We also gained new members: Michael Misicka, June Mullens, Arnold Reynolds; and Gerald M. Reynolds rejoined.

Line Coordinators

While on the subject of lines, this may have been the year when the most line coordinators were in attendance: Sue Clement, Vera Bunkoff, Bill King, Marilyn Newton, Joyce Page, Sue Phaneuf, Glenn Reynolds, Melody Reynolds, Lee Taylor, and Sally Young.

On Friday morning, the line and group coordinators met early to discuss the need for strengthening these positions to provide more assistance to the RFA staff. There will be much more about this subject reported in the coming issues of *Reollections*.

Activities

Activities began on Thursday (Aug 26) morning when all who wished to attend met in the hotel lobby for an escorted trip to the New England Historic Genealogical Society and the Boston Library. We can assume this was a success because the group didn't return to the hotel until the libraries were closed!

Friday (Aug 27) the real activity of the event got under way. After the greetings and remarks by President Bill King, the group was quickly into the RFA Archives. Since the reunion was so near the home of Sue Clement, it was easy to transport the archives to the hotel, and the members didn't waste a minute getting into them -- and staying there until

they were dismissed on Saturday evening. There was a copier available that was never meant for high speed and constant use, but did the job without ever slowing down. RFA provided the paper and the toner and requested donations, which were given in excess of use.

For those who didn't wish to read and copy the entire time, especially spouses, it was a quick trip into Boston for research and touring.

On Saturday (Aug 28) the Annual Membership Business Meeting was held a 1:30 p.m., where the officers reported on their activities for the past year.

Treasurer Joyce Page reported the *bottom line*, a closing bank balance of \$10,065.14, after expenditures of \$5,016.27. Sale of the *RFA Centennial Collection* is the major income after membership dues, and publishing *Reynolds Recollections* was the major expense. The bank balance will be needed to cover the up-front publishing costs of the *Millennium Collection*.

Membership: Registrar Marilyn Newton reported a drop of 73 in membership, with 64 new members, 10 rejoining, and an ending membership of 400.

Publications: Lee Taylor discussed the new James of North Kingstown RI book, for which all of the ads are out (see inside back cover of May-Jun 1999 *Reollections*).

Also discussed was the status of the Millennium Collection: the 1850 census extraction project. We are doing better than we feared and worse than we hoped, but it will be completed. There is a full report elsewhere in this issue.

President Bill King reported that there had been no nominations for officers during the nomination cycle and that it was hoped all the officers would continue for another year.

He also pointed out the increase in staff over the past year and the need for additional assistance, particularly from Line Coordinators for whom a job description is presently being drafted. Additionally, Bill spoke of the need to watch the financial situation because of the need to update and repair computer equipment, and to have money for the *Millennium Collection*.

After announcing the 75th annual reunion as scheduled for 17-23 Sep 2000 in Salt Lake City, Utah, the meeting was adjourned to prepare for the banquet in the evening.

It surely seemed that everyone enjoyed the banquet and lingered until the last possible minute.

This was also the time for reluctant good-byes because of early Sunday morning departures of some. But for others, it still wasn't over.

On Sunday afternoon, Sue Clement took those interested to Freetown MA, the roots of the Election line. The report indicates this trip was a success and that several of the RFA members of this line who had not been at the reunion came to Freetown.

Elisha P. Reynolds and Reynolds Station IL
by William L. King

In June, my wife Helen and I attended a King family reunion in the Quad City area of IL. The address for the host family was Reynolds IL. This tweaked my curiosity. To make it more interesting, on the same weekend after the King reunion the Reynolds High School was having its reunion. Reynolds High was the only high school in the area between 1890 and 1957. The classes were small since this was a farming community and a member of the King cousins had

attended the high school. So Helen and I attended the Reynolds High School Reunion with my King cousins.

It turns out that Reynolds IL, at first referred to as Reynolds Station, was named for E. P. Reynolds of Rock Island, the contractor who built the railroad into Reynolds, Elisha P. Reynolds

From a local history of Reynolds IL, I was given the following:

Elisha P. Reynolds, Sr., an extensive railroad and bridge contractor, and a pioneer of Rock Island County, came to this area from Vermont in November 1839. At that time travelers in this section of the U.S. did not have railroad facilities. The stagecoach was seen on in a few places and at rare intervals. Upon reaching Chicago, Mr. Reynolds set out for Rock Island on foot, walking the entire distance of over 150 miles through undeveloped country.

