IN MEMORIAM

STAN REYNOLDS, 43, the disc jockey of WASH-FM's "After Hours" program six nights a week, died of a heart attack May 30 at Arlington [VA] hospital. He was stricken while riding his bicycle. A resident of Arlington, Mr. Reynolds was born in Fayetteville TN. He grew up in Tullahoma TN, and attended Motlow Community College there. He began his career in radio when he was 17 and worked at stations in Wilmington DE and Huntsville AL. He was a recording engineer in TN for several years and then moved to Orlando FL where he operated an electronic surveying equipment company and was an adviser at Orlando College. In 1990, Mr. Reynolds became a disc jockey with an Orlando radio station. In July 1993, he moved to the Washington area and took over "After Hours" at WASH-FM. The show airs seven nights a week and features romantic tunes and call-ins. He was a member of the American Federation of Radio and Television Artists. His marriage to Jean Reynolds ended in divorce. Survivors include his wife Karen Reynolds, and their two children, Amy and Adam Reynolds, all of Winter Springs FL; a son from his first marriage, Douglas Reynolds, who is serving in the Marine Corps at Camp Pendleton CA; his parents Joe and Helen Reynolds of Tullahoma TN; a brother Steve Reynolds, also of Tullahoma; and three grandchildren. VERNON MCINHAM REYNOLDS, 82, a retired senior corrections officer with the District of Columbia Department of Corrections who also was a former Washington police officer, died of cancer Nov. 14, 1994, at Washington Hospital Center. Mr. Reynolds, of Washington, was born in Nicholasville KY. He grew up in Washington and attended Armstrong High School. From 1942 to 1957, he served with the D.C. police. Later he was an officer at the Department of Corrections Youth Center in Lorton. He retired in the mid-1970s. Since age 7, Mr. Reynolds had played violin. He taught private violin lessons and played with several instrumental groups in the Washington area. He was a guest violinist at the White House three times. His marriage to Elizabeth Reynolds ended in divorce. His second wife, Ethel Lucille Sellers Reynolds, died in 1978. Survivors include three children from his first marriage, Elizabeth Vernall Reynolds of Suitland MD, Franz Vernon Reynolds of Hillcrest Heights MD, and Felix Weir Reynolds of Washington; and four sisters.

LAWSON V. WOOD, of the Dodger/Hatch Road, died unexpectedly Wed. at his home. He was born in Benton [ME] 23 Mar 1929, the son of W. Verle and Ethel (REYNOLDS) Wood. He was retired as a self-employed meat cutter or carpenter; was an avid hunter and fisherman. He is survived by two sons, Walter of Fairfield and Victor of Oakland, two sisters, Mrs. Paul (Carmeletta) Farrington of S. China and Harriet Prime of Winslow; four grandchildren. Graveside services will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday, 4 Jun 1994, at Brown Cemetery, Albion Rd, Benton. The English Bible, which is now recognized as the Authorized Version wherever the English language is spoken, is a revision of the Bishops' Bible, begun in 1604, and published in 1611. It arose incidentally out of a Conference between the High Church and the Low Church parties convened by James I, at Hampton Court Palace in January 1604, for the purpose of determining "things pretended to be amiss in the Church," and was originally proposed by Dr. Reynolds, president of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, the leader and spokesman of the Low Church party, and subsequently on the committee which revised the translation of the Prophets."

BARTIN T. REYNOLDS OF NJ AND IN
History of Wayne County IN, undated
Harrison Township, pp510-511

Bartin T. Reynolds was born in Monmouth Co NJ 29 Jun 1837, and soon after moved with his parents, Thomas and Dorothy (Vannote) Reynolds, to Wayne Co IN. He has pursued farming through his life, and in 1875 purchased and removed to his present farm. He was married 19 Nov 1859 to Lucinda, daughter of Henry and Nancy Wood. They have had four daughters: Malissa A. and Matissa J., twins, born 14 Feb 1861; they died at age of six months; Ida M. born 12 Aug 1862; and Ona M. born 19 Feb 1871. Mr. Reynolds is a charter member of Jackson Lodge No. 552, I.O.O.F., of Jacksonburg, and has passed all the chairs of his lodge. He has a Bible which has been in the Reynolds family 155 years. Five generations are recorded in the book the first being David Reynolds born [no day] Dec 1729. His parents were born, reared, and married 2 Aug 1818 in Monmouth Co NJ, his father of Scotch and his mother of Irish descent.

Their children were nine in number: William, Margaret, Abram, Mathew, Benjamin, Rebecca, James, Bartin T. and Charlotte. Jane, William, Matthew and James died in NJ, and Margaret and Benjamin died in Wayne Co IN. Mr. Reynolds followed the carpenter's trade till he came to Wayne Co, after which he engaged in farming till his death 22 Aug 1881, at the age of 83 years. His widow still survives at the age of 86 years.

