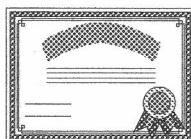

Watkins Matthews, Rancher from Bygone Era, Dies at 98

Watkins Reynolds **Matthews**, a wiry wrangler who spent more than half a century presiding over his family's showcase Texas cattle spread, died on April 13 at the historic Lamshead Ranch, 140 miles west of Fort Worth. He was 98 and the last of his generation in one of the state's oldest and most prominent cattle families.

The 65-square-mile ranch is not especially large by Texas standards -- not much more than twice the size of Manhattan -- but Lamshead was plenty big enough for Watt Matthews. Although he was born in the little town of Albany, a few miles away, he grew up on the ranch, and except for the four years he spent at Princeton University and his regular trips back for reunions of the Class of 1921, he ever say much reason to leave.

After all, his family had been working the ranch since the middle of the last century. Among the first of the region's white settlers, the **Matthews** and **Reynolds** clans helped establish the state's signature cattle industry. By the time Mr. Matthews came along, not even the discovery of oil was enough to drive them away.

Despite its name, Lamshead is strictly a cattle operation (give or take some oil wells and some whitetailed deer). It is named for a creek named Thomas **Lamshead**, an English-born agent of the famous Butterfield Mail stagecoach line, which once ran from St. Louis to San Francisco.

The ranch traces its history to the 1850's, when the Matthews and Reynolds families struck out from Alabama and Georgia and kept going until they met up at the Clear Fork of the Brazos River, on the edge of Comanche territory.

Once they got together, members of the two families began marrying each other with such furious regularity that Mr. Matthews's mother, Sallie Reynolds Matthews, wrote a book, "Interwoven: A Pioneer Chronicle," to get them all sorted out.

The book, published in 1936, became a classic of Texas history, as did "Watt Matthews of Lamshead: A Photographic Study of a Man and His Ranch," by Laura C. Wilson, which extended Mr. Matthew's fame after its publication in 1989.

By then, the ranch had become a historic treasure, and Mr. Matthews, who had been running it for a family corporation since the death of his father in 1941, had become an unofficial tourist attraction, a 5-foot-6-inch cowboy who was not only a genial host and a generous supporter of historic preservation, but also a walking, spitting, bourbon-drinking embodiment of a bygone era.

Like his parents before him, he became famous for the house parties that would draw dozens of friends for days at a time, but as a young man he had got so tired of having to give up his bedroom to his parents' guests that he had moved into the bunkhouse. He did not move back to the

main house until a couple of years ago, and only then as a concession to the comfort of the nurses hired to take care of him as his health began to fail.

Until then, Mr. Matthews made do with a simple room furnished with a bed, bureau, bootjack and chair, all the comforts needed by a man who spent much of his time on horseback, leading the roundup of the spread's 1,500 Hereford cattle and the annual group of calves at branding time.

For all his devotion to the simple life, Mr. Matthews did not shun all new-fangled conveniences. He experimented with using helicopter-mounted cowboys but though the choppers proved effective for a while, especially in flushing strays out of the tall grass, the cattle eventually got so accustomed to the satisfying whoosh of the rotors that the cowboys had to go back to their horses.

For all his fame as a stay-at-home, Mr. Matthews did make one trip to Europe some years back, but that was only because, a nephew explained, a grandniece wheedled him into it by piquing his interest in flying on the Concorde.

As the youngest of nine children, Mr. Matthews came by his longevity naturally. All seven who survived infancy lived beyond the age of 85, five of them into their 90's and one to 105.

It was a measure of Mr. Matthew's standing in the community that at his funeral on Tuesday, some 700 mourners made the 13-mile drive from Albany, a town of about 2,000 residents, then followed a 15-mile ranch driveway to the family cemetery at a natural amphitheater, which has long been the site of a high-spirited annual re-enactment of early Texas days, known as Fandangle.

Earlier, there had been a private service at the small stone Presbyterian church built by the family in 1898, a year before Mr. Matthews became the first infant baptized there.

After the public service, Mr. Matthews, dressed in faded jeans and a Levi's jacket, a bandanna around his neck and his sweaty Stetson at his side in a plain wooden coffin, was as he had requested, buried in the family cemetery next to his oldest sister, Annie Caroline Matthews, who died in 1881.

Mr. Matthews, who never married, is survived by 11 of his 20 nieces and nephews and more great-and grandnieces and nephews than anyone could be bothered to count last week.