Mr. Reynolds was born in Washington County VT, 13 Feb 1817. His parents were Elisha and Betsey (Stuart) Reynolds. Elisha P. lived with his parents until he was 21 at which time he began working at various occupations until he began taking in the construction of public works in 1853. At this time he took a contract for grading five miles of the Rock Island Railroad, which required as many as 50 employees. His largest contract was for the construction of 250 miles of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad, furnishing everything except iron, ties, and spikes. He received \$1,500,00 for this work. Three thousand men and 1,500 teams were needed to complete the contract. Mr. Reynolds had contracts for building 1,500 miles of railroad and many bridges during his lifetime.

Mr. Reynolds married Eliza Young, a native of Vermont on 17 Apr 1847. Their children were: John H., Betsey, Lucy, and Benjamin. A fifth child died at a young age. Mrs. Reynolds died in 1858. Mr. Reynolds married a second time to Amanda Ogden of IL on 20 Oct 1860. The only child of this marriage was Elisha P. John and Benjamin became partners with their father in the E. P. Reynolds & Company.

Mr. Reynolds served as Mayor of Rock Island for two terms.

Sarah (Maccubbin) (Griffith) Reynolds

[The article on John Maccubbin of Anne Arundel Co., Maryland is quite detailed {52 pgs.} and, obviously, only the section dealing with Sarah Maccubbin and Thomas Reynolds are included here. Anyone interested in the entire article, pls. contact the Editor. The immigrant John Maccubbin came to Maryland in 1649; as an indentured servant. He obtained his freedom in time to become a small but quite successful tobacco planter. His daughter was Sarah (**Maccubbin**) (**Griffith**) **Reynolds**.]

Sarah's first known child was born in October 1688. Thus she might have been born as late as 1672; however, since her brother Samuel was probably born about that time, Sarah likely was born earlier, say by 1668.

Sarah married the immigrant William **Griffith** who is said to have come to Maryland from London, arriving as an indentured servant in 1675/76. William Griffith acquired two tracts of land: *Clark's Luck*, 60 acres, which he bought from Neale and Ann Clark for 3,000 lb. tobo. on 13 Jan. 1687/88 apparently about the time he married Sarah; and *Griffith's Lot*, 197 acres, which was surveyed for him in 1694/78 The 1707 Rent Roll lists as the possessor of both these tracts "Tho: Reynolds[,] for Griffiths orphns."

William and Sarah Griffith had at least four children (birth dates from parish records):

1) Orlando, born 17 Oct. 1688; said to have died testate March 1757 (will dated 8 Apr. 1753, proved 25 Apr. 1757); married 6 June 1717 Katherine **Ridgely**, said to have died Feb. 1783, daughter of John and Katherine Ridgely;

2) Sophia, born 27 Apr. 1691; died 19 Apr. 1730; married by 1714 Benjamin **Duvall**, said to have died in 1774, son of Mareen and Susannah Duvall;

3) Charles, born 20 Jan. 1693 / 94; died 6 Oct. 1771 at about 5:45 PM; married first 29 Aug. 1717 widow Mary (**Wolden**) **Mercer**, died 18 Feb 1721/22; married second 1727 Catherine **Baldwin**, died 13 May 1733, daughter of John and Hester Baldwin;

4) William, born 15 Apr. 1697; died testate in Frederick County in 1757 (will dated 28 July 1757, proved 3 Sep. 1757), married by 1720 Comfort **Duvall**, born 17 Mar. 1700/01, died after her husband, daughter of John and Elizabeth Duvall.

William Griffith, the immigrant, died testate in 1699. After a few months, Sarah married on 30 Nov. 1699 Thomas **Reynolds**, born ca. 1660-1662/78 The list of orphans in Middle Neck Hundred dated June 1706 lists Charles Grefeth, Olander Grefeth and Sophiah Crifeth as living with Mr. Thomas Reynolds (somehow William was overlooked again) In the spring of 1707, Thomas Reynolds and his three stepsons apparently went to court together and all four recorded their cattle marks.

As shown in the 1707 Rent Roll, in addition to managing the funds of his stepchildren, Reynolds then owned four tracts: *Nealson*, 100 acres, and *Landing Place*, 50 acres, adjacent on South River; and *Greenbury*, 50 acres, and part of *Baker's Increase*, 30 acres, adjacent on Severn River. He had bought *Greenbury* from William Green for 8,000-lb.