THE REVEREND AND MAPLE RIVER

When you turn off M-52 and travel eastward along Bennington Road in Shiawassee County, the roadside and the area's farms look deceptively like many other rural areas in mid-Michigan. The rolling landscape is planted with wheat, hay and some vegetables. The Maple can be seen to the north, its banks lined with high bushes and willow trees.

Only as you approach the intersection of Bennington and Colby Roads does it become apparent that something is really very different about this particular area. On the left, a brick octagon school house stands at the top of a small hill overlooking the surrounding countryside. On the right, one sees an attractive wood frame Greek Revival farmhouse, fully intact and in excellent condition. Next to the house a small cemetery filled with oak trees and gravestones dating from the 1840's and 50's is surrounded by a wire fence with a simple gate. Across the street from the cemetery stands an attractive Greek Revival Church that looks as if it were transported to Michigan from a small New England town. Elsewhere in the neighborhood, other Greek Revival farmhouses emphasize the visitor's feeling of have stepped back in time.

This is the Maple River Historic Rural District, an area listed on the State Register of Historic Sites in April 1978. A Michigan Historical Marker will soon be placed near the Maple River Church to commemorate the four young couples who settled in the area in 1837 and founded this community. The marker will also note the contributions of Reverend George M. REYNOLDS, the son of one of the founding families, who not only presided over the area's small congregation and taught at its first school, but also served as the architect for most of the area's buildings. It is due to Reverend REYNOLDS' grasp of design that the Maple River area stands out as a center of early Michigan architecture.

Reverend Reynolds was a learned man who studied both religion and architecture and put both fields of knowledge into active use. For example, drawing upon his reading of Orson Squire Fowler's text, "The Octagon House: A Home For All", Reynolds was inspired to construct the Maple River School in Octagon form. Eight-sided structures, according to Fowler, not only enclosed more space than four walled buildings with equal perimeters, but also provided "healthful" environments in which to work and play.

Reverend Reynolds utilized his knowledge of Green revival design to create the finely detailed Maple River Church in 1868. Whether Reynolds developed his understanding of the Greek Revival style through the use of contemporary

architectural pattern books or through travels to the east is unknown. In any case, the elegant proportions of the small building, its corner pilasters and full entablature, and its three-tiered steeple reflect the design of a trained architect. Similar complexity of styling is also seen in the farmhouses of the area that were built using Reverend Reynolds' plans.

We do not know, nor can document how often Reynolds' designs influenced visitors and passersby who saw his buildings and carried ideas on to their own communities.

COMMEMORATIVE MARKER AT COOPER FAMILY CEMETERY

On Sunday, 29 Oct 1994, a newly erected Historical Marker was dedicated at Blythewood Farm. Members of Ocoee Chapter (DAR) hosted the Brigadoon Chapter DAR of Greenville TX, as great-great-granddaughters unveiled the marker at the Bennet Cooper Family Cemetery. The regent of the Greenville TX DAR, Linda Hess and treasurer Rheda Davis, both gr-gr-granddaughters of Bennett Cooper [and RFA members] bought the land marker and got approval from the TN Historical Commission for its placement on Blythewood Farm. Cooper descendants from as far away as San Jose CA and Clearwater FL were present for the unveiling.

Historian and author Stephen O. Addison recounted how in the early 1800s Cherokee Indian Hair Conrad (known as Hair) first built the (now) historical cabin of slit, handhewn poplar wood; that Hair tried to adopt the white man's ways and he wanted to live as they did. It was intended to be a life-time project for his family... however, all of this ended as Hair and his family were forced to leave on the tragic "Trail of Tears" in August 1838.

Bennet Cooper and his wife Lydia Reynolds Cooper, moved into the cabin between 1838-1840. The cabin was later used by tenant farmers. c1873, Cooper gave 1/4 acre of land to be used as a family cemetery. The cemetery, the adjoining Hair Conrad cabin, and Blythewood Farm is owned by Mrs. Bess Neil of Cleveland TN. She restored the cabin, which is now in the Historic Register, and preserved the cemetery, and has been responsible for their upkeep. The cemetery marker reads:

COOPER CEMETERY. In 1873 Bennet Cooper (1797-1886) gave one-quarter of an acre of land for a family burying ground. His first wife, Lydia, was buried there along with several other family members. The cemetery is located on a ridge behind the Cooper Homeplace which was built by Hair Conrad, a Cherokee Indian, who led the Trail of Tears. In 1930, Pearson Blythe Mayfield purchased the property. Mrs. David H. Neil obtained the land known as Blythewood Farms from her father and preserved the Cooper cemetery.

A NEW FATHER FOR CHRISTOPHER REYNOLDS OF VA?

