Things You Need to Know From The Editor

Operating RFA. RFA is a totally labor intensive operation, all the labor being volunteers who have other demands with a higher priority on their time.

There are records of almost 3,000 members to maintain; on any given day there are at least 425 current members. The growth of RFA has been wonderful and that growth has also brought a flip side, a larger workload.

There is research to be done at local research facilities or in the members' files to provide information for *Recollections*.

Typing is endless to get member information for the past 106 years (2,960 members as of the end of 1997) into a computer so it can be found when needed. It is not possible to search through all the paper files to find something -- no one has that kind of time.

Each RFA "job" has multiple tasks, many small enough to be done by someone else, many that would take very little time and effort of someone else. All of which you will be hearing more about.

If you don't do it, who will?

Where RFA Gets Its Money. All of the money comes

from membership dues (\$10.00 a year from an average of 450 members) or from sale of the publications you see advertised in *Recollections*, and just now and then a donation from someone.

Association Money Is Used to produce *Recollections*; for office supplies, postage (the largest single item) telephones, equipment repair and/or replacement (the 2nd largest single item); and to pick up a part of the cost at each reunion. Any that is left over is saved for the next year when membership and sale of publications may decrease, and/or always the hope of a fund growing large enough to publish another book someday.

Your Membership Number is on the first line of the mail label of your copy of the newsletter "pd98 2960 25" means your dues are paid for 1998, your membership number is 2960, and your family line is 25, the American progenitor as yet undetermined.

Among these nearly 3,000 members are these situations: 1) We have files that cannot be matched because the member joined as Mrs. John Doe, the remainder of her contacts (if any) are as Jane Doe and the Does moved to another city/state during the time; 2) the member who joined with a full name and wrote many times using only his initials; there are 24 people with the same initials; 3) the people who put their addresses only on the envelope, not on the envelope's contents, and you know what happens to envelopes, sometimes before the address is looked for on the contents.

Your membership number is used to get to your computer files, so, please, please give your membership number when corresponding with RFA.

Membership renewals are due by 1 January each year, but we give you until March 1 before you are dropped from the computer. Therefore, you get the first issue of *Recollections* each year even if you don't renew.

If you renew later than March 1, your records must be brought from the archives into current files and the back issues of *Recollections* mailed to you by first class mail. Therefore, beginning this year, for those who renew after 1 March, the dues still will be \$10.00, but to get issues of the newsletter you must pay \$2.00 for each issue of that year that you have missed.

Notifying Members of Family Connections. We do not send letters telling new members that we have **not** found a connection. If we find a connection a notice will be in a future issue of the newsletter or you will be notified directly. Sometimes another member will be asked to respond to you if there seems to be a possibility of a connection. Now, the fact that you don't hear from someone does not mean that there is no pertinent information in the files, but such information may not surface for a year or so.

As long as you are a paid up member you will know when it happens.

Why There Is So Little Northern and Western Information in *Recollections*. Because most of the members who contribute information do not live in the North and West, or are not doing research in those areas. We need information from both areas, especially the West.

The Registration Fee For Reunions is determined by the price RFA must pay to the hotel for meeting rooms, equipment, banquet, and transporting RFA Archives and equipment to and from. RFA always subsidizes some of the expense. (There are never enough overnight guests in the hotel to get free meeting rooms.) RFA does not pay any expenses for any member or officer.

A Challenge To RFA Members The RFA Millennium Collection

If we do publish a *RFA Millennium Collection*, a nice project for all of us to become involved in would be the abstracts of all Reynoldses (all spellings) from the 1850 Federal Census. You will recall that the 1790 census was in the *Centennial Collection*.

Those of you who are willing to abstract just one county in one state (more, if you are really willing) should contact the 1850 Census Project Coordinator, W.O. "Bill" Reynolds, 2001 Gasparilla Rd G-18, Placida FL 33946. It will be "first come, first served" on the county/state availability. Remember, all 50 states did not have a census in 1850! About 33-35 states/territories and the District of Columbia, I believe.

