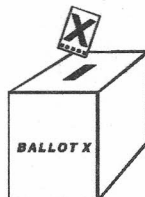

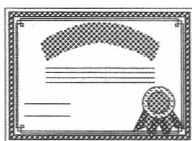
George Reynolds of Cooper County, Missouri

George Reynolds, a highly respected pioneer of Cooper County, residing in Kelly township, is a native of West Virginia. He was born in Brooks Co. 8 May 1847, a son of Josephus and Margaret (Umphrey) Reynolds, both natives of Ohio, born near Steubenville. The mother died in 1897, the father having died in 1870, in Johnson Co. MO. He came to Cooper Co. in 1867 and settled near Nebo, Cooper Co. Josephus and Margaret (Umphrey) Reynolds were the parents of the following children: Samuel, who resides at Boonville, and George, the subject of this sketch were twins; Frank, lives in Boonville; William F. died in 1898 near Blackwater; Robert Scott, died in infancy; Joshua, the eldest of the family was killed at Hatches Run VA, while serving in the Union Army during the Civil War.

George Reynolds has lived in Cooper Co. for 52 years with the exception of 1881 and 1882, when he resided in Vernon Co. He bought his present home in Kelly township in 1887. His farm consists of 120 acres, which is nicely located and makes a pleasant home. His residence is located on an eminence which gives a commanding view of the surrounding country, and under proper atmospheric condition a splendid view of 20 miles to the northwest can be had from this place.

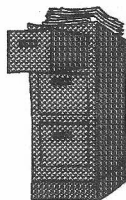
George Reynolds was married in 1872 to Miss Sarah Gallagher, a daughter of Charles and Susan Gallagher, who were early settlers in Moniteau Co., coming from VA. To this union were born the following children: Dr. William H., who resides in Pettis Co., married Minnie Kahrs, and they have two children, Della May and William K.; Cora Maay, married J.J. Baxter, Rockyford CO, and they have four children, Gussie, Arthur N., Walter H., and Willa S.



Mrs. Reynolds died 6 Feb 1901, and her remains are buried in Hopewell Cemetery. Mr. Reynolds is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church at Bel Air. He is an intelligent and well posted gentleman and one of Cooper County's best citizens. (From *History of Cooper County Missouri*, p1109.)

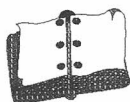

Mrs. Harriet (Lockwood) Reynolds

June 1937: Mrs. Harriet (**Lockwood**) **Reynolds**, a native of Milan and a Life Member of the Firelands Historical Society, who had lived much of her life in Saginaw MI passed away in that city 3 Dec 1933 at the age of 93 years. Born in Milan (Erie) OH, 25 May 1840, the d/o George and Jane (**Osborn**) **Lockwood**, she belonged to one of the early pioneer families of the Firelands. After her marriage on 24 Jan 1865 to Sylvanus J. **Reynolds**, she went as a bride to Saginaw MI where her husband was a leading hardware merchant, a member of the firm of **Shaw, Reynolds and Choate**, and where she assumed at once an active interest in the social and religious activities of the then small lumbering community. She joined the First Congregational church and at the time of her death was its oldest living member. The Saginaw chapter of the D.A.R. also claimed her as its oldest living member. Her husband, S.J. **Reynolds**, who was also formerly of Milan OH, located in Saginaw in 1860 and passed away there in 1908. After his death Mrs. **Reynolds** spent ten years living with her nephew J.C. **Lockwood** in Toledo OH. He was an inveterate traveler and despite her advancing years, she accompanied him on every trip of any consequence. One of these journeys took her approximately 1000 miles inland up

the Amazon River through the dense jungle region in Brazil. In 1919 Mrs. **Reynolds** returned to Saginaw, and made her home with her daughters, Mrs. Carl G. **Lilliestierna** and Mrs. A.B. **Williams**, who survived. She was also survived by three grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Burial was in Brady Hill, Saginaw.

Mrs. Coraline A. (Lockwood) Noake

June 1937: Mrs. Coraline A. (Lockwood) Noake, member of a pioneer family of Milan [OH], died at the home of her brother Walter Lockwood in that village, 8 Jan 1931. She was the widow of the late William H. Noake of Chicago IL, and was survived by her only son, Harry F. Noake of Los Angeles CA. Mrs. Noake was the eldest child of Frank G. and Electa (Reynolds) Lockwood and died in the house in which she was born. Burial was in Milan.