Page 206 from James Clark, Mansfield, Christopher Clark, by Virginia McNaught, 1934 (Library of Congress #3508 CS 71.C6 1934):

Christopher Reynolds came to VA in 1622 on the "John and Francis" (Hotten's Emigrants, b.88-181 and 241. Wm & Mary Quarterly Vol 7, Isle of Wight Records, VA County Records, Vol 6). His son, probably the Christopher mentioned in Hotten's Emigrants, p88, born England 1611, came to VA 1635 in the Speedwell from London. Wife was Elizabeth. His will in 1654 names son Christopher, who was born in 1642, is believed to be the father of Elizabeth, wife of Charles Moorman. [Ed note: The will does not give date of birth for son Christopher.]

Charles Reynolds, listed in Stanard's Colonial Register as a Burgess 1652, and Mr. L.G. Tyler in his Encyclopedia of VA Biography, says he believes this Charles Reynolds, of whom no one seems to know anything, to be Christopher Reynolds (1654), our ancestor, who was a well-known man and large land owner. Christopher Reynolds was often written "Chris", which could easily be mistaken for "Chas."

- I. Christopher Reynolds to VA in 1622 - Burgess 1652.
- II. Christopher Reynolds b 1611, to VA in 1635, Will dtd 1654- names wife Elizabeth and son Christopher b 1642.
- III. Christopher Reynolds b 1642 (supposed to be father of Elizabeth).
- IV. Elizabeth Reynolds (1690-1765) m Charles Moorman (b c1860, d 1757).

Christ Church Paris Register, Middlesex Co VA, gives birth of an Elizabeth Reynold, baptized March 15, 1690, which year is the date of the Elizabeth who m Charles Moorman. Records say "Elizabeth, d/o Christopher Reynolds", so her father may have been Christopher (b c1642) son of the Christopher whose will is dated 1654. (See New Kent Register and Reynolds Wills).

It is said by descendants that Charles Moorman was 15 years old, and Elizabeth Reynolds 13 years old when they married. Elizabeth was 15 years old when her eldest son, Thomas was born (1705). Charles and Elizabeth (Reynolds) Moorman settled near Green Springs, Louisa Co VA abt 1704. They were Quakers and owned slaves (See Wood's History of Albemarle Co VA).

In 1723 Charles Moorman entered 254 acres in Louisa Co VA; in 1724, 111 acres adjoining. In 1735 he patented 400 acres in Albemarle Co (then Goochland Co) at the junction of Mechurn and Moorman Rivers (from which entry the river received its name). In 1736 he entered 433 acres in Louisa Co. In 1738 he, with Charles Mills, entered 4000 acres lying between Moorman and Mechurn Rivers (VA Mag. IV, p228). In 1744 Charles was living in Louisa Co not far from Green Springs....

SOME ILLINOIS MARRIAGES

JOHN REYNOLDS, CARVER, OF ENGLAND AND PHILADELPHIA

In the May-Jun 1994 issue of RR was an article about James (John Reynolds, Carver, of England and Philadelphia from "Magazines Antiques", May 1984). I believe the following paragraphs will add to that.

I have in my possession a ledger of James and Henry Reynolds that starts in Nov 1794. I am enclosing a copy [of 2 pages] that shows their start from the Estate of James Reynolds. My mother always referred to them as glaziers. There was also a son named Thomas, I believe.

This ledger has been damaged by children and pages torn out but there is more than enough to show much history. Many of the citizens of that era are mentioned as well as this notation, "Sold to the President of the United States on 2-20-1795." Family lore is that it was a mirror and that it might be hanging in the White House.

My ancestor, I believe is Henry born 10-8-1774. He was married to Margaret Naglee born 6-5-1776. To this union was born James Wilson on 5-24-1807. He was married to Mary Lynn on 3-12-1829. I know this to be true because I also have a marriage certificate written on sheepskin. He had a sister named Ann Elizabeth who married a Reverend Aaron Rood of MA. James W. and wife are buried in Napa CA.

James Wilson Reynolds and Mary Lynn were the parents of three children that I am aware of: Benjamin, Ann, and Mary Lynn who lived to the ripe old age of 95. Her mother was 92 or 93 when she died.

Mary Lynn Reynolds was born 8-23-1834 and she married John Andrew Dougherty who was born 8-5-1832 on 9-21-1855. To this union was born ten children, the youngest of which was Leona Ann, my mother. She was born 2-10-1880 and died on 12-23-1978 at the age of 97 years. 10 mos. 13 days. Leona Ann married 14 Nov 1817 Robert Shedenhelm born 8-9-1871. The "L." in my address stands for Lynn. It has been passed down from the first Mary Lynn.

Jean Whisler, a member of RFA, and a great niece of my mother, is the granddaughter of Ross Porter Dougherty who was the third son and child of Mary Lynn and John A. Dougherty. Ross was born 6-2-1862.
