SOMETHING NEW ON YOUR MAILING LABEL

Before the centennial birthday reunion, Susan Clement started with Mrs. Mary Reynolds Fosdick, the founder of RFA, as Number One, then numbered each new member in sequential order. Each of you now have a very special RFA membership number: The four-digit number on the first line of your mailing label, pd93 XXXX 17.

RFA NEEDS YOUR HELP

We now have 445 members and there is more work in administering RFA than two or three members can really be expected to handle. RFA expenses continue to climb, and yet, we are still holding dues to \$10 per year. There are a number of ways each member can do a very little and at the same time take over a lot of the workload and cost.

PUBLICITY FOR REUNION: RFA mails letters to one or more newspapers in each of the 50 states, requesting them to print a notice of the annual reunion. Actually, we beg, as we cannot pay for ads. Most newspapers are very helpful; the major ones are not as helpful. We rarely ever know if those we write actually publish the notice.

Getting names and addresses of newspapers is a time-consuming effort, and then we cannot always get names of smaller/weekly newspapers that have genealogy columns. Today, I have typed mailing labels for 220 newspapers, will later make 220 copies of the notice, fold and insert into envelopes, apply label and stamp to 220 envelopes, and take them to the post office, and still won't know if the recipients will publish the notice!

At the cost of a 29-cent stamp, (not including printer ink, paper, envelope) it is still costly to an organization with the income of RFA.

Having said all that, I wish to go on record as believing these notices are crucial. We obtain several new members each year as a result of newspaper notices. It should be noted that we are talking about newspapers only. Notices to genealogical literature is another issue -- for another day.

If each member will:

1- be responsible for notifying their local newspapers, by phone or by letter, we can get the reunion notice across the U.S. with a small amount of effort on the part of each member; or

2- send copy of newspaper notices about RFA, including newspaper name and date, so we will have a better idea of which newspapers to contact in the future; or

3- provide the editor with names of smaller/weekly newspapers that do have genealogy columns, we can more precisely target the audience we are seeking.

EMILY REYNOLDS LINCOLN,
A PIONEER IN EDUCATION
Bula Lincoln Palcic, Gowanda NY

Emily Reynolds Lincoln was a pioneer in the field of education. In 1895 her husband, George I. Lincoln, was appointed Superintendent of the Thomas Indian School on the Cattaraugus Indian Reservation in the State of New York. Emily was appointed Matron. In 1895 the institution consisted of wooden buildings in very poor condition. Under the Lincoln's untiring effort a group of brick buildings were erected. There was a two-story school, 4 dormitories, dining hall and the administration building. The buildings were in a semi-circle with the administration in front, all were connected with a tunnel. This was in 1900. This institution stood as a monument and credit to the Empire State.

In May of 1907 Emily's husband passed away suddenly. The State of New York appointed her Superintendent to succeed her husband. She held this position for 12 years, retiring in 1922, after a total of 27 years of service to the Indian people and the State of New York. She passed away in August of 1923 at the age of 63. Many of the Indian people walked as many as 12 miles to the services in Gowanda NY, bringing flowers. Quite a tribute.

Emily was the daughter of Norman Reynolds and Samantha Page. She was the youngest of 10 children. Emily was born 20 Sep 1860 in Collins Center NY. She married George Ivory Lincoln 22 Feb 1880 in Collins Center. There were three children from this marriage. Bula born 28 Jan 1881 who married George Gratten. Bula passed away in Feb 1908 in Redlands CA. Floyd was born May of 1883 and died Jan of

1886. Ivory Marshal was born 19 Jun 1884. He married Elizabeth Smallwood of Gowanda NY, who died in 1975. They had two children, Bula and Ruth. Ivory passed away 2 Jul 1950.

In 1935 an article appeared in a Gowanda newspaper entitled "Another Lincoln at Iroquois" (the post office of the Thomas Indian School). The second Bula received the position as second grade teacher at the institution. She married Louis M. Palcic of Gowanda 30 June 1938. They had four children: Nancy married James Schaeffer and they have four children. James married Cynthia Davis. There was one child. James passed away Aug 1980. Robert married Katherine Hall. They have an adopted child. L. Martin married Susan Petersen and they have 3 children.

Ruth, the second child of Ivory and Elizabeth married Burt Bury. They had three children: Susan married Edward Christopher (4 children). Thomas married Rene Primazon (2 children). John married Barbara Raab (1 child).

WHO WAS THE WIFE OF JUSTUS REYNOLDS OF NC AND AL?

MARY BYRD OR MARY WRIGHT?

[Shirley descends from Justice/Justus Reynolds through his dau Mary Reynolds who m John Henry Sr, and their son Byrd Reynolds Henry.]

Justice Reynolds b c. 1750, d 1821 Bibb Co. AL where his will is on file. Justice Reynolds has been found in Stokes and Surry Cos. NC in court records in the 1780's then on into Spartanburg Co. SC along the Parceolot R. in 1800.

