Reynolds DNA Genealogy Project G. W. Reynolds

The Reynolds DNA Project was founded in 2003 by Dr. James Reynolds Hull, Ph.D., a member of the RFA. From the beginning, the project has been hosted by Family Tree DNA (FTDNA) in Houston, TX, which utilizes the testing facilities at the University of Arizona, Tucson.

The project has experienced increasing popularity and rapid growth. In October 2006, there were about 30 participants in the Reynolds DNA Project. As of the first week in February 2008, there were 80 participants in this ground breaking program.

In November 2007, Dr. Hull passed his position as Administrator of the DNA Project to Gary W.

Reynolds, who had served as a Co-Administrator since 2006. Gary also serves as a member of the RFA Board with the title of Vice President, Line Coordination. Dr. Hull continues his work with the project in the role of Co-Administrator.

The basis for this project is the fact that yDNA of the male passes from father to son, virtually unaltered, for very long periods of time. The fact that the yDNA is passed down the paternal line makes it invaluable for genealogy studies, which typically follow a surname line. Women do not inherit their father's yDNA.

While the general purpose of the project is to identify participants with matching or near matching DNA characteristics, which indicate a common ancestral branch of the Reynolds family, a second, more strategic objective for the project was set in 2006. We set out as our goal an attempt to characterize the DNA profiles of the lines of the Reynolds family recognized by the RFA.

Our approach is to identify living male descendants of the surname Reynolds from each of those lines, where there are such descendants, by means of documented paper trails of traditional genealogy, and test them. Usually test results of two individuals of the same family are required to characterize the genetic signature of that family. If available, a third individual from the family is also tested to confirm the genetic signature.

During late 2006 and early 2007, two, then three, individuals of the Reynolds surname from RFA Line 35, James and Susanna () Rennolds of Essex Co., VA, were identified and agreed to be tested. As it turned out, none of these three individuals was a member of the RFA and none had any active interest in the genealogy of the line or the particulars of their test results. All consented to testing only because of urging by other family members and because the cost of their testing was underwritten by sponsors. The DNA characteristics on all three of these individuals matched and the results have served to establish the genetic profile of this branch of the Reynolds family. Since then, three additional individuals have been tested and found to be members of unsuspected branches of the James Rennolds line.

From this experience, it has become apparent that family urging coupled with the availability of partially or fully offset costs of testing such descendants of the recognized lines are probably the only means of obtaining the genetic information needed to characterize the RFA lines.

There are obvious benefits to the RFA in the attempt to characterize the various lines recognized by the Association. If we are successful in characterizing these lines, we then have genetic bases for determining migration patterns such as between early settlers in the north who moved south or from south to north. We can also identify previously unsuspected connections between apparently disparate family branches. More importantly, it is probable that many of those with “stonewalled” lineages might find the sources of their families by way of genetic results which characterize the recognized lines.

With these mutual benefits in mind, we request the cooperation and assistance of the RFA membership in the work on characterizing the family lines recognized by the RFA. This will involve the cooperation of current researchers of these lines to identify candidate participants

representative of these lines and full or partial sponsorship of tests, where needed.

The RFA Board has agreed to assist in this effort by establishing an “RFA DNA Fund.” Members who wish to assist in this effort can contribute to the RFA DNA Fund, which will be used to partially off set testing costs for RFA members. WILLIAM C. RANNELLS, farmer of section 8, Boyer township, post office, Dunlap, has been a resident of this section since 1881. Then it was that he purchased 320 acres of raw prairie land, which he has since improved to a great degree. He was born in Noble county, Ohio, 1834. He was the third in a family of eight children born to David and Harriet (Culvertson) Rannells, natives of Pennsylvania, the mother coming from Washington county, that State. The father, who was born in 1812, was married to his wife in Ohio, and his calling was that of farmer. In 1854 he removed to Gentry county, Missouri, where his death occurred in 1857, his wife surviving him until 1878, when she, too, died in the same county. Their family of children were as follows: Louisa, died in Ohio; Caroline married Harvey **White**, of Gentry county, Missouri; W. C., our subject; Mildred, wife of James W. **Owens**, of Gentry county, Missouri; Lucretia, wife of Luther **Knott**, of Kansas; Amanda, wife of Lee **Evans**, of Gentry county, Missouri; Eliza Jane, wife of William **Duncan**, of Missouri; David V., married, farmer of western Nebraska.

