Family Group Sheets

RFA does not have space to store copies of documentation/sources, but we need to know where to find the source used by the member, whatever it is.

Starting with this issue RFA will publish family groups sheets (FGS) that identify the source and note the location of the source, no matter what the source was, including family traditions, or that can be certified by the submitter as being accurate/proven/documented.

Please resubmit family group sheets (FGS) for each generation of your ancestors that you feel are "proved," providing the location of the source of your information. The FGS may be on any FGS form, handwritten, typed, or from genealogy software, as long as location of sources is included. If you would like to use the RFA FGS, just drop a note to the editor for a form that you can copy as you need them.

Finally, please, please notify RFA when you make a connection with another member's record, or when you have been able to correct something that has already been published.

Reynolds' Gift Benefits Oklahoma State University (OSU)

This is the "story behind the story" of the recent \$8.1 million gift by the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation to OSU-Okmulgee. The gift will build a new technology center that will bear Reynolds' name.

Dr. James Halligan, president of OSU, called it the largest grant from a single funding source ever given to an institution of higher education in OK.

Don Reynolds, who died in 1993, was a modern Horatio

Alger. He struggled to work his way through the University of Missouri, holding several odd jobs to finance his education. He started modestly in his chosen profession, journalism, by putting together a few dollars plus borrowed capital to buy his first newspaper, the Okmulgee Daily Times.

From that small beginning, he became founder and principal owner of the Donrey Media Group. He built his vast network of media properties by concentrating mostly upon community newspapers. At the time of his death his media group included 52 daily newspapers, 10 outdoor advertising companies, five cable TV outlets and one television station. In OK alone he had a dozen newspapers, among them the Bartlesville Examiner-Enterprise, Norman Transcript, Claremore Progress, Chickasha Express and his first paper, in Okmulgee.

His foundation contributed to the fund drive for a modern addition to the OSU journalism and broadcasting building in 1975 and for more than 20 years has given to the school's scholarship fund. A number of newspaper executives in the Donrey organization were recruited on the OSU campus.

Before his death he made possible a major academic center on the Columbia MO campus with a multi-million dollar gift.

Mr. Reynolds dreamed on a grand scale, then worked hard to make those dreams come true. He did not forget his modest beginnings when he had reached the pinnacle of his success. Through the foundation he created, he is still remembered.

"Grampa Reynolds' Busy Night" These Plantations by J. Earl Clauson

Anybody with plenty of time and taste for such things probably could collect a basketful of interesting stories along the turnpikes running out of Providence to Hartford, Danielson and other places. He'd better get about it promptly, however, because the oldtimers who know them are passing. The most interesting one to fall on these receptive ears has to do with grandfather's busy night at the Tug Hollow gate on the New London Pike. It was told us by John C. Lewis, who lived on the Warwick waterfront and we believe was then the only person still extant who collected toll on that now neglected highway. He was just a boy. Grandfather was Stephen Reynolds, Mr. Lewis's ancestor.

The New London Turnpike struck out of Providence southwest of Gorham's and followed for part of its route the present Reservoir avenue. It ran down through the Pawtuxet Valley and east of Tiogue Lake - still does, for that matter, although not many motorists follow it, preferring to stick to the concreted Nooseneck Hill Road. It scaled Pine Hill, the capital of Exeter, making a straighter run of it than the hard road, hit into the Nooseneck Hill highway north of Wyoming, held that route to Hopkinton village, and then diverged to the southwest for a pretty direct drive across North Stonington to New London. The distance from Providence to New London by the turnpike is 49 miles, materially less than the routes automobiles pursue today.

Going out of Providence the first tollgate was at the Gorton Arnold stand in Warwick. The second was at Westcott's, below Natick, where, said Mr. Lewis, the only original tollhouse still stands. Arnold's was a whole gate, Westcott's a half gate. Whole gates were 6 1/2 miles apart, half gates 3 1/4 miles. The privilege of keeping gate was let out by the turnpike company. Stephen **Reynolds** paid \$35 a year for his gate at Tug Hollow. He was obligated to keep the pike in repair half way in both directions to the next gate. Toll charges at whole gates were 12 1/2 cents for a chaise, six cents for a man on horseback, six cents for a horse and wagon. A pair of horses paid ten cents. Cattle, sheep and hogs were taxed one cent per head. A "chariot," as private coaches were called, paid 30 cents, and the stage coach 20 cents. But the stage coach never was held up for payment, bills being discharged monthly or annually. When a stage coach was underway, horses at a gallop, as was their customary gait, with passengers and mail aboard, it was very questionable form to halt it between stages to settle a petty toll charge. Foot passengers passed through free. There were plenty of altercations about charges, and often Mr. **Reynolds** would explain to objectors that if they didn't want to pay they could go back a quarter of a mile and find a road which would carry them around the gate and back into the turnpike again. He was easy going that way. At night the gates were left open and everybody went through free. Mr. **Reynolds** couldn't be bothered. There was a half gate at Crompton, and the next below was Jim **Webster's**, a whole gate. Tug Hollow gate lay south of these, near Wyoming.