Mrs. Electa M. (Reynolds) Lockwood

1909?: Mrs. Electa M. **Lockwood** died in Milan [OH] 30 Jul 1907. Electa **Reynolds** was the 12th child of Jason and Esther **Reynolds** and was born in Moscow (Livingston) NY 13 Oct 1833. Of her family but one is living -- a sister, Mrs. Eliza M. **Wardel** of Oakille MI. About the year 1850 she came to Milan with her mother and others of her family. A sister, Mrs. **Marti**, and another sister, Mrs. **Hackett**, with their families, lived many years in Milan. Except for a short time spent at Norwalk Mrs. **Lockwood** remained one of Milan's well known and respected residents. In Apr 1854, she was united in marriage to Francis G. **Lockwood**, who died in Milan 25 Jul 1891. Three children survive her -- Mrs. Cora **Noake** of Chicago, the only daughter, Walter of Milan, and Fred of Grand Rapids MI. Mrs. **Lockwood** lived an industrious, useful life, and many friends can testify to the hospitality of her home and her ready response when an opportunity offered to help another.

Obituaries

Captain Charles A. Reynolds, adjutant and inspector at Fitch's Home for the Soldiers, at Noroton, Conn., died at the Home on Saturday 27 Feb, 1904. Capt. Reynolds was born in Winsted 66 years ago. He enlisted in the 19th Conn. Infantry, afterwards the 2d Conn. Artillery, in 1861; was promoted several times, and made an excellent record during the war for the Union.

Capt. **Reynolds** was a member of Merriam Post, G.A.R., of Meriden; of St. Andrew's Lodge, F. and A.M., of Winsted; of the Army and Navy Club of Connecticut; of the New York Commandery; Military Order of the Loyal Legion. [RFA Annual, 1904, p.25.]

Captain H. Frank Reynolds died 25 May 1905, in Florence Neb. He was chief engineer of the steamship *Pioneer*, which, in 1866, went to the relief of the Sir John **Franklin** Arctic Expedition and recovered the bodies of Franklin and six companions. Capt. **Reynolds** was 81 years of age, and is survived by his brother Edwin **Reynolds**, of Milwaukee. [RFA Annual, 1905, p. 39.]

Mrs. Sally A. Reynolds Holmes, widow of the late Hazard Holmes, died 16 May 1905, at Westerly R.I., in the 87th year of her age...She leaves four children: Mrs. Edward W. **Doty**, Frank W. **Holmes**, Mrs. Frank W. **Coy**, and Miss Fannie D. **Holmes**. [RFA Annual, 1905, p. 39.]

Mrs. Emma Louise Church Reynolds, wife of Wilbur A. **Reynolds**, D.D.S., died 3 Feb 1906 [sic], at her home in Boston, Mass., aged 36. She was...interested in church and charities, and a prominent member of the Daughters of Vermont, having held the office of vice-president of that order. [RFA Annual, 1905, p. 39.]

Dexter Reynolds, of Albany N.Y., died 19 Aug 1906, at the home of his sister, Mrs. Bayard **Van Rensselaer**, which had also been his home for 30 years. He was born at Albany, 22 Dec 1828, and was a descendant of John Reynolds of Watertown, Mass. Being educated as a lawyer, he was admitted to the bar at age 23 years. Practicing at that profession, he at the same time engaged in inventing, obtaining 20 or more patents. Among these were a type-setting machine, a type-distributor, and a direct steel process. He served in the Civil War as paymaster of his regiment. In 1865 he married Catherine Maley **Cuyler**, of Cuylersville. Two sons survive him, Cuyler **Reynolds** and Marcus **Reynolds**, both of Albany. [RFA Annual, 1907, pp. 11-12.]

Henry Augustus Street, M.D., died 9 Feb 1907. He was born 6 Sep 1832, at Cheshire, Conn...he studied surgery, and during the Civil War was stationed at the Connecticut General Hospital at New Haven. After a time he abandoned surgery and engaged in business. He delighted in the study of genealogy, and had collected data for a very full genealogical record of his own ancestry. Dr. **Street** is survived by a widow, Elizabeth **Roberts Street**, a son, Edward A. **Street** of New Haven, and two daughters, Mrs. S.B. **Hutchinson** of Trenton, N.J., and Miss Esther D.

Street, of New Haven, also by a brother, Frederick F. **Street** of Hartford, Conn., and a sister, Mrs. Jeannette **Fleming** of Harrisburg, Pa. [RFA Annual, 1907, pp. 11-12.]