William was reared and educated in Noble county, Ohio, until he was twenty, when he went West to Missouri, locating in Gentry county, where he became a member of the militia. He followed farming in Missouri and Mercer county, Illinois, and in 1874 came to Iowa and bought his present farm in 1881. He has improved it to a remarkable degree, erecting a good residence, two-story, 15 x 26, with an L, 15x16, also a fine barn 36x44. He has planted an acre in an orchard and all of this large farm is fenced in but ten acres. He raises considerable stock.

Mr. Rannells was married in Caldwell county, Missouri, January, 1865, to Sabilla **Longstreth**, native of Morgan county, Ohio, daughter of James and Mary Longstreth, natives of Ohio, who removed about 1864 to Missouri, where they both died.

Mr. and Mrs. Rannells have had eight children, namely: Minnie, a teacher, who has been connected with the schools for ten years; she is one of the teachers in the public schools of Des Moines, Iowa; Anna is also one of the Crawford county teachers, she being engaged in the home district; Flora, another teacher of the same county, in Denison; Charles; William; Harriet, who died when she was six months old; Edgar, Arthur and Luthur.

Mrs. Rannells is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and is an earnest Christian woman. Her husband is a member of the Republican party and takes considerable interest in politics, having considerable influence in that direction. This gentleman has seen many changes in the county where he has become one of the enterprising, energetic business men of his community.

A Reynolds Family Mystery

According to a Biographical Review of Otsego Co., NY, published in 1893, Abraham¹ and Hannah (**Wilber**) Reynolds were the parents of 9 children. The only one named therein was Enoch W., who was about 2 when his parents came to Otsego Co in 1805 from Dutchess Co., NY.

After residing in Middlefield, Otsego Co., NY for about 20 years, Abraham and Hannah and their younger children removed to Collins, Erie Co., NY where they lived for their remaining years. They and four of their children are buried in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery. These are: Phebe Reynolds **Gedney**, Nehemiah Reynolds, Norman Reynolds (my great-grandfather), Abraham, Jr., Enoch W and Hannah Reynolds Gedney.

A few months ago, I was contacted by a Virginia man who was interested in finding out if a Dr. Henry Reynolds (in Huron Co., OH by 1840) was related to Abraham and Hannah and, if so, how. Could he have been a son of theirs? His 1880 obituary gives his date and place of birth as Feb 1802, Cooperstown, NY but does not name his parents.

The great-great-grandfather of the above mentioned Virginia man was Daniel Benjamin Gedney whose mother was Phebe Reynolds Gedney². Daniel B. Gedney had gone to OH in the 1860's and spent some time with the family of Dr. Henry Reynolds; ultimately, Daniel Gedney became a physician. He married Alice Louise **Macomber** in 1866 in Ohio.

Dr. Henry Reynolds died 23 Jan 1880 and was married to Harriet P **Marble** in

Cooperstown NY 5 Mar 1828³. Their children were:

Reynolds Cemetery Jim Wells County, Texas

According to the Reynolds Bible in the possession of Mrs. W. R. Jones of Alice, Texas, the first burial in this cemetery was of Charles, infant son of George and Hannah REYNOLDS. Charles was born Feb. 7, 1868 and died Feb. 13, 1868. The next burial was of Edward TAYLOR, George's uncle who came from England about the same time as George (1854). According to

the Almond Diary, Joseph Almond, their friend and neighbor, built the coffin and read the services for "Uncle Ned" on May 2, 1873. These graves are unmarked, but a low wooden post at the northwest corner is said to be a burial marker for a family member.

JACOB McREYNOLDS

He was born to Jacob and Christinia McReynolds, natives of North Carolina and Virginia, on October 18, 1825 in Smith county, Virginia. When twelve years of age he went with his parents to Missouri, spending one year in Illinois on the way, traveling by horse team. He was educated in Missouri and remained there until 1849, when he turned to the west and crossed the plains with ox teams to California, occupying himself in digging gold in Gold Run, near Grass Valley. After one year at this work he went to Sonoma county locating near Bloomfield, and engaging in farming and dairying on a farm of eight hundred acres, until 1886 when he came to Umatilla county to join his sons, remaining here continuously since. He and sons own over one thousand acres on Camas prairie, where they follow general farming and stock raising.

