IN MEMORIAM

DAVID H. REYNOLDS, RFA member of Soquel CA, died 13 Apr 1993.

JOHN J. REYNOLDS, the developer of the Mastercard, died on Thursday (14 Oct 1993) at Winthrop-University Hospital in Mineola NY. He was 70, and had lived in Garden City NY.

Mr. Reynolds died of heart failure, his daughter, Dianne Reynolds, said. A native of the Bronx NY, Mr. Reynolds served in an Army engineer and supply unit in Belgium during WW II, then became a clerk with the First National City Bank, which later became Citibank. He worked his way up to assistant vice president by 1957, then vice president four years later. He was also attending college in those years, and graduated from NY Univ. in 1955. He later earned advanced degrees from the School of Banking at Rutgers Univ. and the Harvard Univ. School of Business Administration.

In 1967 he was named a senior vice president in charge of all domestic branches. In that capacity, he was responsible for coordinating the development of Citibank's Everything Card, later renamed the Mastercharge Card. In 1969, Mr. Reynolds testified before a NY State Senate subcommittee investigating theft and fraud in the credit card industry.

After leaving Citibank in 1973, Mr. Reynolds was named president and chief executive officer of the Interbank Card Association, now known as Mastercard International, the organization that licenses Mastercard to thousands of banks. In 1979, Mr. Reynolds oversaw the reformulation of Mastercharge into Mastercard, a move made to account for the card's expanding functions.

Mr. Reynolds also served as vice chairman of the advisory board of the Adlephi Univer. Center of Banking and Money Management, chairman of the installment credit division of New York State Bankers Association, and as president of the Consumers Bankers Association.

Besides his daughter who lives in Brookline MA, he is survived by his wife, Anne; another daughter, Maureen Cornacchia of Garden City NY; a brother, Thomas, of Fairlawn NJ; and two grandsons.

John Brickey, Jr, died 12-19-1732 Farnham Parish (Richmond) VA without a will. His widow, Sarah, married Thomas Russell ca 10-31-1774.

DENISON REYNOLDS, NY & PA 1944-1910

While working on my great grandmother's line in Otsego County NY, I can across the following material.

On 19 Jan 1864, 19-year-old Denison Reynolds enlisted as a private in Company I, 144th NY Volunteer Infantry, at Milford (Otsego) NY. His enlistment papers describe him as being 5'10" tall with light hair, blue eyes and a fair complexion. On 25 Jun 1865, he was honorably discharged from the army at Hilton Head SC.

Fourteen years later Denison Reynolds applied for a pension based on war disabilities. Twenty pages of correspondence between Denison, his wife Elizabeth, and the Pension Board are still on file in Washington. This correspondence covers the years from July 1879 until the death of Elizabeth and the closing of the pension in 1933. An interesting picture of the extended Reynolds family emerges from these letters.

Denison Reynolds was born 11 Sep 1844 in the Town of Kortright (Delaware) NY (spelled Court Wright in document). His family also included at least one sister, Emma Reynolds, born 1858, who married a Smith and at least one brother, Frank B. Reynolds born 1860. Emma, Frank, and

Denison were all living in Binghamton NY in 1910.

After his discharge from the army, Denison settled in Montrose (Susquehanna) PA. He seems to have had family in that area. In Dec 1862, a C.W. Reynolds, age 59, of Brooklyn Township (Susquehanna) PA, wrote a pension affidavit for Denison stating:

"...I have known said (Denison) Reynolds intimately ever since he was born, living near and seeing him and being with him frequently and being a neighbor and fellow workman..."

On 25 Sep 1867, Denison married 17-year-old Elizabeth E. Goss at Dimock (Susquehanna) PA. They would have 7 children, as follows:

1 Charles W. Reynolds (named after the above 'neighbor and fellow worker?') born 24 Apr 1870, residing in Binghamton NY in 1910.

