Baltimore, affectionately known as 'Charm City' offers access to numerous truly exceptional genealogical libraries and resources covering both Maryland and national areas. Some of the genealogical resources are:

- **Maryland Historical Soc Library:** The library maintains an extraordinary collection of books, journals, manuscripts, newspapers, maps, photographs, prints, broadsides, pamphlets, obsolete currency, oral histories, ephemera, and microfilm reflecting the history of Maryland and its people. These collections bring four centuries of Maryland history to life.
- **The DAR Library:** over 300,000 genealogical files & manuscripts; 60,000 microfilms of census, military & land records; 15000 unpublished records, 160,000 books.
- **National Archives and Records Administration** an absolute must for any genealogist.

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- **The Maryland State Archives** is the repository for the records of state, county, and municipal governments within the state of Maryland. Among the Special Collections are Adoption Papers, Birth Records, Cemetery Records, Census Records, Church Records, City Directories, County Records, Court Records, Death Records, Divorce Records, Immigration and Naturalization, Land Records, Map Collections, Marriage Records, Military Records, Municipal Records Newspapers, Plats, Probate (Estate) Records, State Records, Tax Lists, and Vital Records.

Rappahannock River Series – Part VI **4th Generation of James Rennolds I's Second Family** by Bill King

John & Elizabeth Rennolds' children were:

1. **Robert Rennolds**, and his brother, Barnard, were in VA State Units during the Revolutionary War and apparently experienced many southern battles over a 3-year period of war. Robert married Dolly Robinson, dtr of George, on 3 Nov 1786 in Caroline co., VA. Robert & Dolly took their family to KY in 1806 & settled in Lincoln Co. Robert died in 1815 and Dolly in 1838. Their estates were settled by Chancery Court between 1840 –1854 in which some of their

children & grandchildren were named. [Note: Tillman had dolly Robinson married to the wrong person.]

2. **Bernard Rennolds** was in the Rev. War. In his pension application he says that he completed his 3-year enlistment & that he was in the Battle of Camden [SC] & was also at the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown. He was on the tax rolls for Caroline Co., VA from 1787 – 1798. He lived in Henrico Co., VA & later in Russel Co., VA, where he died. His married Lucy Johnston, dtr of Benjamin, 1 Feb 1787. Tillman has Bernard with the wrong parents but other than that his showing of Bernard & Lucy's children is a goof representation. See Tillman's Bernard Reynolds T2-6916 for details.

3. **Lucy Rennolds**. I was unable to find any details of Lucy's life.

4. **Jacob Rennolds** was on the tax list in Caroline Co., VA as early as 1783 and listed by himself beginning in 1787. On 15 Nov 1793, he married Martha Burris, dtr of William. Jacob was a doctor. He died by 1814 and his estate was divided in 1825 between his wife, Martha, and their children: Polly, Leland, Nelson, Susan & Eldred.

5th Generation of James Rennolds I's Second Family Robert Rennolds & Dolly Robinson's children:

1. **Larkin Reynolds** was born in Caroline Co., VA & moved, with his parents, to Lincoln Co., KY. On 22 Dec 1810, he married Mary Jones, dtr of Evon & Mariam. In 1823, he purchased, from his siblings, 300 acres in Casey Co., KY from his father's estate. On 18 Dec 1823, Larkin's nuncupative will written by Evon Jones. Larkin & Mary had the following children: Larkin Jr. [Ruth Lockwood & Betty Joe Blackwell line], Robert, Ann, Martha, Joshua J. [Bill King's line], Abraham & Sarah. Mary Jones Reynolds lived for a while on their property and then the family disappears from the records. One family story has that the children were orphaned.

2. **James Reynolds** was said to be one of the older children because he was on the tax rolls in Lincoln Co. early on. He appears to have married later in life but any children he had are unknown.

3. **Robert Reynolds, II** married, on 21 Jul 1812, Elizabeth Feland, dtr of Andrew. By 1823, the family was in Howard Co., MO. Robert &

Elizabeth's children were: Sarah Lucinda, John, Matilda, Andre, Malinda [m. 1840 David H. King], Thomas [m. Elizabeth Jackson {Lynn Downings' line} in 1843] & Montraville.

