MARY REYNOLDS, A 'SPLIT PERSONALITY'?

All her friends testified, and some still live to testify, that at the time mentioned by her she appeared to recover her lost knowledge of much contained in the Holy Scriptures, though, as she says, she could not read, and did not know the Bible from any other book. She never recovered any other knowledge in the same or like manner.

Her parents were both very pious and intelligent--in sentiment Baptists. They had been, as I have before said, intimately acquainted with the Rev. Robert Hall and other distinguished ministers of the same persuasion in England. Among them was a maternal uncle. After the neighborhood had become somewhat settled her father, William Reynolds, used to invite those living near him to come to his house on Lord's Day. He would read a sermon to them, and offer prayer with them and for them. His house was a well-known stopping place. Often the pioneer ministers, chiefly Presbyterian, during their laborious missionary excursions, rested and preached at his house. Under such influences Mary must have made large acquisitions of religious knowledge, and become familiar with the words of Holy Writ. What she had thus acquired and subsequently lost she recovered in the remarkable manner mentioned.

It should be stated that Mary knew the lady, who appeared to her in her dream, to be her deceased sister, not by recognizing her from memory, but by describing her appearance, and learning from her family that the description exactly suited the appearance of her sister. For in her second state, whether asleep or awake, she had no recollection of her sister as one whom she had previously known in everyday walks. One friend thinks also that he has heard Mary say that, in that dream, Eliza informed her that she was her sister. But this is not certain. It is certain, however, that she minutely described a person precisely corresponding to the appearance of her sister.

The indications of mental unsoundness which characterized the earlier portions of the time which she passed in her second state grew fainter, and at length

wholly disappeared after these changes had ceased, leaving her permanently in her abnormal state. This occurred about the year 1829, when she had reached her 36th year. She lived 25 years after this, wholly in her second state. During this quarter of a century no one could have discovered in her any thing out of the ordinary way, except that she manifested an unusual degree of nervousness and restlessness; yet that was not sufficient to attract particular attention. She was rational, sober, industrious, and gave good evidence of being a sincere Christian. For a number of years she was a consistent member of the Presbyterian Church. For some years she taught school, and in that capacity was both useful and acceptable.

During the last few years of her life she was a member of the family of her nephew, Rev. John Y. Reynolds, D.D. Part of that time she kept house for him, showing a sound judgment, and manifesting a thorough acquaintance with the duties of her position.

Her death occurred in January, 1854. In the morning she arose in her usual health, ate her breakfast with good appetite, and after breakfast went into the kitchen to superintend some matters in that department. In a few minutes the servant girl called to Doctor Reynolds, saying that his aunt had fallen down. He hastened to her, and assisted the girl in carrying her into the parlor, where she was laid on a sofa. The girl said that while Miss Mary was engaged about some matter, she suddenly raised her hands to her head and exclaimed, "Oh! I wonder what is the matter with my head." She said no more but immediately fell to the floor. When carried to the parlor she gasped once or twice, but never spoke, and then died. She was thus gratified in a wish which she had often expressed: "Sudden death, sudden glory!" She died at the age of somewhat more than 60 years.

The foregoing narrative embodies all that I have been able to gather which seemed to me to throw any light upon this case of Double Consciousness, the most remarkable which has been recorded. My object in preparing it has been to place before the public, and especially before those interested in mental philosophy the well authenticated facts in the case. That the case was a genuine one admits of no doubt. The leading facts are authenticated by a chain of testimony furnished by witnesses of unimpeachable character, covering the whole period. Mary Reynolds had no motive for practicing an imposture; and her mental moral character forbids the supposition that she had either the disposition or ability to plan and carry out such a fraud; and had she done so, she could not have avoided detection in the course of the 15 years during which the pretended changes alternated, and the subsequent quarter of a century, which she professed to pass wholly in her second state.

The phenomena presented were as if her body was the house of two souls, not occupied by both at the same time, but alternately, first by one, then by the other, each in

turn ejecting the other, until at last the usurper gained and held possession, after a struggle of 15 years. For not only did she seem to have two memories, each in its turn active, and the dormant; but the whole structure of her mind and consciousness, and their mode of operating seemed dissimilar, according to her state. Her sympathies, her method of reasoning, her tastes, her friendships, and the reasons which led to their formation, were in one state wholly unlike what they were in the other. She had different objects of desire, took different views of life, looked at things through a different medium, according to her state.

That her "second state" had its origin in, and was accompanied by physical disease, is evident from many considerations. She herself was conscious of this. In her narrative she writes: "Whenever I changed into my natural state, I was very much debilitated. When in my second state, I had no inclination for either food or sleep. My strength at such times was entirely artificial. I generally had a flush in one cheek, and continued thirst, which denotes inward fever." Physiologists, considering the time of life when the strange phenomena of her life began, and the time of their termination, will form some conclusion as to their ultimate cause; but that the brain was the organ immediately affected is rendered probably from the convulsions that preceded the first change, and from the manner of her death, which unmistakably indicated that the brain was disordered. But the facts, as far as ascertainable now, fail to explain the special features of her case; the two lives, covering 15 years, wholly unconnected with each other, yet each continuous from state to state; and the final settling down into a state of being lasting for a quarter of a century, and accompanied by no special indications of either mental or physical disorder, yet which had no apparent relation to or connection with that which she had passed for the first 19 years of her life, and which continued through a portion of the succeeding 15 years.

