WHERE ARE MY CHILDREN?

It is Friday, January 15, 1993, a mild winter day for Louisa County, Virginia. Standing next to me is my younger sister, Marilyn, her face flushed with excitement. We are in a heavy woods looking at three barely discernible gravestones. They are covered with brambles, briars, tree roots and weeds. Someone, at one time, had even used the grave site to burn trash, for there are piles of charred refuse, pieces of wood, cans and soda and milk bottles of the type not manufactured in 50 years or more.

After clearing away the front of the headstones, we can determine that two of them are the graves of our Great-great-grandparents, Philip Reynolds, Jr.⁴ (1741-1817), and his wife Charity (1751-1828). The third stone has eroded so badly that nothing is legible. The stone on the left reads, "P.R. DIED DE_R 12 1817 AGED 76." The stone on the right reads, "____ CHARITY ____ 1828 AGE ____ 7."

Eureka! We have found them! After considerable searching through deeds, wills, maps and ground reconnaissance this mission is accomplished.

Marilyn and I hold hands and pray over Philip and Charity -- Amen -- "Where are my children?" -- Who said that? Marilyn looks at me quizzically, "What is it brother?" I say to her, "Charity, wants to know what happened to her children. There were 11 you know, and not a few grandchildren. Probably over 30. Her son Holman

Reynolds⁵ had 8 and her grandson Pleasant⁶ had 15!"

"Why did it take six generations and 176 years for you to come here? I don't give a jot about the disintegration of your societies, family values and your personal problems. You are my heirs along with that irresponsible crowd in between that never showed up. Doesn't anybody care?"

Indeed we do, Momma Charity. Cousin Sanford is coming from Indiana, too, with a new headstone. Furthermore, I will bring my children Andrew¹⁰, David¹⁰ and Denise¹⁰ here, along with their children to pray with you.

Footnotes: (1) I now have records and photographs of the graves of six unbroken generations of my Reynolds line, from my father Justus Dandridge Reynolds⁸ Sr (1900-1964) back to Philip⁴ noted above. There are only three more to go back to the ubiquitous Thomas of York. (2) My patient wife Jean observed that "P.R." may have been what Philip⁴ went by since his father was Philip³ Sr. and his second born son was a Philip also -- May be.

WILLIAM REYNOLDS OF

ENGLAND AND VENANGO COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

The 1879 History of Venango County, edited by J.H. Newton, published by J.A. Caldwell, Columbus OH, has the following biographical sketch of William Reynolds:

"p. 564: William Reynolds was born in Worcestershire, England, in 1752. He emigrated to American in 1794, landing in New York city, remained until 1797, then came to Venango Co., Pa., and settled a tract of land where Cherrytree now stands. He being the only settler between Franklin and Titusville, travellers would make his home their stopping place when traveling from Pittsburgh to Erie. When Mr. Reynolds came to these parts he brought his son, John, a lad of 16 years of age, with him. They came in August of 1797 and commenced their improvements. Leaving his son John on the improvements made, he returned to New York city the coming fall to bring his family to his new home in Venango. But it was not until in the spring of 1798 that he reached his new home with his family. He continued clearing away the forests and preparing the soil for cultivation and following farming. He went to Pittsburgh for flour and to Erie for salt. They brought a family of eight children with them to this country, viz: John, William, Joshua T., Edward, Sarah, Lydia, Mary and Ann, all of which are deceased. William Reynolds died January 30th 1820 and his companion in 1826."

There is no estate filed for William Reynolds in Venango County nor are there any deeds in his name. The graves of William Reynolds and his wife are marked by a large marble slab in the Cherrytree Cemetery, bearing the following inscription:

William Reynolds, born Worcestershire, England, emigrated

to U.S. 1791; settled Cherrytree Aug. 1797; died Jan. 30, 1820, aged 60 years.

Lydia Reynolds, born in Herefordshire, England, died May 11, 1826, aged 68 years.

Blessed are the Dead who die in the Lord henceforth. Rev. 15:13

It is probable that this stone was erected by John Reynolds, son of William and Lydia, who became one of the more prominent citizens of Crawford County.

