Before Your Visit To The Family History Library.....

From a March 2000 FHC Memorandum from the Family History Dept., Vol. 21, No. 1, sent to us by the Bowen Family [roc3177a@tisd.net]

The Family History Library in Salt Lake City has one of the largest collections of genealogical

records in the world, but not all of the films listed in the FHL Catalog are housed in the library because of space limitations. Copies of most films for the U.S., Canada, Britain, Germany, and Scandinavia are available in the library. However, copies of many films from other parts of the world must be ordered by library staff from the Granite Mountain Records Vault or the Salt Lake Distribution Center when needed by patrons. If a copy of a film must be ordered, it may not be available at the library for a day or two. A patron who plans to visit the FHL in Salt Lake should search the FHL Catalog in advance at a Family History Center or at the web site [<http://www.familysearch.org/>] to determine if the films are in the library. The patron can then send a letter or an e-mail to the library, preferably four weeks before the visit, listing the films needed in the priority order. Library staff can verify which films are available in the library and which need to be ordered. The request should include the patron's telephone number or e-mail address. Dating Tombstones: One way to help find the era your ancestor was buried is to examine the material from which the tombstone is made. If your ancestor has a stone made of slate or common fieldstone (except wood used by pioneers), chances are the stone dates from 1796-1830.

* If the stone is flat-topped hard marble, dates are about 1830-1849.

* If the "mystery" stone is round or pointed soft marble with cursive inscriptions, look for a date of 1845-1868.

* Masonic four-sided stones began in 1850 and are still in use today.

* Pylons, columns and all exotic-style monuments are usually dated 1860-1900.

* Zinc monuments date from 1870-1900.

* Granite, now common, came into use about 1900.

If the writing is too faded to read, use a 75-watt black light bulb in any lamp that casts light directly on the written message. The writing will miraculously appear!

What Do Those Initials Mean?

Initials after your ancestor's names may provide useful information that you'd not expect. The following list includes initials you may come across when reading old wills/other documents.

a.a.s.: died in the year of his/her age (anno aetatis suae) (86 y/o died in year 86);

d.s.p.: died without issue (decessit sine prole legitima);

d.s.p.l.: died without legitimate issue (decessit sine prole mascula supesita);

d.s.p.m.s: died without surviving male issue (decessit sine prole mascula supersita);

d.s.p.s: died without surviving issue (decessit sine prole supersita);

d.unm: died unmarried;

d.v.p: died in the lifetime of father (decessit vita patris);

d.v.m.: died in the lifetime of mother (decessit vita matris);

Et al: and others (et alia);

Inst/instant: present month (instans);

Liber: book or volume;

Nepos: grandson;

Nunc: Nuncupative will, an oral will, written by a witness;

Ob: he/she died (obit);

Relict: widow/widower (relicta/relictus);

Sic: so or thus, exact copy as written;

Testes: witnesses;

Utl/ultimate: late (ultimo);

Ux or vs: wife (uxor);

Viz: namely (videlicet).

Reynolds, Edwin Ruthvin (1816-1908) Born in New York. U.S. Representative from New York 31st District, 1860-61; state court judge.

Reynolds, Eustace Socialist candidate for U.S. Representative from New York 40th District, 1924. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, James B. (1779-1851) of Clarksville, Tenn. Born in County Antrim, Ireland (now Northern Ireland). U.S. Representative from

Tennessee at-large, 1815-17, 1823-25. Died in Clarksville, Tenn., June 10, 1851. Interment at Riverview Cemetery, Clarksville, Tenn. (See also his congressional biography.)

Reynolds, John (1788-1865) Brother of Thomas Reynolds. Born in Montgomery County, Pa., February 26, 1788. Justice of Illinois state supreme court, 1818-25; candidate for U.S. Senator from Illinois, 1823; member of Illinois state house of representatives, 1827-29, 1846, 1852; Speaker of the Illinois State House of Representatives, 1852; Governor of Illinois, 1830-34; U.S. Representative from Illinois 1st District, 1834-37, 1839-43; candidate for Illinois state senate, 1848; candidate for Illinois superintendent of public instruction, 1858. Died in Belleville, Ill., May 8, 1865. Interment at Walnut Hill Cemetery, Belleville, Ill. (See also his congressional biography.)

Reynolds, John Member of California state assembly 7th District, 1881-83. Burial location unknown.

Member of New Hampshire state senate 18th District, 1893-94. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Lewis Henry (1864-1944) of Clanton, Ala. Born in Macon County, Ala., October 16, 1864. Probate judge; Republican candidate for U.S. Senator from Alabama, 1920; delegate to Republican National Convention from Alabama, 1924; Alabama Republican state chair, 1925. Died December 19, 1944. Interment at Clanton Cemetery, Clanton, Ala.

