She was born Dec. 12, 1926 in La Crosse to Fredrick and Hilda (nee Carr) Reynolds and married David Anderson in 1970. She was a member of the Dodge County Friends of Animals and the North Shore Animal League. She is survived by her husband; four sons, Michael (Jeanne) Reynolds of Hartford; James (Judy) Reynolds of Hartford; Frances (Judy) Anderson of Northfield MI; and Patrick Anderson (Barb Blanch) of Iron Ridge; three daughters, Kathleen (Calvin) Wilcox of Rubicon; Rebecca (Scott) Brodell of Iron Ridge and Valerie Rogers (Scott Neuman) of Beaver Dam; 22 grandchildren; five great-grand-children; and one brother Lloyd (LaVonne) of La Crosse. KICKING BIRD AND THE BIRTH OF OKLAHOMA

a Biography of Milton W. Reynolds

[Ed.note: Great reading even if you have no interest in the Reynolds Family. The following comes from the book's jacket. Milton Reynolds, Kicking Bird, was great-great grand-uncle of RFA member Rex Reynolds.]

FOR THE FIRST TIME the story of Oklahoma told in chronological sequence from the historic Fort Smith Indian council of 1865 to the exciting land rush of 1889. The land struggles of early day Kansas and Nebraska, the great Indian councils, the Boomer movement, the fight of Oklahoma in Congress and much more...all described in a brisk, clear writing style that makes this thoroughly documented historical material read like a novel.

Milton W. Reynolds, also known as Kicking Bird, was a brilliant scholar and master of six languages. He gave up the comforts of the East for a life on the frontier. There his pen and voice stirred the nation as he pleaded for justice to both Indians and settlers.

He became such an authority on Indian affairs that residents, governors, and legislators sought his counsel on Indians and their lands.

Thousands of Easterners flocked to the frontier in response to his plea, "Come West! You can do better!"

The Press of that day considered Reynolds the man most responsible for the existence of OK. Settlers revered him as the man who had provided them homes in the fledgling territory. Historians called him "The Prophet of OK." His complete story and how his "Land of the Fair God" became

a reality are told here for the first time.

CAN YOU IDENTIFY THIS FAMILY?

In the RFA Archives there is a one-page (page 7), typewritten item that we cannot connect to a member or correspondent. If you can help with the identification, please notify the editor. It was received in 1955 and it follows, in its entirety:

From John J. Parker Genealogical notes:

Mary Parker Reynolds and Her Descendants, page 7:

"David Reynolds lived about a mile south of Centre Meeting House at the time of his wife's death (Mary Parker Reynolds) she was buried at Centre Meeting graveyard. David lived on the same farm for several years after and then concluded to break up HouseKeeping divided his land between his two daughters Elizabeth Davis & Lydia Benbow, and went to live with his son in law Jesse Davis where He lived some 2 or 3 years...When his Daughter Elizabeth Reynolds Davis started on a visit to Indiana to see her children in the west in company with her son Joel, he then wished to go to Hopewell 6 miles north of N. Garden in Guilford Co. N.C. to stay with his daughter Lydia Benbow where he died and was buried in Hopewell Burying Ground, Benbows burial place" Information from David Davis.

"The Reynolds family Bible is believed to have been left in the Benbow family where David Reynolds died."

SILKMAN, AVERY & REYNOLDS FAMILIES

Recently, I received a copy of an article in the Spring 1993 issue of The Museum of American Folk Art Magazine. The article is about a friendship quilt made in 1861. Joanna E. Silkman, wife of DeWitt C. Reynolds. The item mentions that Joanna was the third cousin of DeWitt C. Reynolds. Can anyone tell me how Joanna and DeWitt became third cousins?