2 Adelaide C. Reynolds born 2 Feb 1872, married a Hunt, residing Somerville MA 1910.

3 Grace Reynolds born 21 Dec 1874, still single in 1899 and residing in Binghamton NY.

4 John Reynolds born 1 Oct 1876.

5 Kemp Reynolds born 10 Oct 1881.

6 Lizzie Reynolds born 8 Sep 1889.

7 Pauline B. Reynolds born 2 Apr 1893, still single 1910 and residing in Binghamton NY.

In July 1879, "Denison Reynolds, age 36, resident of Borough of Montrose (Susquehanna) PA," filed his claim for a disability pension. The petition states:

"About 10 July, 1864, contacted disease of the legs breaking out of severe and fearful sores on legs, hips and hands, caused by exposure and hardsip incident to the service."

These problems continued to get worse over the years requiring the regular treatment by doctors and restricting his work as a mason:

"claimant not able to do half a day's work in a single day on account of his limbs swelling and sores on his hips, limbs and hands."

He received a partial pension and continued to provide information on his health to the pension office in Buffalo NY. Over the following years these were sent from Post Office addresses in Stamford (Delaware) NY, July 1881; Deposit (Delaware) NY, August 1882; Olean (Cattaraugus) NY, February 1895; and then from 1898 on, Binghamton NY.

When Denison died in Binghamton NY, 15 Feb 1910, he was receiving a \$12 a month pension. Elizabeth continued to receive a widows pension until her death in Binghamton on 13 Jul 1933. Her last monthly check was for \$40.

Page 115, Tomlinson-Reynolds: ...The father of George Tomlinson, who married Avaline Reynolds, was Humphrey B. Tomlinson.

Page 115, Reynolds: The Reynolds family was originally from England, also where the name was spelled in several ways, being Rennells, Runeles, Runniels, Renols, Reynell, or Reynold. One of the Reynold coat of arms has for a crest a fox holding a rose in his mouth, the name indicated a bearer of dispatches, one who "ran ells," perhaps two English ells at a stride, hence the name Runnells. Another explanation is that the family lived beside a brook; the Scotch word "runnell" being a term for a rivulet or brook.

The ancestor of Avaline Reynolds, mother of Mrs. Joseph Thompson, came from New Haven CT. He moved to Wilkes County, North Carolina, in the early part of the 18th century. His name was Elisha. Members of this family took part in the Revolutionary War.

The first Colonial Governor of Georgia was General John Reynolds. No less than five other States have, at different times, bestowed the office of governor of the commonwealth upon a Reynolds. To this roll may be added brilliant jurists, physicians, orators, educators, men of prominence in business enterprises and in the church, some of the most profound thinkers of the day.

Many a Reynolds has fallen on the battle-field. Six brothers fought side by side in the Revolution.

It remains for some one interested in this most fascinating work of following the golden thread of the family line as it is woven through ancestral warp and woof to show our connection with these various families, but it has been impossible for the writer to do more than establish the record of our ancestor from Connecticut.

CUBA DEALS RECALLED

MAINERS SMILE AT TALK OF REPARATIONS

Central ME Morning Sentinel, 17 June 1992, by Steve Eaton, dateline Burnham: It probably sounded like a good deal, even in 1959.

For \$1,000 one could have a house lot on a golf course on a beautiful tropical island. There were 40 people in Maine who thought the proposal worth trying. It might have all worked out if Fidel Castro hadn't mucked it up.

In 1959 Ronello Reynolds Sr. had purchased and was developing about 240 acres of land on the Isle of Pines, which is south of Cuba. Ronello Reynolds Jr. was 22 at the time and he went down to build the nine-hole golf course. In March the course was prepared and ready to seed. Reynolds

Jr. said he came home and intended to go back the next winter.

"Sometime, while we were home, Fidel Castro came and had his chicken barbecue," Reynolds said. Castro took power in 1959 when his forces defeated those of dictator Fulgencio Batista, seized U.S. banks, industries, and land holdings. Cuba's relations with Washington deteriorated and the U.S. broke its ties in 1961.

Those who invested were told they could write off their venture on their income tax, Reynolds said. Reynolds believes the island land intended for a golf course was used for housing. Another investor, Carl Cianchette, said he heard it had been used for a prison.

This week news came from Cuba that it, as a gesture of peace toward the U.S., may be willing to negotiate reparations for U.S. properties that were confiscated....

