IN MEMORIAM

MARGARET M. LEE, 74, who has taught horseback riding to young riders in Virginia's Hunt Country for the last three decades, died Friday, June 25, at Washington Hospital Center of head injuries she received in an accident involving her pony cart. Mrs. Lee was driving a pony cart in the Loudon County village of Unison when the animal bolted, causing the cart to overturn. She taught at the Foxcroft School in Middleburg for 22 years before retiring in 1987 as its director of riding. She also had been active in the Middleburg-Orange County Pony Club and was its district commissioner from 1988 to 1992. During her years at Foxcroft, "Miss Margaret," as she was called, was known for her gruff, tough talking exterior. She also was known for unwavering support for the grooms and school employees and the more than 50 horses in her charge. She had as many as 150 students in her program at one time, involving them in fox hunting, showing, and horse gymnastics. A Foxcroft team, representing the Middleburg Hunt, competed in the Washington International Horse Show. Students of hers went on to become members of the Canadian and U.S. Olympic equestrian teams. Despite two artificial hips, Mrs. Lee continued to ride, and she was active in teaching riding to the disabled. Her hobbies included fly-fishing, shooting, gardening, cooking, photography and travel. A resident of Unison, Mrs. Lee was born in London. She grew up breeding, hunting and showing horses. She came to the U.S. in 1962, after managing the family horse and dairy farm for 10 years following the death of her husband Cyril, in a fox-hunting accident. Survivors include a son, John, of St. Alban's England; a daughter, Margaret Reynolds (wife of RFA President, Glenn G. Reynolds) of Gig Harbor WA; and three grandsons. (Washington Post, 28 Jun 1993) [It is RFA's understanding that after a memorial service at Foxcroft, Mrs. Lee was returned to England for burial.]

JANET THURMOND MOORE, age 22, daughter of RFA member, Senator J. Strom Thurmond, died in April 1993, after she was hit by a drunken driver's car.

NEW FINDINGS ON

WILLIAM REYNOLDS 1734-1809 OF CROSS RIVER NY
 by Jane L. (Hornby) Fox, Lancaster NH

In his History and Descendants of John and Sarah Reynolds (1630?-1923) published 1924, Marion L. Reynolds on page 108 states "He m. Mary ("Polly") Knapp of Cross River...; probably dau. Joshua and Eunice (Peck) Knapp who had a dau. Mary Reynolds in will Sept. 29, 1798. Mary mentioned in will of Sarah Mead, widow of Capt. Jabez Mead, as 'my niece,' June 28, 1786." On page 110, Mr. Reynolds states that Ambrose, brother of William, "m. Miss Mary Knapp of Greenwich, who was b. Nov. 6, 1756; d. March 2, 1840, aet. '83-4' dau of Joshua and Eunice Peck Knapp."

That Ambrose m. Mary Knapp, d/o Joshua and Eunice makes good sense. The ages match up with the marriage and birth of their children and the names of their children are names from both families, i.e. Sarah, Ambrose, Joshua, Gideon, Mary, Bethia, Jared, Benjamin, Eunice.

That William m. Mary Knapp, d/o Joshua and Eunice (_?) Knapp makes no sense at all. First, I cannot find any other Joshua Knapp who m. anyone by the name of Eunice. Second, William's wife, Mary Knapp, couldn't be the same Mary who m. Ambrose, as that Mary was much too young, not even having been born at the time William and his Mary Knapp were already having children. Third, the names of their children do not bear any relationship at all with the family of Joshua Knapp. But, they do relate to the family of Caleb and Clemence (Mills) Knapp.

Thanks to Fred H. Knapp of Richland MO, I have discovered the following:

Caleb and Clemence Knapp were m. ca. 1719/20 at Greenwich (Fairfield) CT. Clemence was the d/o Samuel and Sarah (Denton) Mills. (She has been placed erroneously in the family of Samuel and Sarah (Weston) Mills, which has been proven to be correct.) Known children of record:

(1) Sarah b 9 Oct 1720, Greenwich CT, m. at Greenwich 20 Aug 1740 Joseph Hobby b 23 Dec 1716. (2) Elizabeth b 31 Dec 1722, Greenwich CT, m at Greenwich John Bush. (3) Titus b 7 Feb 1728, Greenwich, d c1810 (or bet 1778-1810) Greenwich, m at Greenwich Althea Marshall d/o Thaddeus Marshall. She d. 1776. (4) Caleb b 9 Nov 1724 Greenwich, d 1767 Goshen (Orange) NY, m. at Greenwich, Amy (or Ame) Rundle d/o William Rundle. (Some records say that William Rundle m. Mary Reynolds, who m 2d _?_ Palmer. Is there any