Some have the Mary Wright theory. I believe Justus Reynolds could have been married twice, first to Mary Byrd, and had Mary Reynolds and perhaps another child or two and she died, then Mary Wright was his second wife. The name Byrd filters down in the family names. I had an uncle named Birty Byrd Butler, I wondered for years why anyone would name a child that until I began my roots search. We called him Uncle Pet.

I wish I knew the reason that Justus left Byrd Reynolds Henry out of his will, would have solved a lot of problems. Perhaps he had already given him his share as the oldest of John Henry's children.

JUSTICE REYNOLDS & THE LOYAL COMPANY

from Family Puzzlers 1259, 5 Dec 1992

Mrs. Morris S. Efurd, 620 W Cass, Gilmer TX 75644 has found mention of the LOYAL COMPANY GRANT in (Montgomery) VA, county surveyor plats. The surveys are for land in (Fincastle) VA on the waters of the middle fork of "Holston's River" and are part of this grant. Her ancestor, JUSTICE REYNOLDS, had 123 acres of land on a south branch of the middle fork "by virtue of an order of the Council Decr. 16th 1773 & part of the Loyal Company Grant ... opposite to William Campbell's land." The plat was recorded 6-5-1774. What was the Loyal Company? By whom was the Company formed and what service had these individuals who received the grants performed? "Where would I find record of what happened to this land and to whom Justice sold it? The VA State Archives says they do not have the grants. Nor does the Montgomery Co. Circuit

Court. These records were filmed by the LDS. Where did they find them? The deeds of Pincastle and Montgomery Cos. 1773-89 do not contain a record for this plat. Where should I search next?" Editor's [Mary Bondurant Warren] note: According to A Hornbook of Virginia History, 1965 edition, the settlement of the Virginia valley prior to the French and Indian War was beginning between the Blue Ridge mountains and Alleghenies, many persons coming down the valley from western PA. "During this same period some Virginians were looking beyond the valley to the unexplored lands west of the Alleghenies. Syndicates like the OH Company and the Loyal Company were formed to exploit this western area. They acquired grants of extensive tracts beyond the mountains, planning to hold them until the region was opened to settlement and then sell the lands in small parcels to actual pioneers. This westward movement was motivated by military strategy as well as the desire for new land and speculative profit." From this it would seem that the stockholders in the Loyal Company were Virginia land speculators. Their land had been obtained by "Treasury right" as purchase was then called. Mr. REYNOLDS had purchased some of the Loyal Company's land, and this had not been a grant of land from the king. Transfer of the land from the Loyal Company to REYNOLDS should have been recorded in the county in which the land lay, where REYNOLDS lived, and where the Company had its headquarters - possibly three different places. The tract became the property of your ancestor. The ancestor might have sold the land, devised the land to kin or friend, lost it for failure to pay taxes, or saw it sold by the Sheriff to satisfy a court judgment. You track post-grant property records in County records. Be aware that the property might have been cut off into a new county, so his/her land records would appear in successive counties. The "target sheet" which precedes and concludes each segment (book) on LDS microfilm shows where the original document being filmed was located. It shows also the date of filming, reduction or enlargement, name of the operator, etc. So read the target sheet, which is photographed immediately ahead of the cover of the book. If the film is not presently available, write the LDS Family History Center, Salt Lake City UT, giving the roll number, and ask them for the location of the book microfilmed. [RFA Editor's note: Mary Bondurant Warren is the publisher of Heritage Papers (170 Windsor Ct, Athens GA 30606), which also publishes Family Puzzlers weekly; subscription is \$31.50 for GA residents, \$30 for all others. This subscription is one that is truly worth the price. I have been a subscriber for several years and inherited the subscription of a friend covering many years before mine began. I have continued the subscription as a resource for RFA.]

REYNOLDS GENERALS IN CIVIL WAR

There were four REYNOLDS generals in the Civil War: two with the Union and two with the Confederacy.

UNION

JOHN FULTON REYNOLDS: b 20 Sep 1820 Lancaster (Lancaster) PA, d 1 Jul 1863 Battle of Gettysburg, bur Lancaster PA. Graduated West Point 1841. A good biography is given in Reynolds Recollections Sep-Oct 1992, by Justus "Jud" Reynolds.

JOSEPH JONES REYNOLDS: b 4 Jan 1822 Flemingsburg (Fleming) KY, d 25 Feb 1899 Washington DC, bur Arlington National Cemetery. At age 15, moved to Lafayette IN, age 16 entered Wabash College at Crawfordsville, age 17 appointed to West Point, graduated class of 1843, with U S Grant.

CONFEDERACY

ALEXANDER WELCH REYNOLDS: b Apr 1816 in (present) Clarke Co. VA (then Frederick), d Alexandria EGYPT 26 May 1876, bur Alexandria, memorial stone in St. James the Less cem, Philadelphia, his wife's home. Graduated West Point 1838. In 1869 entered, as colonel, the service of the Khedive of Egypt in company with a group of former Union and Confederate officers, including his son Frank (or Francis) REYNOLDS and Gen Harry Hopkins SIBLEY of the Confederacy.