Two other contributors to the quilt were Ruth and Olive Avery. The article states that they were the daughters of Harvey and Nancy (Reynolds) Avery. Ruth and Olive were stated as being second cousins of Joanna E. Silkman. They had a brother, Harvey, who married DeWitt's sister, Caroline. Caroline Reynolds is in the John of Watertown Genealogy, p222, #1129, wherein she is said to have married harvey William Avery 5 Dec 1848, son of Wm. and Nancy (Reynolds) Avery. As you can see, one source says Nancy m. Harvey Avery, the other that she m. William Avery. I suspect that he was named Harvey William Avery, and that his son was named after him. Can anyone provide insight into this parentage?

Nancy Reynolds is not identified. Has she ever been identified? Since Joanna E. Silkman was a third cousin of DeWitt Reynolds, and a second cousin to the three Avery children (whose mother was a Reynolds), it seems

reasonable that Joanna may herself be a descendant of John of Watertown. I do not have a complete pedigree for Joanna, only her Silkman ancestors. Does anyone know the parents of Nancy (Reynolds) Avery?

Contributors to the article were Silkman and Reynolds descendants. One was Mrs. William Kelly of Katonah NY (that's right next door to Cross River NY), a Silkman descendant. Another source was Lois Reynolds of Cross River NY. I believe she is a member of RFA. That would be a great find for me and RFA if it turns out that Joanna (Silkman) Reynolds was also a Reynolds descendant. We'd have a whole new line of Reynoldses.

Identifying Nancy Reynolds is also important. After all, while I don't think that Ruth and Olive Avery were ever married, their brother Harvey, married Caroline Reynolds, and had six children, three of whom had children of their own. I would think their descendants would want to know who their fraternal grandmother, Nancy Reynolds, was.

ANOTHER PUZZLE

GLENN/REYNOLDS CONNECTION IN NC

GLENN FAMILY GENEALOGY, by Wayne Glenn, Box 415, Nixa MO 65714 [Bulletin of Old Tryon [NC], Vol XIII, No 4, Nov 1985, p162-163: Lincoln Co NC, 2 Mar 1782, Robert Glenn witnessed the transfer of two slave girls from Henry Reynolds to his dau Mary Reynolds.

State of NC ordered a survey for land of Robert Glenn issued 14 Oct 1783. By 26 May 1785 the survey had been completed and consisted of "206 acres on the waters of Buffalo Creek, joining John Carpenter and Alexander Reynolds' land, including the Widow Davis' improvement."

The third son of Robert and Elizabeth Glenn was John (1772-1853?) m. Nancy Reynolds (?-1842). [No parents given for Nancy.]

Evidently most of the Glenns went to White Co. TN. John stayed in NC. There was a big land feud -- John did not take care of his mother. Lawsuit records should be in county court records for anyone interested in pursuing this event.

ISLE OF WIGHT CO VA MARRIAGE REGISTER VOL I, 1772-1853
Isle of Wight Co VA Marriage Bonds. Date: Sept. 15, 1818.
Contracting parties: HENRY REYNOLDS and Miss Lilly JORDAN.
Surety: Bartholomew Lightfoot. Parent or g'd'n.: No entry.
Residence of parties: no entry.

NORFOLK [VA] JOURNAL, Monday Morning, Feb. 4, 1867. Died at his residence near Western Branch, Feb. 1st, 1867, of typhoid fever, Captain SHARP REYNOLDS, aged 64 years.

AMERICAN BEACON AND NORFOLK AND PORTSMOUTH DAILY ADVERTISER, Norfolk (VA) Monday Morning, June 27, 1831. Married at Lake Drummond Hotel, on Thursday evening last, by Willie McPherson, Esq. Mr. John E. PURDIE to Miss SUSAN REYNOLDS, both of Isle of Wight County.

At the same time and place, by W. McPherson, Esq. Mr SHARP REYNOLDS to Miss Mary RUSSELL, both of Portsmouth.

ISLE OF WIGHT CO VA DEED BOOK 32, pp420-25. Copied from the Archives in Richmond VA. The Deed listed below mentions many, many times that Mary P. (PARKER) was the wife of SHARP REYNOLDS. MBW [initials unknown].