AMOS REYNOLDS AND SOPHIA HOUCK

**Based on Information from Don William Reynolds,
Ventura CA**

Below are the pertinent paragraphs from Tillman's books concerning Amos Reynolds. Note that there are differences in the entries in the two books.

1948 Book:

T1-437 James Reynolds, son of William (436) and Elizabeth (Mossom) Reynolds b 1750 (Stafford) VA. T1-564 Amos Reynolds, son of John (563) and Rachel (John) Reynolds, b 1-16-1801 in Loudoun Co VA, d 3-14-1850 in Knox Co OH. He m. 11-14-1824 Sophia Houch b 4-25-1808 and d 9-8-1849. Issue: Daniel Harris b 12-14-1832 [T1-565]; James H. who d.y.; Sylvester S. who settled in Centerburg OH; Burr H.; William N.; Sarah Ann, Emily S., Caroline; Barbara B. who d.y.; and Mary who d.y. [See T2-6481, below.]

1959 Book:

T2-6296 James Reynolds, of (6295-William), b 1750 (Stafford) VA, m 1774 Susan Lindsay b 1754, and settled (Giles) TN. According to DAR membership 135206 he served in Rev War with VA State Line. Issue: **William who m 10 Mar 1795 Rebecca Harris**; Mary who m 1794 John Harry; David b 1780 [T2-6297]; and Hiram [T2-6305]. See T1-437, above.]

T2-6475 WILLIAM REYNOLDS of (6295) b 1763 Loudoun County VA, m Elizabeth Russell and settled Elkader, IA. Issue: James, John, and others.

T2- 6480 John Reynolds, of (6475), d 1824 Knox Co OH, m Rachel John or Johns. Issue: Amos b 16 Jan 1801; and Joseph b 1802. [See T1-563, above.]

T2-6481 Amos Reynolds, of (6480), b 16 Jan 1801 Loudoun Co VA and d 14 Mar 1850 Knox Co OH, m 14 Nov 1824 Sophia **Houch** b 25 Apr 1808 and d 8 Sep 1849. Issue: Daniel Harris b 14 Dec 1832; James H; **Sylvester S.**; Burr H.; William N; Sarah Ann; Emily S.; Caroline; Barbara B; and Mary. [See T1-564, above.]

As you will see from the following, there is confusion about Tillman's parents of Amos.

Don William Reynolds wrote: "Tillman did make a mistake listing John as Amos' father. John is buried in another plot in Houck Cemetery. He was a cousin of William. Some of the descendants still live in Centerburg. I grew up with them. The courthouse and all the old records burned twice since the early 1800s." [John submitted excellent photos of records in the old family Bible and photos of grave stones.]

"Amos is buried next to his parents in the family plot, Houck Cemetery, Centerburg OH. I live part of the year at Reynolds Farm at Centerburg. This farm has been in the Reynolds family for over 190 years. As a small child I was told many stories of the adventures of William and Rebecca and their son Amos."

Caroline County by Campbell

1729-1735- Benjamin Rennolds was Deputy Sheriff.

1732- Benjamin Rennolds, disturbing the peace.

Note: Benjamin R. wanted to have the tavern at the courthouse. It was claimed that Benjamin R. had his buddies enter his competitor's tavern and destroy it. The competitor's tavern was torn up; but, at the trial Benjamin R. was found not guilty.

1735- Benjamin Rennolds was Tavern Keeper at the Court House.

1737- Wm Crawford agt Benjamin Rennolds, assault and battery.

1738- Benjamin Rennolds purchased Headrights.

1742- Benjamin Rennolds dies- Sarah Rennolds his executrix.

Caroline Co Order Books (from indexes or Dorman's summaries)

1732- Benjamin Rennolds- to keep an ordinary.

1735/36- James Picket a witness for Benjamin Rennolds.

14 Jul 1738- Benjamin Rennolds sworn under sheriff.

1738/9- Benjamin Rennolds assigned 3 headrights.

10 Apr 1741, p31- Looks like Benjamin Rennolds sworn under sheriff of Caroline Co.

8 Oct 1742, p127- Benjamin Rennolds to be tobacco inspector at Roy's Warehouse for the coming year.

14 Jan 1742/3, p143- The last will & testament of Benjamin Rennolds, deceased, was presented in court by Sarah Rennolds his Executrix.

