A History of Calvert Co., Maryland

Reynolds: The Reynolds family is one of those Puritan families widely dispersed from New England to the Southern Colonies.

Thomas Reynolds settled in Anne Arundel Co. The first family in Calvert Co. was John Reynolds, perhaps son of Thomas. He married Sarah **Robinson**, a daughter of Henry Robinson, Jr. of Calvert Co. Robinson died in 1684 and left his lands in Calvert Co., including Robinson's Rest, his dwelling plantation on the Upper Cliffs, to his daughter, Sarah Reynolds.

John Reynolds died prior to 1714 without leaving a will. Edward Reynolds, presumably his son, is listed on the Rent Rolls as owning lands on the Upper

Cliffs, and he and his son, Thomas Reynolds appear on the Tax List of 1733.

The Reynolds family was highly successful in accumulating wealth. If not Quakers, they had connections with the Chews and other Quaker families. Thomas Reynolds became the greatest landowner of the Upper Cliffs. The Debt Book of 1753 shows him possessed of 3029 acres of land, all in the upper County. His lands were inherited by his sons, William and Edward Reynolds.

Edward Reynolds married Mary **Mackall**, the second daughter of General James John Mackall. The Tax List of 1782 shows the Reynolds family land holdings equally divided between Edward and William Reynolds. Edward Reynolds in later years became the wealthier of the two. He was the owner of fifty-eight slaves in 1800, one of the greatest slave holdings in Calvert Co. Edward Reynolds represented Calvert Co. in the Lower House of the Maryland Assembly for several years. He was succeeded by his son, Thomas Reynolds, who seems to have been the last of the line in Calvert Co. He died or left the county prior to the Civil War. It is probable that he sold his slaves and plantations, as did many of the Quakers prior to the Civil War. Ref: Will of Henry Robinson Jr., 1684; Will of William Reynolds, 1730; Will of Edward Reynolds, 1747.

Robinson: The Robinsons were another of the Puritan families from the American Colonies from New England to Virginia. John Robinson, the leader and minister of the Puritan Colony in the Netherlands (were among the) Mayflower Puritans coming to America. The Calvert Co. Branch of the Robinson family was founded by Henry Robinson who settled in Calvert not later than 1658. He transported a number of settlers to Maryland, for which he was granted Robinson's Rest, 1150 acres on the Upper Cliffs adjoining Letchworth's Chance to the south.

Henry Robinson died in 1675 and left his lands to his son, Henry Jr. The latter died in 1684, leaving Robinson's Rest to (...) daughter, Sarah, the wife of John Reynolds. In this way, the wealth of the Robinson family was acquired by the Reynolds family, whose later representatives were among the

greatest landowners of upper Calvert Co.. Refs: Will of Henry Robinson, 1675; Will of Henry Robinson, Jr., 1684.

**The Rappahannock Reynolds Series - Part IV
Joseph Reynolds of Caroline/Orange Co., VA

Tillman has Joseph Reynolds [1808] being b. Isle of Wright Co., VA as a son of Nathaniel Reynolds [1677]. The subject of this article, Joseph Reynolds, was born in one of the counties along the Rappahannock River and was not a son of Nathaniel. Tillman has Joseph m. 1731 to Elizabeth Herndon with issue: William, Phillip, John, Aaron, John [b. 1750], Benjamin, Margaret, Richard, Elizabeth & Tabitha. The only children that I have been able to identify for Joseph Reynolds were: William, Joseph & Benjamin the remaining children shown by Tillman are suspect. Some of these individuals are descended from Thomas Reynolds & Susan Snead [Phillip {see Reynolds & McQuire Ancestors, by William W. Reynolds}] and some appear to be children of Cornelius & Rachel Reynolds of Orange Co., VA [Tabitha & Aaron].

Joseph Reynolds of Caroline Co., VA gave a deed gift to his sons William, Joseph and Benjamin in 1772. The deed of gift was definitely for slaves, with William and Benjamin getting several each, and Joseph getting two. Some say that he gave William land but I did not see this. It is speculated that he gave the deed of gift instead of a will, for he died in 1772.

In 1772, Joseph Reynolds was married to an Elizabeth Estes, the widow of Abraham Estes. She & Estes had two sons: Elisha & Benjamin. By 1764, Joseph Reynolds was their guardian. This would imply that Joseph Reynolds & Elizabeth Estes were married by 1764. We do not know either Elizabeth's maiden name or if she was the mother of any of Joseph's children.

Elizabeth Estes Reynolds died circa 1774. Apparently unhappy with Joseph Reynolds' estate settlement, she brought suits against the estate. In one of these suits, she says that some of the property that Joseph had was received from his father, Cornelius Reynolds.

Summary: 1. This Joseph Reynolds is the son of Cornelius Reynolds & his father and grandfather

would have to be proven.

