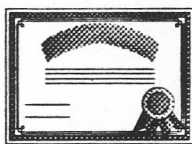

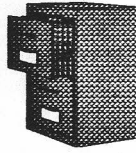
Copies of these photos can be made (at cost) for any RFA member. Send request to Editor.

From Sarasota [FL *Herald-Tribune*, Saturday, 7 Oct 1995: Richard Frederick **Reynolds**, 59, Venice, died 5 Oct 1995. He was born 23 Jul 1936, in West Haven CT, and came to Venice 11 years ago from CT. He was a maintenance worker for Royal Coachman Resort in Venice. He was a Protestant. Survivors include his wife, Judith; three daughters, Debbie of Venice and Donna **Monroe** and Diane **Yenna**, both of North Port; a brother of Norfolk VA; and five grandchildren. Universal Cremation Society is in charge. [From Vera **Bunkoff**, Schenectady NY]

pp 225: Martha **Davenport** b 11 May 1731, d 8 Oct 1758 m 4 Jan 1758 Mr. **Reynolds** s/o Rev. Peter **Reynolds** of Enfield, CT by whom she had seven children. She afterward m Deacon ELY of Long Meadow.

pp 203: Martha Davenport **Wolcott** m Hezekiah **Reynolds** in 1778 who was the father of John Davenport **Reynolds** of Wallingford, and William Augustus **Reynolds** who until his death (1874) owned and resided in the old Davenport place in Elm St., New Haven. B. Martha **Raynolds**, b 3 Feb 1761 Longmeadow. Married 1 Feb 1792, Rev. Aaron **Bascom**, b 1 Dec 1746 Western, d 19 May 1814 Chester. Harvard 1768, trained as a minister. He early served as a missionary among the Indians in the Mohawk valley. In 1869, he was ordained

over the church at Chester, MA, its first pastor, and here he spent the remaining years of his life. She m 2nd 21 Apr 1821, Seth **King**, of Suffield, CT. (Information from *Thomas Bascom and His Descendants*, by Edward Doubleday **Harris**, Boston 1870).

1. **Raynolds Bascom**, b 26 Nov 1793 Chester, d 1828 Camden. Williams College 1813, Andover Theological Seminary 1819. He was Principal of the Academy at Westfield, MA, and afterwards settled as preacher at Camden, SC. He was also a missionary in the Choctaw Tribe of Indians. Huguenots of Pennsylvania

Memorials of the Huguenots in America with Special Reference to their Emigration to PA, by Rev. A. Stapleton, life member of the PA Historical Society. Carlisle PA: Huguenot Publishing Co., 1933. Originally published 1901, index, paper, 164 pp, lists over 1,000 Huguenot refugees. [RFA has pp 122, 123 (re LaRue family) and 148.]

P148: ...The following are names of parents with earliest entry of baptisms of children: (I)...Daniel Renolle, 1755... The Conewago Colony: On the head waters of the Conewago creek, in the eastern limits of Adams Co., a considerable number of Huguenots located at an early day. Among these were...James Pettit...Abraham Larue...Adam DeGomis...John Noel...Also Daniel Renolle prior to 1751. None of the foregoing appear on the lists as foreign emigrants, and it is therefore a fair presumption that they came hither from an older colony. That his inference is correct is born out by the fact that the...and other families named are found among the Huguenots who came to NY and NJ. Soon after 1760 a large number of French and a few Dutch families removed hither from Shralenburg, in Bergen Co. NJ. Their settlement was confined to a locality now in the townships of Traban and Berwick in Adams Co. They were rigid adherents of the Dutch Reformed faith, and built a church in Conewago about two miles east of the present village of Hunterstown. About 1781 many of them concluded to attempt another colonial experiment by securing a large body of land in Shelby Co. KY...In 1793 another colony of nine families left the Conewago settlement, and located at Owasco Lake, in Cayuga Co. NY. To such an extent was the Conewago colony reduced by removals and defections that the maintenance of a distinctive congregation of their faith (the Dutch Reformed), became impractical and in 1817 they petitioned the Legislature for permission to sell their church, which was granted..."