data on that marriage in RFA records?) (5) Amy b 23 Nov 1726, Greenwich, d. aft 1774 Greenwich, m 1st 13 Jan 1748 Ebenezer Mead Jr (this might be a reason Mary (Knapp) Reynolds is mentioned in the will of a 'Sarah Mead' as "my niece" but better reasons follow), m 2d Benjamin Hobby, both marriages at Greenwich. (6) Samuel Mills b 7 Feb 1728/9, Greenwich, d c1770 Greenwich. (7) Charity b 5 Dec 1733, Greenwich, m. at Greenwich 10 Nov 1751, Joseph Lockwood s/o Joseph. (8) Hannah b 22 Jan 1735/6 Greenwich, m at Greenwich Nathaniel Close s/o Benjamin and Ruth (Brown) Close. (9) Amos b Jun 1742 Stamford, d 27 Jul 1789 Stamford, m at Greenwich Mary Smith d/o John Smith. (10) Lydia b 1743/44 at Greenwich, d aft 1797, m at Greenwich, Horton Reynolds s/o Gideon Reynolds and brother of William. She is mentioned in the will of her father as Lydia Reynolds, so was m. bef 28 Oct 1762, and in Horton's will dtd 1797, so was still living at that time. It is important to note here that she was mentioned in the will of Sarah, widow of Capt. Jabez Mead, as "my niece, June 28, 1786", which indicates that she was probably the sister of William's wife, Mary Knapp, who was also mentioned as "my niece" in Sarah Mead's will. (11) Mary b 23 or 28 Nov. 1736 Greenwich, d aft 1809 at Cross River NY, m 1752 at Greenwich William Reynolds s/o Gideon Reynolds.

Children of William and Mary (Knapp) Reynolds:

(1) William b c1752, d aft 1809, m Mary (not Sarah) Lyon d/o Samuel Lyon. They went to New London. (2) Clemence b 30 Aug 1754, d 1 Dec 1795, m 1784 Thomas Hitchcock. (3) Sarah b Cross River NY, m _?_ Ames. (4) Mary b Cross River, m _?_ Hobby. (5) Gideon b 1783 Cross River, d 14 Jul 1847; m 1st 27 Dec 1803 Cross River Betsy Reynolds d/o Nathaniel and Hannah (Todd) Cooley Reynolds. (6) Joseph H. b (not necessarily after 1790), as the eldest son William was, by the time of the 1790 census, over the age of 16 and indeed was prob even m. by that time and had children of his own. So the two sons in the 1790 census under the age of 16 were prob Gideon and Joseph H. This makes even more sense if you figure that Mary was, by 1790, 54 years old and prob not having children any more.)

CONCLUSIONS:

That her name is Mary Knapp is not sufficient evidence that she was indeed the d/o Caleb and Clemence (Mills) Knapp. That she was born in 1736 makes her a good candidate for the wife of William Reynolds.

The most compelling facts are: (1) She named her 2d child Clemence; (2) while somewhat less compelling, she named her 3d child Sarah, (her grandmother on her father's side was Sarah Rundle and her grandmother on her mother's side was Sarah Denton); (3) She, and her sister Lydia, wife of William's brother Horton, are both mentioned in the will of Sarah Mead, widow of Jabez Mead, as "my niece"; and (4) Caleb Knapp did have a sister named Sarah, whose marriage I haven't yet found, but could have been the Sarah who named Lydia (Knapp) Reynolds and Mary

(Knapp) Reynolds in her will and who would have been an aunt to Lydia and Mary.

It is therefore my conclusion that Mary "Polly" Knapp, wife of William Reynolds (History of John and Sarah Reynolds (1924) p. 108) was more probably the d/o Caleb and Clemence (Mills) Knapp than of an unknown Joshua and Eunice (??) Knapp and definitely not the d/o Joshua and Eunice (Peck) Knapp.

An interesting aside to all this is that these connections bring the Palmer's and Peake's etc. into my family again through two lines. This makes William Palmer a grandfather of mine through four lines.

CICELY [OF JAMESTOWN]

From Behold Virginia, by George Willison

On Good Friday morning, 22 Mar 1622, hostile Indians massacred the Virginia colony, killing 347 men, women, and children. Unwilling to lose everything they had built "with much time, charge, and labour" a few bold spirits defied the order to abandon their plantations, among them a "Samuel Jordan from Beggar's Bush, where he fortified and lived in despoit of the enemy."

"Jordan died a year later, and there was a rush for the hand of his young wife, led by the Reverend Greville Pooley. Jordan had been in his grave only a day or two when Pooley sent Captain Isaac Madison to plead his suit. Cicely replied that she would willing take Pooley as any other. But as she was pregnant, she would not engage herself, she said "until she was delivered."