This Indenture made and entered into this tenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight (1838) between SHARP Reynolds and Mary P., his wife, and HENRY REYNOLDS (Jr.) of the first part, and James Chalmers of the County and State aforesaid of the other part. We stipeth, that the said SHARP REYNOLDS and Mary P., his wife, and HENRY REYNOLDS for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred and seventy five dollars to the said SHARP REYNOLDS and HENRY REYNOLDS in hand paid by the said James Chalmers at and before the sealing and delivery of these present, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledge, they, the said SHARP REYNOLDS and Mary P. his wife and HENRY REYNOLDS have granted, bargained and sold, and by these present do grant, bargain, and sale and convey unto the said James Chalmers, his heirs and assigns all their rights, title, interests, claim and demand in and to a certain tract parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the said county, containing by an old survey, one hundred and fifty acres more or less of which HENRY REYNOLDS _____ right and _____ adjoins the land of Joseph Thomas, Mary Whitfield, Horatio Goun, Joseph B. Whitiker and Elizabeth Davis... claim and demand of these the said REYNOLDS, Mary P., his wife, and HENRY REYNOLDS in and to the aforementioned list or parcel of land of which HENRY REYNOLDS SEN... The grave yard thereon exception. And the said SHARP REYNOLDS and Mary P. his wife and HENRY REYNOLDS...agreed...their heirs, and against all (can't make out last line.) [Barbara did not find the grave yard, but she believes this to be where Sharp and Sophia and

Henry Sr are buried with all the "older" ones.]

EASTERN ARKANSAS: PHILLIPS COUNTY THE S.M. REYNOLDS FAMILY

p795, 1889, GOODSPRED

S.M. REYNOLDS, one of the prominent farmers and stock growers of Marion Twp, is the 6th of a family of 8 children born to the union to Thomas and Elizabeth (Winters) Reynolds, natives of TN. Thomas Reynolds was farmer by occupation and continued this pursuit in his native State until about 1848, when he moved to Franklin Co AR. He purchased land near Ozark AR, continued his former pursuit, and was among the first to settle in that county. He died in 1854 and the mother the year previous. Of their eight children, four are now living: Christopher Columbus (resides in KS); S.M.; Zach (resides in MO; and Robert C. (who resides in Plano TX). W.D. (deceased) was in the war with Mexico, and was in the battles of Buena Vista, Marengo and at the City of Mexico at the surrender.

S.M. Reynolds was born in Greene Co TN in 1846, and was reared by his brother, W.D., and received his education in the common schools of Phillips and Lee Counties AR, as his brother moved to this State in 1859. The latter entered the land and S.M. worked on the same until 22 years of age. In 1868 he married Miss Mary J. McGrew, of Phillips Co, and the daughter of William and Sallie (Clabough) McGrew, natives of TN and NC, respectively.

Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds are the parents of eight children: W.T.; Henry L.; James P.; Marion F.; Mary E. (deceased); Carrie A.; Minnie G.; and Octavus (deceased). After his marriage S.M. Reynolds moved to Sharp Co AR, where he followed the trade of blacksmithing for about one year and then returned to Phillips Co. He settled on his present property, which was owned by his wife and which consisted of 120 acres with 50 acres under cultivation.

In 1862 Mr. Reynolds joined the boys in gray, Anderson's company, commanded by Dobbins, and was in the battle of Helena 4 Jul 1863. He was at the surrender of Little Rock, and was also in a number of skirmishes, etc. He was captured in Phillips Co, was sent to Helena and there remained for two weeks when he was paroled. This was the latter part of 1864.

Mr. Reynolds is a member of the County Wheel and Farmers' Alliance, and is Vice-President of the Subordinate Wheel. He is a member of K. of H., Spring Creek Lodge No. 2643, and is also Vice-President of this. He and Mrs. Reynolds and three of the children are members of the Christian Church.