4. **Benjamin Reynolds** married Permelia Skidmore, dtr of Joseph, on 21 Jan 1822. Benjamin was on the Lincoln Co. tax rolls until 1831. DAR paper # 523888 on Robert Reynolds I for Mrs. Frances Rabb suggests that he went to Howard Co., MO. One might look in the Howard & adjacent counties in MO for them. [Note: On Lincoln Co. tax rolls from 1821 – 1831 there was a Benjamin Reynolds, Jr. I do not know who he was. I question whether or not any of Robert's children were old enough to have fathered/mothered a child that old.]

5. **George Reynolds** married Sarah Skidmore 14 Oct 1813 in Lincoln Co., KY. George was on the tax rolls until 1823. I believe that he took his family to MO at that time. Some of his children were in Randolph Co., MO. George & Sarah had 14 children: Larkin, Dolly, Joseph, James, Catherine, Margaret Ann, Permelia, William, Sarah Jane, Daniel Boone, Hiram McKevey [Willa Mae Johnston's line] & Ebenezer Edgar.

6. **Martha 'Patsey' Reynolds** married Bailey Brown 17 Jan 1820. They probably went to MO in the mid-1830's, where they lived in Marion & Monroe Co.'s. Their children were: Robert, Amanda, Mary, Jacob, Joseph, Newton, Sarah Elizabeth & George C.

7. **Elizabeth 'Betsey' Reynolds** married James Green Daniels 24 Aug 1818 in Lincoln Co., KY. She & her family lived several years in Casey Co., KY. Elizabeth, her husband and her brother, Thomas Reynolds, filed papers for the Chancery suit in Lincoln Co. to reach a settlement of Robert & Dolly Reynolds' estates. After this, some of her family went to MO. Elizabeth died in Randolph Co., MO. She and James Daniels' children were: Amanda, Perelina, Malinda, Robert Campbell [Mrs. Frances Rabb's line], Jennings Green, Beverly Robinson, John Sublette, Pleasant, Levisa, Thomas Reynolds, Logan Henderson, Martha Sarah, Mary A. & Bernetta.

8. **Cornelius Reynolds** married Angelina Hocker 19 Mar 1821 in Lincoln Co., KY. They had two children: Margaret Ann & Manerva. They moved to MO in the late 1800's where Angelina died & Cornelius married Evalina Thornton 16 Oct 1827 in Howard Co., MO. They spent

most of their lives in Saline Co., MO, where he died 2 Nov 1842. Cornelius & Evalina had the following: Robert N., Peter Thornton, Larkin R., Cornelius, Sophia, William M & Mary Virginia. Tillman had Cornelius Reynolds, T2-5929 with the wrong parents and does not show the earlier marriage to Angelina.

9. **Sarah Reynolds** would have been born ca 1803. She married Constantine Brown sometime between 1823 – 1840. In the 1840 census, they were in Marion or Monroe Co., MO; they spent most of their lives in Monroe Co. I do not know who their children were but suggest that the 1850/1860 Census be checked.

10. **Thomas Reynolds** was the youngest child of Robert & Dolly Reynolds. He bought his sisters', Patsey Brown's, share of their parents' estate in 1835; in 1846, he bought his sister, Sarah Brown's, share also. Thomas married Patsey Brown 1 Mar 1837 in Lincoln Co., KY; Willis Brown was the bondsman. Thomas died between 1888 – 1892 in Houstonville, Lincoln Co. He & Patsey had two children: Elizabeth & Jane. Thomas stayed with his mother on the family farm until her death ca 1837. He may have ended up owning this farm, containing 100 acres on the Hanging Fork branch of the Dix River [near Houstonville, KY].

