A STORY OF TWO REVOLUTIONARY WAR SERVICEMEN

Most quilters are familiar with a quilt pattern called "Burgoyne's Surround" - a pattern with lines from the four corners joining a circle in the center, with an overall background. The converging lines represent the Colonial forces coming from different directions to fight British General Burgoyne at the battle of Saratoga, in New York. I'm in the process of creating this quilt as a wall hanging, using a red patterned center representing the British Red Coats, of course, with blue lines representing the colonial forces, and using a leafy green background representing the forests that they marched through to get to Saratoga. This quilt is significant to me, because my ancestor, Capt. Daniel Reynolds of Londonderry, NH, fought at the Battle of Bennington, Vermont, on August 16, 1777 in Col. Moses Nichols' regiment, under Brigadier General John Stark of New Hampshire, which battle preceded Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga.

The British plan had been to cut New England off from the other colonies. This would be achieved by having Burgoyne's forces march down from Canada through New York. However, Burgoyne's army was in need of military stores and supplies, so two units of men were sent to the arsenal depot located at Bennington, Vermont.

Alarmed at the pace and probable success of Burgoyne's advancing army, the newly formed Republic of Vermont appealed to neighboring New Hampshire for assistance to help halt the increased British attacks and invasions. Coming out of retirement, Brigadier General John Stark of New Hampshire accepted the leadership of the Colonial forces. Under Stark's command was the entire Bennington force, most of whom were untrained.

Aware of the advancing British troops moving east toward Bennington, Stark decided to head them off rather than defend the supply depot at the Bennington site.

Therefore, it was approximately five miles northwest of Bennington, near Walloomsac Heights, now in New York State, that the actual battle took place.

Since Londonderry is located on the easterly side of New Hampshire, I presume 35-year-old Capt. Reynolds' company of soldiers started their march at approximately that point, walking completely across New Hampshire, then across what is now Vermont, and into New York; up hills, down hills, up mountains, down mountains, and across the Connecticut River. After that "little stroll," they then had to engage in a major battle, for their new country, and for their lives! I have been to the battlefield, which is now a state park, and I have driven up the hill to the top, now cleared of trees, and I have read the plaques which take the visitor through the whole battle. I have looked from the top of that hill eastward towards the town of Bennington where the needed supplies were located, and I have looked down the hill where the British troops had camped. If I had to walk up that hill, I couldn't have fought a battle at the top! If I had to walk across two states, I couldn't have walked up the hill to fight the battle!

Daniel's wife Hannah was left at home with six small children, all under the age of ten. The eldest, nine-year-old Stephen, probably carried the burden of the heavier chores, while Sally, not quite eight, would help with the care of the younger children. The next in line, five-year-old Daniel, would not be much help, nor would the four-year-old twins and one-year-old daughter. Probably only the older two would realize their mother's fears for the safety of their father.

The fighting began at three o'clock on the afternoon of August 16. Folklore has John Stark uttering the immortal words, "There are the Red Coats; they will be ours or tonight Molly Stark sleeps a widow." The first shot was fired by Col. Moses Nichols' battalion (perhaps Capt. Reynolds' Company #1?); and by five o'clock that evening, the British troops were retreating in disorder. On October 17, 1777, due in large part to the lack of the much needed supplies, Burgoyne surrendered with his entire command, following the Battle of Saratoga, which resulted in a major turning point for the American Revolution.

At the same time in our history, James Leighton, a tailor of Durham, NH, aged 27, perhaps motivated by the \$40 enlistment bonus, signed on as a mariner in September 1777 for service under Capt. John Paul Jones on the *Ranger*, the newly-completed Continental war-ship. Was that \$40 bonus the enticement for him to leave his pregnant wife behind, or was he motivated by patriotism? His wife Sarah would give birth to their daughter Elizabeth before James set foot ashore again in Portsmouth.

The *Ranger* sailed from Portsmouth on November 1, 1777; Jones' first assignment was to carry dispatches with the news of Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga to First Commissioner Benjamin Franklin who was in France. On arriving in France, the *Ranger* received the first foreign

recognition of the national flag of the United States. Before the *Ranger* would again rest in her home port of Portsmouth, she would raid the mainland of England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales, and capture the 20-gun ship, Drake. What stories for James to tell when he again saw his friends and family in New Hampshire!

How excited and happy Sarah must have been to have her husband home again, and to show him their first-born, Elizabeth. They returned to Durham and had seven more children, all living to adulthood, certainly a rarity for those times.

Almost twenty years pass, and now ROMANCE comes into the story. I have no idea how their children met, but both Daniel Reynolds and James Leighton were selectmen of their respective towns, so perhaps their grown children met at political or social events. Daniel Reynolds, third son of Hannah and Col. Daniel Reynolds, married Elizabeth Leighton, first child of Sarah and James Leighton, on August 6, 1797, and they settled in Durham, her home town.

Did their fathers ever sit down together to a meal and reminisce about their war-time experiences? Did it ever come out, over a tankard of hard cider, perhaps, how Capt. Daniel Reynolds fought Burgoyne's forces at Bennington, and then how seaman James Leighton was on the ship that carried the news of Burgoyne's defeat at Saratoga to Ben Franklin in France? Did they ever wonder at the Fate that brought their two children together? Did one of them ever say to the other, "Well, that's a story to tell our grandchildren!"

I mentioned in the beginning about the quilt I was working on - when it's completed it will be a wall hanging, to be hung below a picture of the *Ranger*, thus bringing together symbols of my two ancestors who participated in different roles in the same conflict of the Revolutionary War, and whose children met and married. Without that joining of the Reynolds and Leighton lines, I wouldn't be here!

Ulster Surnames

REYNOLDS

Reynolds is more common in Connacht and Leinster than in Ulster. It can be of English origin, but the majority will be of Irish or Scottish stock.

The personal name Reynold derives from the Old French Reynaud and ultimately from the Old German Raginald, both names introduced into England by the Normans. Reynolds means simply 'son of Reynold'.

However, in Ireland and Scotland the Norse personal name Rögnvaldr, which means 'ruler of the gods', was borrowed into Gaelic as Ragnall and this name too was anglicized as Reynolds. Also the MacRanalds or MacRannalls, Scots Gaelic MacRaonuill, became Crandle, Crangle, Crindle, Cringle, MacReynold and Reynolds.

The Co. Leitrim sept of MacRaghnaill, the MacRannalls, nearly all anglicized to Reynolds or MacReynolds. Thomas M'Grannell, of the main line, was in the 16th century the first to adopt the name Reynolds in obedience to an Elizabethan statute. The sept of Mag Raghainn in counties Armagh and Tyrone, which originally anglicized to Magronan and MacGronan, eventually, some as late as the 20th century, took the name Reynolds. The Renaghans, in Gaelic Ó Reannacháin, anglicized to Reynolds in the districts around Keady and Crossmaglen in Co. Armagh, and Castleblayney, Co. Monaghan. Around 1900, in the Cootehill district of Co. Cavan, Reynolds was being used interchangeably with Randalson, Reynoldson and Ronaldson.

Members' Questions



Q: May I be my Family Line Coordinator?

A: Until RFA received the question, there were no *Family Line* coordinators -- just a Line Coordinators, one for each acknowledged American progenitor. We still have Line Coordinators and now we will have *Family Coordinators*.

RFA RULES FOR FAMILY COORDINATORS

PURPOSE: The purpose of the RFA Family Coordinator is to collect, organize and document data on descendants of a particular Reynolds family, particularly one for whom a documented connection with an established Reynolds line cannot be identified. In general, the Family Coordinator will focus on one couple, and word toward identifying all of their descendants.