tobo. on 11 Aug. 1696, and bought a part, 30 acres, of *Baker's Increase* from Morris and Elizabeth Baker for 2,000 lb. tobo. on 13 Sep. 1699; he and Sarah sold *Greenbury* and the entire tract *Baker's Increase* (80 acres) to Henry Wright for £ 90 on 14 Mar. 1708/0977 He bought *Neelson* and *Landing Place* from Neale and Jane Clark for £ 140 on 18 Mar. 1704. He bought 100 acres on Swan Neck ("except for the 30 foot square burying place in the orchard") from Richard Horner for £ 82/10/0 on 12 Aug. 1701; he and Sarah then sold this land to John Hammond for £ 90 on 25 Feb. 1702/03. He bought a part, 164 acres, of *The Level* from John and Ellen Cross for 8,000-lb. tobo. and £ 45 on 28 Oct. 1701, he and Sarah sold this land to Joseph Hill for 8,000-lb. tobo. and £ 50 on 10 Mar. 1701/02, that same day he and Sarah sold *Proctor's Park*, 518 acres, to Henry Maynard (a merchant of London, England) for 12,400 lb. tobo Thomas Reynolds also acquired *Walnut Neck*, 122 acres, and *Food Plenty*, 830 acres. All Reynold's lands lay in Anne Arundel County (*Food Plenty* ended up just across the line in Howard County when that county was set off from Anne Arundel in 1851).

Thomas Reynolds repeatedly was sheriff. In 1696 he was one of several hundred Maryland officials who signed the Address to King William; Reynolds, as subsheriff, signed among the "Civell Officers & Magistrates &ca of Ann Arundel County." According to his own deposition on 15 Feb. 1717, Thomas Reynolds "for about the Space of 16 years past and upwards ... Acted as under Sheriff or High Sheriff without any Intermission in Ann Arundell County and in all that time had the North Side of South and Severn Rivers for his walks.." Sheriffs frequently were unpopular since they were the county tax and fee collectors. They often extended credit to planters for payments due; these were private debts to the sheriff who frequently had to hound his debtors for many years. At that time high sheriffs generally were paid commissions of 5-10% of what they collected (and they had other income as well), from which income they paid the deputies (sub-sheriffs, under sheriffs) they employed. On 2 July 1714 Thomas Reynolds petitioned the Governor to be appointed sheriff at the next vacancy; he was "commissionated" high sheriff of Ann Arundel County again in October 1714, probably for the customary three- year term (a one-year appointment followed by up to two optional one-year renewals).

Thomas and Sarah Reynolds had four at least

children (birth dates from parish records):

1) Lavinia, born 31 Jan. 1700(/017) at 11 A. M. married by 1722 Amos **Simpson**, son of Thomas and Elizabeth Simpson. Lavinia and Amos were both living on 22 Apr. 1725 (when her father gave them land);

2) Thomas, born 25 Jan. 1703(/047) at about 3 A. M.; living 6 Sep. 1743 (when he signed the inventory of his father's estate); married 8 July 1722 Elizabeth(-);

2)Maccubbin, b. 13 May 1707; d. Aug. 1748;

3) Sarah, born 9 June 1710; living and unmarried on 9 Mar. 1725/26 (when her father gave her land)..

Sarah (Maccubbin) (Griffith) Reynolds died 22 Apr. 1716. Thomas Reynolds, Sr., then married Elizabeth (--), apparently soon after Sarah's death. Thomas and Elizabeth had at least two children: Rebecca and Turner; thus Elizabeth probably was (considerably) younger than Thomas. During the mid-1720's, when Thomas Reynolds was probably in his sixties, he and Elizabeth gave parts of *Food Plenty* to their children: (1) "We, Thomas Reynolds Sr. and Eliza. Reynolds of AA, for the love we have for our son-in-law Amos Sympson & daughter, Levina Sympson of AA, have given them 210 acres, being part of a tract called Food Plenty ... Apr 22, 1725"; (2) "We, Thomas Reynolds Sr. and Eliza. Reynolds of AA, for the love we have for our daughter, Sarah Reynolds of AA, have given her 210 acres, being part of Food Plenty Mar 9, 1725[/6]"; (3) "I, Thomas Reynolds Sr. of AA, for the love I have for my daughter and son, Rebecca Reynolds & Turner Reynolds, I give them 210 acres, to be equally divided ... part of... Food Plenty If both grantees die without issue, then ... for the love I have for my wife, Eliza. Reynolds, I grant her the 210 acres [Land to be divided by] Henry Ridgley, Orlando Griffith, Thomas Reynolds Jr., Thom's Spurder, Maccubbin Reynolds, William Griffith, and Amos Simpson ... the division to be made when my sd daughter Rebecca Reynolds shall come to the age of 16 or day of marriage....Apr 11, 1726".

Thomas Reynolds, Sr., had died (apparently intestate) by 6 Sept. 1743 when his estate was appraised at 14/6/9. He must have been at least 80 years old and by then must have given away most of what he had once owned.