Mr. **Reynolds** - South County oldsters incline to pronounce the name **Runnels** - was a cooper. His son-in-law, Warren **Lewis**, handled the tollgate at the time John C. **Lewis** came into the picture. But grandfather's busy night happened

while he himself was running the tollhouse as a sideline to his cooperage business. This was in 1832, long before John C. **Lewis** had been thought of. In the autumn of that year a man came along and bought a load of barrels. Standing by watching the transaction was what was then known as a traveler and today is called a tramp. The Providence and Stonington Railroad was being put through, with construction camps here and there of laborers, largely raw Irish, doing the pick and shovel work. The traveler, who said his name was **Burke**, watched interestedly when grandfather brought out a shotbag containing what looked like a lot of money. Actually it was about \$60 in one dollar bills. The barrel deal was closed and the purchaser said he would be back two weeks later for another load. He disappeared down the road, and presently also did **Burke**.

Two weeks later, on Nov. 16, 1832, at nightfall **Burke** turned up again. He was barefooted. He rapped at the **Reynolds** door and asked whether he might stay the night. The hospitable and humane country people couldn't find it in their heart to turn him away into the chilly night, so they let him in, fed him and appointed him a bed in the loft. A couple of coopers' apprentices, Burgess **Terry** and Sam **Wager**, had their beds there also. That night the boys went out to a party. **Burke** turned in. The apprentices came back late and tired, and **Wager** went to bed still wearing his cravat, a stiffly starched neckcloth. His slovenliness probably saved his life, although there's no moral in that. **Burke** had taken into the loft with him a bundle which it was later found contained white pine twigs. After the apprentices were sound asleep, he broke a few of these to determine whether or not anyone was disturbed by the crackling noise. Nobody stirred. **Burke** then got off his bed, crept to where **Terry** and **Wager** lay, and began striking at them with an axe he had brought in from the woodpile. **Terry** was quickly disposed of with a cracked skull, but **Wager**, sleeping with his arm over his head, was only hurt by the first blow and yelled. **Burke** struck him again, this time rendering him unconscious.

Wager's yell had aroused grandfather, who stood at the bottom of the stairs asking what the trouble was. **Burke** rushed down with his knife in his hand - a big, cheap clasp knife - and stabbed him deeply in the side. He fell, **Burke** on top. Grandmother **Reynolds**, completely aroused by now, rushed to the front door to go for help. There were four stone steps. Before she could get down, **Burke** had caught her and stabbed her twice in the breast. Concluding she was finished, he ran back into the loft, past grandfather

who lay bleeding all over the floor, and stabbed Wagner in the neck. That was where the cravat saved the apprentice's life. It happened that that day a man had fallen off the roof of the Tug Hollow mill and broken his leg and people were up in the house a quarter of a mile away. Grandmother, hurt and plenty frightened but plucky, managed to make her way there and spread the alarm. By the time help reached the **Reynolds** house **Burke** had run out, picked up his shoes beside the woodpile, where he had left them the night before, and fled. Twenty men and women were soon after him with guns, pitchforks and clothes tub mauls. They could follow his trail across the meadows, white with rime, until it disappeared into Miry Gutter, a nearby swamp. There it was lost, and **Burke** was never taken.

The Reynoldses believed he took refuge among his fellow Irish in one of the railroad construction camps. But several years later a man before being hanged in Massachusetts confessed to killing an entire family in Exeter, R.I., and it may have been **Burke**. Grandfather **Reynolds** lived nine years after that exciting night. Mr. **Lewis** still had the nightshirt he wore, its old bloodstains never washed away, and the knife with which he was stabbed. **Wager**, recovering, ran away to sea. **Terry**, a silver plate in his skull, moved to Plymouth, Mass.

