REX S. REYNOLDS (1893-1951), son of SHERMAN and CYNTHIA (KING) REYNOLDS, born in Missouri, died Sep 1951 in Greenfield Mass. At the time of his death he was manager of the Weldon Hotel in Greenfield. He had a long career as a theater man, restaurant manager and hotel operation. He came to Greenfield in April 1945 to manage the local hotel. He had charge of restaurants at the Washington [DC] National Airport prior to WWII, and during the war was at Maryland University, in charge of feeding Jesuit priests there. He spent several years in the entertainment field before coming to Greenfield he was general manager of the Colonial Hotel in Gardner. His wife was Suzanne K. [____] Reynolds. RFA MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

JAMES A. REYNOLDS OF HANFORD CALIFORNIA

I am a descendant of Christopher Reynolds, who landed at Isle of Wight VA in 1622. His descendants were involved in tobacco farming in VA, NC and SC, and moved into the KY area in the later years of Daniel Boone. One of the stories that I have says that one of my "greats" went on a turkey shoot with Dan'l shortly before he died. My great grandfather, JOHN B. REYNOLDS, was born in Nicholas Co. KY. He moved with members of his family into IN, then to IL where he died in Schuyler Co. or his wife moved to Schuyler Co. after his death. Some of his family moved on the Grant Co. WI. In 1853, a wagon train left Grant Co. headed for the West under the leadership of CUTLER SALMON,

whose wife, JANE (or Janet), nee REYNOLDS was John B.'s sister. John B. was not with them when they started, but two of his brothers, JAMES A. (and his family) and ELDRIDGE, were with them. John B. caught up with the wagon train at Council Bluffs IA. They arrived in Hangtown CA, on 10 Sep 1853 and most of the people from the train then settled on the Sand Plains in San Joaquin Co. In 1861, John B. returned to KY, IN, and WI, and in the process picked up a wife, MARGARET ROSANNA RAMSEY, and brought her back to CA. Both are buried in Union Cemetery near Stockton. (I suspect that his trip east had something to do with the Civil War, possibly with meat for soldiers.) They had four children: JOHNNY, who died young and is also buried in Union Cemetery; EDWARD EVERETT REYNOLDS; EMMA REYNOLDS wife of GEORGE SMALL, of Lathrop; and GEORGE REYNOLDS, who married (MARY?) WELTHY ELLIOTT, parents of GEORGE REYNOLDS JR of Modesto.

My grandfather, EDWARD EVERETT REYNOLDS, married his brother-in-law's sister, FLORA BELLE (SMALL) JACQUEMAN. Her father (and George Small's) was CHARLES M. SMALL, a ship's carpenter, from Bowdoin ME, who built steamboats in his yard on Mormon slough in Stockton. Her first husband, JOSEPH J. JACQUEMAN was a steam engineer on board a steamboat and died of apoplexy at age 41 on the boat. She and my grandfather had three children: JOHN G. REYNOLDS (my father); CHARLENE REYNOLDS, who married HOWARD B. LEE of Seattle; and EVERETT CHARLES REYNOLDS.

EMMA (REYNOLDS) SMALL had two daughters: EDNA SMALL who married ANSEL WILLIAMS, Superintendent of Schools in Stockton for many years; and HAZEL (I believe) who married Dr. DARDIS, a veterinarian in Stockton. Emma lived into her 90's in Stockton, raising two grandchildren, MARGARET DARDIS, a government nurse, and TOMMY DARDIS, who was killed while taking photos of the Santa Fe "Golden Gate" streamliner in the early 30's. Another of her grandsons, ANSEL WILLIAMS JR was killed in a military training flight crash, also in the 30's. His sister, nee Williams, married a Wheeler, I believe, who was a mayor of Stockton, or the so of a Stockton mayor.

GEORGE and WELTHY (MARY?) REYNOLDS had four children: NADINE LOGAN; HAZEL CRUMP, ESTELLE BALATTI and GEORGE REYNOLDS JR. All, except Estelle, live in the Modesto-Escalon area. Estelle lives in San Luis Obispo.

JOHN G. REYNOLDS married CHARLOTTE PITKIN WILLIAMS, whose father was a Lay Supply Preacher for the Methodist Church who came from Redruth, Cornwall, England, to CA before 1880. They had two children: JACK EDWARD REYNOLDS and JAMES A. REYNOLDS. CHARLENE (REYNOLDS) LEE had three children: ROBERT C. LEE who died young; PATSY (LEE) SHINSTRUM from Kirkland WA; and DONALD LEE, also in the Seattle area. EVERETT CHARLES married SOPHIE _____. They had no children. He was an engineer for the Caterpillar Tractor Company in Stockton according to the 1920 census. He later was a Postal Service employee for many years in Stockton.