-ordered that Thomas Madison, Thomas Buckner, Henery Harris and Benjamin Wooden, any three of them to appraise Benjamin Rennolds's estate.

-Rose, a negro girl belonging to Sarah Rennolds adj. to be 12 years old.

Note: Benjamin Rennolds died at the prime of his life; if he had not died he probably would have become a wealthy man. His children were probably under age with the possible exception of son, William.

11 Feb 1742/3, p149- Benjamin Rennolds estate appraised & recorded. There were a number of small cases by Sarah Rennolds, the Executrix of Benjamin Rennolds, during 1743.

12 Aug 1743- May Burton acknowledged his deed indented to Sarah Rennolds.

13 Jul 1744- Mace **Pickett** pays Sarah **Rennolds** for 3 days attendance (as witness).

12 Apr 1745- Sarah **Rennolds** acknowledged her deed of land indented to William **Rennolds** and several others of her children.

Sarah **Rennolds** must have remarried in 1745.

Note: Due to the fact that only some of the Order Books and none of the Wills and Deeds books remain in Caroline Co, piecing together the family history was very difficult.

Family of Benjamin **Rennolds**

9 May 1749- James **Rennolds** signs a deed.

10 Nov 1749- Paid to James **Rennolds** for building a little house at the courthouse, £500.

9 Mar 1749/50- John and Jane **Wyatt**'s deed indented to William **Rennolds** was proved by Robert **Farish**, Edmund **Pendleton** and John **Rennolds**.

May 1750, p218- John **Young**'s will presented by the Executrix, Sarah **Young**.

Note: Sarah **Rennolds**, widow of Benjamin **Rennolds**, married a Mr **Young**; it is thought that his name was James **Young** but never saw positive proof of it. This John **Young** was either her husband or her stepson.

10 May 1751- Jack, Negro boy belonging to James **Rennolds** adjudged 7 yrs old.

12 Mar 1751- Thomas **Rennolds** being admitted to choose a guardian made choice of James **Rennolds** who with Wm **Bowler** his security ack. their Bond.

12 Mar 1751- With the approbation of the Court Thomas **Rennolds** bonds himself an apprentice by indenture to James **Rennolds** to serve till he is 21 yrs of age.

Note: Thomas **Rennolds** should be at least 16 yrs old in order to do this.

10 Nov 1752- John **Hipkins** agt Sam'l **Jeuter**- Slander. Witness for **Hipkins**: Thomas **Pickett**, James **Jamison**, Charles **Beasley**, James **Young**, James **Rennolds** (he traveled 14 miles each way).

15 Aug 1755- James **Rennolds** returned an account against Thomas **Rennolds** orphan of Benjamin **Rennolds**.

11 Sep 1755- John **Pickett** the younger is appointed guardian to John **Rennolds** with Wm **Bowler** his security ack. their Bond. (Which John **Rennolds** is this?).

12 Nov 1756- Petition James **Phillips** agt Benjamin **Rennolds** & James **Young**.

12 May 1757- Benjamin **Rennolds** agt estate of James **Rennolds**. (Which Benjamin and James **Rennolds** are these?)

13 Jan 1758- Benjamin **Rennolds** ack. his deed indented to James **Young**.

Jul 1759- Sarah **Rennolds**, a witness. (Who she?).

10 May 1760- Thomas **Reynolds** agt Jno. **Tiller**.

13 Jun 1760- Jas. **Phillips** agt Jas. **Reynolds**- Dismissed.

13 Jun 1760- John **Reynolds** agt Reubin **Brauer**(?)- Dismissed.

13 Aug 1761- To view a convenient bridgeway from **Reynolds** and **McKinny**'s to the main road. (Is it **Reynolds** and **McKinny** or **Reynolds McKinny**?).

14 May 1761- James **Reynolds** agt John **Pettery**.

9 Jul 1762- John **Reynolds** agt Reuben **Brown**'s estate.

9 Jul 1762- John **Pickett** to pay John **Reynolds** and his wife for being witnesses.

13 Aug 1762- Thomas **Reynolds** agt Thomas **Pickett** & John **Hart**.

10 Sep 1762- Thomas **Reynolds** agt James **Charles**.

Feb 1764- Wm **Poe** and Thomas **Reynolds** securitys for Elizabeth **Charles** Admin. for Oliver **Charles**.