William Reynolds, the grandfather, of our subject, was in the War of 1812, and the maternal grandfather, Christopher Winters, was a German from PA and last resided at Charleston TN.

REYNOLDS AND VIRDINS OF DELAWARE

The Virdins of DE and Related Families

[Extracts of all Reynolds info by Ed. These extracts were written c1900 by Herman Carter and John C. Gooden.]

The Virdin family is so interrelated to many of the early families of DE that no brief genealogy can tell the story...The first branch or generation...is that of Peter Lowber, who died in 1698...The following generations are then enumerated: Lowber, Broadway, JOHN REYNOLDS, Rodney....

From the Reynolds' branch came John Reynolds, who emigrated to DE from ENG. He purchased 134 acres of land 12 Nov 1722. His will was probated 2 May 1729, in which he named his children: [surname for all is Reynolds]: Daniel, George, John, Robert, Sarah, Elizabeth, and Mary.

Daniel Reynolds was a tutor in the Lowber family and married one of the daughters. He received 'Golden Ridge' from the Lowbers and in his will, probated 14 Jun 1736, he gave it to his children.

Michael Reynolds, on 25 Apr 1757, volunteered in the French and Indian Wars No. 23 on the muster roll of Captain John Caton, DE Archives, Vol 1, pl3...

...The Broadways once owned nearly all the land on the road from the MD line to the farm of former Gov. Robert J. Reynolds, near Petersburg DE...

...From newspaper obit dated Dover [DE] 25 Nov 1949 concerning Albert H. Hargadine who died at home in Great Falls MT, formerly resident of Felton [DE]... Mr. Hargadine was the son of the late Dr and Mrs Robert W. Hargadine of Felton...and a great grandson of the late Gov Robert J. Reynolds of DE.

[Does anyone have info on Gov. R.J. Reynolds?]

WILLIAM REYNOLDS & FAMILY OF SEILING OK & BLODGETT MILLS NY

Bill Reynolds, as he was called, came from Seiling OK with his wife and 2 sons, 1 daughter -- to Blodgett Mills NY, 2 miles from Cortland NY.

Bert Reynolds, a young man probably 19-20 stayed in Blodgett Mills and married Mary _?_. They had one son Milton who died when he was two years old. Mary died just three years ago, in 1992. The marker, in the cemetery in Blodgett along with other Reynolds family members related to the writer, reads:

REYNOLDS		
son	Mother	Father
MILTON	MARY M.	BERT A.
1916-1918	1893-1992	1884-1956

Because the winter was too cold, Bert's family all returned to Seiling - Mother, Father, one brother and one sister (don't know names). At the same time Cleveland Lash and his parents came from Seiling OK to Blodgett Mills. They, too, returned to Seiling because of the cold winters, except Cleveland Lash, who stayed in Blodgett Mills and married Bessie Mae Reynolds (John of Watertown line) and my aunt. He had three children by a previous marriage (wife had died) and had five children by Bessie Reynolds. All lived in Virgil-Blodgett Mills area. Aunt Bessie Reynolds Lash was a school teacher for many years in that area. All are buried in the Blodgett Mills Cemetery, Blodgett Mills NY. [Ed. Note: Louise sent photo of the cemetery marker for Bert, Mary & Milton.]

Old Cemetery at Marshall Corner, Coweset, Brockton MA: Zenas Reynolds, died June 22, 1842 in his 70th year; Orin, son of Zenas & Rebecca, died Sept. 26, 1822, in his 22nd year; Elizabeth, dau. of Zenas & Rebecca, died July 23, 1826, aged 19 mos. 7 days.