William Reynolds - Revolutionary Soldier

Born 5 May 1754 in England. Came to New York about 1770 and shortly thereafter took the side of the Americans and joined in fighting for their cause. He enlisted in Orange County NY militia serving in the First Regiment. He was severely wounded at the Battle of Fort Montgomery. The injuries which he sustained endured until his death 18 Jun 1816.

He married 15 April 1780 Martha Lamoreaux, the daughter of John Lamoreaux and Betsy Tice. She was born 27 Jan 1761. Died 21 Nov 1838. They resided on a farm in Monroe. Their children were:

The will of William Reynolds made just before he died in 1816.

In the name of God Amen. I William Reynolds of the Township of Monroe, County of Orange and State of New York being weak in body but sound in mind and memory do order and dispose of my temporal concerns in manner following 1st I order all my just and lawful debts to be paid and funeral charges, 2nd I give and bequeath to my True and loving Wife two good beds and a sufficient quantity of bedding one Tea Kettle pan pot her Teapot Silver Tea spoons and all the Crocory ware the choice of any cowes theas exclusive of her right of Dowry. 3d I give and bequeath to my Tow sons Thomas and William Reynolds all my Landed property that I am seased of at my deth to them and their heirs or assigns forever to be equally divided and as soone as Convenient after my death the above described Real property to be apried by three judicious competent men to be Chose by my heirs and Executors the above appraisement to be made within the space of one year after my deseas the hole of my personal property after taken out what allready disposed of to my wife **Martha** to be Soaled and after paying my debts the Residue to be added to the appraisement of my Real property and my two sons **Thomas and William Reynolds** To have one hundred dollars each more than my daughters. I will and bequeath the one equal half of the Residue of the before mentioned appraisement to be qually divided between my two daughters **Sarah Brooks and Charity Howell** to be paid t othem in the manner following viz at the expiration of one year after my death the one equal third part of their Respective Legacys and the Residue to be paid in two annual payment with Interest from the Time the first payment comes due ad if either of my sons **Thomas or William Reynolds** shall or do substantiate any charge against my Estate then the said Charge or demand to Taken out of their own Legacys excepting obligations my son William holds against me. In 1850, a farmer, Andrew was in Gill Twp (Sullivan) IN with wife Martha, age 26, born in KY, and children, all born in IN: Richard, age 8; Thomas, 7; Mitton, 5; Agness, 3; and Albert 1.

In 1860, still a farmer, he was in Charleston Twp (Clark) IN, with wife Martha and children, all born in IN: Thomas, age 14; Jane, 12; Albert, 11; Anna B. 7; and William 3.

In 1870, a cooper, Andrew and Martha were still in Charleston with Belle, age 68; and children, born in IN, William, 12; Mollie 8; Jane **Baxter**, 21; and Viola 2.

In 1880 Andrew, cooper, a widow, age 58, was living in Paola (Miami) KS. In this census Andrew (or the person giving info to the census taker) indicated both his parents were born in KY. Where in KY and who were they?

I descend from Andrew's apparent first child and son, Richard **Reynolds**, who was born 24 Aug 1841 Charlestown (Clarke) IN and died 14 Apr 1888 in Paola (Miami) KS. He married Mary **Ruddell** and they had eight children:

Mrs. Webb and Her Claim to Citizenship In the Choctaw Nation

Blue County
Choctaw Nation
Indian Territory
January 14, 1886

Hon. J.D.C. Atkins
Indian Commissioner

Dear Sir: I wrote you in behalf of Mrs. Emma **Webb**, a daughter of James **Reynolds**, a citizen of the United States, who married Fawcett B. **Dean**, a Choctaw Indian then residing in the State of Alabama. When the tribe was moved to this country Mrs. **Reynolds** remained with her husband. Miss Emma **Reynolds**, now Mrs. **Webb**, two years after the treaty between the Choctaw Indians and the United States, removed to Mississippi, where they remained until April 1843. Thence to Texas, where she was married to James M. **Webb**, at Palestine, Tex., in 1847. They left Texas in 1867 and have been living here since last named year. Mrs. **Webb** is quite an old woman and wishes to establish her claim to the privileges of her tribe in the Indian Territory, and is in fact a half-breed Choctaw to all intents and purposes. I have known the **Webb** family for the last fifteen years, and have always regarded Mrs. **Webb** as an Indian. They are intelligent, honest, sober, industrious and very pious members of the Missionary Baptist Church and are very desirable citizens for any community, and they are in full affiliation with the balance of the Choctaws.