The State Department said 5,911 Americans lost \$1.8 billion in the nationalizations, a figure that has grown with inflation and interest to between \$5 billion and \$6 billion....

Reynolds, however, said he is not interested in returning to the island as long as Castro is in power. Reynolds does not know how much his father and an uncle, Algier Reynolds, had invested in the Cuban development. The plan had been to work in Maine in the summers and on the island in the winters. Reynolds' father also had an option to purchase a hotel that was located on a beautiful beach on the island. If Castro had not thwarted their plans, Reynolds said he'd be a much wealthier man today. He now owns Lakeview Golf Course in Burnham, which was created in 1927.

[Algier Reynolds, mentioned above, was the father of RFA member Arthur Ward Reynolds of FL - the Burnham ME branch of the Electious Reynolds line.]

REYNOLDS COATS OF ARMS

From the Reynolds Genealogy by

J. Montgomery Seaver, c1928

A coat of Arms is an emblem or device which is displayed by titled persons, persons of royal blood, and their descendants. Coats of Arms were originally used for purposes of identification and recognition on the field of battle as well as in civil life.

It is claimed by some writers that Coats of Arms, in a crude form, were used by Noah's sons after the flood. There are records of other Coats of Arms, in one crude form or another, at different periods of ancient history. Heraldry, however, as we know it today, did not become of much importance until soon after the invasion of England by William the Conqueror, A.D. 1066. Heraldry became of general interest at about the time of the Crusades.

The most widely used of all Reynolds Coats of Arms, in existence for many centuries, is described in Burke's General Armory, The Encyclopedia Londonensis, Liber Heraldica and other reliable works on heraldry, in some

cases accompanied by illustrations:

	<u>Heraldic Language</u>	<u>English</u>
Arms	Ermine, two lions passant, guident, gules, ducally crowned or.	On a black and white shield two red lions, walking but facing forward, wearing ducal crowns of gold.
Crest	A wyvern, wings elevated vert, holding in its dexter claw a sword proper.	A green wyvern, wings elevated, holding in its right claw a sword in proper colors.
Motto	Fide sed cui vide. (Latin)	Have confidence, but see in whom you place it.

The above Coat of Arms has been used for generations by many American Branches of the Reynolds family.

DO'S AND DON'TS FOR GENEALOGISTS

Our thanks to a member who suggested we reprint the following item from Family Puzzlers No. 1205, 23 Nov 1991:

DO - enclose a SASE (stamped, self-addressed envelope) with your letter when asking for help.

DO share information whenever you can.

DO always acknowledge, and thank everyone for replying to your request.

DO expect to find some embarrassing ancestors.

DON'T worry about them. We're not responsible for their actions, but we are responsible for recording the truth accurately.

DON'T expect every genealogical correspondent to be a "pen pal." Stick to the genealogical data and facts. Save your chatty letters for friends and close relatives.

DON'T demand others to share their research. Most are generous; remember it represents years of THEIR HARD WORK.

DON'T write "send me everything you have (or can find) on the xxx family."

DON'T believe everything found in print. All try to be accurate, but errors and omissions abound. The only requirement for a typeset, cloth-bound, archival-quality books, is that it be paid for!

DO enjoy your search, and the wonderful people it leads you to!

STANDARD SOURCE CITATIONS

One of the sessions at the recent reunion, which was well attended, was held by Susan Clement, during which she discussed the basic source documentation required to produce an acceptable genealogy or family history. Sue didn't have a "lesson plan." She can discuss it in her sleep.

But the National Genealogical Society came just in time. Just when Sue and I are discovering that among all the records we are entering into computers, we are finding less and less documentation. Unless we improve, our records 100 years from now will be no more useful than they are today -- and the source material will be another 100 years old.

In the Jul-Aug 1993 NGS Newsletter, p16, NGS/CIG Digest, is an article which says it all. While this article from the GEDCOM Coordinator, (GEDCOM Note No. 1, "Source Citations," June 2, 1993) has to do with computer standards, you can't have computer info until you have paper info, soooooooo....

"This GEDCOM note proposes a minimum set of information fields (tags) required to contain a minimum standard source citation...accept this guideline...such that any research...will be acceptable as far as source citation requirements are concerned....

