FAMILY NOTES

YESTERDAY

ELIZABETH (McLAUGHLIN) REYNOLDS. Another sister, Elizabeth (McLaughlin) came in the winter of 1837, with the family of Samuel Ayers, to their new homes in the wilderness. They were originally from Perry Co. PA. They settled each as follows: John McLaughlin... Samuel Ayers... Joseph McLaughlin. John McLaughlin's sister, Elizabeth, married Adna Reynolds. On that eventful day she did a washing in the morning for the family, shelled, that morning also, one-half bushel of corn, and that afternoon carried it on her shoulder, through the woods to Bird's mill, located on

Mill Creek, north, got it ground, again reshouldered and carried it home, baked the wedding cake, and was married the same evening. The distance to Bird's mill was at least two and one-half miles, making five miles to an from, for the lady to travel. This was in the fall of 1838... There was also a Rachel McLaughlin and a David, so the "family washing" for several people, mostly adults, must have been a rugged job in those days. Anyway, Reynoldses certainly had some good stock in their family lines! FREDERICK REYNOLDS (1 Nov 1764-16 Apr 1841, playwright, was born in London, son of an attorney. His grandfathers were both very wealthy, and he had no need to earn his living. He was educated at Westminster, and in 1782 entered the Middle temple, but soon discovered that the law was not his forte and that his interest was entirely in the stage. From 1814 to 1822 he was permanently attached to Covent Garden Theater, and from 1823 was on the staff of Drury Lane, officially labeled as "thinker." In 1799 he married a Miss Mansel, an actress, and they had one son. He composed in all nearly a hundred tragedies and comedies, the best known of which were "The Exile" and "The Renegade," and some of his earlier plays were published, but whatever his capacities as a "thinker," as a dramatist they were very slight, and his plays are now quite forgotten. Principal works: Werter, 1785; Eloise 1786; The Dramatist, 1789; Life and Times of Frederick Reynolds: Written by Himself, 1826; A Playwright's Adventures (novel) 1831. About: Reynolds, F. Life and Times of Frederick Reynolds, Athenaeum, 24 Apr 1841. (British Authors of the Nineteenth Century. Ed., Stanley J. Kunitz, New York, H.W. Wilson Co., 1936.)

GEORGE WILLIAM MCARTHUR REYNOLDS (23 Jul 1814-17 Jun 1879), novelist, was born in Sandwich, the son of a naval captain. He was educated privately and by travel on the Continent. In 1846 he became editor of the London "Journal," and from the end of the same year until 1870, of "Reynolds's Miscellany; to the latter he contributed many of his stories. From 1840 he had charge of the foreign intelligence department of the London "Despatch." His sympathies were frankly revolutionary, and because of this he was obliged to resign in the troubled year of 1848. He became the leader of the Chartists, the working-class radicals of the time, and even in this group was an extremist. In 1849 and 1850 he edited "Reynolds's Political Instructor," from 1850 to his death, "Reynolds's Weekly Newspaper." His novels were extremely sensational, and most of them were mere pot-boilers, not intended to be literature. Principal works: The Youthful Impostor, 1835; Modern Literature of France, 1839; The Drunkard's Progress, 1841; Mysteries of London, 1846-55; Mary Price,

1850 (as play, as novel 1852); *The Soldier's Wife*, 1853; *The Loves of the Harem*, 1855. About: *London Times* 18 Jun 1879. (British Authors of the Nineteenth Century. Ed., Stanley J. Kunitz, New York, H.W. Wilson Co., 1936.)

HERBERT A. REYNOLDS b Collins Center NY on 21 Dec 1852, s/o Norman and Samantha Page Reynolds. His family originally came from Cooperstown NY. One of 10 children, Mr. Reynolds received his early education in Collins Center. He then attended Springville, Forestville, and Bath Academies, later studying law. In 1878 Herbert Reynolds m Grace Hudson, the d/o Stephen and Charlotte Blair Hudson. To them were born three daughters: Lottie, Elizabeth, and Dorothy. Admitted to the bar in 1883, he was the only lawyer in the Collins Center area for many years. Always working for the best interests of the community, Mr. Reynolds held many town offices. He served as Town Clerk, Justice of the Peace for 12 years, Postmaster for 5 years (appointed in 1889 during the Harrison Administration), and school trustee for the new school which opened in Sep 1884 in Collins Center. Herbert's dau, the late Lottie L. Mosher, entered as a pupil in the first grade that year. Mr. Reynolds later became Clerk of the school board and served for many years. In January of 1895 he was appointed Clerk in the office of the Erie County Clerk of the Supreme Court. In addition to these public services, Herbert A. Reynolds operated a grocery store and rented land outside the village on which he raised crops. The Reynolds family attended the Methodist Church in Collins Center. During the first World War, Mr. Reynolds assisted farmers with their exemption papers and later compiled a War Record of the Town of Collins. A member of the I.O.O.F., he went through the chairs and served as Noble Grand. He was on the staff that helped institute the I.O.O.F. in Eden on 15 May 1914, and also in Hamburg with the laying of the cornerstone of the I.O.O.F. Temple in 1915. He was on the Deputy Team that installed officers in six city and county lodges in Erie District No. 1. He served as Secretary of the Friendship Lodge in Collins Center for 25 years. In the summer of 1921 Mr. Reynolds' health began to fail, and he died 17 Aug 1921 at the age of 69. He is buried in the Collins Center Cemetery. (Granddaughter Marilyn Bobseine, Allegany NY)