Christian Reynolds, Codorus Township, administration report filed March 7, 1837.

Daniel Renoll, Codorus Township, will probated, Dec. 27, 1800. Wife Mary Elizabeth, eldest son Daniel living in

Washington County, Maryland, sons, Christian and Henry at home, son Peter in Washington Co., Md., son Jacob, daughter Elizabeth married to Feliz Glatfelter, Barbara married to Peter Lau, Susanna married to Adam Ernst and Magdalena married to Conrad Meyer. Page 203, Book "K".

Henry Renoll, Codorus Township, will probated Oct. 14, 1824. Sons, Henry Daniel, (Is this Henry Daniel or Henry and Daniel?) Adam, Jonathan, Samuel, David and daughters Salome married to Samuel Ruth, Litia and Elizabeth Renoll. Page 178, Book "P".

Records in Christ Lutheran Church of York

Catharine Reynold, daughter of John and Catharine, born March 28, 1813, baptized May 27, 1813.

Daniel Renoll and Martha Hutton were married January 1, 1829 in the First Reformed Church of York.

Samuel Ronalds, son of Thomas and Elizabeth, born April 6, 1794, baptized April 10, 1794.

Records in the Register of Wills' Office at York

Samuel Reynolds died in Cumberland Township, York County (now Adams) in 1758. His will was probated here at York May 2, 1758. Names wife Marthew, daughter Mary Reynolds and brothers William, James, Robert Reynolds. Mentions brother-in-law Samuel Perry and uncle David McGaw. Page 168, Book "A".

William Randels Sr., Newbury Township, York County, will probated March 30, 1792. Daughter Hannah Miller, daughter Martha Randels, daughter Martha Randels [sic], daughter Janett Randals, sons William and Hugh. Page 303, Book "H".

Records in "Cuthbertson's Diary"

(Cuthbertson was a missionary who traveled through Lancaster, York and parts of Cumberland County):

Hugh Reynolds and Margaret Neilee were married Nov. 30, 1756.

John Reynolds, son of Margaret Reynolds, baptized April 27, 1760.

John and Elizabeth, son and daughter of George Reynolds of Big Cove, were baptied (sic) Dec. 4, 1751.

Joseph Reynolds, son of Henry Reynolds, baptized August 15, 1759.

Joseph Reynolds, son of Margaret Reynolds, baptized April 7, 1763.

William Reynolds and Martha T. Patterson were married January 1, 1754.

William Reynolds, son of Mary Reynolds, baptized April 18, 1758.

Records in the Recorder of Deeds' Office at York

Dec. 3, 1762, Henry **Reynolds** of Lower Chichester Township, Chester County, carpenter and Sarah his wife, and Samuel **Reynolds** of Spyark in Lower Chichester Township, Chester County, miller, and Jane his wife deeded land to George **Stevenson** of Yorktown. This land had belonged to Henry **Reynolds**, dec. Book "B", Page 35.

Whereas William **Logan** in Court Oct., 1758 obtained a warrant against Martha **Reynolds** and Samuel **Perry** and David **Magaw**, executors of the estate of Samuel **Reynolds**, dec., late of Marsh Creek, York County (now Adams County). The deed states that Samuel **Reynolds** died owing a debt of 607 pounds and the Court ordered that the said executors sell the deceased tract of land in Cumberland Township. The land was sold at public sale to Hance **Hamilton**. This deed dated March, 1759 is found on Page 332, Book "A".

The tombstone of Samuel **Reynolds** still stands in Lower March Creek Cemetery, near Gettysburg, Adams County, Pa. with the following inscription: "**Reynolds**, Here lyes ye body of Samuel **Reynolds** April 29, 1758 aged 38 years."

Blunston's Land Grant west of the Susquehanna

John **Reynolds** obtained a Grant April 10, 1737 for 250 acres of land (a settlement for his son) on a branch of the Conegochague below the land surveyed to Hans **Ireland**.