Feb 1764- On the petition of James **Reynolds** it's ordered- view roads from Elias **Blackburn**'s to Dickies Quarters-it being a nearer way, etc. (8 Mar 1764).

8 Mar 1764- James **Reynolds** hog stolen and killed.

9 Mar 1764- Phillip **May** to pay James **Rennolds** for being a witness.

13 Apr 1764- Benjamin **Rennolds** agt James **Dismukes**.

10 May 1764- Wm **Frebanks** deed indented to Benjamin **Rennolds** was approved.

11 May 1764- John **Rennolds** agt John **Pickett**, slander-decided for plt-awarded £25.

11 May 1764- John **Rennolds** agt John **Pickett**, trespass-decided for plt-awarded £25.

11 May 1764- Witnesses for John **Rennolds** in his cases agt John **Pickett**: William **Rennolds**, Abraham **Harper**, James **Rennolds**, Thomas **Rennolds**, Sarah **Young**, William **Hoard**, Benjamin **Sneed**.

Note: This **Rennolds** family stuck together; they very often were witness for each other.

11 May 1764- John **Rennolds** was witness for John **Pickett** agt Benjamin **Hubbard**.

12 May 1764- John **Pickett** Sr agt John **Rennolds** and Sarah **Young**, in debt- def won. Witnesses for John **Rennolds**: Wm **Hoard**, Thomas **Pickett**, Thomas **Rennolds**.

14 Jun 1764- Benjamin **Rennolds**, witness for Cornelius **Beasley**.

14 Jun 1764- William **Rennolds** ack. his deed indented to James **Rennolds**.

10 Aug 1764- James **Rennolds** agt James **Gauge**, in debt.

10 Aug 1764- Phillip **May** to pay James **Rennolds** for being a witness.

15 Sep 1764- Thomas **Rennolds** agt John **Pickett** the younger.

15 Sep 1764- John **Rennolds**, witness for Thomas **Rennolds** coming 16 miles (and returning).

11 Oct 1764- Thomas **Rennolds** agt Sarah **Young**.

14 Feb 1765- James **Rennolds** on a repleng(?) bond agt James **Wily** and John **Sutton**- awarded £15.6.8 and interest.

15 Feb 1765- John **Rennolds** agt John **Chenault**-defendant owes £7. plus interest.

14 Jun 1765- Road proposed by James **Reynolds**.

11 Jul 1765- James **Reynolds** ack. his deed of land to William **Reynolds**.

13 Sep 1765- Benjamin **Reynolds**, witness for Phillip **May**- coming 14 miles-also, Thomas **Rennolds** was witness for **May** agt **Pickett**.

9 Aug 1765- Thomas **Reynolds** agt Sarah **Young** and others- in Chancery- Suit set for hearing.

1765- John **Pickett** agt John **Tiller** and others; witness for **Tiller**, John **Reynolds**.

11 Oct 1765- Sarah **Munday** and John **Reynolds** witnesses for James **Reynolds** agt **Pickett**. Did James and John **Rennolds** have a sister named Sarah who married a **Munday**?

12 Oct 1765- James **Reynolds** agt John **Pickett Jr**- Trespas.

12 Oct 1765- John **Reynolds** witness for Thomas **Pickett** agt **Johnston**.

13 Jun 1766- James **Reynolds** agt John **Evans**.

10 Jul 1767- James **Reynolds** agt Benjamin **Hubbard** & John E. **Payne**.

10 Sep 1767- Apparently Thomas Dillard **Harris** and Rachel his wife deeded something to William **Reynolds**.

13 Nov 1767- Mace **Pickett** agt Hannah **Herndon** admix of James **Herndon**, deceased- Witnesses for Hannah H.: Thomas **Pickett**, John **Briant**, William **Reynolds**, Sarah **Young**, Ann **Pickett**, Richard **Hodge**, Phillip **May**. (Are these people related to **Rennolds**?).

14 May 1768- William **Reynolds** agt Benjamin **Reynolds** Exr. & C. defendant- In Chancery- William R. made his point and got £9, but gave up the rights to a small piece of land devised to him by the testation.

11 Aug 1768- John **Rennolds** agt John **Chenault** & Younger **Pitts**- in debt- adjudged £8. Also agt John **Chenault**- adjudged £12.

May 1769 Thomas **Reynolds** plt(?).