JACK EDWARD REYNOLDS, retired in Sacramento after 45 years in Education and passed away a year later leaving his wife, VIVIAN ____, and two sons: RICHARD REYNOLDS, of Buffalo NY;

and ROBERT REYNOLDS of Orinda CA.

I, JAMES ALLEN REYNOLDS, retired after 30 years in Education. With my wife, Virginia (deceased 15 Mar 92) are the parents of five children: PATSY JO (REYNOLDS) DUNCAN of Duncan OK; JAMES RONALD REYNOLDS of San Luis Obispo; twins ROGER STEVEN REYNOLDS of San Jose and RODNEY ALLEN REYNOLDS Phd, of Honolulu HI; and JANE ALICE (REYNOLDS) HEATH, of Seattle WA. Patsy has two sons, Ronnie has two sons, Roger has one son, Rodney has one daughter and two stepsons and Jane Alice has one daughter.

THOMAS REYNOLDS b Cornwall ENG 1813, came to America 1842; migrated to Daviess Co. IL before 1850. In 1850 went to gold fields of CA, returned to his home on Rush Creek and died 1875, leaving his wife and 7 children. Wife was Sarah S Cliff, b Cornwall ENG 27 May 1831; came direct to Jo Daviess Co. IL with her parents in 1844; resided at Elizabeth and Weston (Jo Daviess Co.); m Thomas Reynolds 24 Nov 1853. In 1878, was living at Woodbine (Jo Daviess) IL, as widow, farmer, Sec 28, PO Elizabeth (Jo Daviess) IL, owned 215 acres of land. Ch: John T, Sarah A, George W, William W, Samuel B, James W, Lemuel H, lost two ch.

WILLIAM LAW REYNOLDS b 1829 Hertfordshire ENG, came to America 1851, remained 1 yr in VT, 2 yrs Rochester NY, came to Jo Daviess Co. IL 1856. Farmer, Sec 14, PO Woodbine. Living in 1878. Served in Army in Civil War; mustered into 124th Regt IWI at Dixon; was at Camp Butler, Vicksburg; at siege of Spanish Fort, a severe engagement, lasting 13 days & nights; went to Montgomery and returned to Vicksburg where he was honorably discharged at close of war. Owned 110 acres of land. He m Miss Mary Green 7 Jun 1857. She was b Yorkshire ENG 15 Oct 1836, came to WI with her parents in 1842. Ch: Martha Anne, George W., and Jesse Green. MAJOR GENERAL JOHN FULTON REYNOLDS

Major General (M.G. - 2 stars) John F. Reynolds entered the U.S. Military Academy at West Point NY from Lancaster PA in 1836 and graduated with the class of 1841. His classmates and friends during the four years at West Point included Generals Grant, Doubleday, Buckner, Buell, Bragg, Longstreet, Rosecrans, Pope, Thomas, Hooker, D.H. Hill, Jubal Early, Hancock, Thomas, P.G.T. Beauregard and W.T. Sherman. His graduation number was 1084, which means he was the 1,084th cadet to graduate from the academy.

There is a hero's place at West Point overlooking the Hudson River known as Battle Monument which was dedicated on 31 May 1897. General Reynolds' name is inscribed on this monument erected to the men and officers killed in

the Civil War. The stone shaft atop the monument is the largest piece of turned granite in the world. It also contains the names of 2,230 brave fallen soldiers.

M.G. Reynolds served as an artillery officer in the Mexican War and was the Commandant of Cadets at West Point when the Civil War broke out in 1861. This was, and is a very prestigious position in the Army. He was appointed brigadier general of U.S. volunteers in 1861. He served with distinction in the Peninsular Campaign.

In his first principal engagement in the Civil War, he defeated Robert E. Lee at Cheat Mountain in western Virginia near Elkwater. Reynolds' losses were 21 while Lee lost almost 100. This action secured that portion of Virginia for the North in the early part of the war.

General Reynolds was shot dead by a Confederate rifleman as he rode forward disposing his troops on the first day of the battle at Gettysburg. His death occurred at 10:15 a.m., 1 July 1863, along a woodline adjacent to McPherson's Ridge a few miles south of the town. There is a large equestrian statue of him where he fell.

General Reynolds was at the time of his death the Commanding General of the Union's I Corps or 1st Corps, and was ironically replaced by a classmate, M.G. Abner Doubleday, later to become famous as the founder of baseball.

His body was brought back to be buried with his kindred in Lancaster PA by two of his aides, Capt. Ridle and Major Rosegarten. At his burial, Napier's eulogy was quoted, "no man died on that field with more glory than he, yet many died, and there was much glory."