George Huntington Reynolds died 3 January 1908 at Mansfield Depot, Conn. Mr. Reynolds was a descendant of James Reynolds of North Kingstown R.I. He was born at Mansfield 8 Feb 1829, one of 12 children. Working on a farm in his boyhood, and later as a spinner in a factory, he employed his spare moments studying and practicing mechanical drawing. As a result he gradually worked his way up to the position of chief draughtsman of the Delamater Iron Works and, after the Civil War, became superintendent of the same. He held the latter position until 1884, when he resigned to take a position with the Crane Elevator Co. of Chicago. His work in that capacity resulted in great improvement in the passenger elevator service. He was also an inventor and builder of dynamite guns and locomobiles. In 1853 Mr. Reynolds married Abby E. **Brown**, of Westfield, Vt. Four children were born to them, two of whom are living -- George Osmar **Reynolds** and Irving H. **Reynolds**. [RFA Annual, 1908, pp. 12-14.]

The Rev. Elmer Kendall Reynolds died 25 Jan 1908 at Farmington Ill., where he was pastor of the Baptist Church. He was born at Albany, Vt., 27 Dec 1861, of the family line of John of Wethersfield. After attending schools in Vermont and Massachusetts, and taking an academic course in Wisconsin, he finished his education in Illinois at Morgan Park Theological Seminary, and then labored for 15 years as a successful and much beloved pastor, serving four different churches. His wife was May **Cady**, of El Paso, Ill. She and their five children survive him. [RFA Annual, 1908, pp. 12-14.]

Mrs. Henry Kirke Wight died at home in Indian Orchard, Mass., 8 Mar 1908. Jane (**Eaton**) **Wight** was born East Lyme, Conn., a daughter of Jacob S. and Adeline (**Reynolds**) **Eaton**. Her childhood was spent at Ludlow, Mass. where she received her education and afterwards engaged in teaching. She is best known for her great love for and devotion to the Evangelical Church, of which she had been a member 57 years. She served the church as organist and teacher of the young men's class in Sunday School. She was a member of the D.A.R., the Y.W.C.A., and a Children's Aid Association, and was also an enthusiastic student of genealogy. She married Henry Krike **Wight** 10 Dec 1862. Her husband survives her, also a son, Ralph Waldo **Wight**, and a grandson, Kirke Stafford **Wight**. [RFA Annual, 1908, pp. 13.]

John Dwight Reynolds, former RFA member, died 3 Jun 1908 at his home at Andover, N.J. in his 81st year. His birthplace was Mansfield, Conn., and he was a brother of

the late George H. **Reynolds** of that place, and of Edwin **Reynolds** of Milwaukee, Wis. Beginning teaching in autumn 1849 at Stillwater, he continued teaching in schools of Andover, Dover, Washington, N.J. and several other places. For a time he was town superintendent of schools...Mr. **Reynolds** was a member of the Andover Presbyterian Church, and the last survivor of the first Board of Ruling Elders, having been a member since 1858. He married Martha **Slater** 6 Apr 1854. A second marriage occurred 26 Dec 1863 to Mrs. Mary A. (**Stackhouse**) **White**. He is survived by a daughter and granddaughter.

The Hon. Edwin Ruthven Reynolds, of Albion, N.Y., a member of RFA, died at home 4 Jul 1908. He was born at Salem, N.Y., 16 Feb 1816. He learned the printer's trade in his father's newspaper office at Poultney, Vt., when Horace **Greeley** was an apprentice there. He graduated Hobart College, Geneva, N.Y. For six years he was principal of Albion Academy, meanwhile studying law and being admitted to the bar. As justice of the peace, as county superintendent of schools, as editor of his county paper, the *Orleans American*, and as contributor to other local papers, he became prominent in public affairs. Being elected to the 46th Congress he had the privilege of standing near President Lincoln when he delivered his first inaugural address. Upon returning home he served his county as judge and surrogate for four years; then for many years engaged in the practice of law. He was an earnest Christian and a member of the Presbyterian Church. Mr. **Reynolds** married Elizabeth Ann **Gale**, who died in 1905, at Gaines, N.Y. in 1847. He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Grace **Phillips**, of Albion, who has resided with him and cared for him since the death of his wife. [RFA Annual, 1908, pp. 14.]

Adolphus O. Reynolds, of Media, Pa., died 12 Aug 1908, at Colora, Md. A native of Lancaster County, Pa., he entered the employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company after attending the West Nottingham Academy of Cecil County, Md., and held an important position with the company for many years. Mr. **Reynolds** was a member of the Maryland branch of the family, and after the death of John T. **Reynolds** was elected to succeed him as a member of the Committee on Family History, representing his branch.