pgs. 645 – 647 **Nelson Gilbert Reynolds**, High Sheriff of Ontario County, since it was organized in 1853 is the son of Rev. John Reynolds, many years a Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal church, and a native of the north of Ireland, and, was born at Kingston; Upper Canada., January 23, 1814. His mother was Mary, nee Gilbert, whose father was from England. Young Reynolds was educated at Upper Canada College, and Cazurovia (New York) Seminary; at fifteen years of age went to England, and became an officer in the 11th Lancers, afterwards Huzzars; in 1833 returned to Belleville, Canada, where his parents were residing; shortly afterwards went out to what is now Manitoba, as Lieutenant of a company of the 54th regiment, contingent troops, in the service of the Hudson Bay company, going as far 'west as Jasper House, part way up the Becky Mountains, and enduring many privations, hardships, and perils. Returning to Belleville, he was elected to the Upper Canada Parliament, before he was of age, taking his seat as soon as legally entitled to it. The Parliament, however, was soon dissolved. For several years Mr. Reynolds was President of the celebrated Marmora foundry, or smelting company, was also at one time at the head of a steamboat company, and interested in banking, mercantile business, railroading & other enterprises, this period of his life being subsequent to the rebellion of 1837-'38.

At the breaking out of the so-called "Patriot war," Mr. Reynolds was an officer on duty and during all that trying period, was perfectly loyal to the parent Government, having no desire to see a separation of Canada from the mother country. But he did not believe in any "'family compact" as it was called; thought the Local Government was wider the control of an oligarchy, and wished to see a changes. In short, he heartily sympathized with those who advocated the principles of "Responsible Government," and was a bold and strong advocate of such government.

During those times he was in several skirmishes; received three wounds, still carrying a ball in his right thigh, and was falsely accused of being a traitor. During the excitement, when at its highest pitch, he crossed to the American side; soon afterwards returned and voluntarily surrendered; was tried for conspiracy and treason before Judge McLean, at Kingston, at a special court ordered by Lord Durham, who visited him while in prison, and 44 witnesses were examined on the part of the Crown, and not one in his defense. He declined to have any lawyer to plead his case; made, himself, a clear statement of his views; explained the motive which had prompted his every act, and was acquitted without the jury ever leaving their seats. Then was witnessed such a scene as a courtroom rarely furnished. Men of all political parties rushed to Mr. Reynolds in their joy and excitement almost tore him clothes off, and carried him out of the courthouse, and through 'the streets making the welkin 'ring with shouts and hums, the troops o'n duty saluting him as he passed'.

Mr. Reynolds held almost every municipal office in the town of Belleville, and the' county of Hastings; and has been sheriff of Ontario for 26 years; he is the oldest sheriff in years, but the youngest in that office, probably, of any man in the Province. In fact, from the time that he became a military officer at 16 years of age, he has held some official position, either under the, Government of Great Britain, the Province of Ontario, or some municipality, and nearly, all his life, many of such offices conjointly. He is a man of universal business talents, and executive abilities, and great force of character. Until quite recently he has been a man of great physical endurance; in his younger years, was known as 'Iron Reynolds," and though never a professional athlete, has always been blest with great activity and muscular strength. He has been a good sportsman, a great horseman, and

has often ridden in steeplechases. Mr. Reynolds is a member of the Church of England, and was warden of churches at Belleville and Whitby.

He was first married to **Hannah M Eyre**, a near descendant of Sir Giles Eyre, of Eyre Court in the north of Ireland and by her he had 12 children, she dying in September, 1850. Most of the children died young, only two of them now living. Florence Mary Hastings, wife of Frederick Casey, barrister, Smith's Falls, and Charles Bagot, who is at Belleville.

His present wife was **Frances Eliza Armstrong**, daughter of James R Armstrong, of Toronto, at one time member of Parliament, married March 16, 1852. By her he has also had 12 children, nine of them yet living. Frances De Saullus, the eldest daughter, is the wife of Harvey L Henderson, of Montreal; the others are single.

In 1859, Sheriff Reynolds built a remarkably fine residence, called "Trafalgar Castle," in which he has resided for years. It is not only a mammoth structure for a rural town, but most elaborately finished, with the Reynolds and Armstrong costs of arms, and other devices in the wings showing much taste. Finding it too large for him to take care of, it is now occupied as a Ladies College, he retaining a large interest in it, and 'residing more centrally in Whitby, in a house quite spacious enough for his use. For 3 years he has been afflicted with paralysis, which confines him meet of the time to the house.