General Reynolds was born in Lancaster 20 Sep 1820. He had a brother named James L. Reynolds, a prominent democrat who served on Governor Curtin's draft commission during the Civil War.

From many memoirs of that era it is clear that General Reynolds was highly respected. Perhaps representing the best of that said of him is the statement by General Robert E. Lee in his memoirs: "Among the officers killed at Gettysburg was Major General John F. Reynolds, whose gentlemanly bearing and soldierly qualities were unsurpassed in any other officer of either army."

REYNOLDS, RUNNELS, ET AL, IN HISTORY by Sybil R. Taylor

If we are to trace our family prior to the 17th century, it will be helpful to have an overview of our name, where it came from and how it was translated from language to language over the centuries. To really understand this would require PhD's in Latin, Greek, Hebrew, and the shift in pronunciation and spelling of Old English (Anglo-Saxon), Old French and Middle English, which is not our purpose in this column! By over-simplifying and condensing

all the events of the world's history into a tiny capsule perhaps we can see the history of names as they developed, possibly even catch a fleeting glimpse of our family's very deep roots in the history of mankind, and finally we will find our very own ancestors intertwined in history as it unfolds.

To put this capsule of time into perspective, let Alvin Toffler speak from Future Shock (N.Y.: Random House, 1970, p3): "If the last 50,000 years of man's existence were divided into lifetimes of approximately 62 years each, then there have been about 800 such lifetimes. Of these 800, fully 650 were spent in caves. Only in the last 70 has it been possible to communicate from one lifetime to another, as writing made it possible to do. Only in the last six lifetimes did masses of men ever see a printed work. Only during the last four has it been possible to precisely measure time. The overwhelming majority of everything we use in daily life was developed in the present -- the 800th lifetime."

It must be stated here and now as an absolute: Because of the evolutionary nature of name development, it is virtually impossible to pinpoint the exact date of the formation of any new name. Most often we do not have all the documents that prove our ancestry. It is the preponderance of evidence upon which we base our assumptions about our family history, and so it will be with our name and those early ancestors who bore it. A major reason for RFA's existence is to amass that preponderance of evidence.

Names of contributors, certain sources and editorial notes will be enclosed in brackets. The historical events not specifically related to our family were subjectively selected by the editor as being significant in its impact on the development of our family.

THE BEGINNING

In biblical times, names were Adam, Noah -- there was no mention of any family name. The most we were given in the way of identification was that someone was the son (daughter, wife, husband) of someone else.

2082 B.C. Abraham established himself in Canaan.

1700 B.C. Ir, son of Milesius of Spain, killed in shipwreck off the Kerry coast of Ireland.

1612 B.C. Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt.

Today in the Hebrew language the name David Ben Gurion still tells us that David was the son of Gurion. As populations grew and travel increased, the name often obtained a suffix, the area or town from which the person came.

500 B.C. Himlico of Carthage explored the Atlantic coast line of Europe.

330 B.C. Pytheas of Massilia explored the coast of Spain

and Gaul (today the area of France and the Low Countries).

- 279 B.C. The Gauls invaded Greece.
- 237 B.C. Spain conquered by the Carthaginians.
- 102 B.C. Julius Caesar born.
- 55 B.C. Julius Caesar invaded Britain.
- 54 B.C. Julius Caesar invaded Britain a second time.
- 51 B.C. Julius Caesar completely subjugated Gaul.
- 40 B.C. Herod became king of the Jews.

By the birth of Christ it was still "Joseph, the son of David" or "Joseph of Arimathea" and "Saul (later Paul) of Tarsus.

- 61 A.D. Boadicea [a woman] lead Britons against Romans.

During the Dark Ages (following the fall of Rome) most Europeans were known first only by their given names, and later occasionally by their given name prefixed to their place of birth.

- 565 A.D. Ethelbert was king of Kent.
- 593 A.D. Ethelfrith founded kingdom of Northumbria.
- 714 A.D. Charles Martel was ruler of France.
- 720 A.D. Saracens invaded France.
- 772 A.D. Charlemagne reigned over France.
- 797 A.D. Danes invaded Britain.
- 827 A.D. Egbert was overlord of Britain's kingdoms.

Previous to the 11th century, Britain was dominated by a mixture of Germanic stock - the Anglo-Saxons from the Continent of Europe and the Danes or Norsemen from Scandinavia. When a child was named in an Anglo-Saxon family, the name had to be absolutely original, completely different from any other in the village, and a name that no ancestor had ever used. The name selected was one meant to inspire the child as he grew; e.g., nobility of character, Aethelsunu (Aethel, meaning noble, and sunu, meaning son, i.e., "Nobleson").