John **Reynolds**, July 7, 1737, obtained a Grant for 100 acres of land at a place called Pine Meadows amongst the Pine Barnes [Barrens?], about 2 miles southwesterly from where he lives.

A search through the Pennsylvania Archives revealed the fact that John **Reynolds** from York County served in the Revolution under Capt. Charles **Coulston** of York County Militia. He was a seven months' man. Found on Page 693, Volume 2, Sixth Series, Pennsylvania Archives.

William **Renolds** served in the York County Militia after the Revolution in 1786-7 under Capt. **Taylor**, Page 1416, Volume 3, Sixth Series, Pennsylvania Archives.

Members Write

A Reynolds Family History

I have [obtained] much of the following from *Pioneer Families of Dryden, Lapeer County, Michigan*.

William Reynolds, b 1812, Aryshire, Scotland, d 1893 Dryden MI, buried in Thornville Cemetery which he helped found on 27 May 1874. He moved to Ireland in 1830 and to New York in 1832. He m 1st 1833 New York NY Margaret Fleming, d/o James and Sarah Fleming, b 1807 Monahan, Ireland, d 18 Oct 1868 Dryden MI, bur Thornville Cemetery. Their child: William Joseph Reynolds, b 10 Feb 1842 NJ, d 21 Feb 1901 Dryden MI, bur Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, Dryden.

The earliest record I have of William J. Reynolds is his Volunteer Enlistment Oath, dated 21 Mar 1865 in Pontiac (Oakland) MI. The enlistment is for one year. In it he is described as being 5'8" tall, with hazel eyes, brown hair and dark complexion. He was given a \$33.33 bounty for enlisting. By 13 Apr 1865 he is mustered as a Private with Co. E, 8th MI Regt, MI Cavalry. By July he is mustered with Co. L. The 22 Sep 1865 Muster Out Roll in Nashville TN shows that he retains his revolver and saber and has to pay the U.S. \$11.00 for a pair of spurs.

On 27 Nov 1905 the U.S. Pension Agency in Detroit MI reports that he has been dropped as a pensioner due to death. While serving in the above mentioned regiment he was disabled by an "injury to the head and deafness contracted at Columbia TN in Aug or Sep 1865."

I have a letter from Linda Lee, which was written to her grandfather Oliver A. Reynolds from his father William J. Reynolds, dated "Dryden March 11/1900," which reads as follows:

"My Dear Boy it is Sunday night and your Ma and me are here alone Roy went out for a drive and I guess he is at the League, for he has not come back yet him & me were at church this morning and after dinner he went with Frank he has not been drove much since you were here he feels good & want exercise your Grand Pa went up to North Branch yesterday to be gone a couple of weeks, so we are here alone to night Ma is reading, and O.S. Daleys

team has just gone by with a load I presume for Church Bade took a load this forenoon. The snow has settled down so it is quite good sleighing now and people are making good use of it there is to be church Social at Philander Foots {Ardis Waggoner, a historian in Dryden has told me that this man was her Great-grandfather.} next Tuesday Eve & Every body is invited a good place to go they are nice People. They had one at Mr. Daley a week ago Saturday, a success financially, all for Church also one at Mark Braidwood a short time ago. I intind going to the corners in the morning to see to having a lease made out for Robert also Chattel mortgage we have got home 200 posts and we are going to draw 100 for Robbie I think we will do to morrow march weather is such you cant tell what you can do in the matter of work a great ways ahead, it has been a stormy month so far, but Lish Whitaker said if march comes in like a Lamb it ll go out like a Lamb, well how to do you like your work it is better than to be working nights I would nt like working nights but I have done a lot of it a weaving carpets in Philadelphia your Grand Pa Reynolds your Uncle Robert & me we wuold work until 9 & 10-o-clock nights and all day but we was making good wages them times Robert & me were only Boys then & we could make 1,75 to 2,25 a day & father could make more but now times are changed, that work is done by power now. But I can not help thinking of them times, but that was before [the] war..., it dont seem to me but a little while ago when the 6th & 8th massachusetts Infantry were on their way to washington & other troops lots of them I had a chance to seem them as they passed but my what changes since that time I am quite along in years & Roy is older than I was then or perhaps I was 19 or 20, many a good man was buried in the south on a count of that war & may have passed away here gone home & I am writing about it well Ollie Roy got them apple trees trimmed up but snow has been so deep we have nt done any thing but our chores lately. But the first of April will soon be here & lots of work will show up some fince to make besides the regular farm work to do, I would rather work than play gentleman, all we need is good health and we are usually well trusting this will find you all well I will close this by saying good bye for this time & love to you all your father W.J. Reynolds."