We want the abstracts taken from the census schedules, **not** published indexes, and do not use these published indexes (paper or CD-ROM) as the guide to the schedules. There are many, many errors in these publications. You will be sent census abstract forms to use. We also want all possible spellings of the name, most of which will be included on the census forms (at least, those that can be thought of at the time). We still have members who do their research only for *Reynolds*, which is a big mistake in the early years -- did the county clerk or census taker write your grandpa's name as *Wreynolds* or *Wrenolds*? Other possibilities are *RA...*, *RE...*, *RI...*, *RO...*, *RU*. Oh yes, then there are the same spellings prefaced with *Mac* and *Mc*, not to mention the double "n" and double "l" in all the combinations.

Microfilm copies of all of the 1850 census records are available at the Federal Regional National Archives, the LDS Family History Center in Salt Lake City UT, and the

Orange County Public Library, Orlando FL. I am certain there are others that I do not know of. If not in-house, they may be available through the local LDS Family History Centers. State Archives, as well as local genealogical society libraries, will have, at least, records of the areas they cover. You do the abstracting and we will find a source for you!

If you have a microfilm/fiche reader, the American Genealogical Lending Library, P.O. Box 244, Bountiful UT 84011, lends the census reels by mail. Someone has a contract to rent them to the public for the National Archives, but I will have to find that source later.

To Bake The Cookies or To Buy Them. When my children were in school there were relentless bake sales. I was working and going to school (really, I never liked to bake), so I was always willing to buy the cookies, or donate money to the cause. Here's your big chance.

S-K Publications, P.O. Box 8173, Wichita KS 67208-0173 has printed to paper from the National Archives Microfilm, as *Census Microfilm Books* a great many of the 1850 censuses. These books of print-outs are by county and state.

Their latest ad in *Everton's Genealogical Helper* listed numerous counties from AL, AR, GA, IL, IN, IA, KY, MD, MI, MS, MO, NY (Putnam Co.), NC, OH, PA, SC, TN, TX, VA, WV, and WI. There may be more.

The prices per county range from \$15 to about \$45-50. Unless you buy for your own library, rather than for RFA, please check with the Bill Reynolds, the 1850 Coordinator, before buying to avoid duplication.

I have bought several of the AL counties and find them much preferable to reading microfilm, and of equal quality.

Charles and Tabitha (Palmer) Reynolds of VA, KY & IL

Page 1, Chapter 1:

According to the U.S. Census which is taken every 10 years starting in 1790, Charles **Reynolds** was born abt 1798 in VA. I have a strong feeling (but feelings are not proof) that he probably came from Bedford County, Virginia. On the 1810 census of Bedford County, a Charles and Alexander are listed among other **Reynolds**. On the 1820 census for that county there are listed Greenville (Granville?), Charles, Charles Jr, Alexander and James **Reynolds** along with

several other families of **Reynolds**. Later when Charles and Tabitha **Reynolds** lived in Sangamon County, Illinois, two close neighbors were Alex and James **Reynolds**. James **Reynolds** lived close to them again later in Wayne County, Illinois. Also they named their 2nd son James.

Charles **Reynolds** married Tabitha **Palmer** or **Palmore** who, according to the census, was born about 1806 in Virginia. In Bedford County, Virginia, there were also several **Pallmers** or **Palmares** listed. The name seems to be spelled both ways in different documents. In looking in the indices to the Bedford County Will Books, County Order Books and Deed Books there were a lot of **Palmers** and **Palmares** and **Reynolds** but I could not identify any specific tie-in to our Charles and Tabitha.

What caused me to think Bedford might be the county they came from is because the name Greenville or Granville is a name not often seen in records and Greenville **Reynolds** first appeared on the 1820 census for that county. A Granville **Palmer** lived close by them later in Wayne County, Illinois and also in Gasconade County, Missouri. The Granville **Palmer** who lived in Gasconade County owned an 80-acre farm adjacent to Charles' farm in Township 40, Range 6, Section 27 of Gasconade County. Also, four of his sons were named Thomas, Joseph, James and Charles. This Granville **Palmer** is listed as Grandville in the Gasconade County History Book, but is Granville in the 1854 Court records when he died intestate. Charles and Tabitha named their eighth child Granville. But keep in mind all of this is interesting but not proof of a tie-in to Bedford County, Virginia.