"Users should be enabled to provide as little or as much source citation information as they desire, but they should understand that research conclusions without supporting evidence lack credibility, thus reducing the value to those who could otherwise benefit from the work [underscoring added]."

The following is copied verbatim from the article:

PRINCIPLES

1. We can accomplish more working together than apart.
2. Quality research can be shared in such a way that others need not repeat the effort.
3. Credibility of research conclusions depends on the evidence on which they are based.
4. Computers can encourage and facilitate quality research.
5. Setting a minimum requires a balance between enough information to be effective, but not more than others are willing to provide.

ESSENTIAL PURPOSES FOR SOURCE CITATIONS

An effective source citation must:

1. Give the location of the source such that others need not search again to locate it.
2. Permit evaluation and comparison with other evidence without accessing the source.

MINIMUM STANDARD SOURCE CITATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Author or creator of the record
2. Date record was created
3. Title or description of record

4. Page number or equivalent
5. Publisher and year of publication, if published
6. Repository address and archive identification number (film number, etc.)
7. Type of the source, identified by either the type of the event recorded in the source (birth record, death, census, taxation), or by other document types including: biography, genealogy, oral genealogy, history, family Bible, family record, newspaper, obituary, estate packet, journal, correspondence, interview, personal knowledge, tradition.

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Even if you don't use a computer, your family group sheets should contain this information. Without the source documentation your descendants will have to start all over again, just as you did. Even if the source is "my own personal knowledge" write that on the form, but remember:

You can confirm the birth of your child--

You cannot confirm your own birth!

GILLIUM REYNOLDS OF NORTH CAROLINA

SUBMITTED BY RICHARD LASELL, NEW HOPE MN

Jasper Newton Reynolds, who carries on farming on section 28, Cass township, belongs to one of the most prominent and honored families of Guthrie County, Iowa. His birth occurred in (Owen) IN, on 31 Aug 1847. He is a brother of E.J. Reynolds and a son of Gillium Reynolds. His remote ancestors were English and his grandfather Reynolds was a participant in the American Revolution.

Gillium Reynolds was a native of NC, born in 1796, [parents may have been James and Sarah (Green) Reynolds] emigrated to IN in early manhood and settled in Owen Co. when that part of the state was nearly all covered with heavier timber. In Owen Co. he was married to Miss Winnie Beman, a native of NC and a dau of Jacob Beman, who was born in that state of English parentage. To this worthy couple were born 13 children, two of whom died in infancy, the names of the others being as follows: Nancy Jane, wife of Thomas Burgess, who was a soldier int he Civil War and is now deceased; Sarah, wife of Jonathan Morris, of Stuart IA; E. Jackson; Isom R., of Santa Barbara CA; Wealthy, the wife of Arthemus McClaran, who resides in Panora; Matilda, the wife of Isaac Morris, of Snohomish, WA; Linnie Ann, the wife of James Moris, who resides near Panora; Allen H. of Panora; Willis, deceased; Jasper N., of this review; and Mary Ellen, the wife of Moses Morris, a resident of Washington.

The father left his home in IN 10 May 1852, accompanied by his wife and little ones, and set out for IA, traveling with an ox team and bringing with them three horses and 25 head of cattle. The journey from IN to (Guthrie) IA consumed 23 days an on their arrival here they stopped on a hill just south of Panora, where the father bought a claim on which was a log cabin.

In July of the following year he took up a tract of government land, but he was not permitted to enjoy his new home long, for in Oct 1856, at the age of 50 years, he was called to his last home. Politically he was a democrat and a strong adherent to that party. He was, however, a great admirer of General Taylor and voted for him, the only time he left his favorite party. He was a man of strong physique and great moral courage and exerted an influence

for good wherever he resided. His widow, after surviving him many years, passed away in Dec 1876.

Jasper N. Reynolds was only 5 years old when brought to Guthrie Co. by his parents... his education in public schools... remained at home until 24 years of age and then engaged in farming on land which he inherited from his father... now owns and cultivates 90 acres of valuable and productive land adjoining the city of Panora.