Jonas Reynolds, died Aug. 5, 1795, in his 53rd year, Rev. Soldier

THE FIRELANDS PIONEER [OHIO]

Submitted by Jody Davis, Williamsburg VA

Mrs. Electa M. Lockwood died in Milan [OH] 30 Jul 1907. Electa Reynolds was the 12th child of Jason and Esther Reynolds and was born in Moscow (Livingston) NY 13 Oct 1833. Of her family but one is living -- a sister, Mrs. Eliza M. Wardel of Oakille MI. About the year 1850 she came to Milan with her mother and others of her family. A sister, Mrs. Martin, and another sister, Mrs. Hackett, with their families, lived many years in Milan. Except for a short time spent at Norwalk Mrs. Lockwood remained one of Milan's well known and respected residents. In Apr 1854, she was united in marriage to Francis G. Lockwood, who died in Milan 25 Jul 1891. Three children survive her -- Mrs. Cora Noake of Chicago, the only daughter, Walter of Milan, and Fred of Grand Rapids MI. Mrs. Lockwood lived an industrious, useful life, and many friends can testify to the hospitality of her home and her ready response when an opportunity offered to help another.

Mrs. Coralin A. (Lockwood) Noake, member of a pioneer family of Milan [OH], died at the home of her brother Walter Lockwood in that village, 8 Jan 1931. She was the widow of the late William H. Noake of Chicago IL, and was survived by her only son, Harry F. Noake of Los Angeles CA. Mrs. Noake was the eldest child of Frank G. and Electa (Reynolds) Lockwood and died in the house in which she was born. Burial was in Milan.

Mrs. Harriet (Lockwood) Reynolds, a native of Milan and a Life Member of the Firelands Historical Society, who had lived much of her life in Saginaw MI passed away in that city 3 Dec 1933 at the age of 93 years. Born in Milan (Brie) OH, 25 May 1840, the d/o George and Jane (Osborn) Lockwood, she belonged to one of the early pioneer families of the Firelands. After her marriage on 24 Jan 1865 to Sylvanus J. Reynolds, she went as a bride to Saginaw MI where her husband was a leading hardware merchant, a member of the firm of Shaw, Reynolds and Choate, and where she assumed at once an active interest in the social and religious activities of the then small lumbering community. She joined the First Congregational church and at the time of her death was its oldest living member. The Saginaw chapter of the D.A.R. also claimed her as its oldest living member. Her husband, S.J. Reynolds, who was also formerly of Milan OH, located in Saginaw in 1860 and passed away there in 1908. After his death Mrs. Reynolds spent ten years living with her nephew J.C. Lockwood in Toledo OH. He was an inveterate traveler and despite her advancing years, she accompanied him on every trip of any consequence. One of these journeys took her approximately 1000 miles inland up the Amazon River through the dense jungle region in Brazil. In 1919 Mrs. Reynolds returned to Saginaw, and made her home with her daughters, Mrs. Carl G. Lilliestierna and Mrs. A.B.

Williams, who survived. She was also survived by three grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Burial was in Brady Hill, Saginaw.

JAMES REYNOLDS & BETSEY PENOYER

[The following, a copy of two pages from a manuscript, was submitted by Darrell McLain, Aurora IL, who obtained permission for RFA to publish from Silas Reynolds III who wrote that permission is granted "in an effort to determine our lineage in the Reynolds family." Mr. Reynolds is not a member of RFA - yet.]

The Reynolds Family were descendants of King James I of Eng., and his wife Anne of Denmark. King James was a son of Mary Queen of Scots and Lord Henry Darnley.

James Reynolds came from England and married Betsey Penoyer. While he was crossing the ocean the ship was taken by Capt. Kidd, the pirate. He was young and active and secreted himself in the ships rigging until all the crew was put to death.

When he was discovered Capt. Kidd offered to save him if he would join his band of men. He consented but deserted at the first opportunity.

He was with him long enough to see him bury all the gold that an ox team could haul, after burying one of his men with it as guard. The location was the west bank of the Hudson river on a mountain.

He had a number of children: Betsey, who died of a broken heart, Peter, James, David and Henry, and Caleb.