May 1769- Thomas **Reynolds** & Elizabeth his wife agt James **Young** Exers- Involves slaves and a marriage promise.

Jun 1769- William **Rennolds** agt Thomas **Pickett**.

Jun 1769- Richard **Lewis** agt William **Rennolds**-dismissed. Ordered that William **Rennolds** pay Elizabeth **Rennolds** and Sarah **Young** for being witnesses. Also pay James **Rennolds**.

Oct 1769- Thomas **Rennolds** agt Thomas **Pickett** of

William **Rennolds**. (What does this mean?).

Nov 1771- Benjamin **Rennolds**, defendant.

Apr 1772- James **Rennolds** says he has land on both sides of Woodson's Branch; he wants to erect a mill.

May 1772- James **Reynolds** appointed overseer to roads from Dickies Quarters to the Essex line. (Is this our **Rennolds**?).

14 Jun 1772, p51- John **Rennolds** there.

1772, p107- John **Pickett Sr**, deceased agt John **Pickett** the elder- (his uncle?).

Sep 1772, p135- ___ agt Thomas **Reynolds**, the School Master.

14 Jun 1772, p51- Exer. of John **Simple** agt John **Rennolds**. Also agt William **Rennolds**; also agt Thomas **Rennolds** (workman); also agt Joseph **Rennolds**- Case abates by the return of the sheriff.

Note: Looks like our clan; but why Joseph? It would make more sense if it were James instead of Joseph.

Note: Have not done Order Books for years 1773 to 1778.

Jun 1773, p302- William **Reynolds** agt Sarah **Young**.

Jul 1773, p327- Benjamin **Rennolds**, defendant.

Nov 1779- To divide the estate of Benjamin **Rennolds**, deceased. Benjamin **Rennolds** and Phillip **May** give bond to the commissioners for the preservation of the estate of Mary **Rennolds** who is judged insane. (Benjamin **Rennolds**' widow is Mary **Rennolds** and apparently they have a son, **Benjamin**, who is of age).

Dec 1779- To divide the land whereof James **Rennolds** did possess between the widow and the legatees agreeable with his will.

Feb 1780- To divide that part of the estate of James **Rennolds**, deceased devised to Benjamin, Thomas, William **Rennolds** and the children of John **Rennolds**, deceased agreeable to the will of the said James **Rennolds**, deceased. It was done.

Feb 1780- Says Benjamin **Rennolds** served as a soldier till properly discharged- 1760.

Mar 1780- Says William **Rennolds** served as a soldier in 1758.

Mar 1780- A division of the slaves belonging to the estate of James **Rennolds**, deceased returned and ordered to be recorded.

Mar 1780- Mary **Rennolds** will.

Apr 1780- In Chancery- Benjamin **Rennolds**, Thomas **Rennolds**, William **Rennolds**, Robert **Rennolds**, Jacob **Rennolds**, Bernard **Rennolds**, Lucy **Rennolds**, children of John **Rennolds**, deceased by William **Rennolds** their guardian-cpt-against-Elizabeth **Rennolds**, widow of James

Rennolds, deceased, defendant.

Benjamin and Sarah **Rennolds** very likely were married in Essex Co for Caroline Co was not formed until 1727. Caroline Co was formed from Essex Co, King and Queen and King William Co. That part of Caroline Co that came from Essex Co was the northeast portion and was in St Mary's Parish and later (after the Revolutionary War) the main part of St Marys District. The southwest part of Caroline Co, that which came from King William Co was St Margaret's Parish and known as St Margarets District. The narrow center portion of Caroline Co was from King and Queen Co and was named different parish names. This region of the county was apparently divided up between the St Margarets and St Marys Districts. The Benjamin **Rennolds** family was in the St Margarets District of Caroline Co. Benjamin **Rennolds** was apparently in this region when Caroline Co was formed.

The Court Records of Caroline Co were all destroyed during the Civil War with the exception of some of the Court Order books. This has made it extremely difficult to sort out family records in this county.

In 1723/4 in Essex Co, James **Rennolds Sr** died. Among other things he left his wife, Sussannah, 1/3 of his estate and son James Jr 1/2 of 500 acres and son Benjamin and grandson William the other 1/2 of 500 acres. Since his will was written this way it is assumed that grandson William was the son of Benjamin.

Thus Benjamin & Sarah **Rennolds** were married by 1723/4 and that their son William was born by 1723/4. (It is interesting that both James, Jr and Benjamin had sons named William and very likely both Williams were eldest sons.)

