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#### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE 69th RFA ANNUAL REUNION Chicago IL, 22-24 September 1994

This year's reunion in Chicago was a great success, thanks to the efforts of our hostess, Louise Reynolds Lindholm. Our hotel looked out over Lake Michigan, with a spectacular view, and despite some dismal weather, our spirits couldn't have been brighter.



Our group met Thursday morning, and headed over to the Newberry Library for some serious research. The staff was most accommodating, and I, for one, was rather overwhelmed by the extensive resources available for genealogical research. I only wish I had planned some additional time in Chicago to take advantage of the opportunity for research there. Many in our group had some success and good luck in finding some stubborn Reynolds connections.

After a long hard day at the library, most of us met for a congenial and leisurely dinner at the hotel restaurant. Others took the opportunity to explore Chicago, and what it had to offer.

On Friday morning, bright and early, the official reunion began with coffee and a chance to renew acquaintances with cousins and to meet new family members. The RFA Archives was available for research, and many took advantage of the printouts, books and other materials. A few members returned to the Newberry for more research time there.

During the day, Bill King gave a presentation on "The Thomases of Early Virginia." Bill has spent a great deal of time and effort doing thorough and careful research in the early Virginia records. He provided members with a summary of his findings, and presented his theories on the various men by the name of Reynolds and probable relations that lived in early colonial Virginia.

After Bill's presentation, Russ Lindholm presented a seminar on Archival Photography, and preservation of old and new photographs. Russ's expertise in the area was eagerly welcomed by members, and his advice was greatly appreciated.

On Saturday morning, the Archives was again available for members' research. Several members made connections with proven family lines, and there were representatives of most of the lines available to help put these branches into proper perspective.

During the morning, Louise Lindholm presented material on the Winthrop Fleet of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, and had some new discoveries to report which may impact on the identification of the origins in England of the Robert of Boston and John of Watertown lines.

Sue Clement led a discussion group on the importance of accurate and proper genealogical documentation. The group discussed current professional standards of documentation and proof, as well as various sources, both routine and unusual, that could be of help in proving family connections.

The annual business meeting was held on Saturday afternoon, with active participation by members. (See minutes to follow.)

The RFA annual banquet was held on Saturday evening as the culmination of the weekend activities. The guest speaker was Tony Hoskins, Reference Librarian at the Newberry Library. He spoke of the history of the Library and the resources available there to genealogical researchers. Mr. Hoskins entertained many questions from the group related to specific family research problems and was most helpful in providing some clues and possible resources to be checked.

As always, as the weekend drew to a close, it was hard to say goodbye to our Reynolds cousins. We feel we've always known those we have only just met. And, as the years go by, we grow ever closer to those we have known for a long time. There really is a Reynolds Family Spirit, and it becomes stronger and brighter with each reunion.

#### GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

President, Dr. Glenn G. Reynolds opened the meeting with a welcome to all present and provided an update on the status of the Executive Board.

#### NEW EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

During 1994, both Stewart Essex, Executive Vice President, and Steve Roth, Vice President for Membership, decided not to run for re-election for the 1995 membership year. During meetings of the Executive Board, it was decided to combine the two vacant positions for the purpose of streamlining the Board and make it work more efficiently. A request for nominations for this position and all others were published in the newsletter during the year. One nomination was received for the vacant position. As there was only one nomination, no election will be held. The Executive Board is pleased to announce that Marilyn Newton, of Winterset IA, of the Henry of Pennsylvania line, will be the new Executive Vice President in charge of Membership for 1995.

#### MEMBERSHIP

Lee Taylor presented a membership report in the absence of Steve Roth. The RFA currently has 505 members. There were about 78 non-renewals in 1994, and therefore, probably no net loss in membership over the year. An extensive Publicity Campaign was undertaken this year, with letters being sent to a large number of libraries, historical societies and genealogical societies.