The 1860 U.S. Census for Philadelphia PA, 19th Ward,

lists William **Reynolds**, age 50 (1810), b in Scotland, as a "carpenter." His wife, Margaret, age 51 (1809), b in Ireland. Lists their ch as Joseph aged 16, Robert aged 14, and twins named Eliza and Margaret aged 13 (1847).

The 1870 U.S. Census for Dryden (Lapeer) MI lists a Thomas **Reynolds** aged 36 (1834) b NJ, wife Pebe aged 35 (1847) b NY, ch (all b MI) Mary, age 8 (1862); Bessie, age 6 (1864); Wm age 1 (1869).

Living next door are William age 58 (1812) b Scotland, Wm J. age 28 (1842) b NJ, Harriet age 28 (1852) b MI, Albert age 2 (1868). Also listed in William's household are: Sarah **Cardwell** age 31 (1839) b NJ, Jirah **Cardwell**, male age 10 (1860) b MI, Alida, female age 9 (1861) b MI. These are William Joseph **Reynolds**, his wife Harriet **Lewis** and their father William **Reynolds**. William's wife Margaret had died in 1869 after they left Philadelphia. I do not know who Albert is, unless he was William and Harriet's first child that died very early.

The 1880 U.S. Census for Dryden MI shows Thomas and Phebe **Reynolds** and their family.

A few houses down are listed W. **Reynolds**, age 68, born Scotland, with both mother and father born Scotland, Susan, wife age 67 b NJ; and Jerry **Cardwell**, grandson, age 20, b MI. This is William's 2d wife. The **Cardwell** boy seems to be the same as the Jirah in the 1870 census. Sarah **Cardwell** has since married Peter Van Bergen **Schuneman**, and it seems that Jirah (Jerry) is living with grandpa.

I have some confusing info pertaining to Patrick Reynolds, born abt 1760, in Co. Meath IRE. He m. a total of 3 times, with his 1st two wives being born (and apparently passing away) in IRE. By the year 1800 Patrick had fathered 10 sons: William b 1786, Patrick b 1788, Thomas b 1789, John b 1791, Roderick b 1793, Cornelius b 1795, Redmond b 1796, Jarleth b 1798, Dennis b 1799, and Philip b 1800. Around 1800, or thereabouts, he relocated to Culpeper VA, where he allegedly married for a third time. The name of this wife is unknown.

I'm quoting from a document, appears to be dated around 1910, the source of which is uncertain. Patrick Reynolds "married a 3rd wife at Culpeper Court House, Virginia. He resided at Knobber, Meath Co IRE. Then sailed to the United States in 1774 on the ship (--blank--) with his 10 sons. After being at sea six weeks they had reached New Foundland Banks when a storm rose and drove the vessel back to the Irish coast. After arriving in the U.S. he settled at Culpeper Court House and resided there until (--blank--) when he moved down east to (--blank--)."

He obviously didn't have 10 children in 1774, at least some of the dates given are obviously wrong. That would mean that William, born 1786, never went to America or went and returned, as the Family Group Sheet indicates.

"Other info that I have, and have no idea as to its validity, is that members of this line brought legal action against the Reynolds Tobacco Family for whatever and lost. The time and venue is unknown."