The following is 5 pages from a privately published booklet entitled Autobiography of John Reynolds, Read on His 88th Birthday, June 18, 1870. There is no title page in this publication:

"My paternal grandfather, John Reynolds, of Elmly, Worcestershire, England, inherited an entailed estate of great value. He married Miss Sarah Fox (I think of London). The issue of the marriage were John (the heir to the estate), James (who had a large wholesale and retail woolen and linen draper shop in Birmingham and left a large estate to his children), William (my father), Henry (an attorney who died in early manhood, leaving a son and daughter who were dependent on their uncles), Edward (who was for a time partner with his brother James, afterward went into business with his nephew--sons of the deceased brother Henry), and daughters Sarah, Mary, Anne and Betsey (Elizabeth). Sarah married John Harwood, grocer, of Birmingham, with whom my father served his apprenticeship. Mr. Harwood was an eminently pious man, and a deacon in the Baptist church. Mary married John Guest, a large manufacturer of Japanned ware in Birmingham. He died rich. Anne married a framer named Moule. Betsey, the youngest daughter, married a farmer named Edwards. Both had good estates.

"My maternal grandfather was Joshua Thomas. He was born February 22, 1719. Licensed to preach in 1743, installed pastor of the church in which he was baptized (Leominster) in 1754, and remained its pastor until his death, Aug. 25, 1797. (See Appendix, Note 1.) He married Elizabeth Jones. They were both natives of Wales.

"Their issue were Joshua, Timothy, Lemuel, and daughters Elizabeth, Mary, Lydia (my mother), and Sarah. Joshua settled at Holywell, Flintshire, was an agent for the Anglesea Copper Mine Company. Timothy was pastor of the Baptist church in Devonshire Square, London. Lemuel was in the jewelry business. He never married. Elizabeth married Richard Nichols. He followed a sea-faring life, and died at the close of what was designed to be his last voyage, on board the ship after she had entered the dock. He had not the opportunity of seeing his wife, or daughter, an only child. Mary married Richard Hathaway. They resided in Colchester. Sarah, the youngest, never married. All whom I have named have long been dead--my paternal grandfather before my parents married. My maternal grandfather died August 25, 1797, at the age of seventy-eight, and my

grandmother June 14, 1807, aged eight-five years. (See Appendix, Note 1.)

"My cousins of the first degree were numerous, of whom, I suppose, a few only are now living, and of them I have no knowledge, having ceased correspondence many years.

"Of my father's family I am the oldest. I was born June 18, 1782 in Colchester. Eliza was born in Colchester, October 5, 1783. Mary was born September 18, 1785; Lydia, August 23, 1786; Sarah, November 24, 1787; Anne, June 4, 1789; Eleanor, October 27, 1790; William, November 24, 1792 (these six were born in Birmingham); Joshua, born at sea October 11, 1794; Edward, born at Brooklyn, N.Y., October 18, 1797; Louisa, born at Cherrytree, Venango County, Pennsylvania, September 5, 1802.

"Eleanor died in New York April 4, 1793. Eliza died in New York, May 11, 1804. Anne died in Cherrytree, September 17, 1830. Sarah died in Cherrytree, August 14, 1852. Mary died in Meadville, January 3, 1854. Lydia died in Cherrytree, April 19, 1864. William died in Meadville, February 16, 1868.

"My father first settled in Colchester in 1781 or 1782, and removed to Birmingham in 1794, where he resided on the street called 'Deritend,' nearly opposite Alcester street. His business was grocer. He was not successful in business, and lost much during the political riots in Birmingham in 1793. Being a dissenter, his house was marked for destruction, entered at night by the mob, and much plundering done. The children were taken out of bed and carried to their uncles."

THE IRISH REYNOLDS FAMILY FROM CAMDEN SC

The Irish Reynolds family from Camden SC first came to my attention when reading the Civil War diary of Mary Boyken Chestnut (The Private Mary Chestnut, by Woodward and

Muhlenfeld). Mary's husband, James Chestnut, Jr. had a sister Mary Cox (I think her name was Mary Cox Chestnut, I don't see any indication she was a widow) who married a Dr. George Reynolds. It was not until last March, at a Capers family reunion in Charleston, that I learned more about this family. According to Historic Camden, Vols. II-III, Dr. George Reynolds, Dr. Mark Reynolds, and Dr. William Reynolds were sons of William and Mary Reynolds of Armagh, Ireland. The first of this family in SC was:

JOSEPH REYNOLDS (1787-1844), of Camden, took out his naturalization papers in 1815, stating that he had been 7 years a resident of the state (SC). He was a native of Armagh, Ireland and an uncle to Drs. George, Mark and William Reynolds. In the "Camden Gazette" of 1816 he advertized a "school for young ladies, limited to twenty-five." This was probably on the corner of Broad Street and Monument Square and deeded by Samuel Mathis to Joshua in 1816. Joshua married Sophia Mathis, the daughter of Samuel Mathis. Sophia died in 1834, age 39. Their children were:

1. ELIZABETH REYNOLDS, b 1814; m her cousin, Dr. William Reynolds of Columbia SC. Their dau, also named Sophia, along with her aunt, Jane (see below) conducted the private "school for young ladies."

2. MARGARET MILLER REYNOLDS (1816-1844), m William B. Johnson, editor of the "Camden Journal."

3. SOPHIA VOGAN REYNOLDS (1818-) m 20 Dec 1837, Samuel Elizabeth [sic] Capers who descended from Richard Capers, father of Mary Capers m to Richard Reynolds (1672-1758) of St. Helena's Island SC (thus, the "Capers Connection").

4. REBECCA REYNOLDS (1821-1847) m Dr. F.L. Zemp. One dau, Sophia.

5. SAMUEL MARK REYNOLDS, b 1823, m Miss Singletary.

6. MARY BLOUNT REYNOLDS (1826-) m Rev. Claudius Hornby Pritchard, who lived in Camden.

7. WILLIAM LISTER REYNOLDS (1828-) m Miss Jane(?) Bell.

8. JANE HARPER REYNOLDS (born 1831) conducted the "School for young ladies."

(End of children of Joshua Reynolds)

DR. GEORGE REYNOLDS born 1803 and d 1847 (son of William and Mary Reynolds of Ireland and nephew of Joshua Reynolds) came to Camden SC to his Uncles at age 18 then studied medicine in Philadelphia graduating in 1824. He married Mary Cox, dau of Colonel James Chestnut in 1834. Their children were:

1. MARY REYNOLDS (1837-1903) m Henry W. DeSaussure.

2. EMMA REYNOLDS (1839-1917) unmarried.

3. SARAH REYNOLDS (1840-1878) m Joseph J. Mackey, a resident of Camden.

4. ELLEN REYNOLDS (1842-1920) m Dr. Charles A. DeSaussure.

5. ESTHER REYNOLDS (1845-191) m Ref. F. Bruce Davis.

(End of children of Dr. George Reynolds)

DR. WILLIAM REYNOLDS, brother to Dr. George Reynolds, came to Camden in 1828 and practiced in Camden. Going back to Dublin he studied to become a dentist and was in practice in Columbia SC. He m ELIZABETH REYNOLDS, dau of

his Uncle Joshua Reynolds. The had one dau Sophia. Dr. William Reynolds d in 1871.

DR. MARK REYNOLDS, the youngest brother, came from Ireland in 1836. He was educated in Camden and Charleston, SC and settled in Statesburg, where he married Julia Reese. He died in 1883.

I do not know the author of Historic Camden Vols II and III as I was sent only a few pages by a Capers cousin. It is very interesting as it tells of the above Reynolds family and their good luck during the Civil War to have befriended Union soldier, Lt. John A. McQueen, "a gentleman" who protected them and their property. The Civil War diary of Mary Chestnut tells more about the three Reynolds brothers and is available anywhere after the reprint several years ago.

I am happy to help anyone with SC Reynolds connections. I do have a small number of books of my own and for the most part colonial records of the Low Country families.

Emily sent family group sheets starting with T1-1084 Richard David Reynolds, descending through line of his daughter, Mary Fortney, and wrote, "You will notice that my gr-gr-gr-grandfather was Joseph C. Reynolds, born in GA in 1793. He is an unknown. I have evidence (but not proof) that his father was Joseph Reynolds and his mother's name was Frances. I suspect his grandfather was Richard Reynolds of (Wilkes) GA, d abt Sep 1789." Her family group sheet for each family is presented below following the T1/T2 entry.

T1-1084 Richard David Reynolds, son of David (1076) Reynolds, b 3-27-1757 (Henry) VA, d 8-21-1836 (Muhlenberg) KY; served in Rev War with VA State Line (R-6715); m 3-2-1785 Nancy Grisham, b 9-15-1767 and d in KY. Data from family Bible.