Reynolds, Melvin Jay 'Mel' (b. 1952) Born in Mound Bayou, Miss., January 8, 1952. U.S. Representative from Illinois 2nd District, 1993-; defeated, 1988, 1990. Convicted in 1995 on sexual misconduct and obstruction of justice charges and sentenced to five years in prison. Convicted in federal court in 1997 of 15 counts of bank fraud, wire fraud, and lying to the Federal Election Commission. Still living as of 1998. (See also his congressional biography.)

Reynolds, N. N. Delegate to Democratic National Convention from Arkansas, 1876. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Nancy Presidential Elector from Missouri, 1996. Still living as of 1996.

Reynolds, Omar H. of Clanton, Ala. Republican candidate for U.S. Representative from Alabama 4th District, 1926. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Raffo of Louisville, Ky. Republican candidate for Kentucky state house of representatives 36th District, 1975. Still living as of 1975.

Reynolds, Robert John (1838-1909) Born March 17, 1838. Governor of Delaware, 1891-95. Died June 10, 1909. Interment at Loudon Park Cemetery, Baltimore, Md.

Reynolds, Robert (McConnell) (1826-1885) of Camden, Ala. Delegate to Republican National Convention from Alabama, 1868, 1872; U.S. Minister to Bolivia, 1874-76. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Robert Rice (1884-1963) of Asheville, N.C. Born in Asheville, N.C., June 18, 1884. Died in Asheville, N.C., February 13, 1963. Interment at Riverside Cemetery, Asheville, N.C.

Reynolds, Samuel Williams (1890-1988) Born in Omaha, Neb., August 11, 1890. Served in the U.S. Army during World War I; U.S. Senator

from Nebraska, 1954. Died in Omaha, Neb., March 20, 1988. Interment at Forest Lawn Cemetery, Omaha, Neb

Reynolds, Thomas Justice of Illinois state supreme court, 1822-25. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Thomas (1796-1844) Brother of John Reynolds. Born March 12, 1796. Governor of Missouri, 1840-44. Died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound, February 9, 1844. Interment at Woodland Cemetery, Jefferson City, Mo.

Reynolds, Thomas A. of East Greenwich, R.I. Delegate to Democratic National Convention from Rhode Island, 1864. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Thomas Cate (1821-1887) Born in South Carolina. Lieutenant Governor of Missouri; elected 1860; Governor of Missouri, 1862-65. Killed himself by leaping down an elevator shaft at the Customs House, St. Louis, Mo., March 30, 1887. Interment at Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis, Mo.

Reynolds, Verne L. Labor candidate for U.S. Representative from Maryland 3rd District, 1922; Socialist Labor candidate for Vice President of the United States, 1924; Socialist Labor candidate for President of the United States, 1928, 1932. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Virginia W. of Richmond, Va. Delegate to Republican National Convention from Virginia, 1964. Still living as of 1964.

Reynolds, W. J. 'Bill' of Allen, Ky. Member of Kentucky state house of representatives 95th District; elected 1973. Still living as of 1973.

Reynolds, Wallace J. of Royal Oak, Mich. Democratic candidate for Michigan state house of representatives 68th District, 1970. Still living as of 1970.

Reynolds, William Workers candidate for Governor of Michigan, 1928. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, William H. Delegate to Republican National Convention from Rhode Island, 1868. Burial location unknown.

Reynolds, Wilson S. of Middletown, Conn. Alternate delegate to Republican National Convention from Connecticut, 1920. Burial location unknown.

Runnels, Hardin Richard (1820-1873) Nephew of Hiram George Runnels. Born in Mississippi, August 30, 1820. Member of Texas state house of representatives, 1847-54; Speaker of the Texas State House of Representatives, 1853-54; Lieutenant Governor of Texas, 1855-57; Governor of Texas, 1857-59; delegate to Texas secession convention, 1861; delegate to Texas

state constitutional convention, 1866. Died December 25, 1873. Original interment a private or family graveyard, Bowie County, Tex.; reinterment in 1929 at Texas State Cemetery, Austin, Tex.

Runnels, Harold Lowell (1924-1980) Born in Dallas, Tex., March 17, 1924. Served in the U.S. Army Air Force in World War II; member of New Mexico state senate, 1960-70; U.S. Representative from New Mexico 2nd District, 1971-80. Died in New York City, N.Y., August 5, 1980. Interment at Rest Haven Memorial Gardens, Lovington, N.M. (See also his congressional biography.)

Runnels, Hiram George (1796-1857) Uncle of Hardin Richard Runnels. Born in Hancock County, Ga., December 17, 1796. Mississippi state auditor, 1822-30; member of Mississippi state legislature, 1830, 1841; Governor of Mississippi, 1833-35; delegate to Texas state constitutional convention, 1845. Died in Houston, Tex., December 17, 1857. Interment at Glenwood Cemetery, Houston, Tex. Runnels County, Tex. is named for him.