At the time of the Revolution these five brothers enlisted against England, which so incensed the Eng. Government that a reward of one thousand pounds apiece was offered for the head of any of these brothers, either dead or alive.

They escaped capture but Tories caught Henry of Monroe, Sullavan Co. They attacked the house but could not make an entrance. They then tried to descend a large chimney but were smoked out by burning feathers. Later in July 1782, they obtained entrance by pretending they were some of Washington's men in search of deserters.

They attacked Henry Reynolds, wounded him and hanged him to the trammel pole of the fireplace. They then proceeded to search the house for valuables. His wife was ill in bed but his daughter Phoebe, twelve years old cut the rope and put him on the bed. The Tories returned to the room, beat poor Phoebe and hanged her father again. But she again saved his life by cutting the rope. This time they attacked with knives and swords. They cut off one ear and wounded him in thirty one places. They put him in an old trunk and left him for dead.

They took away many valuable things, destroyed others, fastened the door on the outside and set fire to the

house. Phoebe climbed out of the window and extinguished the fire. She then returned to her father and discovered that he was still alive. By following her mother's advise [sic] she managed to make her father as comfortable as possible. Then at an early hour she went to the neighbors for help. They pursued the Tories and returned to Mr. Reynolds' house to give what aid they could.

After many weeks he recovered and although he was always crippled, he lived to the eighty five years old.

On back of above page:

Henry Reynolds married Mary Fowler of West Chester Co, New York. He was in trade with a Mr. Birdsall in West Chester Co, and afterwards moved to Orange Co., N.Y. and went in business with David Sands, a Quaker in 1782.

Henry Reynolds was the grandfather of Silas Reynolds, he was born in 1743-died 1828. He was elected to the Legislature of the state of New York in 1804. He had fourteen children:

Phoebe b 1769, married Jeremiah Drake, died 1853.

Caleb b 1771, supposed to have been killed in the War of 1812, while defending the city of Washington.

Jessie b 1773, d 1834.

Reuben b 1775, d 1864 in OH.

Jeremiah b 1777, d in OH at an old age.

Betsey b 1779, d 1788.

Daniel b 1781, d 19 Aug 1868.

Polly b 1783, d 1865.

Jane b 1785, d 1843.

James b 1787, d 1796.

Hophni b 1789, d 1843.

Martha b 1791, d 1867.

Catherine b 1791. Her husband left her and she was in pursuit of him the last heard of in Cayuga Co, N.Y. He came to IL but she never found him.

Benjamin b 1793, d 1860.

Henry Reynolds was a private in the Revolution.

Daniel Reynolds was the father of Silas Reynolds. He was born in Orange Co NY and moved to Sullivan Co when 14 years old. He belonged to the Society of Friends. He was a farmer and married Rebecca French who died May 20, 1882. Rebecca French was daughter of Joseph French and Sybil Richardson, from near Dunstable, near the Kennebec River. He had 8 children:

Abigail who married J.D. Gillett and had no children.

Maria who married John C. Hall and had five children:

Daniel, Sally, Bradley, Isaac and Abigail.

Isaac, born 1808, died 1884.

Silas, born Sept 18, 1810, died 1889, married Jane Eliza Wandover March 21 1835, and had 7 children (Jane, Joseph, Elizabeth, Isaac, Olive, Grace, Minnie). Jane Eliza Wandover, wife of Silas Reynolds, was the daughter of Albert Wandover and Eliza Carpenter. She was born near Poughkeepsie Orange Co, N.Y.

James who married Roxanna C. Paull and had two children, Emma C. and Clara L. He was 74 when he died.

Isiah, who died at the age of seven.

Joseph, born June 11 1819, died Feb 21, 1891. He

married Mary E. Mort__ [Morton?] and had one son Blake. Rebecca French was the mother of all of these children although Daniel Reynolds was twice married after she died.