But the amorous Reverend could not wait and came a few days later with Madison, telling her "he should contract himself unto her --- and spake these words --- "I, Grivell Pooley, take thee, Sysley, to my wedded wife, to have and to hold till death do us part, and thereto, I plight thee my troth." Then (holding her by the hand) he spake these words: "I, Sysley, take thee, Grivell, to be my wedded husband, to have and to hold till death do us part."

Cicely said nothing, but they drank to each other and kissed. Then evincing some delicacy about her situation, she asked "that it might not be revealed that she did so soon bestow her love after her husband's death." Pooley promised but was soon boasting of his conquest, very foolishly, for "Sysley" now engaged herself to William Ferrar, one of the Deputy Treasurer's younger brothers.

Enraged, Pooley brought suit for breach of promise. The case was too much for the authorities at Jamestown, who referred it to London, meantime issuing a proclamation against "certain women of this colony (who) have, of late,

contrary to the laws ecclesiastical of the realm of England, contracted themselves to two several men at the same time, whereby much trouble doth grow between parties..."

Ministers were ordered to give notice that whoever "shall use any words or speech intending to the contract of marriage, though not right and legal, yet may so entangle and breed struggle in their conscience, shall for the third (!!!) offense undergo either corporal punishment, or the punishment by fine or otherwise, according to the guilt of the persons so offended."

[Editor's note: Cecily's maiden name is still unknown, but we will revisit her often, as others have declared that she was Cecily Reynolds. In any event, Cecily was surely the 'First Mother' of Virginia. Just as surely, the Reverend Pooley was the most colorful. The files of the Virginia Company contain the above story, and more. It is interesting that if the local authorities could not act, neither could company headquarters in London.]

HENRY AND JAMES REYNOLDS AND THE REYNOLDS MILL

This story is about my Great-Great Grandfather, Henry Reynolds and Henry's son James Reynolds and the Spring Creek Mill.

Henry and his wife Sarah and their two children John and Elizabeth came to MO from TN in 1836-37. It appears that Henry had a dream of building a mill and spent some time searching for just the right location for it. I have records of him in Gasconade, Greene, Christian and Stone Counties. He may have found the right location as early as 1839, in Stone Co. MO, but it was railroad land and Henry had to wait until the railroad had surveyed it before he could purchase his 140 acres. In the meantime, Henry settled in Polk township, Greene Co. MO and began farming. Henry's family was one of the first known to settle in this area, and at first, as in all pioneer communities, farming methods and machinery, transportation and communication were primitive. By 1850 Henry and Sarah's family had grown to 10 children.

In Green Co. Henry had at least two other Reynolds families as close neighbors. I have not made a connection yet, but suspect that they were relatives. In the 1850 census records, next door to Henry's family was a Benjamin L. Reynolds, b 1811 in KY, his wife Marjanette, and their ch: Mary E., Tarah A., Martha J., Patricia, E. Robert, Harriet M., John W. and William J. Apparently this family migrated from KY to IL before settling in MO in 1848. Very nearby in the same township was David D. Reynolds, b 1795 TN, his wife Mary and their ch Nancy and Martha, all born in TN. In the next dwelling were more Reynolds, but they appear to be more ch of David and Mary. Their names were: John T, James, William C., Sarah E., Jessie R., and Alssia B. This family appears to have migrated from TN abt 1833.

In the early 1850's Henry purchased his land in Stone Co. and began building his mill.

Henry's wife Sarah died between 1850 and 1857. On 1 Oct 1857, Henry married Margret Kerr, a widow with four sons and at least two daughters. Now with a family of at least 18, this must have been quite a work crew! Soon the mill was complete. Not only did this mill grind grain for bread stuff, Henry had included a carding machine, a cotton gin and a sawmill. The convenience of these facilities brought many new settlers into the community. By 1860 the Reynolds Mill was quite prosperous.

Then the Civil War came. There were apparently a few small skirmishes, as well as many raids by Confederate Bushwackers in the general area of Reynolds Mill prior to the Battle of Wilsons Creek in 1861. This was a major battle fought just a few miles north of the Reynolds Mill. Henry Reynolds' four older sons, John, William, Henry and George as well as his four step-sons all joined the Union Army and went off to war.

Sometime in 1863, while all eight boys were away from home, Confederate Bushwackers came to the Reynolds Mill. They set fire to the mill and all of the buildings burning them to the ground. They then set fire to all but one of the Reynolds corn fields, destroying most of the winter's food supply.