Kentucky became a State in 1792 and in 1824 Charles and Tabitha **Reynolds** were living in this frontier land when their first child William A. (Alexander, maybe?) was born. Two daughters, Flora and Dora were born between 1825-1827. James T. **Reynolds** was born in 1828 and he was listed as being born in Illinois as recorded later in the 1850 census of Illinois where he was living at the time. In 1830 Charles and Tabitha were listed on the census for Sangamon County, Illinois. Vandalia was the State capital at that time and Springfield is the present State capital. Also child number five, Hayden Brook **Reynolds** was born in 1831 in Sangamon County, Illinois.

Shortly after that, Charles and Tabitha **Reynolds** moved to Wayne County, Illinois and Joseph was born in 1833, Lydia in 1836 and Granville in 1839. They were still in Wayne County when the census was taken in 1840. The records for that era burned along with the courthouse in Wayne County, Illinois, so if they had any record of land purchases there, it is now gone.

The 1850 census shows that Charles and Tabitha **Reynolds**

had moved to Gasconade County, Missouri where twins Winfield Scott **Reynolds** and Zachary Taylor **Reynolds** were born in 1847 and Tabitha, their last child, was born in 1850.

According to the book *Personal Recollections of John Darby*, by John Darby, later mayor of St. Louis, "the inhabitants of Gasconade County at the time spoken in (1827) were nearly all frontier backwoods people,... immigrants mostly from Tennessee, Kentucky, Virginia and North Carolina. Unfortunately, many were unable to read and write, and greatly wanting in education."

When Charles and Tabitha **Reynolds** moved to Gasconade County, they homesteaded land in Sections 22 and 27 [sic] in Township 42 North and Range 6 West. They also owned other land because in 1854 they sold 80 acres in Section 18, Township 42 of Range 5 West. Each time they each signed their signature with an X. These parcels of land are in Third Creek Township, West and Northwest of Owensville, Gasconade County, Missouri and near the area of Old Wollam and New Woolam...

This land that Charles **Reynolds** homesteaded lying in Sections 22, 27, and 28 [sic] of Township 42 Range 6 West is not part of the **Boettcher** farm. William **Boettcher**'s grandfather Wegamen **Boettcher** bought the land in the latter 1800s and William was born on it. Charles and Tabitha's oldest son, William A. died 29 Mar 1858 and he was buried on this piece of land. William **Boettcher** is now dead and his son Glenn **Boettcher** owns the land. In 1982 my two cousins, Joan **Spaedy** and Floyd **Bunton** and I visited William **Boettcher** and his wife Esther and he took us to the place where William A. **Reynolds** was buried in 1858. It is way off a back road up a hill and hidden by a lot of trees and brush. On the way up the hill we passed the gravestones of the little Bock family cemetery where there are several tombstones. **Bocks** owned this land before the **Boettchers** and after the **Reynolds**.

The grave of William A. **Reynolds** and his tombstone was at one time enclosed with a short stone fence. The stones are all fallen down, but the tombstone is in fair shape. There are 9-11 other indentations in the ground where there are graves. Also there are a number of field stones which had been placed by each grave.

I have searched Gasconade County Courthouse records, Gasconade Cemetery records, and visited a number of likely places where Charles and Tabitha **Reynolds** could be buried, but have come to the conclusion that Charles, Tabitha and probably others in the family were buried here (**Boettchers**') when they died...When Charles **Reynolds** died, he died broke and owing the money to pay his doctor's bill, so the cost of a tombstone was probably out

of the question...As I examine the records at the Gasconade Courthouse left behind from this family's estate, I believe they needed money.

Was Joseph in some way related to the **Reynolds** in (Caroline) VA where the name "Larkin" also appears? Was he related in any way to the other **Reynolds** in the area of (Botetourt) VA, including Silas **Reynolds**, and William **Reynolds** who m Amma **Elder**? The ch of Joseph and Rachel **Reynolds**:

Susannah Reynolds b abt 1775, d aft 1830, m abt 1790 Noah **Hawkins** (where and when?).

Thomas Reynolds b abt 1777, m 7 Mar 1797 Mary **Love**, d/o Jean **Love**. Bond in (Botetourt) VA & (Franklin) VA.

Mary Rachel Reynolds b abt 1778, d bef 1837 (Botetourt) VA, Back Creek of Roanoke River; m 9 Apr 1799 Josiah **Martin**. Bond in (Botetourt) & (Franklin) VA.