#### MEMBERSHIP DUES - LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP

Dr. Glenn Reynolds informed the membership that it has been decided that membership dues would stay at \$10.00 per year for the 1995 membership year. A Lifetime Membership category would be added in 1995. Members must be at least 65 years of age to qualify, and it has been determined that a \$100.00 lump sum payment would be required. The Treasurer and Executive Secretary will be finalizing the details.

#### TREASURY

A Treasurer's report was not available due to family illness that prevented Mary Hurd from joining us. (See end of this report for Treasurer's Report.)

#### PUBLICATIONS

Lee Taylor presented a Publications report. To date 203 copies of the Centennial Collection have been sold of the total 300 printed. We expect to place additional advertising about the book in various publications in the near future. An index to each year's volume of the 1991-1992-1993 newsletter has been compiled by Lee Taylor and will also be available for sale at a nominal charge to defray the cost of printing and mailing. It was suggested



by the membership that a 5 year cumulative index be compiled at the appropriate time. Lee stated that she would like to increase the newsletter to monthly, but the costs are prohibitive at this time. However, it appears that we will be able to add 2 additional issues, increasing the total number of issues per year to 8.

#### LINE COORDINATION

Nancy Smith presented a report on Line Coordination. She expressed thanks to all the Line Coordinators for the work they do to assist members in their family searching, and in preserving information on their family lines. There are currently 14 Line Coordinators, with 3 new coordinators having been added this year, Bill King for Thomas Reynolds of VA and William and Ann (Harrison) Reynolds of VA, Joyce Page for Katherine (Reynolds) Starbuck of Dover NH and Nantucket MA, and Kerry Reynolds for Reynolds & Crook of MD. Nancy read excerpts of letters she had received from some of the Line Coordinators.

#### RFA ARCHIVES

Susan Clement reported on the activities of the Executive Secretary and the status of the Archives. Computerization and preservation of the RFA archives remains a priority, and is an on-going process. Significant progress has been made, and the focus for the coming year will be to establish individual membership files in the computer for all past and current members in an effort to establish quick access to historical membership information.

Dr. Reynolds expressed thanks to Russ & Louise Lindholm for their work in planning and making this year's reunion successful.

#### 1995 REUNION IN SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH

Bob & Pat Daniels provided information on the status of next year's reunion in Salt Lake City, and research at the LDS Family History Center. The date has been set for the 11-16 September 1995, and a block of rooms has been reserved at the Howard Johnson's hotel next door to the Library. Make reservations early even if you have to cancel later. Further details will be published in RR.

#### UPGRADING RFA COMPUTERS

A motion was made and carried by the membership to support an upgrading of the RFA computer systems for the Executive Secretary and the Vice President for Publications/Newsletter Editor.

#### CANCELLATIONS OF REGISTRATIONS FOR REUNIONS

A motion was made and carried regarding cancellations at future reunions. Starting in 1995, no refunds will be made for cancellations of reunion registrations after a date to be set by the reunion coordinator(s).

#### ENDOWMENTS/BEQUESTS TO RFA

A discussion was held regarding the RFA receiving endowments and bequests. This will be presented to the Legal Advisor for consideration.

No further business was noted, and the meeting was adjourned.

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MARY REYNOLDS, A 'SPLIT PERSONALITY'?

Her family soon learned where she had gone, and allowed her to remain some weeks. During that time she was a guest of Mrs. Kennedy, whose husband, Dr. Kennedy, had recently died. At the same time a young lady, Miss Nancy Dewey, was a guest in the same family. Between her and Mary Reynolds a strong friendship sprang up. One night they agreed together to play off a practical joke on Mr. John Reynolds, who was boarding at the same house. But it happened that neither of the young ladies awoke at the right time, and when Mary awoke in the morning she had changed to her natural state.

She now found herself in a strange house, for she had never been in Meadville in her natural state. She had for a sleeping companion a person who was a total stranger. She saw nothing with which she was familiar, and could not

imagine where she was. Being in her natural state, quiet and reserved, and even shy, she asked no questions. Miss Dewey spoke of the trick which they had proposed to play but had not awaked to perform. Miss Reynolds made no reply. She remembered nothing of the trick, and knew not who it was that addressed her. Miss Dewey saw that something unusual had occurred. She probably suspected the true state of the matter, for she had been fully told of the singular changes to which Miss Reynolds was subject. So she became silent.

