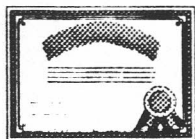

SCOTT REYNOLDS
the Toast of Lebanon IN

SCOTT REYNOLDS was no stranger to good test results, but he still did a double-take when he received the news in the mail this week that he had scored a rare but perfect 1,600 on his Scholastic Assessment Test.

"I rushed home from school to see what my score was and I was amazed," said the Lebanon High School Sr whose grade point average is 4.6 on a 4.0 scale. He said his high grade-point average comes from taking honors classes, which are weighted (and graded) higher than regular classes.

From his after-school job at the Lebanon Public Library, Scott called his mother Rachel, who was equally amazed... Scott said his sister, Lauren, 14, took the news with pride, but touched with a bit of natural sibling reaction: "She thinks people may expect her to live up to this."

News of his feat spread quickly throughout the Boone County town, and Scott became somewhat of a local celebrity – with good reason. Kevin Gonzalez, a spokesman for Educational Testing Services, the firm from Princeton NJ that administers the SAT, said... "We will have about 2 million students take the SAT this year, and significantly less than 1 percent will make the maximum score of 1,600."...

A National Merit Scholarship semifinalist, Scott took the SAT initially in Nov 1994 and scored an admirable 1380. But he wanted to retake the exam to improve his chances for selection as a National Merit Scholar...

He plans to earn an undergraduate degree in business before going to law school, where he would like to specialize in corporate law.

Young **Joshua Reynolds** - of the R.J. Reynolds tobacco family - was a believer, but he had trouble getting people to come to his seminars. His solution? Bring biofeedback to the people in the form of a personal monitor they could wear on their bodies.

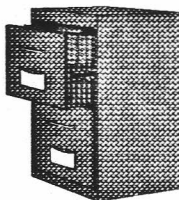
After learning of a stone made of a heat-sensitive crystal, Reynolds studied the changes in the stone's color and determined what each one meant when the stone was held close to the hand: Black stood for gloom and sadness, blue was tranquility, red-brown was irritability, purple was ecstasy, and yellow-green was stability and happiness.

Setting the stones in rings, Reynolds began selling them in 1975 for up to \$250 each. Demand was good, but almost at once, cheap knockoffs began appearing on the market, selling for just a few dollars each and cutting dramatically into Reynolds' sales. By 1976, there were mood watches, mood belts, and even mood underwear -- but (luckily) by that time the public's mood for them had passed. [Boca Raton FL: Globe Communications, 1995.]

p111: Chapter 8. Longfield Church in a time of Crisis, Civil War Years: When Deacon Joseph A. Cooper returned from the convention, he attempted to enlist official support for the Union cause. His efforts met with very limited success. The area leaders were afraid of reprisals from the State; however, Cooper readily gained support among the general populace. William S. Reynolds, a recent convert at Longfield Church, was one such supporter. Many other members from Indian Creek Church supported him. Among those advocates were John E. Hutson and William R. Hutson, sons of Elder James Hutson.

page 114-115: Chapter 8: Pilots, or guides, helped many Union men escape to KY to join the Federal Army. Generally, the pilots were older men, well acquainted with the mountain trails. The young men gathered at a pilot's home and waited for an opportune time to travel. To avoid detection by Confederate soldiers, the mountainous trek had to be made at night. After leading the men to an enlistment place, the pilot slipped cautiously back to his home. Pilots became noted for their skill and courage. Perhaps one of the most interesting pilots was also a Federal Army soldier. His name was William S. REYNOLDS. Reynolds, like Joseph Cooper, had been a soldier in the Mexican War. Upon enlistment in the Union Army, REYNOLDS was assigned to the Ohio Army Headquarters. He was appointed Chief of Scouts in the Secret Service. He acted as a pilot, spy, scout, and recruiting officer. It is said, that REYNOLDS frequently came to occupied Knoxville, sought out people here and there, and gathered information about the Confederate Army. At such times, he would pick up a few recruits and head back to KY. His daring ways became notable. REYNOLDS was greatly admired for his skill in outwitting Confederate soldiers. William S. REYNOLDS and his scouts often became involved in skirmishes with Confederate patrols. REYNOLDS was wounded on several occasions. One skirmish took place at Dandridge, TN, on May 19 or 20, 1864. Henry Diggs was in Reynolds's scouting party. Confederate soldiers discovered the position of the union scouts and attacked them. The fighting was brief, but furious. Reynolds was wounded in the leg, and Diggs was shot and killed by a Rebel cavalry man. Reynolds had the sad duty of burying his friend, and reporting Diggs' death to his widow.

p144 & 146. Chapter 9, An Era of Rebuilding and Growth: In Nov 1890, the "investigating" committee was given the responsibility of investigating and reporting "the names of members that drink." Those cited in Dec 1890: ...6. William Reynolds (not the William S. Reynolds of Civil War years). 7. Andrew Reynolds. During the 1890s, various other charges were brought against church members. Harvey Davis was caught playing cards. John Beach, John Massengill, and William Reynolds were caught gambling at a shooting match.

p86: Chapter 6, Church Discipline as Practiced in the Early Years: In 1848, Brother John Reynolds was charged with participating in a shooting match at Cherry Bottom. When his trial came up, he told the congregation that he believed he did nothing wrong. He said if the church could convince him he sinned, he would acknowledge it. The congregation labored with him for several meetings. Brother Reynolds was never convinced he did wrong. The church, finally, voted to exclude him.

p94: Chapter 7. Church Activities and Attitudes

p155: Chapter 10. The Years Following the Turn of the Century 1900: At 7:30 Monday morning, May 19, 1092 [1902?], the worst mining catastrophe in the history of the South occurred. An estimated 184 men were killed in an explosion at the Fraterville Mine near Coal Creek TN. Twenty-one of those men were active members at Longfield Church, and many others regularly attended church meetings. a total of 35 men were buried at Longfield Cemetery. 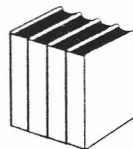