Larkin Reynolds b abt 1780, d bef 1830 (Botetourt) VA, Back Creek of Roanoke River, m 6 Apr 1806 Hannah **Ferguson**, d/o Andrew & Mary **Ferguson**. The name Larkin is carried down through at least three generations in this family.

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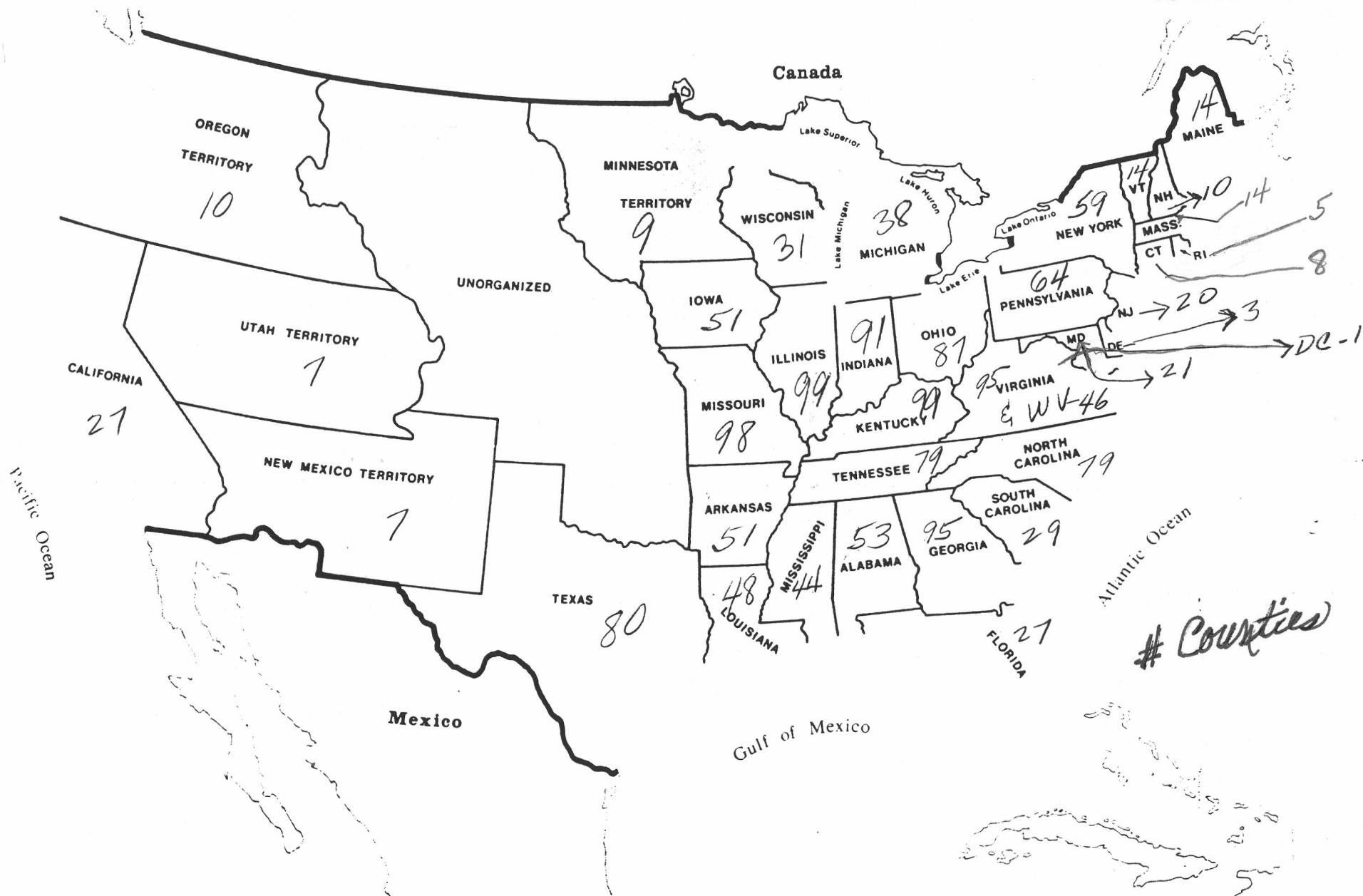
