separate and apart from the said John P. Reynolds unless by the mutual consent of the said John and Rebecca and that she shall not at any time hereafter claim or demand from the said John P. Reynolds any part of his estate or any support therefrom either for herself or such Child or Children as she may have with her nor shall she contract any debt with the view of charging the said John P. Reynolds therewith nor shall she claim of demand as her dower from any other person to whom he may convey any real estate nor from his heirs or devisees or such real estate as he may die seized of any part of such estate after the death of her said husband if she shall survive him and the said Timothy Newell doth further covenant and agree that if at any time the said John P. Reynolds shall be obliged to pay and shall actually pay or be legally charged with any debt or debts which the said Rebecca hath contracted since the twentieth day of November eighteen hundred and sixteen or may hereafter contract that then the said Timothy his heirs executors and administrators shall indemnify and reimburse to the said John all such sum or sums of money and all such costs and charges as he may be put to, on account of any such debt - and further the said Timothy for himself his heirs executors & administrators doth covenant to and with the said John his heirs executors administrators and assigns

that if at any time after the death of the said John the said Rebecah shall claim demand and receive her dower in any real estate which the said John may convey or die seized of or her part of the personal estate of the said John if he shall died intestate then and in that case the said Timothy his heirs executors and administrators shall indemnify and pay to such heirs devisees executors administrators and assigns the value of such dower and all such charges and costs as they or any of them shall be compelled to pay by reason of any such claims of dower as aforesaid also the value of such part of the personal property as she shall claim & receive as aforesaid given under our hands & Seals the day & year as before written at Sturbridge County of Worcester & Commonwealth of Massachusetts