I am entirely ignorant with regard to the proper course to pursue to reinstate Mrs. Webb fully in every particular with her tribe, but I feel sure you will do all you can for this Indian lady in the direction indicated.

Please see Hon. D.B. Culberson and I know he will indorse any statement I may make. Mr. J.M. Webb was in Colonel Culberson's regiment in the late war, and I know he will be glad to aid any of his old friends. I am at present in the Territory professionally, where I have been practicing

for the past 16 years, and if my attempts to connect myself with your Department were futile, I may in a feeble way be of some outside assistance to you and your wards. Thanking you most cordially for your past recent courtesies, I am, meanwhile, my dear sir,

Sir: I am in receipt of your communication, dated 14 Jan 1886, in which you refer to the case of Mrs. Emma Webb, a half-breed Choctaw, who has resided in that nation since 1867, and state that she desires to establish her claim to citizenship.

In reply I have to state that under the provisions of the act of the Choctaw council approved October 21, 1882, Mrs. Webb should make application to the proper tribunal of the Choctaw Nation. If her claim is refused, she should then appeal to the agent, as pointed out in said law and in the instructions given to late agent Tufts, copy of which will be found in the annual report of this office for the year 1884; (page 44) copy inclosed.

The Grout House

Patti wrote on notepaper with a drawing of the Grout House on Pine Crest Farm where she lives, 3 miles NW of Lodi. The sketch was made by Lori Ryan in 1977. On the back of the card the following is printed.

The Grout House on Pine Crest Farm, three miles NW of Lodi WI on Chrislaw Road was built about 1850 by **Sylvester Reynolds**. It took two years to complete the construction of the massive walls which are about 14 inches thick. **Margarethe (Herr) Krauslach** & her son, **Charles W. Chrislaw**, purchased the farm in 1883. The east wing was added about a year later. The five Chrislaw children: **Daisy (Chrislaw) Williams**, **Grace (Chrislaw) Gottschall**, **Roy Chrislaw**, **Neva (Chrislaw) Robertson**, & **Ralph** - as well as **Ralph's** two children: **John** & **Elizabeth (Crislaw) Martin** - were born in the Grout House. By the turn of the century, the grout walls were coated with a veneer of concrete to protect them from weathering & the front porch and shutters were added. The name 'Pine Crest' was registered in 1924. In 1929 **Grace (Chrislaw) Gottschall** bought the farm. The east wing was raised to make two bedrooms above & a bath & washroom were finished off in the back. The **Ralph Crislaw** family, the **Irving Atoe** Family & the **David Williams** family successively ran the farm until the **Gottschalls** retired there in 1944. After that, the grounds were landscaped & extensive remodeling was done to the interior, including the installation of two fireplaces. **Herbert Gottschall** built the tenant house next door with the help of **Harley Chrisler** & **Harry Drew**. **Ralph** & **Vera (Paton) Chrislaw** lived in the tenant house until the management of the farm was taken over by **Bob** & **Patricia (Gottschall) Schuknecht** & family -- **Schoe**, **Cherie** & **ShelaghBeth** - in 1968, making five generations to have lived at Pine Crest. The Pine Crest brand was registered in 1974. A basement was put in under the east wing in 1977, followed by interior restoration & remodeling. (It has been vacant since 1977). The 100th anniversary of the 1st **Steele Picnic** in WI was held at Pine Crest in 1973 & the 75th **Chrislaw-Herr Picnic** was held

there in 1977.

Patti added a note to the card, "It has been vacant since 1977 - amazing how fast an unheated building deteriorates in this climate - a shame."

The head of the Genealogy Collection, Greg **Gronlund**, was our first speaker on Friday. He gave lots of information about the library's collection and how to use it, with some focus on some of the more unique materials the library has to offer. He also provided some general tips and pointers about genealogy research in general.

The second speaker was Laura Jo **Hooks**, who works at the Orlando LDS Family History Center. She discussed ways to extend research using the LDS materials. She gave many pertinent and humorous examples from her own family and research.

Of course, the RFA archives was available for members and guests to use in their research. Several folks had their laptop computers along, and many provided direction, information and guidance to the researchers. Others took advantage of the opportunity to avail themselves of the Orlando Library's collection.

On Saturday, the archives were again available, as well as the Library. The Annual RFA Business Meeting was held in the morning. After introductions around the room, the reports were given by the various officers about the general business of the RFA over the past year.