In Essex Co, 20 Sep 1737, Benjamin **Rennolds** and Sarah his wife and Sussanna **Holland** his mother (apparently James **Rennolds Sr**'s widow married a Holland) of Caroline Co sold 230 acres to James **Rennolds Jr**. (James **Rennolds Jr** probably had the adjacent 460 acres.) It is very likely that this acreage was Sussanna's dowers land. Benjamin appears to have looked after his mother after his father died.

From 1729 to 1735 Benjamin **Rennolds** was Deputy Sheriff of Caroline Co. Records indicate that he was sworn in as Under Sheriff in Jul 1738 and Apr 1741; it is very likely he held these positions from 1729 to 1742. Oct 1742 he was to be Tobacco Inspector at Roy's Warehouse. (This was considered a very important position in a county.) Up to his death he had many legal transactions recorded in the county; am sure that many had to do with him being Deputy or Under Sheriff of the county.

In 1732, Benjamin **Rennolds**, along with a number of his

"cronies" were arrested for disturbing the peace. Seems he wanted to have a tavern at the Court House; so he supposedly organized a party to destroy his competitor's business place.

Since Benjamin **Rennolds'** friends "were on the jury" the Jury did not determine that he was guilty. At any rate, in 1732 Benjamin **Rennolds** was approved to keep an ordinary; also, ca 1735 he was a tavern keeper at the Court House.

Note: The original Court House for Caroline Co was located at what is now the entrance to Fort A. P. Hill on Route 301. Currently (and probably at the time that Benjamin got his "ordinary") the Court House is at Bowling Green, Va.

On 14 Jan 1743 Benjamin **Rennolds'** last Will proved by his Executrix, Sarah **Rennolds**, his widow; thus he probably died in Dec 1742.

Benjamin and Sarah **Rennolds** had sons named: William, James, John, Benjamin Jr, and Thomas(very likely they were born in this order) and possibly 2 or 3 daughters.

Note: I have seen nothing to indicate who their daughters might have been or who they might have married. Possible married names of daughters might be: **Hawes, Herndon, Hord, May, Munday, Sneed and Tompkins.**

William, James, John, Benjamin, Jr and Thomas **Rennolds** were sons of Benjamin and Sarah **Rennolds**. Benjamin **Rennolds** died 1742/3. Sarah **Rennolds** acknowledged her deed of land in 1745 indented to William **Rennolds** and several others of her children. At that time Sarah **Rennolds** married a man named **Young**. I thought he was James **Young** who died ca 1769; however, in May 1750 Sarah **Young** was executrix of the will of a John **Young**. Was this person her husband or a stepson? In 1777 Sarah **Young** bought land from Samuel and Ann **Hawes**. Later it is noted that Samuel **Hawes Sr** obtained the 24 acres that was in John **Rennolds'** estate (he being the son of Sarah). Who was Samuel **Hawes**; could he have married a daughter of Benjamin and Sarah **Rennolds**? The **Rennolds'** had a habit of supporting each other.

On 14 Jan 1742/3 Benjamin **Rennolds'** will was presented to court by Sarah **Rennolds**, his Executrix. It is possible that some and maybe all of Benjamin and Sarah **Rennolds'** children were under age at the time of his death. The sons were William, James, John, Benjamin, Jr and Thomas; there may have been daughters but I have seen nothing to identify them. On 12 Mar 1751 Thomas **Rennolds** chose his brother, James **Rennolds**, his guardian and binds himself an apprentice to be indented to James **Rennolds** to serve till he is 21 years old. I assume Thomas to be the youngest son

and most likely 16 years old in 1751. I also assume that either William or James to be the eldest son and the others in the order indicated above.

The last mention I saw of Sarah **Young** in the Caroline Co Order Books was on 11 Dec 1777 when a deed indented from Sarah **Young** to Benjamin **Rennolds** was proved by the oath of Benjamin **Tompkins**, Thomas **Hawes**, and Julius **Coleman** and ordered to be recorded. If she were alive at this time she probably would have died during the next twelve months. If she were dead by Dec 1777 and the deed was being proved and recorded after the fact, then most likely she died between Sep 1776 and Nov 1777 the period when the Order Book records are missing. At any rate I saw no evidence that she died, a will, estate proceedings, etc.; she should have had an estate.
