Dennis W. REYNOLDS merchant, Reyno. For many years Mr. Reynolds has been a prominent resident of Randolph County, and has enjoyed the reputation of being an intelligent and honorable

business man. He possesses that shrewd business tact and energy which are characteristic of people of Illinois birth, for he was born in Jackson County, of that State, in 1840, being a son of James M. and Elizabeth Reynolds the former of whom removed from the State of North Carolina to Illinois, while it was a Territory. The father was a native of North Carolina, and the mother of Jackson County, Ill. He was a farmer and hunter by occupation; was a participant in the War of 1812, and two years after his wife's death, which occurred in 1857, he married Minerva **Foster**. He was sheriff of Jackson County for four years, and also held a number of minor offices in Arkansas. He was noted for his morality and charity, and his death which occurred in 1884, at the age of seventy years, was a severe loss to the community in which he resided. Dennis W. Reynolds is self-educated, and when only seventeen years of age he entered mercantile life at Cherokee Bay, which enterprise received his attention for three years, or until the war broke out. On the 11th of March, 1862, he dropped all his work to enlist in the Seventh Missouri Infantry, Capt. A. G. Kelsey's company, as a private, and was afterward promoted to the rank of sergeant and then to captain, which position he held until hostilities ceased. He was at Greenville. Mo., Little Rock, and was with Price on his raid through Missouri. After being paroled he returned to his home in this county, and was one of the successful husbandmen of the county until 1875, when he established his present mercantile business at Corning, Clay County, Ark., and since 1878 has been at Reyno. Mr. Reynolds possesses a thorough knowledge of the business in which he is engaged, and has the necessary requisites for successfully conducting it. He also manages his farm and gives considerable attention to the propagation of stock; and it may be truly said that in every enterprise in which he has been interested, and to which he has given his attention, his labors have been followed with excellent results. He has always taken a deep interest in the politics of the county, and although not an unreasonable partisan he has always been a Democrat in his political views. He is a Master Mason, and he and his wife, whose maiden name was Mattie J. **Wilkis**, are earnest and consistent members of the Baptist Church. He was first married in 1861, to Miss Nancy **Luttrell**, but her death occurred the following year at the age of eighteen years. She left one son, James, who died in 1888, aged twenty-six years. His second wife was the widow of A. G. **Kelsey**, and had formerly been Miss Mary **Ellis**. She was born on Blue-Grass soil, and died in 1868, having borne two children: Madison A. and Elizabeth A. To him and his present wife have been born the following family: Leoa, Ervin and Pearl. Three children died in infancy. Mrs. Reynolds conducts a millinery establishment in her own store, and her bonnets and hats are always trimmed in excellent taste and the latest style. Mr. Reynolds was the first to clear the land and build

where the town of Reyno now stands, which place, by the way, was named in his honor. He erected the first dwelling house and hotel, and is now doing business in the first business house in the town.

The Millar-du Bois Family Its History and Genealogy; Written And Compiled By Eva Miller Nourse; 1928

ELIZABETH **Millar** the first child of William and Elizabeth (**Perree**) Millar was born in Stone House on the Millar plantation near Front Royal, Virginia, on "Tuesday, September 19, 1771, 11 o'clock, 11 minutes" by Bible record. She was married before her father died; in their Virginia home August 9, 1787 to William **Raynolds** of Richmond Co., Va. born June 23, 1764; died October 14, 1814 in Canton, Ohio.

"The grandfather of William was Geoffrey Raynolds born bout 1656 in England and was of royal blood and during the scourge there of cholera, "The black death", he was sent with a tutor to Virginia; when the conditions at home permitted his return he desired to make the new world his home and the "a" in the name was adopted to designate him and his descendants from all other Reynolds.." No one of the clan has been found who fails to use the changed spelling though not all are informed of the origin. The will of Geoffrey Raynolds, executed March 3, 1721; probated June 11. 1725 in Richmond Co. VA.