Miss Reynolds dressed herself and found her way down stairs, wondering and perplexed, but waiting to see what would happen, and hoping that something would soon occur that would solve the mystery. Mrs. Kennedy (afterward the wife of Mr. John Reynolds) came into the sitting room, and spoke in her usually cheerful manner; but Mary knew her not. Soon after her brother John entered the room. Then all was at once explained. In both states she knew him. In both states she knew that he resided in Meadville. She informed him of the occurrence of the change, though there was little need of it. The observation of a moment or two, and the change in her disposition, were sufficient to reveal to her friends the transition from one state to the other. She was then introduced anew to those among whom she had so strangely fallen. She remained at Mrs. Kennedy's, in Meadville, for some days, and then returned home.

Very soon after her return she awoke one night, and arousing a sister with whom she was sleeping, she exclaimed, "Come, Nancy! it is time to get up and play that trick on John." She had changed into her second state, and supposed that she was still in Meadville and sleeping with Miss Nancy Dewey, and that it was the same night on which they had planned the joke. When she found she had returned to the "Nocturnal Shades," as she called her home in Venango when she was in her second state, she was much chagrined, for the larger society she found in Meadville was, in that state, much more to her taste.

The foregoing statement illustrates two things. One is, that she did not in one state recognize acquaintances of the other state; the other is, that there was a blank in her memory of the period, however long, passed in a given state when she passed into the other. Thus weeks and months disappeared during one sleep. And the sleep from which she awoke seemed to her but the continuation of that into which she had fallen long before.

During the earlier period of these changes she manifested, while in her second state, many symptoms of wildness and eccentricity, amounting almost to insanity. Proof of this is found in her long abstinence from food and sleep, and in her indifference to, and even strong prejudices against, her best friends. "For some time," she writes, "after I had been in my second state, my feelings were such that, had all my friends been lying dead around me, I do not think it would have given me one moment's pain of mind. At that time my feelings were never moved with the manifestations of joy or sorrow. I had no idea of the past or the future; nothing but the present occupied my mind."

She was also very restless, and had a strong and uncontrollable inclination to wander off into the woods. Being utterly devoid of fear she could not be restrained by any representations her friends made to her respecting her perils from rattlesnakes, wolves, and bears, all of which were numerous in the vicinity. These things made her friends solicitous, and caused them to keep as close a watch as possible on all her movements.

It has been already stated that she was very careful to keep the letter of her word, though she did not feel herself bound by its spirit. She seemed rather to delight in finding some means or pretense of avoiding that, ass giving her an opportunity of boasting of her smartness. She was very ingenious in finding such pretenses. But when once she promised to do nor not to do a certain thing, her family and friends had perfect confidence that she would keep her word.

On one occasion in her ramblings she met a bear. She was on horseback riding along a path when she met it. In giving an account of the adventure on her return home, she said she had met a "great black hog," which acted very strangely. She said it grinned and growled at her, and would not get out of the way. She said her horse was frightened, and wished to turn back. She ordered the black creature to leave the path, but it would not mind her. "Well," said she, "if you will not get out of the way, I will make you." She was about to dismount and attempt to drive it from the path, when it slowly retreated, occasionally stopping, turning round, and growling. She used to insist that the bears with which her friends sought to frighten her from rambling off too far, were only "black hogs."

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HE BUILT THIS CITY: MARCUS T. REYNOLDS

From *Metroland*, Albany NY, May 5-11, 1994

From Art, 'Style Follows Function: Architecture of Marcus T. Reynolds, Albany Institute of History & Art, through June' by Rich Kreiner: Last month I was able to commend the Schick Gallery for recalibrating an appreciation for New York State landscapes through attention to bedrock. In much the same way, the Albany Institute sharpens our view of the surroundings, here removing scales from the eyes not for naturally occurring monuments but manmade ones. Each of the 40 projects examined in "Style Follows Function" is the work of a single man, Marcus Tullius Reynolds, through this exhibition, residents of Albany are cordially invited to wake up and smell the architecture.