ELIGIBILITY: Any member of RFA may apply to be a Family Coordinator. It is generally expected that Family Coordinators will be a descendant of the couple for whom they apply to represent. One member of the couple, i.e., the husband or wife, must have the surname Reynolds or a variant spelling thereof.

REQUIREMENTS: Use of an IBM or compatible, MS-DOS personal computer using the LDS Personal Ancestral File (PAF) program is preferred for purposes of compatibility with other RFA functions. Other genealogy software which can produce a GEDCOM file is also acceptable. An organized, standardized system of typed or clear, handwritten family group sheets is also acceptable.

APPLICATION PROCESS: All applications for the position of Family Coordinator must be submitted to the RFA Executive Secretary and must indicate the names of the couple, and all significant identifying biographical data for both the husband and wife. The Family Coordinator may choose to include only descendant families with the surname Reynolds (or variant spelling), although RFA welcomes complete descendant files, including files of families of any surname. This is especially useful if there are intermarriages between branches of the family. The application must also include a statement and description of the specific system to be used for all record keeping and documentation, e.g., a specific computer program, family group sheets, etc. All applications will be reviewed by designated members of the Board of Directors. The RFA reserves the right to accept or reject any application. Generally, an application which identifies a couple which can be documented back to an established RFA line will not be accepted. An individual applying on the basis of such a couple will be referred to the appropriate Line Coordinator, and the Line Coordinator may determine the role of the individual with regard to responsibility and coordination of material for the particular family.

RESPONSIBILITY AND USE OF MATERIAL: Each Family Coordinator will be responsible to the RFA Executive Secretary. Once the initial organization of family data has been completed, it must be submitted to the Secretary for addition to the RFA Archives. Additional corrections and updates will be submitted to the Secretary periodically in order to maintain a current family file. Submitted information may be used to assist other RFA members to establish a family connection. The RFA reserves the right to print submitted material in the *Reynolds Recollections*, giving acknowledgment to the Family Coordinator, and may also edit the material as needed for printing. The Family Coordinator retains all other rights to the material, and the RFA will not publish the material in any other form without express permission as stated above.

GUIDELINES FOR FAMILY DOCUMENTATION TO BE USED BY FAMILY COORDINATORS

Using PAF or GEDCOM Compatible Software

- Start the family records file with the Reynolds member, whether husband or wife, as record #1, and the spouse as #2. Proceed with entering children in birth order if known.
- The name of the data file should help to identify the Reynolds progenitor. For example, JOSEPHMA for Joseph Reynolds of Massachusetts; BENONI for Benoni Reynolds; BUTLER for Edward and Ann (Reynolds) Butler; BUTTEMT for Michael Reynolds of Butte Montana.

Using Standardized Family Group Sheets

- The Family Group Sheets used should have either a section for recording all the sources and notes, or have an attached sheet for that purpose.
- Each married couple will have a separate Family Group Sheet, even if there are no children.
- Handwritten Family Group Sheets must be hand-printed or hand-written legibly.

Instructions for Documentation

- The Reynolds progenitor of the family (Record #1) and all direct descendants must have some documentation (in notes, not the actual document) of the source of any information provided about that individual. Spouses' notes should include sources for any specific data about them; however, if only his/her name is known from a source documented in the spouse's file, duplicate notes are not necessary.
- Anecdotal information may be included in the notes on any individual; however, an individual cannot be a primary source for a piece of information unless the individual was an eyewitness to the event.
- If the source of the information is personal knowledge it should be indicated in the notes. Also if the information is derived from conversations, interviews or correspondence, note the person who provided the information as the source.
- Specific locations of vital records, deeds, probate records, court records, etc. should be noted with the city/town/county/state where found and the appropriate book/register and page number if applicable. In addition, note any specific reference that could be used by another individual to locate the record. Specific locations of cemeteries should be included.
- Material taken from other published sources, such as family genealogies, source record anthologies/compilations, newspapers, etc. should contain a full bibliographical reference, including page numbers.