He was married in Lafayette county, Missouri, in April, 1852, to Miss Telitha Cooper, a native of that state, whose parents were natives of Shenandoah valley. To them were born eight children: Frank W.; Lewis M.; Charles N.; Edward H.; Martha A., wife of W. Boynton; Hester, wife of Charles L. Gist; Alfred H. ; Emma R., wife of Sylvan Upson, of Reno, Nevada. All except the last are living on Camas Prairie. His wife died in Sonoma county, October, 1869.

When he first went to California, flour sold at thirty dollars per barrel, bacon seventy-five cents per pound and other things in proportion. In 1851 he made a trip back to the old home, via the Isthmus and New York. The following year he crossed the plains again, accompanied by his wife. One [sic] since he crossed and recrossed the continent, making five times that he performed that journey. During his time in California he was several times elected to fill public office, in variably discharging those duties with faithfulness and ability. He is now enjoying the golden time of life, surrounded with his children, having also the substantial rewards of wise and industrious enterprise

during a long life of unsullied reputation.

David Rannels was b about 1748 (his name is also spelled Rennells. Rannolls. Rannel, Randol Randall). He mar Sarah **Smiley** whose mother's maiden name was **Craig**. The

Craig family were among the early settlers in Western Pa., as early as 1700. David Rannels moved into Belmont Co., Ohio, about 1805. with his sons-in-law. Samuel Lucas and John **Pryor Jr.**, who had mar Sarah Rannels in Greene Co. Pa. David Rannels obtained from the U S Govt a grant for land in the NW 1/4 of Sec 34. 6 Twp, Range 4 in Belmont Co. Ohio, on 16 Mar 1815. On 28 Mar 1818 he sold this land to **Basel Davis** for the sum of \$200.

He [David Rannels] died in Belmont Co, on 2 Apr 1832 and is bur in the old section of Bethel Methodist Church Cem near Centerville. Ohio. His wife survived him; she was living as late as 1834 in Belmont Co, Ohio. David and Sarah Smiley Rannels had several children including Eleanor and Sarah, also Elizabeth, wife of **Benj. Miller**, Samuel and Enos Rannels all of Belmont Co. Ohio.

Records of Pa show one David Rannolls was a private in the Rev War under Capt Wm Scott's Co.. of Militia., 4th Battalion of Washington Co. Pa. (See Pa Arch ser 6, vol 2, p 159).

J.T. Reynolds Passes Away Last Night - Former Big Four Engineer Succumbs in Florida home.

James T. Reynolds, known generally among his friends on the St. Louis division of the big Four as "Blondy," passed away at his home in Englewood, Fla., about midnight Sunday night. Mr. Reynolds had been in failing health for the last two or three years, suffering from paralysis. The third and final stroke of the disease came about thirty days ago, and since that time his condition has been serious.

The body is to be taken to Lorain, OH, for burial. The services will be held in that city either on Thursday or Friday. While no delegation will be set from this city by the engineer's organization, it is expected that some

of Mr. Reynolds' old-time friends will go to attend the last rites.

Native of Ohio.

Mr. Reynolds was a native of Ravenna, OH, having been born in that city on December 24, 1856. When a young man, Mr. Reynolds took employment with the Cleveland, Lorain and Wheeling Railroad, which is now the Baltimore and Ohio. After a few years with that road, he went to Des Moines, Iowa, and worked for a short time, coming to the St. Louis division of the Big Four on March 19, 1884, as an engineer. For many years he worked as a freight engineer, but for the last twenty years or more he had been in charge of the engines of passenger trains. His last run before being retired on a pension on March 23, 1920, was on runs 11 and 46, on the west end, which runs he had held for six or seven years.

Retired by Ill-Health

He was retired because of failing health, even though he had not yet reached the usual retirement age of seventy years. Since that time he had made his home in Englewood, Fla., where he had erected a cottage. His sister, Miss Mae Reynolds, had lived with him and cared for him during his decline in health. Mr. Reynolds and Miss Emma Coen were married about forty-two years ago, Mrs. Reynolds having passed away after only seven or eight years of married life. Surviving are two sons, George Reynolds, living in Dallas, Tex., and John T. Reynolds, Mattoon, and sisters, Miss Mae Reynolds, Englewood, Fla.; Mrs. Margaret McIlvain, Mrs. Seward Williams, Miss Carrie Reynolds, Miss Lillian Reynolds and Mrs. J. White, all living in Lorain, OH.