Until another challenger is advanced, Albany holds the distinction of having the greatest per capita concentration of diverse and interesting buildings of any functioning city in North America. As an Albany-based architect in the early part of this century, Reynolds was in a unique position to make the most of the city's

economic and political clout. His best known building, of course, is one of the city's most highly regarded structures, the Delaware & Hudson Railroad Building at the foot of State Street. But the revelation of this show is the extent and the richness of Reynolds' legacy.

It is likely that a building designed by Reynolds has, for one of many reasons, impressed you personally in the course of casual travels through the area: the reach and crown of the white Albany City Savings Institute; the stolid and expansive bearing of the Hackett School on Delaware Avenue; further down the street, the fanciful Fire Truck House No. 4, crowned with stone guardian beavers; the sudden Italian palace of the Van Rensselaer Houses at 385-389 State Street; the striking, towerlike prow of the Albany Trust Company that allows both Broadway and State Street to slip around it peacefully.

Reynolds designed them all, and plenty more, in variations of classical, Jacobean, Tudor, Dutch, colonial revival and Flemish Gothic styles and other adulterated blends. A stylistic philanderer, he used them all and committed to none. His commissions range from individual homes (both urban and country) to schools, funereal monuments and banks. Especially banks. The exhibit, sensibly enough, clusters each different type of building together. This allows substantiation of such claims as private homes allowed for his least constrained expression and banks represented his "most coherent stylistic group of buildings." Because of his privileged social position, Reynolds was something of an "architectural shark that gobbled up most of the clients."

... Eugene I. Johnson mounted the campaign [for the exhibition] and wrote the accompanying catalogue, which supplies many of the exhibition labels. Johnson takes some effort to place the architect within the context of his era, both professionally and socially. As an economic and political nexus, Albany afforded its residents a certain stature, and Reynolds' clients "rightly saw themselves as no less cosmopolitan than their relatives" in New York City and Boston...

In affixing Reynolds' place in time and his art's evolution, the exhibit must run directly into the penumbra of America's certified architectural genius, Frank Lloyd Wright... Surprise gives way to shock in finding that "Wright and Reynolds were almost exact contemporaries" and in placing Wright's revolutionary Robie House of 1909 alongside some of Reynolds' contemporary plans...

A recommended guide to such further explorations of Reynolds' work is Johnson's own volume Style Follows Function. His chapter on the D&H building is particularly engrossing. Johnson is not so critical as one would like, and devotes more space than necessary in detailing the social milieu in which Reynolds' commissions arose. Yet in vividly encapsulating the moment and its personalities, his asides are often revealing. On how the Van Rensselaers, residents of that Italian palace on the park, thought of themselves in relation to the city, Johnson

states that as head of the clan, William Bayard, "was entitled to think of himself as Prince of Albany, a native the facade did nothing to undermine," and that Louisa Greenough Van Rensselaer, "his Boston Brahmin wife, reportedly regarded Washington Park as her private front yard."

Page 91: "That summer (in Bristol) a storm destroyed all the crops and most of the cattle in the village. For fear of another attack most of the inhabitants fled to Massachusetts. In September, Lafayette, in titular command of 2,000 Americans, arrived to set up a line of defense across the neck. His command post was the high ground still called Fort Hill, across the road from Deacon Joseph Reynolds, and he planned to billet with the deacon. He rode down alone to the deacon's, without epaulets and without announcing his name. In 1778 he was only 21 years old. Mrs. Reynolds, who had expected a whole retinue of venerable officers, supposed he was an equerry. She fed him, but warned him not to eat too much since she was awaiting the Marquis de Lafayette. 'Madame,' said Lafayette, 'I am the Marquis.'"