His son Frank (or Francis) REYNOLDS graduated West Point 24 Jun 1861, was lt. colonel of 39th NC Infantry, CSA. After the war, he also entered, as colonel, the service of the Khedive of Egypt. He d 19 Jul 1875, age 34 in Ilion NY.

DANIEL HARRIS REYNOLDS: b 14 Dec 1832 Centerburg (Knox) OH, d 14 Mar 1902 Lake Village (Chicot) AR, bur Lake Village cem. Attended Ohio Wesleyan University and law school at Somerville TN. After war, a returned to AR, resumed law practice, served one term in AR state senate (1866-67). Son, Robert W. REYNOLDS, resided Lake Village AR.

Montgomery, Pay Master to the Georgia Militia "being in full of our pay and travelling expenses" to "Waynsboro (the place of rendezvous)." [May be Waynesboro (Burke) GA.] The men gathered in fall 1814 or Jan 1815, residence "45 miles from place of rendezvous", and 150 miles from place discharged. Witnessing payment Capt. Thomas B. Carr's Company was Cornelius Collins. Among others: Anderson REYNOLDS; and William REYNOLDS.

While researching, remember -- if you can possibly pronounce the spelling with the most slurred of enunciation it probably is a member of our clan.

REYNOLDS-SOULES -- LeRoy H. Curtis, 2117 Fisher Dr, Wooster OH 44691-2123: Need ancestors/descendants of James Reynolds of PA (?). Ch: Nelson Reynolds, Civil War soldier; Ransom Reynolds (19 Dec 1838 - 20 Jul 1924) of Canal Fulton OH; Davis Reynolds of Oberlin OH; Vincent; and Daniel Franklin Reynolds (15 Nov 1824 - 17 Sep 1909) m. Polly Soules.

REYNOLDS-TAYLOR-HENEGAR-MALONE -- Lawrence L. Carr, 5527 Chester Lane, Rocklin CA 95677: My mother was Mary Lou Reynolds, d/o John Reynolds and Anna Lucretia Taylor. I have traced the Taylor line back to ca 1600, but not so lucky with Reynolds. My grandpa John Reynolds' parents were Jacob and Malinda Henegar Reynolds who were m (Green) TN Oct 1842. Stephen Tillman's book indicates that my Jacob Reynolds was s/o Joseph Reynolds. I have been to the (Greene) TN courthouse two times and made very thorough search of all available records and could find no connection between Joseph and Jacob. At this point in time, I have no positive proof as to who were Jacob's parents. I do have a clue that his mother may have been a Malone.

REYNOLDS-WILBER -- Marilyn K. Bobseine, 82 N 3d St, Allegany NY 14706: Parents/ancestry of Abram (Abraham) Reynolds b 12 Dec 1776 prob (Dutchess) NY, m c1800 Hannah Wilber d/o Enoch and Phebe (Church) Wilber. Abram d 30 Sep 1849, Hannah d 18 Jul 1833 both in Collins Twp (Erie) NY. Had sons Nehemiah (1810-?) and Norman (1812-1873) and prob dau Phebe (1804-1884), poss other children. Norman m Samantha Page (1816-1886) d/o Ely Sr and Ophelia (Bingham) Page. They were my gr-grandparents.

THE FIRST AMERICAN BIBLE

In 1790, Robert Hodge and Samuel Campbell decided that a Bible should be published in this new nation and sought financial support for the venture. When the project became a reality two years later, their list of subscribers was included therein, headed by no less a personage than "George Washington, Esq., President of the United States." Among the 1,279 Americans who financed this undertaking was ... **JAMES REYNOLDS**, house carpenter, New York City... (National Genealogical Quarterly Vol 80, #2, Jun 1992, Notes and Documents: "The Bicentennial of a Bible: Subscribers of 1792," contributed by Erma Miller Angevine.)

THE REYNOLDS FAMILY ASSOCIATION CENTENNIAL COLLECTION

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One of the dreams of the founders of RFA was to gather Reynolds' family history and genealogy into one complete volume. From 1899, an "Annual Report" was published for each year until 1937. The Annuals evolved into a vehicle for sharing the results of RFA's active research and publishing the Reynolds archival material. These Annuals have become an invaluable aid for those pursuing their Reynolds ancestors. Sadly, they have long been out of print. A few libraries have a complete collection, but most often Reynolds researchers have little or no access to them.

Although the publication of the Annuals ceased, the search for and collection of Reynolds' historical material did not. The RFA Archives contain correspondence, abstracted source records, family group sheets, ancestor charts, books, unpublished manuscripts donated to RFA by its members, and various other family history materials. The availability of this material has been limited.

The Centennial Collection is a volume of history and genealogy of the Reynolds Family reprinted from the Annuals with the addition of new, updated, and corrected material from the RFA Archives. Included are:
