A.H. JACK REYNOLDS' funeral will be 2 p.m. Friday at Peach United Church of Christ, with the Rev. Carl R. Schroedel officiating. Burial will be in Grandview Memorial Gardens. Mr. Reynolds, 79, of 616 13th St SE, a longtime Rochester salesman, died Tuesday of complications of emphysema at Rochester Methodist Hospital where he had been a patient since Saturday. He had been ill for five or six years. He was born 15 Oct 1905, in Madelia MN. He came to Rochester in 1921. He married Ida Schellhammer on 15 Aug 1935, in Eyota. Mr. Reynolds was a salesman and had

worked for Reynolds Wholesale Co., as well as the Pontiac garage. He was a member of the church council at Peace United Church of Christ and of United Commercial Travelers. He is survived by his wife; two daughters, Mrs. Don (Jean) Erdman of Rochester and Mrs. Michael (Alyce) Lundberg of Coon Rapids MN; a son, Dale of Bloomington; eight grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; and a brother, Gordon Reynolds of Rochester. A grandson and two sisters preceded him in death. Friends may call from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. Thursday at Vine Funeral Home, then one hour before the service on Friday. [Post Bulletin 29 May 1985. FRED J. REYNOLDS, long-time director of the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, IN, died on 18 Aug 1995, at the age of 84. Mr. Reynolds, who began working at the library as a page in 1930, eventually became director of the system in 1959. He retired in 1979. In 1961, under Reynolds' expert management and innovation, the Historical Genealogical Department was created. Since that time it has become the largest historical genealogy research center in any public library in the world. Curt B. Witcher, current manager of the department and president of FGS, observes, "His interest always rested in finding and making more and better information available...his simple vision, his ability to realize the maximum benefit out of nearly every situation...and his desire to serve the ordinary people in an extraordinary way established the tradition of excellence which guides the Allen County Public Library to this day." GORDON E. REYNOLDS, 91, of the Charter House and a longtime member of the Olmstead County Fair Board died Saturday (11 Apr 1992) at St. Marys Hospital after a brief illness. Born 14 Apr 1900, in Madelia MN, he grew up there. He had lived in Rochester since his marriage to Anna A. Rawley on 28 Apr 1922. Mr. Reynolds was a salesman for the Gamble-Robinson Co. and later founded Reynolds Wholesale Co. He sold the business in 1947. A promoter of horse harness racing, he owned and raced packers and trotters and had served as director of the Tri-State Harness Racing Association. He was a longtime member and secretary of the fair board. His wife worked at Kersten Furs and at Weber & Judd drug store. Mr. Reynolds was a member of First Christian Church, the Elks Lodge and United Commercial Travelers. There are no immediate survivors. A sister and brother predeceased him in death. The funeral was today at First Christian Church, with the Rev. Richard Sagarsee officiating. Burial will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday in Riverside Cemetery in Madelia MN. GENE^oLOGY

This column will be for early generations of RFA lines (American progenitors) that were not included in *The RFA Centennial Collection*. The lines acknowledged by RFA will be based on the "preponderance of evidence" provided by presently available supporting documentation. As stated above, RFA has American progenitors (lines) and members whose progenitors are not yet known. These are RFA Family Groups, which will be discussed in more detail later.

CHRISTOPHER REYNOLDS OF VIRGINIA by Sybil R. Taylor

Until more documentation is available, RFA will support the genealogy of Christopher of Virginia as presented in *Adventurers of Purse and Person, Virginia 1607-1624/5*, 3d ed, 1987, rev & ed by Virginia M. Meyer (from 1974-1981) and John Frederick Dorman, F.A.S.G. (from 1981-1987), published by Order of First Families of Virginia, 1607-1624/5, Richmond, 1987 [pp502-506].

It will be through these descendants that RFA will accept descendancy from Christopher without additional documentation. If you have additional supporting documentation for these families, please advise the editor. If you have any supporting documentation to carry this line down a generation, or more, please advise the Editor.

The verbatim text of the 3d edition follows:

REYNOLDS¹

***1. CHRISTOPHER¹ REYNOLDS** came to Virginia in the *John and Francis*, 1622, was recorded in the census, 1623/4, at Warwick Squeake (Isle of Wight), and in the muster, 1624/5, headed the list of Mr. Edward Bennett's men there.² On 13 March 1625/6 he deposed in the General Court "that he did see and read Peter Collins indentures and that by the indentures he was to serve Mr. Bennett four years."³

On 15 Sept. 1636 he was granted 450 acres in Warrisquick County bounded with a back creek and running eastward behind the Pagan Shore some three miles upward.⁴ A patent granted to John Mungoe, 21 Oct 1684, refers to 100 acres on the south east side of Hutchison's Creek which Robert Sabine sold to Christopher Reynolds, 21 Dec 1634, and which he in turn sold to Peter Hill, 1 May 1639.⁵

Christopher¹ Reynolds left a will dated 1 May 1654 which described him as "being in healthful Body and sound in Mind & Memory," made bequests to his sons Christopher,

John and Richard and daughters Abbasa [sic], Elizabeth and Jane, wife Elizabeth, and George Rivers (apparently a stepson), and directed that his wife Elizabeth have the ordering and bringing up of his sons John and Richard, to be of age at 16, and daughters Elizabeth and Jane to be of age at 15⁶. He apparently married (1) --- and (2) Elizabeth (---) Rivers.

Issue: (by 1) 2. CHRISTOPHER²; 3. Abbasa², mentioned in father's will as having had a "Portion already, which was 2 Cows and two Calves"; (by 2) 4. John², left will 11 March 1668/9-3 May 1669, naming "Brother George Rivers," brother Richard², sister Jane², "Sister Elizabeth Rivers" and her daughter Mary, and "sister Elizabeth Jordon ... (and) her son Richard Jordon";⁷ 5. RICHARD² 6. ELIZABETH²; 7. Jane²; 8. (perhaps) (child)², unborn at time father wrote his will.

2. CHRISTOPHER² REYNOLDS (Christopher¹) patented 350 acres in Isle of Wight county, 25 Nov. 1657, "by the miles end of four hundred and fifty acres of Land patented by Christopher Reynolds, Deceased." and running along Cypress Creek.⁸ He married --- Sharpe, sister of Richard Sharpe whose will, 15 Jan. 1699/1700, left all his land to "Cozen" (nephew) "Richard Reynolds ... to divide & give to his three sonnes, Richard, Sharpe & Christopher Reynolds," gave Richard, son of Richard, a silver tumbler, and named Richard Reynolds, who was designated in the probate as Richard Reynolds, Jr., as his executor.⁹

Issue: 9. RICHARD³

3. RICHARD² REYNOLDS (Christopher¹) on 23 April 1681, as Richard Reynolds, Senr., patented 380 acres on the north west side of Lower Bay Creek in Isle of Wight, 209 acres of which was part of 450 acres granted Christopher Reynolds, deceased, 15 Sept. 1638, and given by his will to his son John² who bequeathed to Richard².¹⁰ He sold this 380 acres to his nephew Richard Reynolds, Jr., 8 June 1698, and the next day Richard, Jr., sold him 100 acres of this same tract.¹¹ In 1704 he owned 853 acres in Isle of Wight County. He married Joyce, d/o Richard Staples.¹² An appraisal of the estate of Richard² Reynolds was made 24 June 1707.¹³

Issue: 10. CHRISTOPHER³; 11. JANE³; 12. Elizabeth³, deeded land by her father, 9 Oct. 1706.¹⁴

6. ELIZABETH² REYNOLDS (Christopher¹) married Richard Jordan of Isle of Wight Co. who on 10 May 1679 was granted 363 acres on the northwest side of the head of Lower Bay Creek at the mouth of Cypress Creek, adjoining Richard³ Reynolds, Jr.¹⁵ He married (2), by 20 Dec. 1680, Alice --, at which time he gave bond for her maintenance with his son John³ Jordan as security.¹⁶ Before his death he moved to Surry Co. where, 3 May 1687, his son Richard³ was granted administration on his estate¹⁷ and Charles Savadge was granted a probate of the nuncupative will of Alice Jordan.¹⁸

Issue: [Jordan] 13. RICHARD³; 14. JOHN³.

9. RICHARD³ REYNOLDS (Christopher², Christopher¹) on 10 May 1679, as Richard Reynolds the Younger, patented 566 acres in Isle of Wight County on the north west side of the lower Bay Creek, which included 241 acres, part of 450 acres granted Mr. Chr. Reynolds, 15 Sept. 1636, by his will given to his eldest son Christopher and his heirs forever, who bequeathed to Richard, his only son and heir, and another 100 acres, part of 350 acres granted, 18 March 1662/3, to Richard Jordan, Sr., who conveyed prior to the patent, 17 May 1658, to Chr. Reynolds, who bequeathed to Richard.¹⁹

He married Elizabeth, d/o George Williams. On 4 Feb. 1693/4 Richard Hutchins and his wife Elizabeth confirmed to Richard Reynolds, Jr., land then in the possession of Reynolds and Elizabeth his wife, d/o George William and the lawful inheritor.²⁰ Her brother George Williams, Jr., on 6 April 1700 conveyed to them an additional 97 acres of high land and 16 acres of marsh land.²¹ On the Isle of Wight quit rent roll, 1704, Richard Reynolds was charged with 746 acres and Elizabeth Reynolds with 100 acres.

Richard³ Reynolds left will, 27 July 1711-26 May 1712,²² giving to his wife Elizabeth for life the plantation he lived on, providing land for each of his three sons, and giving to Richd. Jackson land on Blackwater Swamp which he had sold him and given bond to acknowledge "when I have app^d for itt." The patent for 200 acres on Blackwater Swamp at the mouth of Tarapin Swamp was not issued to Richard Reynolds, Jr., until 13 Nov. 1713.²³ On the same day Mr. Richard Reynolds of Isle of Wight was granted (also posthumously) a new patent for 113 acres on the branches of Pagan Creek which included 97 acres deeded to him by George Williams.²⁴ His widow, Elizabeth Reynolds, held 816 acres in Isle of Wight County, 1714.²⁵

Issue: 15 Christopher⁴, died before 22 Feb. 1741/2 when his estate was divided to his unnamed widow and orphans²⁶, married, by 9 March 1715/6,²⁷ Anne ---; 16. Richard⁴, held 213 acres on Isle of Wight County, 1714,²⁸ married Rebecca --, who left will 4 May 1745-6 March 1755;²⁹ 17. Sharpe⁴, left will 8 July 1754-5 Sept. 1754.³⁰

10. CHRISTOPHER³ REYNOLDS (Richard², Christopher¹) on 28 July 1707 conveyed to Timothy Tynes 100 acres his father had purchased from Richard³ Reynolds, Jr., and his mother, Joyce, and wife Elizabeth, both relinquished their dower rights.³¹ On 28 April 1708 he conveyed to Robert Brock 450 acres which had been granted to his father by escheat patent, April 1682,³² and on 23 April 1711 he sold to John Butler 200 acres which Ambrose Bennett had given to him.³³ He married Elizabeth, d/o Robert and Susannah Brock.³⁴ He moved away from Isle of Wight County, perhaps to Northampton County, N.C.

Issue: John⁴.