JOHN HAMILTON REYNOLDS (9 Sep 1796-15 Nov 1852), poet, was born in Shrewsbury. His father was head writing-master at Christ's Hospital. He was educated at St. Paul's School and then became a clerk with an insurance company but spent most of his time on literature. He was a friend of Hunt and Byron, but above all Keats, who admired his work and considered him his equal as a poet. He was even bracketed in some reviews with Shelley, though he showed so little understanding of the great poet's work that he even parodied Shelley's "Peter Bell," which is of course itself a parody of Wordsworth's poem. Indeed poetry intrinsically meant so little to him that an attractive offer from a solicitor in 1818 diverted him from writing for a long time, and he wrote

little of consequence after 1825. He traveled on the Continent in 1820, the year before his marriage, and then for a while contributed to the "Edinburgh Review," the "London Magazine," and other periodicals, but this phase ended with a quarrel with Hood, who had been his friend and collaborator, especially in his humorous verses. Until 1831 he was a part-owner of "The Athenaeum." In 1838 his literary life came to a complete end when he moved to the Isle of Wight and became clerk of the County Court. There he died at 56, a brilliant, witty writer, an authentic poet of great promise, especially as a sonneteer, but a man old before his time, soured and embittered by the failure of both his literary and legal careers - a failure largely due to some inherent defect in his own character. Principal Works: *Safie*, 1814; *The Eden of Imagination*, 1814; *The Naiad*, 1816; 1,2,3,4,5 (farce) 1819; *The Fancy*, 1820; *The Garden of Florence and Other Poems* (as John Hamilton), 1821; *Odes and Addresses* (with Thomas Hood), 1825. About: *Athenaeum* 27 Nov 1852. (British Authors of the Nineteenth Century. Ed., Stanley J. Kunitz, New York, H.W. Wilson Co., 1936.)

SEABORN GROVE REYNOLDS. There is not in Los Angeles County, perhaps, a man more worthy the title of true pioneer than is he whose name stands at the head of this biographical notice. He is one of the very first who came to the county. When a boy of 12 years of age he landed in this State, and knows full well all the hardships and privations of frontier life. But by the thrift and economy and by co-operation of his excellent ___, he has made a home, and reared a large and intelligent family of children. Mr. Reynolds was born in Yalobusha County, Miss., 29 May 1834. His father, Simeon Reynolds, was of Irish extraction and was born in RI. He married Florinda Sullivant of Bedford County TN, the dau of James Sullivant, whose ancestors were Scotch. Mr. Reynolds is the 5th of a family of 8 children. He attended the common schools of Coffeeville MS when a boy. When he was 8 years old his mother died and his father afterward married again. While yet a mere boy our subject went to TX, and with Major Erskin joined a train for CA, spending 8 months crossing the plains and driving 1,500 cattle. Twice they were attacked by Indians, and some of the work cattle were killed. After experiencing hardships and adventures incident to the overland trip they landed in CA in Nov 1854. For some time young Reynolds worked in the mines, and later purchased 160 acres of land in El Monte, which he farmed for 3 years. After this he was in the stock business 5 years. In 1865 he bought the farm where he has since lived. Where he beheld the mustard 15 feet high, and where there was not the smallest switch of timber, the passer-by now beholds a comfortable farm residence, and productive fields, and orchards and vineyards laden with luscious fruits. Mr. Reynolds was married in this county, in 1855 to Miss Martha Thompson. Her parents were Samuel and Margaret (McKamy) Thompson, the father a native of VA

and the mother of TN. They were pioneers in VA in 1852, and had a family of 4 children. The father died about 7 years ago. Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds have 11 children: Flora, Robert, John, William Oliver, Linnie M., Emma, Joseph B., Davis, Ralph, and George. Mr. Reynolds had held the office of deputy sheriff of Los Angeles County for 10 years and has also served in other public offices. He is a highly respected citizen and has a cordial welcome for aall, and is noted for that true hospitality which is characteristic of the Southern people generally. CLAY REYNOLDS, one of Texas' more celebrated writers, completed his third novel, which was reviewed in Dec 1992 by Daniel Marder in the "Tulsa World." This novel, Franklin's Crossing, is far more ambitious than the well-received Vigil and Agitate which are tight tales spun about singular incidents. The University of Tulsa Ph.D. has recently completed a collection of essays, "Taking Stock, A Larry McMurtry Casebook," and the influence permeates the pages of Franklin's Crossing, which is a saga of hardship and humanity along the trail of a wagon train attacked by Comanches as it treks through Texas to Santa Fe NM. Published by Dutton, 600 pages, \$22. (Submitted by Julia Dean)

DON REYNOLDS, Tulsa author, just published his first book Crackerjack Positioning: Niche Marketing Strategy for the Entrepreneur, reviewed by the "Tulsa World" business editor, 31 Jan 1993. Don Reynolds is a consultant, an award-winning professional speaker and now a published author. He has been a jet pilot, broadcaster, lifeguard, realtor, peddler, journalist, income tax consultant, trainer, banker, author, bootlegger and country music disk jockey. For a man that has been a jack-of-all-trades, Reynolds' message is singularly focused. When he sought out a publisher for his book, the major publishers would

not publish his book unless he made it broader in interest. He said "You can't be all things to all people. I knew I had to stick with what I was writing about." So Don formed Tulsa-based Atwood Publishing and the result is a 288-page book that sells for \$21.95. (Submitted by Julia Dean)