Elizabeth (Reynolds) Tubb

I have very little info on my Reynolds ancestor - what I

have found was included in a well documented book published on her husband's family (Tubb). Although it does not give the source (other than general reference to family bible records), it lists Elizabeth Reynolds' birth date as 6 Apr 1792. She married James Tubb Jr about 1813 in Smith Co TN (later Dekalb Co).

...I did find reference in a book (from the TN Co History Series) on DeKalb Co that among the earliest settlers in the area were John, Gay, Josiah & James Reynolds who were brothers. Josiah married Sarah Exum (from NC) in 1815. Gay died about 1820 leaving 2 minor daughters, Amanda and Mary. I have "lost" John & James. There is also a William Reynolds who appears early in Smith Co records - he received a NC land grant in the same area in 1797 - I have also found a reference that he was married to the sister of Josiah's wife, Sarah Exum.

I have checked Tillman's book on the Reynolds family and found Elizabeth listed as the wife of James Tubb, and as the mother of my ancestor, Julia Tubb. Though not all of her children are listed, the ones that are listed are correct. The book names Elizabeth's parents as John Reynolds & Mary Davis who married in VA 1792. I found that marriage record in Prince Edward Co VA. Also, Elkanah & John both appear on VA census records up through 1820 in Prince Edward Co. Since the marriage was in Feb 1792 (only 2 months before Elizabeth's birth) it doesn't seem likely that Elizabeth was their child (though certainly possible). The fact that John & Mary remain in Prince Edward Co, however, seems to eliminate them as her actual parents as does the fact that John is listed on the marriage bond as the son of Elkanah.

Among the other children attributed to John & Mary Davis Reynolds are Peter & John. Both of those men appear in the later census records for Smith Co. Although Peter had died by the 1850 census, his wife (the one listed in the book) appears and John (jr.) also appears with the same 1800 birth year. Although I can't recall offhand which one, either John or Peter had named their first born daughter Narcissa, and Elizabeth also named her firstborn dau Narcissa. Since this was not a common given name, it seems to be a possible link between Elizabeth, John & Peter. In addition, Peter's family is living next to Elizabeth's husband (she died in 1843) and John is shown living very close to both of them.

Tillman's book lists the parents of John Reynolds (who married Mary Davis & is the father of Peter, John & Elizabeth) as John David Reynolds & Mary Martha Gay. Among the children of John David & Mary Martha are James, Josiah, Gay & John - these appear to be the same men who were in TN records around 1800-1810. I am really confused now! The info on John David & Mary Martha's children becomes quite confusing. Another child attributed to John David and Mary Martha is Lydia who m. Benjamin Benbow I have found the will of David Reynolds in Guilford Co NC records (probated 1815) in which he names

his son-in-law Benjamin **Benbow**, dau Lydia **Benbow**. Further, he mentions that he has a brother, Jeremiah **Reynolds**. This would appear to be the same John David, but since it mentions none of the sons attributed to him, isn't much help.

I believe my Reynolds famliy which appears in Smith Co TN was from NC and were from either Randolph or Guilford Co (David & Jeremiah **Reynolds** both are listed on 1810 census in Randolph Co.)

Info is that Paris later lived in Amherst (Lamb) TX. Have no record of when Henry J died or where bur; have no record of who Paris married or if he had any children.

I know John William had a brother George Washington **Reynolds**, and "Wash" moved his family to MO some time after the Civil War began. The 1840 census records for Hardy Co show only one Reynolds - Henry **Reynolds**, and I suspect he was John and Wash's father. In the 1850 census for Hardy Co there are three Reynolds households: John William **Reynolds**, Henry **Reynolds**, and James **Reynolds**. At the time of the 1850 census, "Wash" was living with John William and Sarah **Reynolds**, as was an Elizabeth S. **Reynolds** (do not know who she was). I suspect that James Henry **Reynolds** was a brother of John and Wash, but certainly would like to be able to confirm that as well as go on farther down the line.