2. The Elizabeth to whom Joseph was married to in 1764 – 1774 was **not** the mother of his children. The children shown by Tillman for Joseph are only about one-third truly Joseph's. The identity of Joseph's first wife, and the mother of his children, would have to be proven. RFA members claiming this Joseph Reynolds as their ancestor should take note of this.

3. Joseph Reynolds' Sons:

William lived in Orange Co., VA. In 1795, William Reynolds, of Orange Co., VA, and his wife, Elizabeth, sold to Joseph Reynolds 300 acres of land. One would have to research Orange Co. to determine if William & Elizabeth had issue.

Joseph also lived in Orange Co., VA. Some say he was born in 1750; he married, 16 Feb 1774, Susannah Wright.

27 Apr 1780: Joseph & Susanna his wife sold 100 acres to Rush Hudson.

5 July 1791: John Wright & Frances, his wife, sold to Joseph Reynolds 50 acres formerly purchased by Reynolds from Thomas Walker and then sold to John Wright who is now selling it back.

1795: William Reynolds and Elizabeth his wife sold to Joseph Reynolds 300 acres.

20 Feb 1806: Joseph Reynolds & Susanna. His wife, to their son, Washington Reynolds, 211 acres. [Note: all of the above mentioned lands appear to be in the same general location. Some of the land may have been given to William and/or Joseph by their father, Joseph Reynolds.]

In his will of 28 August 1819 [proven 7 Aug 1821], Joseph named his wife, Susanna Wright Reynolds; sons: William, Washington & Joseph; daughters: Mary Wigglesworth and Henrietta Wells. [Note: this family has been both well researched and documented.]

Benjamin was also in Orange Co., VA; some say he died as early as 1773 and had been married to an Elizabeth. Benjamin & Elizabeth apparently had at least one son, Benjamin, Jr. Elizabeth remarried to a James Grady. On 4 Nov 1800, James & Elizabeth Grady received from Benjamin Reynolds of Columbia Co., GA, \$100.00 for her dowers interest in two slaves who were given in 1772 to Benjamin Reynolds, deceased, by his father, Joseph Reynolds. In 1800, these slaves were in the possession of William Reynolds [an uncle, I presume]. Obviously,

Benjamin Reynolds, Jr. was in Columbia Co., GA by 1800.

**History of Rockingham Co., NH & Representative
Citizens**

Page 1284 -**Frederick W. Reynolds**, owner and operator of a good farm in East Derry, Rockingham Co., NH was born in 1856, a son of Stephen and Sarah (Sergeant) Reynolds. The father, born on the old Reynolds homestead in 1820, was a carpenter and farmer, and in politics a republican. His wife Sarah was a native of Candia, NH. They were the parents of five children, only two of whom are now living, Frederick W., the subject of this sketch, and Walter. Tracing the Reynolds ancestry farther back, we find that

the grandfather of our subject, on the paternal side, was also named Stephen. He was born in Derry in 1768 and was a farmer and carpenter. He died in 1848. His father was Daniel Reynolds, a Revolutionary soldier, with the rank of colonel, who served under General Stark at the Battle of Bennington [sic VT]. Thus we see that for at least four generations the Reynolds family has been located in this section, and its members generally have been patriotic, industrious and law-abiding citizens, useful and respected in their day and generation.

Frederick W. Reynolds was reared and educated in the town of Derry, attending the common schools and Pinkerton Academy. He has made farming his life business, and, inheriting the steady and industrious qualities of his ancestors, has achieved a comfortable degree of prosperity. He is a public spirited citizen, taking an interest in everything calculated to promote the development of the town in which he resides, and his aid and influence can always be counted on in behalf of any worthy cause.

OLD SOLDIER GONE

Died at Whitehall, NY the 16th inst., Mr. Jonathan Reynolds*, at the advanced age of 100 years. Mr. Reynolds was a native of Dutchess Co., NY. He came into this town at an early period and resided on his farm on Otter Creek until a few years since when he removed with his son to Whitehall. He retained his physical and mental powers almost without perceptible decay till near the end of his long life. At the age of 90, he had scarcely lost the vigor and activity not of middle age merely but by early manhood. He was very fond of the sports of the field, and at the age of ninety he went out and shot a fine deer upon the banks of the creek. He ever maintained an irreproachable character.

He was a soldier of the revolution, now a title of the highest honor. From 1832, he received a pension as Lieutenant, in which rank he served under Washington. He has left to this town many descendants.

We remember one trait in his character which showed his estimate of the privileges he helped to purchase. He was ALWAYS found at the ballot box while he resided among us; -- an example worthy of imitation.

*Jonathan Reynolds was a descendant of John Reynolds of Watertown, Line 20.