William Raynolds left Richmond Co., VA where he was born, and settled in Front Royal at the

time of his marriage to Elizabeth Millar whose father established them there and in his will, probated three years later, further devised to them.

But with the first government land sales in Kentucky and Ohio in 1802, the tide of sentiment was strong for western settlement. Hence, immediately upon he marriage and departure for Ohio of his wife's brother John William Millar late in 1803, many letters passed between them showing themselves precursors to Mr. Raynolds removal to that state family, settling at Zanesville. "He volunteered under Gen. Cass and was captain of a Company of Volunteer Infantry which he raised and was at the surrender of Hull at Detroit, where he contracted a disease from which he died October 14, 1814 with the rank of Major. His wife Elizabeth whom he always called "Captain" survived him many years, dying on May 20, 1843." A grandson remembered her to have been blind for a year before her death, but that she bore it uncomplainingly.

Following is one letter to his brother-in-law

John William Millar—
Front Royal, Frederick Co. VA

Dear Johnny

It is unaccountable to me why I have not received an answer to neither of the letters sent to you via Chillicothe (postpaid) they were directed to be forwarded by the Post Master at the first safe opportunity, that they were forwarded I have no doubt and have been expecting for several weeks past an answer.

I now improve an opportunity by Mr. Isaac Millar of Kentucky to forward this via Portsmouth or Alexandria. He has promised to stop on his way down Ohio at the mouth of Scioto from whence I am in hopes you will soon get it, as I am told by your Brother 'tis your County Town and the nearest to you; be pleased to spare no pains in procuring an opportunity to write me. I am as yet lying on my oars and wish before I have an occasion

to use the helm to know the course I am to steer and the place of destination; much has been said of Louisiana, give me the reports current

of that country in your neighborhood together with your own opinion, many things in my first letter required answers which am in hopes you will attend to: Elections for members to our State Legislature Will take place In April next and the event begins to be the topic of conversation in almost every circle, and several publications in papers have been made, evidently intended to introduce corresponding committees thro the County for the purpose of election, how It will terminate I know not, but am one of the supporters of the plan. Make my best respects to your companion together with the Captain's to you both—we are all well. I received a letter from Billy a day or two ago, he was well. Mrs. Readley has been unwell but is recovering very fast, and nothing of moment respecting others of your friends and acquaintances worth relating. I expect to see you as early in the Spring as the roads will admit but must certainly receive a letter from you before I start. Accept dear Jack the assurance of my best respects—

William J. **Reynolds**, assistant cashier of the People's Exchange Bank at Russellville, was born in Pope County, Ark., in 1846, and was the second of ten children born to William and Josinor (**Matthews**) Reynolds both natives of Tennessee. The parents came to Arkansas in 1839, and are still residents of this State, living at Atkins. William J. Reynolds was educated in the common schools of this county, and when twenty-one years of age, started out to fight his way in life as a merchant, engaging in business with his father at Dover. They continued in business at that place until 1871, under the title William Reynolds & Son, and then moved to Atkins, where they continued for three years. Our subject then became assistant station agent and operator at Russellville, continued in that capacity for five years, and then was at

Clarksville one year, filling the same position. After this he returned to Pope County, and in the fall of 1880 was elected circuit and county clerk, which office he held for one term (two years). He was then station agent until 1885, and was then appointed postmaster at

Russellville, continuing in that position until May, 1889. In March of the following year, the organization of the above mentioned bank, he was elected to his present position. Mr. Reynolds was married on the eighteenth of April, 1871, to Miss Sarah R. **Lewis**, a native of Tennessee, and the daughter of Dr. J. O. Lewis, who came to Pope County in 1859, dying here the following year. Mr. Reynolds is a member of the various degrees of Masonry, Blue Lodge No. 274, Chapter No. 76 and Palestine Commandery [p.249] No. 7, all of Russellville. He has been secretary of the chapter for nine years, and recorder of the commandery for five years. He owns a neat cottage in Russellville which he erected in 1889, and is one of the representative citizens. He has been a member of the Board of Aldermen of many years.