11. JANE³ REYNOLDS (Richard², Christopher¹) married Richard Casey of Isle of Wight County who left will 8 March 1745/6-9 June 1748.³⁵ Her father conveyed to her and her husband, 9 Sept. 1706, part of the land he lived on.³⁶

Issue: [Casey]: 19. Ann⁴ married --- Applewhaite; 20. Sarah⁴, left will 31 May 1764-6 July 1775,³⁷ married John Smelley, who left will 16 Sept. 1764-7 Feb. 1765.³⁸ 21. Patience⁴; Martha⁴, married John Wills who left will 31 Oct. 1765-7 May 1772;³⁹ 23. Richard⁴, on whose estate John Scarsbrook Wills was granted administratoin, 7 April 1763.⁴⁰

13. RICHARD³ JORDAN (Elizabeth² Reynolds, Christopher¹) on 6 Nov. 1688 sold to Robert Caulfield land which he inherited as heir to his father.⁴¹ He was listed among the militia of Surry County, Oct. 1687. He married Elizabeth --- and left will 24 Sept. 1695-7 Nov. 1699.⁴²

Issue: [Jordan] 24. Richard⁴, deeded 130 acres by his father, 10 Sept. 1695,⁴³ owned 350 acres in Surry County, 1704, left will 27 Dec. 1749-19 Nov. 1751,⁴⁴ married ---; 25. Rachell⁴; 26. Elizabeth⁴, married John Fort, who left will 21 Oct 1725-10 March 1725/6;⁴⁵ 27. Margaret⁴, married --- House; 28. Charles⁴, under 20 in 1695; 29. Robert⁴, under 16 in 1695; 30. Hannah⁴; 31. Sarah⁴; 32. Mary⁴.

14. JOHN³ JORDON (Elizabeth² Reynolds, Christopher¹) was deeded by his father 100 acres in "Maine Cypress Swamp," 30 March 1679.⁴⁶ He married Jane ---, who 7 March 1681, as "wife of John Jordan," gave power of attorney to John Burwell "to discover any right and title I may have lost by deed of gift from my father-in-law Richard Jordan, Sr., to my husband for 6 acres of land and timber at the lower end of 100 acres."⁴⁷ He died before 21 Oct. 1687 when "Jane Jordan relict of John Jordan" was granted administration on his estate.⁴⁸ She was still alive when her son sold land in 1704.

Issue: [Jordan]. 33. John⁴, who sold, 9 Nov. 1704, to Nicholas Casey 100 acres conveyed by Richard Jordan, Sr., to his son John, 31 March 1679 and confirmed 1 Nov. 1679, "which said land did descend unto the said John Jordan from his father John Jordan".⁴⁹

In the eastern part of the country, we read of serious riots on the 18th at Lowestoft. (Due to the ravages of the Black Death in 1348 and 1361, there was a great shortage of manpower; and so that workers could not take advantage of the situation, the Legislature stepped in and limited, by statute, the legal wages of labourers, artisans, and servants.) The riots, as it appears from the indictments, were chiefly under the guidance of Richard Ressh, a foreigner from Holland.

The latest date of acts of violence in Suffolk on June 23, on which day JOHN REYNOLDS of Bawdsey on the east coast, seized the court rolls of the manors of Hollesley and Bawdsey and broke into the houses of George Glanoye and Clement Brethenham there. John Northern, also of Bawdsey, on the same day attacked the manor house at Hollesley belonging to Wm of Refford, Earl of Suffolk, who was then at Bury trying rioters in his official capacity, and took and burnt all his court rolls.

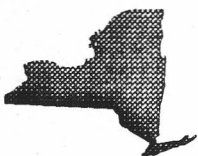

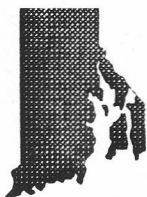

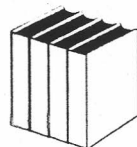

p82 After Ferris d in 1815, ae 93, the story of his imprisonment and terrible sufferings, from Nov 1778 to Jun 1782, has been too often published for me to repeat here. It is said that when Ferris' house was burnt by the British, JOHN REYNOLDS, a Tory from Shoreham, formerly a neighbor of Ferris' from Dutchess Co., in his zeal for his King, requested the privilege of putting the torch to Ferris' house with his own hands.

p84 WM. REYNOLDS, son of JOHN REYNOLDS, from New Concord NY, was a Tory, the only one who ever lived in this town [Shoreham VT]. Some time after the war, he settled in Canada on land given him by the British government.