The hearings of this case on the sanative [sic] treatment of the insane, on questions of mental science beyond those alluded to, on questions of conscience or casuistry, and on the religious aspect of the matter, are left to the thinking world. None will be more ready than the author to receive light on any of these important and intricate matters.

WILL OF JOHN REYNOLDS OF DICKSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Transcribed by William Glasgow Reynolds

1826 Recorded 30 Jan 1830 Dickson Co. TN Wills, Vol. A, pp 83-83: "In the name of God Amen. John REYNOLDS, Sen. of the County of Dickson and State of Tennessee, being old and weak in body but of sound mind and memory do this sixth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty five make and publish this my last Will & Testament revoking all other of my former

Wills and in manner and form as follows. First It is my will that all my just debets and funeral expense be paid out of my estate. Secondly, I wish my beloved wife Susannah REYNOLDS to have full and entire possession of the plantation I now live on including the small tract George Martin formerly lived during her natural life or widowhood. I also wish she may be allowed an ample support for herself and my two children for the present year, out of what is already laid up or may be made for that purpose. I also give her forever her choice of any two of my work horses. I also loan her my negro man GILLIS to further the support of herself and my two children. I also loan her my negro man Isaac for the same purpose giving my Executors the right to retain them on the plantation or hire them out as they may deem most expedient for the interest of my children. I wish my Executors to retain in the family and in the possession of my wife during her widowhood everything necessary to carry on the far either in farming tools, stock of all kinds, household goods and Kitchen furniture with my oxen and ox cart provided my just debts can be paid otherwise. I also wish my Executors to dispose of all surplus property toward the payment of my just debts at the times they may think most advantageous foar my heirs. It is my will and desire that my Executors pay strict attention to the education of my children and that they remain under the direction of their mother during their minority or her widowhood. Should my wife marry again my Executor may continue my children with their mother or take them from her using his discretion. It is my will that when my son THOMAS becomes of age he be allowed to have and forever to hold as his own real right and property all the aforesaid tract of land as well as the Martin tract forever but by no means shall he be allowed to disinherit his mother during life or widowhood. It is also my Will that my Daughter NANCY have and forever hold as her own property right a small tract of land thirty-five acres more or less, known as the Pond tract, provided said land be not otherwise disposed of before my death. It is my will and desire that should my wife marry again that an equal division of all my property be made, my lands excepted, between my wife and my two children, my lands my wife will have no share in, neither do I wish any accounts made of the legacy bequeathed her forever. Should any of the above named children die before becoming of age it is my will the surviving child have the dead child's share. Should THOMAS and NANCY both die within an heir or an heir begotten of their own body it is my will their whole both shares of my estate be equally divided between all my first wife's children, name, John and Mark REYNOLDS, Charlotte LIVINGSTON, Polly WILSON, Gilly REYNOLDS, Heaven Acary DUNNWAY, Alley SMITH, Elley McMURRAY and William T. REYNOLDS, or their heirs, this being the whole and every part and parcel, that I allow any of my first wife's children and last named, of my estate with what they have already received of me and no part of this provided Son THOMAS and NANCY or either of them live to enjoy it themselves or have surviving children to inherit

this estate. And as before stated under no circumstances whatever shall my wife be disinherited from her peacable inheritance and support on the land I now live on during her natural life or widowhood. Should my wife continue and die a widow it is my will and desire that the whole of my estate in her hands be given to Son Thomas and Nancy or their heirs forever if any surviving children they have. If not to be equally divided amongst my first wife's children above named. Lastly I make and ordain my beloved wife Susannah REYNOLDS and my worthy friend Thomas BATSON Esq. of Montgomery County Executrix and Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said John REYNOLDS Sen'r have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written. Signed sealed published and declared by the said John REYNOLDS the Testator as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof (s) John REYNOLDS (Seal). Witnesses: H.W. Turner August 21, 1826; William Morris August 21, 1826; D.W. Martin August 21, 1826.

RUNNELS, HARMON: Minutes of the Executive Department from Nov 5th 1800 to Nov 1st 1802 Passports: Page 359 -- 2d Dec 1801 Ordered That Pass ports through the creek nation to the Mississippi Territory be prepared for the following persons - to wit - Raleigh HOLT, Harmon RUNNELS and Josua SCURLOCK, Bryant WHEELER and John RAZOR -- which were presented and signed.

RUNNELLS, LEWIS: Pages 61-62 - Sat. 9th March 1811. On applicatons Ordered That passports be prepared for the following persons to travel through the Creek Nation of Indians -- to wit, one for the Reverend Howell WALL with his wife nine children and six negroes -- one for Mr. William Hall TUTEN with his wife and his wife's sister from Beaufort District South Carolina - one for Mr. Roderick DONIPHAN from the State of South Carolina, One for Mr. Lewis RUNNELLS with his wife and six children from Burke County [GA], One for Mr. Archibald McDUFFIE, with two negroes from Cumberland County North Carolina, and one for Mr. Duncan BLUE from Moore county North Carolina - Which were severally presented and signed.