When the Civil War ended, only four of the eight boys came home. I know that George Reynolds survived (My great-grandfather) and I have found pension records for John Reynolds and Benjamin Kerr. I am still searching for the fourth survivor.

Henry seems to have been devastated by the events brought on by the war, his mill was never rebuilt. He continued to farm the land until his death in 1892. It is said that when Henry was 87, he bitterly recalled the burning of his mill and corn fields. His voice shaking with rage, he called down fire and brimstone on the heads of his tormentors.

CHRISTOPHER REYNOLDS of VA (T2-6292). His land grant in Warrisquick Co. (aft 1637 name changed to Isle of Wight Co.) of 450 acres is dated 15 Sep 1636 (VA Archives, Patent Book 1 (1623-1643), part 1, reel 1, pp 382-383).

The nine servants who had their transportation paid by Christopher are not named. (Abstracted: M.M. Nugent: "Cavaliers & Pioneers", p47, ect.)

His will dated 1 May 1654 (VA Archives, Isle of Wight Co. Will Book A, pp46-48). A proven date is not available for this will. It has been abstracted by many writers.)

Christopher is listed as living in VA (a survivor of the Good Friday massacre, 22 Mar 1621-22) on the muster of 16 Feb 1623-24. Gov. Francis Wyatt order to Capt. Ralph Hamor, 19 Apr 1622 to bring the survivors to Jamestown Island for their safety (Records of the VA Co. of London, III, part ii, p50a).

The request of Edwin Bennett of the plantation of Warascoake that his people might be returned thereto 7 Oct 1622 (Records of the VA Co., v II, pp104-5).

JOHN REYNOLDS (____) son of Christopher T2-6292 died young, d.s.p. His will of 11 Mar 1668 probated 1669 (VA Archives, Isle of Wight Co., Record of Wills & Deeds, V.2 1661-1719, Reel 23, p62). It mentions his brother Richard (6293), sisters Jane, Elizabeth, and half-brother George Rivers. His brothers Thomas & Christopher are not mentioned.

RICHARD REYNOLDS (T2-6293), son of Christopher (T2-6292) made his will 27 July 1711, proven 26 May 1712 (VA Archives, Isle of Wight Co. Record of Wills & Deeds, V.2 1661-1719, pp536-538).

RICHARD REYNOLDS (T2-6294) No known documentation.

THOMAS REYNOLDS (T2-7077) Son of the above. There is a court record dated 13 Jul 1769 of a suit & judgment between a Thomas & William Reynolds (T2-7078) (VA Archives, Caroline Co. Order Book 1767-1770, Reel 18, p456).

WILLIAM REYNOLDS (T2-7078) removed from Caroline Co. VA to Edgefield District SC before the revolution. His oldest son, Fielding (T2-7079) born in Caroline Co. VA c1763, who served in Rev War. He recounts his birth and migration to SC in his approved pension application (National Archives approved pension S-17041, Rev Pens. Files 1800-1900 Microfilm M804-2026, frames 1372-3). He was awarded \$93.33 per year and lived in AL after c.1828. The father, William, made many land transactions in Edgefield SC from 24 Mar 1789 to 23 Sep 1808. No further record or will has been located. William (T2-7078) appears in the first census of 1790, 67, and also 1800.

WILLIAM LEWIS REYNOLDS (T2-7118) son of William (T2-7078), was born c 1782. He made his will 18 January 1863, probated 2 Mar 1863 (Edgefield Co. SC Probate, Box 84, pkg 3356). It mentions his son John (T2-7120) first.

JOHN REYNOLDS (T2-7120), son of William (T2-7118) above, was born 22 Apr 1810 and died 30 Sep 1896. He spent his entire life in Edgefield Co. SC. Data is from his obelisk in Gilgal Cemetery.

ROBERT REYNOLDS (T2-7386), a younger brother of William

(T2-7078) born VA 1760, died Columbia Co. GA 20 Dec 1815. He married Mary Jones of VA in Edgefield Co. SC 20 Dec 1788. She died in GA 2 Jul 1860. She filed on 5 Nov 1855 from Columbia Co. GA a rejected Bounty Grant 223654-55. They had several children including Martin Burton Reynolds (T2-7388) 1796-1859.

The age of the Meeting House, still in use, is not known, but the sheds for horses and carriages still exist. In a small grave yard beside the church is a marker: "In Memory of JOHN W. REYNOLDS, Died March 7th 1863 In The 31st Year Of His Age." The foot stone reads "J.W.R."

Before 1866, declarations also included the date and place of arrival in the US and place of embarkation. After 1866, the form usually gave a physical description, current place of residence, last foreign address, name of ship, and port
